## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints took a 1-0 lead in the sixth inning before the rain fell, stopping the game for an hour and 24 minutes. Simeon Woods Richardson allowed just three hits in his 5.0 shutout innings of work, striking out four and walking two. Following the delay, the Saints pushed their lead to 4-0 thanks to RBI singles from Jair Camargo and DaShawn Keirsej Jr., followed by an Alex Isola sacrifice fly. The Sounds rallied back for a pair of runs in the bottom of the frame. Nashville took a 5-4 lead in the eighth on a three-run home run from Yonny Hernández. The Saints went down in order in the ninth, dropping their first game of the season.

**STARTING STRENGTH:** Starting pitching has been a strength for the Saints in the first four games of the season, sporting a 1.54 ERA, the third-best in Triple-A. The two earned runs allowed by starters are the second-fewest in the circuit. Simeon Woods Richardson turned in the eighth start of at least 5.0 innings and zero earned runs in the International League on Tuesday. The Saints had 11 such starts in all of 2023.

**LOOKING TO CHANGE THE TUNE:** In the last two seasons, the Saints and Sounds have only met twice, both at CHS Field (4/26-5/1/22 and 5/2-5/7/23). The Saints lost the series three-games-to-two in 2022, with the finale getting canceled. In 2023 the clubs split their six-game set, giving Nashville a 6-5 advantage in the all-time series. This is the first trip to Nashville in the Saints' fourth season as the Twins' Triple-A affiliate.

**IT ALL SOUNDS THE SAME:** Starting pitcher Caleb Boushley will feel right at home when he makes his start tonight in Nashville. Boushley, who spent each of the last two seasons in Nashville, started 51 games (54 appearances) for the Sounds between 2022 and 2023. In the 2022 season, he went 12-2 with a 3.25 ERA, tied for the league lead in wins and ranked second in ERA. Boushley made his MLB debut with the Sounds' parent club, Milwaukee, last season. He earned the win in his only appearance, allowing a solo home run in 2.1 innings, striking out five.

**RISP ASSESSMENT:** When the Saints have gotten runners in scoring position, they have been able to cash in at a high rate, hitting a *Triple-A best* .400 average. Their 1.059 OPS with runners in scoring position ranks second in the circuit. Of their 10 hits with runners in scoring position, only two have gone for extra bases: the two home runs that were hit on Opening Day. The two extra-base hits with RISP are tied for the second-fewest in Triple-A. Only three teams have one extra-base hit with RISP (Columbus, Omaha, Worcester).

**AND THE SAINTS GO MARCHING IN:** For the first time in franchise history, the Saints will play a home game in the month of March. Last season was the first time they had ever played a game in March, when the season opened on March 31 in Toledo. The March 30 start is the earliest in franchise history, including their days as an independent club. Last season, following their three-game roadtrip in Toledo, their first two home games on April 4 & 5 were postponed. Their April 4 game was postponed due to six inches of snow that had fallen on March 31 and their April 5 game was postponed due to inclement weather.

**HAVING A GRAND OL' TIME:** The St. Paul Saints thrived with the bases loaded in 2023, clubbing 14 grand slams, the most in all of baseball. The 14 slam tied the modern day record (since 2005 in the Minor Leagues, as far back as minor league stats are available), matching Albuquerque who did it in 2022, Cleveland, who accomplished the feat in 2006 and Oakland who did so in 2000. No Major League team had hit more than 14 grand slams in a season in the Modern Era (since 1901).

**IT'S LIKE DAY AND NIGHT:** When the sun is shining, the Saints are red hot with the bats. Across Minor League Baseball over the last three seasons in day games, the Saints are second in home runs (157), fourth in runs scored (604), and total bases (1595). Contrast that during night games and the Saints are 16th in homers (421), 25th in runs (1769), and 26th in total bases (4680).

**HOPING TO BE PRIME 'BIG ALEX' MCDONALD: LIST TOP 30 PROSPECT:** The Saints will have plenty of talent to start the season, especially if you go by the Top 30 List. The Saints have seven players listed on Baseball America's Top 30 List on their active/IL roster. They are: Brooks Lee (#2/#35 overall), David Festa (#5), Austin Martin (#10), Yuniør Severino (#20), DaShawn Keirsej Jr. (#23), Jair Camargo (#26), and Simeon Woods Richardson (#30).

**MAYBE ONE DAY WE'LL MEET:** The Saints will play only one new team in the 2024 season, the Syracuse Mets when they visit CHS Field from June 4-9. There will still be six of the 19 IL teams the Saints will have yet to play when their fourth season wraps up in 2024: Charlotte Knights, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Norfolk Tides, and Worcester Red Sox. The Saints have also not traveled to eight International League cities. Along with those six teams, the Saints have not traveled to the Gwinnett Strippers and Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders. *The only new ballpark they visit this season is the Nashville Sounds, their first roadtrip of the season.*

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins lost their first game in Milwaukee, 3-2, on Tuesday. The Brewers took a 3-0 lead after the third inning against Twins starter Louie Varland. The Twins plated a pair of runs on sacrifice flies from Matt Wallner in the fourth and Christian Vázquez in the seventh. They finish their two-game series today at 12:10 PM CT, with Chris Paddack (NR) squaring off against Joe Ross (NR). The Twins open their home portion of the schedule on Thursday at Target Field against the Cleveland Guardians.

**WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP:** Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

**SOMETHINGS BREWING:** One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

**GIVE BACK:** Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
