Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, hoping to secure his first win of the season (has pitched to the 5th only six times). The Mud Hens will counter with RHP **Luke Taggart**. Columbus is 42-30 (.583) versus right handers this year. Taggart has pitched against Columbus once in his career, making his Triple-A debut in Huntington Park on 4/30 (ND, 2.1IP, 1BB, 2K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus has pulled ahead in the season series vs. Toledo (9-4) after going 10-11 opposing the Mud Hens last year (have not won a season series since going 11-10 in 2022). The Clippers have scored first in 10 of 13 against Toledo this year (8-2), compared to 37 times (20-17) in their other 89G. Individually, **Daniel Schneemann** has hit .356 with 6HR and 19RBI against Toledo in his career (23G).

Brushing Off the Homers

The Clippers were outthomered 4-2 last night, but Columbus prevailed for the 14th time when watching the opposition hit more over the wall (2nd most in the IL; 14-24, .368, 2nd best win percentage). The last 13G have seen the Clippers more than doubled up in the homer column (29-14), as their season differential has dropped to -15 (15th, only team in the IL with at least 53 wins and a negative differential).

Ingle is Back

In 13G since his option, **Cooper Ingle** is 21x55 (.382), drawing 7BB (.452OBP) with 8XBH (2HR, .600SLG). Thursday's 4x5 game pushed his season average over .300, while also qualifying him for rate statistics, as he is one of two players in the IL, along with Iowa's **BJ Murray**, hitting .300/.400/.500. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.308OPS (12HR) in 35G (.613OPS and 2HR in 28G between DH and LF).

Angel Ascendant

Over his last 31G, since 6/18, **Angel Genao** leads the IL in OBP (.479), while ranking 2nd in batting (.377, 43x114), 3rd in walks (23) and 8th in OPS (1.032). He owns a 16% walk rate in that time (140PA; 8% in first 35G with Columbus) and his 11K yield an 8% rate (21% in first 35G). Saturday's multi-K game was his first since 5/31 (40G between; 40PA with 0K from 7/8-7/22, 50PA with 0K from 6/23-7/3).

Long Time, No Schneemann

Daniel Schneemann returned to the Clipper lineup last night for the first time since 5/31/24, singling with a trio of walks in his 170th career game (99RBI as a Clipper). In his last 33G with the Clippers, since 4/25/24, he has slashed .345/.465/.638 with 7HR and 28RBI. In his Huntington Park career, he has produced a .908OPS with 16HR in 85G, while turning in a .795OPS with 7HR in 85G on the road.

Walks Waning

Though the Clippers maintain a comfortable lead in the IL in walks (522, +31 on 2nd), they have drawn just 42BB in 10G since the All-Star Break (t-10th). **Kahlil Watson** has only 8BB in his last 29G with Columbus (30BB in first 31G, ranked 2nd in the IL through 5/9). **Bo Naylor** has just 3BB in his last 14G (24BB in first 28G with Columbus) and **Cooper Ingle** has 1BB in his last 6G (8BB in 8G prior).

Looking to Rebound

Ralph Velazquez produced a multi-hit game on 7/19 vs. Indianapolis, a day after his career best 30G on base streak was snapped (.383OBP from 6/3-7/10, t-4th longest in the IL this year), but he went 0x21 in 6G after (average dipped 31 points). He collected a pair of extra base hits last night, boosting his OPS in Huntington Park to .915 (.579 in 25G on the road; 23x65 with 3HR in last 18G at home).

Serious Growth

Kody Huff clubbed his 15th HR of the season last night (all in last 252AB; had 15HR in previous 856AB, 6/28/23-4/5/26). Having already also established career highs in runs, triples, RBI, walks, and steals, Huff is just seven hits and four doubles from personal bests. He is 7x19 in his last 6G (double, triple, 3HR) and his .918OPS is 5th best in the IL (.682OPS in MiLB career prior; **Cooper Ingle** leads: .987).

Rare Company

Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, **Milan Tolentino** is 25x85 (.294) in his last 27G, collecting 13XBH (.553SLG) and 15RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 20G, Tolentino has drawn 18BB to 16K (74PA; 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA). He is one of 11 in the IL with at least a dozen HR and SB, along with **Kahlil Watson** (Columbus and Omaha are only teams with two).

This Date in Clipper History

7/29/1979

Bob Kammeyer beat Pawtucket 4-3 to win his 8th straight decision and improve to 13-4 on the season. Kammeyer (16-8, 3.92ERA, 10CG) would win a franchise best 16 games in 1979, but fell short in the IL Pitcher of the Year voting to teammate **Rick Anderson** (13-3, 21 saves, 1.63ERA). The next season, Kammeyer went 15-7 with a 2.91ERA and 13CG to win the award. His 23CG are an all-time Clippers record.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,462 to 1,403).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 147-118 (.555) in pitch reviews, with batters going 75-75 (.500) and pitchers/catchers going 72-43 (.626). They have run out of challenges in 41G and have not challenged in 5G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 792, would rank as 6th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 119 through 102G (on pace for 174SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 33CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 153 runs while crafting a .904OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 83 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +70 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 238-149 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 79 grand slams and 1,961RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.36 through the first 102G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 196HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 57G this season (33-24, .579), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 3rd most last at bat wins this year (14, two off the lead) while playing in the 3rd most games decided in the last at bat (26, Memphis has 28). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 100G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-52 (.480, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 439-455 (.491), 409-409 with Columbus (.500).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 53 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 50.0IP, ranking 34th among that group with a 5.07ERA (65.2IP, 37ER) and 39th with a 1.54WHIP. He ranks 6th with 69K thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24; had second career 0K game on 7/9 at Lehigh Valley).

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 39 times over his short career (16G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 13-10 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.50ERA (220.0IP, 172H, 65R, 61ER, 46BB, 212K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.49 over 55G (268.1IP, 286H, 152R, 134ER, 70BB, 245K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters were 3x38 with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). That all changed in his 13th start, at Lehigh Valley on 7/9, when he labored through the opening frame on 41 pitches, allowing a trio of runs (3x6, 2BB). In 2G since, including his relief outing on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, Peterson has held the opposition scoreless in his first inning of work (1x7, 2K). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a 1.012OPS off Peterson (6HR in 100AB), while batters 4-9 produce a .665OPS (1HR in 154AB).

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .330 (37x112) with runners on base (.352, 25x71 with RISP) this year, while going just 36x142 (.254) with the bases empty. Only 22.5% of at bats end in a strikeout with RISP (16K, 71AB), compared to 29.0% in all other scenarios (53K, 183AB). He did not uncork a wild pitch this season until his 410th offering with men on base, 7/9 at Lehigh Valley (had another wild pitch in next outing, 7/18 vs. Indy; 3WP in 1,105 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).

From the 'Pen:

Peterson made his third career relief appearance (all with Columbus) on 7/18 vs. Indianapolis, picking up a suspended game in the 4th inning against the Indians. Pitching on his regular day of rest, he threw 72 pitches over 4.0IP, while allowing 4ER (15.0IP, 11ER in relief career).
