FOR STARTERS: The Trash Pandas continue their Opening Series tonight, against the Biloxi Shuckers (Milwaukee Brewers with game two of the three-game series).

TOP ATTENDANCE ON OPENING DAY: The Trash Pandas led the Southern League in attendance on Opening Day with 6,658 fans. Knoxville (5,434), Pensacola (5,038 SO) and Columbus (4,897) started the season at home.

2026 SCHEDULE: The complete 138-game schedule will run from April 3 to Sunday, September 13 ... The first half of the season will conclude with a six-game series against Montgomery at Toyota Field from June 16-21. The regular season will wrap up with another six-game series at Chattanooga, scheduled for September 8-13. The final home series at Toyota Field will take place from September 1-6 against Montgomery.

OPENING DAY HISTORY: The Pandas opened the season at home for the second-straight year, and third all-time. Friday's 7-6 loss to Biloxi dropped the Pandas to 0-3 in those games. (lost to Chattanooga 9-1 on 4/4/25, and 6-3 in 11 innings on 4/8/22). The Pandas are 2-4 all-time on Opening Day. The last win on Opening Day was an 8-2 win over Birmingham on April 8, 2022.

AGAINST THE SHUCKERS: The Trash Pandas are 31-36 all-time against the Shuckers, and 19-18 against them at Toyota Field. In 2025, Rocket City finished 6-6 against the Brewers affiliate, and 4-2 at home, one of just two home series won during the 2025 season. Rocket City will visit Biloxi later this month, April 21-26, and will return to Madison, August 18-23.

4-RBI'S FOR FLINT ON OPENING DAY: Tucker Flint smashed two doubles, and had four RBI in Friday's opener against Biloxi. The 4-RBI night was the second-most by a Trash Panda on Opening Night- Trey Cabbage drove in five on 4/8/22 at Birmingham.

GLOBAL BASEBALL SERIES: The Trash Pandas wrapped up their final tune-up before Opening Night with a 6-3 win over Japan's Toyota Red Cruisers on Wednesday night at Toyota Field. **Tucker Flint** led the way offensively, homering twice and reaching base four times. The victory capped the three-game Global Baseball Series in front of a crowd of 4,355. The Red Cruisers opened the series with a win over Alabama A&M on Monday, while the Trash Pandas topped UAH on Tuesday before Wednesday's finale. The day began with a ceremonial Cherry Blossom Planting outside Toyota Field with Trash Pandas and Toyota Executives, symbolizing friendship and new beginnings, followed by a pregame celebration featuring the national anthems of Japan and the United States and a presentation of both countries' flags. The Red Cruisers are the official corporate baseball team of Toyota Motor Corporation, competing in Japan's elite industrial league system and serving as one of the nation's premier development pipelines to professional Japanese baseball and the Samurai Japan national team.

2025 SEASON IN REVIEW: The Trash Pandas, managed by **Andy Schatzley** concluded their fifth season with a 45-92 record, finishing fourth in the Southern League's North Division, 35.5 games be-

hind the champion Birmingham Barons. Rocket City went 24-45 at Toyota Field and 21-47 on the road, being outscored 637-445 for a -192 run differential.

In the first half, the Trash Pandas posted a 24-44 record, placing fourth, 15 games back of the Chattanooga Lookouts. The team went 13-26 at home and 11-19 on the road, ending the half on a nine-game losing streak, including a seven-game sweep by Chattanooga, a new club record. Rocket City scored 219 runs while allowing 310.

The second half saw the team finish 21-48, again fourth in the division and 22 games behind Birmingham. The Trash Pandas went 11-19 at home and 10-29 on the road, scoring 226 runs while surrendering 327.

NEW COACHING STAFF: **Joe Kruzel** was named manager of the Rocket City Trash Pandas prior to the 2026 season, becoming the third manager in franchise history following **Jay Bell** (2021) and **Andy Schatzley** (2022-25). Kruzel enters the role with more than 30 years of coaching experience at the professional and collegiate levels. The 2026 season marks his first year managing in the Angels' system after serving four seasons in a developmental leadership role. His all-time managerial record is 473-472. Joining Kruzel in Madison this season are **Daren Brown** (Coach), **Tim Leveque** (Pitching Coach), **Doug Henry** (Assistant Pitching Coach), **Tony Jaramillo** (Hitting Coach), **Dylan Culwell** (Athletic Trainer), **Chase Galloway** (Assistant Athletic Trainer), **Matt Gabriel** (Strength and Conditioning Coach), **Tristan Saglime** (Game Planning Strategist), and **Joe Wike** (Video Assistant).

PACKING IN TOYOTA FIELD: Since the opening of Toyota Field in 2021, the Trash Pandas have outperformed every other Southern League team in fan attendance, welcoming a remarkable 1,511,011 fans—an impressive average of 6,559 per game. The April 4 crowd of 6,597 led the Southern League in attendance on Opening Night, with Birmingham coming the closest at 5,346. Through the first two months of 2025, and despite two brand new ballparks, Rocket City led the league by averaging 4,432 fans per game. According to wunderground.com, rain was recorded on 22 out of 37 home game days. Despite these challenges, Rocket City led the league in attendance by averaging 4,366 fans per game. The Trash Pandas led the Southern League in attendance over the Independence Day stretch, drawing a league-best 7,157 fans to Toyota Field on July 3. The next closest was Chattanooga, which welcomed 6,311 fans on July 4.

WELCOME BACK CAMPERO: After a breakout 2024 season in Rocket City—where he was named the team's Hitter of the Year and a Southern League All-Star after batting .279 with 14 home runs and 29 stolen bases—he quickly climbed the ladder to Triple-A and the Majors. He made his MLB debut in September 2024, recording his first hit and home run, and went on to appear in 28 games with the Angels in 2025 while also hitting .322 in Triple-A. Now back in Rocket City, he returns as a proven, versatile offensive threat with Major League experience and impact speed.

PANDAS ROSTER: The Trash Pandas Opening Day roster features 17 returners from the 2025 season.

ANGELS PROSPECTS: The veteran team has three players among the Angels' top 30 prospects, according to MLB Pipeline: OF Raudi Rodriguez (No. 15), RHP Joel Hurtado (No. 22), and RHP Austin Gordon (No. 26).

Raudi impressed in 2026 Spring Training, batting .350 with an .835 OPS as a non-roster invitee. Last season, he dominated Low-A Inland Empire in 2025, hitting .281 with 49 extra-base hits and an .842 OPS across 125 games, earning multiple honors in 2025, including five Player of the Week awards, two Player of the Month selections, and the Angels Kenny Myers Memorial LAA Minor League Player of the Year. He also starred in the Arizona Fall League, batting .433 and earning AFL All-Star and Fall Stars Game MVP honors.

Hurtado pitched the majority of 2025 with Rocket City, going 5-6 with a 2.70 ERA (86.2 IP - 26 ER) and 56 strikeouts in 18 games (all starts). He led the staff in the first two months, recording five quality starts and 54.2 innings pitched. Before being shut down for load management in June, he ranked among the league leaders in starts, innings pitched, wins, ERA, WHIP, and groundouts.

In Gordon's first pro season in 2025 with Tri-City, he was 4-5 with a 5.44 ERA over 84.1 innings pitched, 27 walks, and 95 strikeouts.

Elijah Dunham (NYY), **Jose Gonzalez** (TEX), **Eybersson Polanco** (Rule 5, BOS), **Aneurys Zabala** (Japan), and **JJ D'Orazio** (ARI) are all making their Angels organizational debut this weekend. Nick Rodriguez becomes the first 2025 draft selection to reach the Double-A level.

LAUNCHED TO THE LEAGUE: Since 2021, the Trash Pandas have seen 47 players move on to play major league baseball, and ten made the move in 2025. **Walbert Ureña** became the 47th player in franchise history to make his Major League debut, doing so during the Los Angeles Angels' Opening Day win over the Houston Astros on March 26.

A native of San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic, the 22-year-old Ureña was one of ten former Trash Pandas named to the Angels' Opening Day roster, including former manager Andy Schatzley. He was the first reliever out of the bullpen following José Soriano, tossing a scoreless 2/3 of an inning in the seventh, while allowing one hit, walking one, and striking out one.

SPORTS CENTER? MORE LIKE PANDA

CENTER: The Trash Pandas grabbed national attention in 2025 with four highlights on ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 and one on the "Not Top 10," putting Rocket City in front of millions of viewers. Joe Redfield's leaping catch over the berm railing at Toyota Field landed at No. 6 on May 15, while intern Cason Clarke's tarp slip and barrel roll five days later earned a Not Top 10 nod. The team closed the season with three more Top 10 plays in the second-to-last week: Mac McCroskey's sliding stop at No. 8 on August 31, and Ben Gobbel earning back-to-back spots with a barehanded play (No. 9, Sept. 2) and diving snag (No. 7, Sept. 5). In total, Rocket City delivered four Top 10 moments—and one unforgettable blooper—that reached ESPN's massive national audience.

BUILDING THE BRAND: From January through August 2025, the Trash Pandas generated 41.3 million social media impressions—an average of 5.2 million per month—ranking second among all Double-A clubs and ninth across Minor League Baseball. The team's combined audience on Facebook, Instagram, Tik Tok, and X grew by 10% this year to 356,000 followers. Since debuting in 2021, the Trash Pandas have surpassed 200 million total impressions, establishing themselves as one of the most consistently engaging brands in MiLB. In addition, The Trash Pandas hit the West Coast in 2025 with four games (July 31 vs. Birmingham, August 14 vs. Knoxville, August 28 vs. Columbus, and September 10 vs. Chattanooga) televised and streamed live on FanDuel Sports Network West during the second half of the 2025 season.

THE 2025 ROSTER AND HISTORIC MOVEMENT: The Trash Pandas made a club record 128 roster moves during the 2025 season, reflecting a busy and ever-changing lineup. The moves were distributed throughout the year with eight in April, 13 in May, 28 in June—including 11 on June 17—plus 17 in July, 24 from August 1-6 (16 on August 2), six on June 2-3, and 16 in September. These frequent changes shaped the team's roster and contributed to the dynamic nature of the season. 57 players took the field for the Trash Pandas in 2025, which included 32 pitchers and 25 position players.

THE 2025 SHUFFLE: In May, the team added veteran pitchers Jordan Holloway, Sean Poppen, and José Quijada, while several positional moves included Christian Moore being promoted to Triple-A, Cole Fontenelle transferring to the ACL Angels, and Mitch Daly joining Rocket City. Injuries and development assignments also impacted the roster. June saw recalls, releases, and transfers involving players such as Sam Aldegheri, Oscar Colás, Jared Southard, Corey Holland, and AJ Block. August brought the promotions of Brady Choban, Denzer Guzman, and Nelson Rada, while injuries, releases, and new arrivals from Triple-A and High-A continued to shuffle the roster. In September, the roster saw additional additions, including Mitch Daly, Chris Clark, Carlos Espinosa, and Keythel Key, keeping Rocket City's lineup constantly in flux throughout the season.
