YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels picked up their first win of the season, beating the Senators, 7-4. Seth Lonsway started and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with no walks and seven strikeouts. Adrián Sugastey opened the scoring with an RBI groundout in the top of the fourth. In the sixth, Sugastey hit an RBI single to pick up his fourth RBI in the last two games. Vaun Brown was hit by a pitch with the bases loaded and Sugastey later scored on a wild pitch to open a 4-0 lead. The Senators closed the score to 4-2 in the seventh with a two-run double by Maxwell Romero Jr. Jairo Pomares hit a two-run homer in the top of the ninth and Brown added an RBI double to extend the Richmond lead to 7-2. TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of six games in their first road series of 2025, facing the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals.

EVEN STEVEN: In their 238 all-time, head-to-head games, the Flying Squirrels and the Senators are 119-119 against each other. In the Flying Squirrels' first five seasons, they went 46-35 against the Senators from 2010-2014. From 2015-2019, the Richmond went 35-52 against Harrisburg. Over the last four seasons from 2021-2024, the Flying Squirrels have posted a winning record against the Senators three times, going 37-32, but went 7-11 in head-to-head meetings last year. Richmond is also 3-0 against Harrisburg in the postseason, sweeping the 2011 Division Series.

ONE IN THE WIN COLUMN: The Flying Squirrels avoided their first four-game losing streak to open a season with their win on Tuesday night in Harrisburg. They started 0-3 for the first time since 2016 when they dropped the first three games of a four-game set against the Hartford Yard Goats in their inaugural season with Richmond playing as the road team at The Diamond. They also started 0-3 in 2012 at New Britain before salvaging the final game of that series. Along with those two years, the Flying Squirrels' only other 0-2 start prior to this year was in 2014, when they dropped their first two games of the year before going on to reach the Eastern League Championship Series at the end of the season. Last weekend, the Flying Squirrels were swept in a season-opening series for the first time in franchise history. The Senators are 0-4 to being the season for the first time since 2014. Their last 0-4 start was in 2007, when they began the season 0-6.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS went 64-74 last season, missing the postseason for the first time since 2021. For the year, Richmond hitters ranked fifth in the Eastern League in batting average (.238), fourth in hits (592), third in doubles (230), fourth in triples (26), 11th in homers (88) and 11th in stolen bases (123). Flying Squirrels pitchers ranked eighth in the league in ERA (4.22) and fourth in strikeouts (1,281). The 2024 Flying Squirrels used 64 different players, setting a new franchise record.

THE SENATORS The Senators dropped all three games of their season-opening series at Erie over the weekend. They were outscored, 20-4, in the three games. Last year, the Senators went 68-70 and finished in third place in the Eastern League's Southwest Division. They were 38-31 in the first half and finished a game behind Erie from clinching the division's first postseason spot. This year, the Senators offense is ranked last in the Eastern League in batting average (124). The Harrisburg pitching staff has the league's highest ERA (6.75). Harrisburg's roster includes four of Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including RHP Jarlin Susana (No. 3), 3B Cayden Wallace (No. 9), OF Daylen Lile (No. 10) and INF Yohandy Morales (No. 22). Five Senators players are ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects, including Susana (No. 2), Lile (No. 9), Wallace (No. 10), Morales (No. 12) and RHP Marquis Grissom Jr. (No. 23).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Joe Whitman makes his Double-A debut. In his first full professional season last year, Whitman split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene, going 3-8 with a 4.63 ERA in 23 starts. He finished the year ranked ninth in the Giants organization in strikeouts (108) and tied for ninth in games started. Whitman was selected in the second round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Giants out of Kent State, where he was the MAC Pitcher of the Year that season. Before transferring to Kent State near his hometown of Akron, Ohio, Whitman pitched at Purdue. Entering 2025, Whitman was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Giants prospect and No. 7 by MLB.com. For more on Whitman, see page two.

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Kyle Luckham makes his second start of the season. In his season debut as Harrisburg's Opening Day starter on Friday, he allowed three runs over 3.1 innings at Erie. All four runs scored in the fourth inning. This year marks Luckham's third overall with the Senators. He first pitched for Harrisburg for one start in 2023. Last year, he worked 23 games (21 starts), going 5-8 with a 4.47 ERA. Luckham was promoted to Triple-A Rochester last July for four starts before returning to Double-A. Luckham has made four previous starts against Richmond in his career, all coming last season, and has gone 0-2 with a 6.45 ERA (16 ER/22.1 IP). Luckham was selected in the 15th round of the 2022 MLB Draft by the Nationals out of Arizona State University.

HOWELL AT THE MOON: Carter Howell was named the 2024 Flying Squirrels Player of the Year in his first Double-A season. He spent all of last year in Richmond. For the season, he led the Eastern League in doubles (30) and triples (7). He also led the Flying Squirrels in batting average (.272), on-base percentage (.347), slugging percentage (.391), OPS (.738), hits (121), walks (47), extra-base hits (40), total bases (174), runs (64) and stolen bases (15). He reached base four times in Friday's season opener and has totaled three hits and three walks through the team's first four games.

FAMILIAR FACES: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 22 players who have previously played for the Flying Squirrels. There are six players who have made their team debuts, including **Aeverson Arteaga, Sabin Ceballos, Manuel Mercedes, Rodolfo Nolasco, Braxton Roxby** and **Joe Whitman**. Roxby, acquired from the Reds in a trade earlier this year, is the only newcomer with previous Double-A experience.

WHERE DID THESE GUYS COME FROM?: There are players from six different counties on the Flying Squirrels' Opening Day roster, including the United States (20 players), Venezuela (3), the Dominican Republic (2), Cuba (1), Panama (1) and Puerto Rico (1). Among the 20 American-born players, 11 different states are represented, including North Carolina (3), Florida (3), Ohio (3), California (2), Michigan (2), Pennsylvania (2), Kentucky (1), Minnesota (1), North Dakota (1), Rhode Island (1) and Texas (1). There are 11 players who joined the Giants organization out of the MLB Draft, six were signed as non-drafted free agents, six as international free agents, four who were picked up in trades and one who was claimed in the minor-league phase of the Rule 5 Draft. For 23 players, the Giants were their original affiliated organization and five have played with other major-league organizations.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. Friday marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date.

BOULEVARD TO THE BAY: Last season, 14 former Flying Squirrels players reached the majors for the first time. That was the most in a season in franchise history. In 2014, 11 alumni made their MLB debuts, including Joe Panik, Adam Duvall, Andrew Susac, Matt Duffy, Jackson Williams, Edwin Escobar, Hunter Strickland, Chris Dominguez, Gary Brown, Brett Bochy and Chris Heston. The Flying Squirrels alumni to debut in the majors last season were Erik Miller (2023 Flying Squirrels), Landen Roupp (2022-23), Kai-Wei Teng (2022-23), Nick Avila (2022), Randy Rodriguez (2022-23), Mason Black (2023), Gerson Garabito (2021), Spencer Bivens (2023), Raymond Burgos (2023), Hayden Birdsong (2023-24), Parker Dunshee (2023), Grant McCray (2024), Sandro Fabian (2021) and Trevor McDonald (2024). Christian Koss (2024) made his debut for the Giants earlier this week as the first new former Flying Squirrel in the majors this year. Dating back to 2022, 23-of-the-last-26 Flying Squirrels alumni who have reached the majors have debuted with the San Francisco Giants, with Garabito (Rangers), Fabian (Rangers) and Dunshee (Braves) being the only exceptions. The 2023 season saw 10 former Flying Squirrels players debut in the big leagues, including a team-record five from that season's Richmond roster.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster includes six players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 10), Diego Velasquez (No. 13), Sabin Ceballos (No. 16), Trent Harris (No. 26), Aeverson Arteaga (No. 27) and Jack Choate (No. 28). There are also six players ranked in MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list, including Whitman (No. 7), Harris (No. 11), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).


THIS DATE IN RICHMOND **BASEBALL HISTORY**

BASEBALL HISTORY

In 1955, the Boston Red Sox beat the New York Giants, 5-2, at Parker Field in front of a crowd of 12,640. The Giants led off the top of the first inning with back to-back homers by Bobby Hofman and Bill Gardner. They were held scoreless the rest of the game by Red Sox pitchers Willard Nixon and 41-year-old Ellis Kinder. Willie Mays went 0-for-3 with a walk and a stolen base. Monte Irvin had two hits. Ted Lepcio hit a solo homer in the fourth to tie the game, 2-2. Faye Throneberry gave Boston a 3-2 lead with an RBI single in the seventh. Billy Goodman added a two-run single to open a 5-2 Red Sox lead. In 1961, the brand-new Minnesota Twins beat the Baltimore Orioles, 7-2, at Parker Field. Covington native Jim Lemon hit a two-run homer in the first for the Twins. The Orioles answered in the bottom of the frame with singles by Walt Drapo and Chuck Essegian to score Brooks Robinson and Earl Robinson. Reno Bertoia gave the Twins the lead for good with an RBI hit in the fourth. Harmon Killebrew went hitless for Minnesota. Whitey Herzog broke his nose after being hit by a bat during pregame warmups. In 1967, the Pittsburgh Pirates beat the Philadelphia Phillies, 6-2, in front of 8,608 at Parker Field. In the top of the first, Maury Wills reached on an infield hit and Willie Stargell followed with a two-run homer. Roberto Clemente, Bill Mazeroski and Dick Allen all went hitless. In 1990, Francisco Cabrera hit a two-out, game-tying homer in the ninth and Jim Kremers knocked a walk-off single for his first Triple-A hit in a 6-5 R-Braves win over the Toledo Mud Hens at The Diamond. In 2015, Kelby Tomlinson hit a bunt single to score Rando Moreno in the bottom of the 14th inning, giving the Flying Squirrels a 3-2, walk-off win over the Baysox on Opening Day at The Diamond. In 1955, the Boston Red Sox beat the New York Gi-

After missing most of 2023 with injuries, he set career highs in games and innings pitched (54) last year. A Pittsburgh native, Bednar was selected by the Giants in the first round (14th overall) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State, where he was named the Most Outstanding Player of the College World Series that year while leading the Bulldogs to a national championship.

2025 SEASON: -CAREER NOTES: Cotter is back with the Flying Squirrels after working eight relief outings last year, closing three saves. Cotter spent most of the year with High-A Eugene, going 6-4 with a 2.27 ERA in 35 outings. He also pitched one game with Triple-A Sacramento. Cotter signed with Giants in 2023 from the independent High Point Rockers.
