RING AROUND THE ROSIE: In the Patriots' final game before the All-Star break, Jeisson Rosario batted for the cycle in his former home ballpark (Hadlock Field in Portland, spent all 98 games with BOS organization in 2021 playing for Sea Dogs). Rosario's cycle marks the first for Somerset since becoming the Yankees' Double-A affiliate and the first Patriots cycle since 2017 when the team was still in the Atlantic League. During the series in Portland, Rosario went 9-for-14 and reached base in 13/18 possible chances, making for a .643/.737/1.071 slash line over the four games he played in (1.808 OPS).

WILL TO WIN: In his last start at home, Will Warren threw seven shutout innings, allowing only three hits en route to winning his first career Pitcher of the Week Award. Warren has thrown seven innings and earned the win each of his last two times out. He has not allowed a HR since his Double-A debut on 6/2 @BNG. Dating back to June 8, Warren leads the Eastern League with a 1.34 ERA and is tied for the league lead with 5 wins over that span, with teammate Sean Boyle. Boyle won the Patriots' second straight POW award last week and his 1.84 ERA over this stretch dating back to June 8 ranks 2nd in the league only behind Warren. **ADJUSTING WELLS:** After beginning his Double-A career, 1-for-17 in his first 4 games, Austin Wells has adjusted well at the plate. Coming out of the All-Star break, Wells is on a 6-game hit streak, which is tied for his longest hit streak this season across all levels he's played at. Over this streak, Wells is 8-for-26 (.308/.357/.385) with a .742 OPS.

HAPPY TRAILS, HADLOCK: On Somerset's last road trip before the All-Star break, the Patriots hit 12 HR at Hadlock Field in Portland, their most in a single series this season. Across the 12 regular season games Somerset played in Portland this year, the Patriots hit 23 HR. Elijah Dunham's 5 HR at Hadlock Field this season are more than he has at TD Bank Ballpark (3).

**BLAKE RAKES:** During Somerset's last road trip in Portland, Blake Perkins snapped a 49-game homerless drought with his second 2 HR game of the season on 7/14. In doing so, Blake Perkins matched his career high of 8 HR for the 3rd time in his career (2017, 2019), doing so in 61 games this season, after never gotten to the the milestone in under 120 games (2019). Perkins emerges from the All-Star break on a season-best 8-game hit streak in which he has gone 14-for-35 (.400/.432/.629) with a 1.061 OPS, 6 RBI and 6 R.

## **RHP #11 WILL WARREN**

CAREER: (7-5, 2.81 ERA, 80 IP, 79 K, 1.09 WHIP)

PITCH SELECTION: Fastball (93-96), Changeup, Slider (mid-80s), Curveball (mid-70s)

- Awarded his first career Pitcher of the Week honors on 7/10/22 with Somerset, after earning the win on Thursday, 7/6 vs. Bowie, when he got through a career-high 7.0 IP, allowing no runs on three hits and five strikeouts to earn his 4th win as a Patriot and 6th total of the season.
- Began his rookie season in 2022 by pitching to a 3.60 ERA with 42 strikeouts in 35 IP over eight starts in High-A Hudson Valley, before being promoted to Somerset on 5/29.
- Did not pitch in 2021 season after being drafted--instead worked with the Yankees strength and conditioning department to gain 20 lbs. of muscle, also worked to add a slider and two-seam fastball to his repertoire.
- Attended Southeastern Louisiana University, where he was named to the 2021 Southland All-Conference Team his senior year, going 7-2 with a 2.57 ERA and 95 strikeouts in 91 innings over 14 starts. Warren led the Southeastern staff in wins (7), innings pitched (91.0), strikeouts (95) and opponent batting average (.214). He ranked third, second, fourth and fifth in the conference in those same categories, respectively, while also finishing fourth in ERA (2.57).
- Attending the same college as 12-year MLB veteran LHP Wade Miley, Warren finished his Southeastern Louisiana career with a 13-10 career record, four saves and a 3.90 ERA. He allowed only 178 hits in 205.0 career innings pitched, striking out 193 batters.
- No. 4 ranked RHP in Mississippi class of 2017 by Perfect Game, was state champion at Jackson Prep as a senior, when he went 7-0 with a 1.39 ERA.
- Ranked by Baseball America as Yankees No. 27 prospect and the No. 160 prospect of the 2021 MLB Draft, while he was unranked on both lists by MLB Pipeline.
- Warren's curveball and slider both exceed spin rates of 3,000 RPMs.

## COACHING STAFF



## **DAN FIORITO** ★ MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



## GERARDO CASADIEGO ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

## **JAKE HIRST** ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).



## **AARON BOSSI** ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

- Collegiately, Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with 7 HR, 74 RBI and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collgiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). Both of Wells' parents, Greg and Michelle, were graduates and former athletes at the University of Arizona as well.
- During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League (collegiate summer ball) with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox, logging time in 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting .308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.
- Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit .428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. Wells is currently living at the Volpe household, alongside teammates Max Burt and Blake Perkins.
