NEWS AND NOTES

HOME COOKIN: Last night's win over the Bats was the 43rd home win of the season for Nashville. The Sounds remain tied with Low-A Hickory (TEX) and Double-A Tulsa (LAD) for the most home wins in the minors this year. With nine games remaining this season at First Horizon Park, the Sounds currently have their seventh-most wins at home for any season since 2005. Nashville set the franchise-record with 51 wins in 1980.

ONE IS PLENTY: All nine Sounds batters recorded a hit on Thursday. It was the fourth time this season that all Nashville hitters in the starting lineup recorded at least one base knock. The Sounds improved to 19-18 on the season in one-run games and was the third time they have won at least three one-run games in a single-series this year (May 12-17 vs. Iowa, May 26-31 vs. Gwinnett). The Sounds have played four straight one-run games since the series finale in Jacksonville last Sunday. Thursday marked the first time Nashville has won three straight one-run games since May 21-23, 2021 against Gwinnett (3-2, 2-1, 1-0) as part of a 15-game winning streak.

BID YOU BADD00: Akil Baddoo hit his 11th homer of the season with a go-ahead three-run shot in the bottom of the seventh inning on Thursday night. It was his third home run in his last eight games since the start of the Jacksonville series last week. Six of Baddoo's 11 home runs this season have been go-ahead home runs, second-most on the club behind Brock Wilken (8). The 11 home runs on the season are the third-most on the team behind

Brock Wilken and Jeferson Quero with 15 each. Baddoo is four homers away from tying his Triple-A career-high (15), a mark he sent last season with the Toledo Mud Hens.

TRIPLE AYE: Blake Burke went 1-for-3 with his first triple at the Triple-A level in Thursday's game. It was the fifth career three-bagger for the Brewers no. 12-rated prospect who has a career-high three triples this season after hitting a pair for Double-A Biloxi. It was his first triple since June 4 in game one of the doubleheader against Montgomery. The Sounds lead the International League and rank T-4th in Triple-A with their 37 triples this year and are tied for the fourth-most in a single-season since 2005. The 2018 Sounds hit 47 in 2018.

DON'T LOCK HIM UP: Brandon Lockridge posted a 1-for-4 night, adding two RBI and a walk against the Bats on Thursday. Lockridge has posted seven RBI in his last four games, highlighted by his career day against the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp last Friday when he went 3-for-5, added two doubles and recorded a career-high five RBI. In 14 games with Nashville, he has put up a .236 batting average (13-for-55), added three XBH, 11 RBI and eight runs. It marked his second multi-RBI game of the season for the Sounds and 66th regular season game with 2+ RBI since the start of his professional career in 2018.

WILKEY WAY: Brock Wilken hit his 23rd double of the season and produced a 2-for-5 night in Thursday's win. His 23 two-baggers rank eighth in the Brewers farm system this year. It

was his first double since he recorded a two-bagger in three straight games on August 20-23 at Norfolk. The 24-year-old also ranks sixth in RBI (74) and eighth in walks (76) among full-season minor league hitters in the Brewers' farm system. Thursday was his 13th multi-hit game of the season for the Sounds and ranks tied for third behind Jeferson Quero (23) and Tyler Black (14) among active players on the roster.

WELCOME TO THE CROW: Coleman Crow made his 16th start (17th appearance) of the season for the Sounds, recording his seventh quality start and earning a no decision against Louisville (7.0 IP, 9 H, 2 ER, 4 K). Six-of-the-seven quality starts have come in his last eight games since July 19 vs. Norfolk. Since rejoining the Sounds on July 4, Crow ranks second in ERA (2.47) and IP (54.2), third in WHIP (1.15), and sixth in AVG (.234) among qualified International League pitchers. The no. 23-rated prospect has recorded 23 quality starts in his professional career since 2021. Ten of the 23 quality starts have come within the Brewers' farm system since joining Double-A Biloxi and Nashville last season. He has the third-most quality starts in the system over the last two seasons behind Tyson Hardin and Jaron DeBerry with 12 each. Crow has earned a quality start all 23 times he has gone the minimum 6.0+ IP to qualify and Wednesday night was his fifth career QS of 7.0+ IP or more. He joined Hardin as the only two Sounds' starters to work 7.0 IP in a game this season after Hardin did it on May 17 in his Triple-A debut vs. Iowa.
