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JULY 12th ROCHESTER (8-9)/(53-37) at WORCESTER (8-9)/(44-44) 1:05 pm

Rochester Red Wings RHP Andry Lara (2-6, 5.97) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Seth Martinez (2-2, 5.98)

Wings to Go – The Worcester Red Sox face the Rochester Red Wings for the final time in 2026 when the clubs close out their 6-game series at Polar Park this afternoon at 1:05 pm. The WooSox – who lead this current set, 3 games to 2 – will not be too disappointed to see the Red Wings fly away until next year after today’s series and season-series finale. Rochester leads the season-series 14 games to 7 with one game to go. The teams had two different scheduled games against each other cancelled due to rain. Today’s finale – also the last game before the four-day All-Star break this Monday through Thursday – is live on NESN+ as well as on NASH 98.9 FM.

Ten-Pinned – After winning the first three games of this series, the WooSox have dropped the last two games giving up 10 runs in each. The Red Wings used 4 homers and 13 hits to roll yesterday, 10-3 after a 10-4 victory on Friday behind a 15-hit attack. Rochester has belted 12 HR in the first five games of this series and 37 HR in the 21 games of the season-series thus far. Worcester won each of the first three games including a doubleheader sweep on Wednesday, 5-4 and 10-2 along with an 8-7 victory on Thursday. The Sox – up 3 games to 2 in this current 6-game set - are 7-6-2 in their 15 series thus far...7 wins, 6 losses, and 2 splits.

You Never Know What You Are Going to See at Polar Park – This entertaining series has seen some rare baseball feats that fans don’t often witness. During Wednesday’s make-up doubleheader, the WooSox hit a grand slam (by Tyler McDonough) in their last at-bat to win Game 1 and then began Game 2 with a grand slam in the 1st inning (Brett Harris) to complete the sweep. On Thursday, the WooSox infield was able to turn their first-ever triple play at Polar Park (and the second triple play in WooSox history). With Rochester runners on 1st & 2nd base and on the move during a hit & run, Sox SS Nick Sogard made a leaping grab of a line drive and then tossed to second baseman Tyler McDonough to double up the lead runner who then threw to first baseman Mickey Gasper to complete the triple play. And on Friday night, Rochester third baseman Brady House hit for the cycle as the former 1st round draft pick of the Washington Nationals out of high school in Georgia (2021) tripled in the 1st-inning, doubled in the 3rd, homered in the 5th, and then singled off the Worcester Wall in rightfield leading off the 9th inning. Former WooSox and current Red Sox infielder Tsung-Che Cheng had the first cycle in WooSox history this past April 10th vs. Columbus at Polar Park.

Still a Fine Stretch – Despite the back-to-back setbacks, the WooSox have still won 4 of 6 and 8 of their last 12 games. They have dropped to 1-game under the .500 mark in the second half of the season at 8-9. Worcester is exactly at the .500 mark overall on the season at 44-44 for the 11th time this season. They have 58 games remaining (31 at home & 27 on the road) as they bid for their 6th winning season in this their 6th year in Worcester.

What’s Ahead – The WooSox and the entire International League join with all MLB teams to enjoy four straight off-days starting tomorrow (Monday) through this coming Thursday. Worcester will return to action after the break for a 3-game weekend series at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre from this Friday through Sunday (July 17-19). The WooSox will be back at Polar Park to take on the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp (AAA-Miami) for a 6-game series from July 21-26. After today, Worcester will have 30 home games remaining this season along with 27 road games.

Close Encounters – Six of the last 11 WooSox games have been decided by 1-run with the Sox winning 4 of those 6. Worcester is now even at 12-12 in 1-run games this season.

Ups and Downs – Worcester has been a streaky team over the last seven+ weeks. The WooSox have had a 5-game losing streak from May 19-23, a 4-game winning streak from May 26-20, a 5-game winning streak (June 4-9), a 4-game losing skid right after that (June 10-13), a 3-game losing skid (June 18-20), a 5-game losing streak (June 23-27), and right after that a 4-game winning streak from June 28 – July 2. The WooSox most recently had another 4-game winning streak from July 5-9.

Even at Home and Away – The WooSox are 21-21 at home at Polar Park compared to 23-23 on the road.

The probable pitching match-ups for the series later this week at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre this coming Friday – Sunday are all TBD at this point – especially considering it's five days from now!

Has been hit by pitch 21 times to lead the league. Those 21 HBP are a new modern day Boston Red Sox Triple-A record that was held by David Eckstein with 20 HBP in 2000. Ward leads the WooSox with .284 average at home in 31 games (31-for-109) w/ 26 SB.

Getting Rid of Rochester – The Red Wings lead the season-series over the Red Sox, 14 games to 7, although the WooSox have a 3 games to 2 lead in this current 6-game set. Back from April 28 – May 3 the clubs split a 6-game series in Rochester. The Wings did win the final two games in Rochester over two months ago, and then a few weeks later (May 19-23) the Red Wings came to Worcester and swept an abbreviated 5-game series from the WooSox (out-scoring the Sox, 42-18). The finale of that series on May 24 was first postponed due to rain and then ultimately cancelled when it was not made up in Rochester in June. From June 9-14, the clubs were slated to play a 7-game series (with the makeup from May 24), but that eventually was reduced to a 5-game set with two games cancelled due to weather. Worcester won the opener of that series on June 9, 6-5 in 10-innings, but Rochester would take the next four games to clinch another series victory, this time 4 games to 1. The finale on June 14 was rained out, so the Sox and Wings will now play 22 times this season. Worcester will play Buffalo for 24 games as the Bisons are the club the Sox will face the most this season.

Stats vs. Rochester This Season – WooSox batters are hitting .228 vs. Rochester in the first 21 games of the season series (153-for-670) with 18 HR & 95 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 7-14 with a 6.24 ERA (122 ER in 176 IP) with 37 HRA & 134 runs allowed.

What a Difference a Year Makes – Last season the WooSox won 18 of the 24 meetings with Rochester to post their best-ever season series record against an opponent (18-6). Furthermore, from June 3-8 of last season at Polar Park the WooSox swept a 6-game series vs. Rochester (or a facsimile of these Red Wings). Thus far this season, however, the Red Wings have won 13 of the last 17 meetings and lead the season-series, 14 games to 7.

Best Wings Ever - Worcester posted their best record in their history against any International League opponent in a single season last year vs. Rochester going 18-6 vs. the Red Wings (8-4 in Rochester and 10-2 at home at Polar Park) for a .750 winning pct. In 2024, the WooSox went 16-7 vs. Lehigh Valley and that .696 winning pct. was their best against any IL foe (of more than six games) since they came into existence in 2021 before last year's dominance of the Red Wings. During their inaugural 2021 Covid-impacted season, the WooSox only faced five different opponents all year and they had their most success against Lehigh Valley going 22-13 (.629).

Worcester/Pawtucket vs. Rochester– Worcester leads Rochester in the all-time series (since 2021) with 70 victories compared to 60 for the Wings. Worcester is 33-36 all-time vs. the Wings at Polar Park while the WooSox are 37-24 in Rochester. Furthermore, Worcester/Pawtucket is up on Rochester, 394-383 in the remarkably close last 47 years of facing each other since 1979.

Homer Haven – WooSox batters have been on a home run binge of late. They have blasted 15 HR in their last 11 games and over a longer stretch, Worcester has homered in 25 of their last 32 games since June 4 for a total of 37 HR. By comparison, in their previous 20 games between May 10 – June 3 the Sox hit just 8 HR total. The WooSox are 34-17 when they homer in a game this season, however, they are next to last in the International League with 83 HR on the year.

2nd Half Adjustments - The WooSox have begun the 2nd half of their season with an 8-9 record after starting the second half with 5 consecutive defeats. On June 27 they fell a season-low 4-games under .500 with their 36-40 overall mark (now 44-44). It was Worcester's lowest point in more than 14 months since they were also 4-games below .500 on April 11, 2025 at 4-8. They have not been 5-games under .500 since August 16, 2024 (56-61).

Half Marathon - The WooSox finished the first half of the season with a 36-35 good for a tie for 4th-place in the International League East division (tied for 10th overall in the 20-team IL). The WooSox did have four games cancelled due to weather so they only played 71 of their scheduled 75 first half games. The Sox also played on 31 games at home in the 1st half (17-14) compared to 40 road games (19-21). Worcester's first half rankings among the 20 teams in the International League: Offensively 13th in **Batting** (.247), 17th in **Runs** (347), tied for 19th in **HR** (63), and 9th in **OBP** (.347). WooSox pitchers were 7th in the league in **ERA** (4.54) and had the 5th lowest **Batting Average Against** (.241). And the WooSox had a +2 scoring margin (scoring 347 runs while allowing 345).

Series Matters – The WooSox – up 3 games to 2 in this 6-game set vs. Rochester - are 7-6-2 in their 15 series thus far...7 wins, 6 losses, and 2 splits. Last year, Worcester went 8-9-10 in their 27 series played... 8 wins, 9 losses, 10 splits.

Plead the Fifth – Worcester recently ended a 5-game losing streak (June 23-27). They also had 5-game losing streaks from May 19-23 (all at home vs. Rochester) and from April 14-18 (all in Nashville). Worcester's longest losing streak all of last year was also 5 games (April 25-30, 2025). They have not lost 6 straight since a 6-game losing streak from May 22-28, 2024. Their longest losing streak in their 5½-year history came in 2022 when they lost 10 consecutive games from May 5-15, 2022. The WooSox had a 5-game winning streak from June 4-9 to match their season-best 5-game winning streak from March 31 – April 5 all in St. Paul, Minnesota. Those are their longest winning streaks since a club-record 9-game winning streak last year from June 1-11, 2025.

Highs and Lows – The WooSox (at 44-44 now) have been exactly .500 a total of 11 times this season. Worcester dipped to a season-low 4-games under .500 on June 27. Their low point last season was 4-games below .500 on April 11 at 4-8. The Sox have been a season-high 6-games over .500 four different times this season- April 10 (9-3) & April 12 (10-4) and May 2 (18-12) & May 8 (21-15).

Cancel Culture - Worcester has had four games cancelled due to weather (all in the 1st half) – April 3 at St. Paul, May 9 at home vs. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, Game 2 of a make-up doubleheader at Rochester on June 11, and June 14 also at Rochester.

Weather or Not – The WooSox have had four games cancelled due to inclement weather (one at home & three on the road) and four others postponed this season (two at home & two on the road). Last year the WooSox set a new club record for most home games either postponed or cancelled in a single season with nine (along with two other road games postponed).

June Tune – The WooSox went 11-13 in June suffering their second straight losing month. The WooSox went 10-15 in May after a 17-12 mark in March/April. Worcester pitchers had a 4.65 ERA in June (109 ER in 211 IP) while batters hit .245 (197-for-805) with 26 HR. The Sox were out-scored by their opponents, 124-109 in June.

Final June Leaders – OF **Allan Castro** (.305 in 22 games) led the WooSox in batting in June followed closely by INF **Mikey Romero** (.300 in 19 games). Romero led the team in HR (5) while Castro led the club in RBI (14). Among regular pitchers, RHP **Oswaldo Berrios** was 2-1 with a 0.57 ERA in 7 games while RHP **Wyatt Olds** was 1-1 with a 0.93 ERA in 9 games in June.

May We Skip the Month – Worcester's 10-15 record in May was the second worst month they have ever had behind only a 10-16 month of July during their inaugural season of 2021. Worcester has been remarkably consistent in their history and more recently since August of 2024 they have had just three losing months in their last ten months. The WooSox went 15-10 this April.

Monthly Team Stats for May – Worcester hitters batted .235 this May (193-for-823) with 41 doubles, 4 triples, and 22 HR in 25 games while WooSox pitchers had a 4.85 ERA (118 ER in 219 IP) with 29 HRA. The Sox out-scored by their opponents, 126-110.

Monthly Individual Leaders for May – WooSox May leaders offensively included: **Anthony Seigler** at .344 in 18 games in May with 3 HR & 14 RBI and **Nate Eaton** at .289 in 19 games with 6 2B, 1 3B, 2 HR, 9 RBI. On the pitching side: **Tommy Kahnle** made 11 scoreless relief appearances in May covering 11 shutout innings; **Alec Gamboa** was 1-2, 1.89 in 5 G, 3 GS; **Eduardo Rivera** was 3-0, 2.20 in 8 RA; and **Noah Song** was 1-0, 2.25 in 7 RA.

An Enjoyable April – After going 2-2 to begin the season from March 27-31, Worcester posted a winning April going 15-10. The Sox finished April alone in 1st-place in the International League East Division. The 15 wins this April equal the most Worcester won in any month last season when they went 15-10 in June and 15-13 in August.

April Stats Leaders – As a club the WooSox batted .252 in April with 19 HR while Sox pitchers had a 4.63 ERA with 24 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents during the month, 127-122. **Vinny Capra** led the Sox in average in April hitting .322 in 18 games with 7 2B, 2 HR, 13 RBI, and a team-high 18 runs scored. **Matt Thaiss** (.324 in 11 games with 2 HR & 11 RBI), **Nate Eaton** (.301 in 23 games with 5 2B, 1 3B, 3 HR & 10 RBI), and **Kristian Campbell** (.294 in 23 games) all enjoyed fine Aprils. Leading pitchers during the month were **Payton Tolle** (2-0, 0.82 in 2 GS) and **Jake Bennett** (2-0, 1.00 in 4 GS) while **Tayron Guerrero** was the best out the bullpen posting a 1.13 ERA in 7 relief appearances with 2 saves.

A Winning Tradition – The 2025 Worcester Red Sox went 76-73 to post a winning season for the fifth time in as many years of existence (and for the fourth year in a row under former manager Chad Tracy). Worcester finished 41-33 during the first half last year and then 35-40 in the second half. Overall the 2025 WooSox went 40-34 at home compared to 36-39 on the road. The Pawtucket Red Sox posted five straight winning seasons just once in their 47 years as Boston's Triple-A affiliate – that coming from 1996-2000.

How the WooSox Have Won - The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark, the 2024 team matched that win total going 79-71, and as mentioned the 2025 squad went 76-73. Heading into this season, the WooSox were 383-339 all-time for a .530 winning pct. including a 195-168 record at home compared to a 188-171 mark on the road.

Fun Fact – Of the 295 players who have played for the Worcester Red Sox in their 5½-year history (up to today), a total of 217 of them have played in the Major Leagues (74%) including 148 with the Boston Red Sox (50%).

Portland Sea Dogs Update – The Double-A Portland Sea Dogs (11-6)/(46-39) won at New Hampshire last night, 8-3. Ronald Rosario had 3 hits and 3 RBI, Miguel Bleis also had 3 hits including a double and 2 runs scored, and Raudelis Martinezx smacked a 2-run Hr (#1). Blake Wehunt (5-4) was the starter and winner – 5.2 IP, 6 H, 3 R, 3 ER, 0 BB, 6 SO while Jedixson Paez earned SV #2 with 3.1 scoreless innings to close it out.

WOOSOX ROSTER MOVES – None today as of early this morning. The WooSox will soon add INF Brett Harris back onto their roster following his option from Boston on Saturday.

Harris, 28, started for the Red Sox at first base on Thursday against the Chicago White Sox going 0-for-2 with a HBP. He was acquired in a trade with the Athletics on July 1. The right-handed hitter has also played in five Major League games this year for the Athletics, making one start at third base. He has also hit .317 (53-for-167) with 35 runs scored, 13 doubles, one triple, six home runs, 40 RBI, 25 walks, and a .936 OPS in 42 Triple-A games between Las Vegas (37 games) and Worcester (five). Originally selected by the Athletics in the seventh round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the Illinois native has batted .192 (35-for-182) with three home runs and 17 RBI in 74 career Major League games with the Athletics (2024-26) and Red Sox (2026).

It has been a busy start to July for the WooSox as the club has been involved in 23 moves that has featured six newcomers joining the WooSox in the first 12 days of the month.

Worcester has made at least one player move during 69 of the last 95 days (not including today yet) between April 7 – July 11 for a total of 133 moves during that stretch. The WooSox went three consecutive days without a player transaction (May 30, May 31, and June 1 – although they did not play on June 1) for the first and only time since just after their season-opener when they did not make a move during four straight days from March 28-31.

The WooSox have used a total of 56 players already this season (36 pitchers and 20 position players).

Furthermore, 16 different WooSox players have been promoted directly from Worcester to Boston this season (not counting rehabbers). The lucky list: RHP Zack Kelly, RHP Tyler Uberstine, LHP Tyler Samaniego (three times), RHP Jack Anderson (twice), LHP Eduardo Rivera (twice), LHP Payton Tolle, OF Nate Eaton (twice), LHP Jake Bennett (twice), LHP Alec Gamboa (three times), C/INF Mickey Gasper, INF Nick Sogard, RHP Tyron Guerrero, INF Anthony Seigler (twice), RHP Tommy Kahnle, INF Tsung-Che Cheng, and INF Brett Harris. In addition, the WooSox had their manager, Chad Tracy and hitting coach, Collin Hetzler both promoted to Boston for those same roles with the Red Sox on April 26.
