THINKIN 'BOUT LAST NIGHT: The River Bandits bats went cold on Opening Night, as they fell to the Cubs 3-1 ... the loss results in Quad Cities' first set of back-to-back Opening Night losses since 2011/2012 and their third to South Bend in the last four years ... Quad Cities struck out 16 times, hit 0-for-8 with runners in scoring position, and left 10 on base ... Despite the loss, Quad Cities' bullpen kept the Bandits in the game, allowing just 1 ER over 5.1 inning with 9 strikeouts ... Carson Roccaforte plated the Bandits' lone run of the game with a two-out RBI double in the bottom of the ninth ... Carter Jensen (2-5, 2B) and Jared Dickey (2-4) each recorded a pair of hits.

HITTER'S BLOCK: A.J. Block was perhaps the biggest bright spot for Quad Cities in last night's loss, as the left-hander stymied the Cubs with 2.0 perfect innings of relief, including a pair of strikeouts ... he threw just 18 pitches and threw 15 for a strike ... the appearance marks the first game action in 922 days for Block who after helping lead the Bandits to a High-A Central Championship in 2021, had missed the past two seasons with a left arm missed the past two seasons with a left arm

**OPENING NIGHT THIEVERY:** Quad Cities' 3 stolen bases yesterday are the most on Opening Night for the club since 2017 ... Trevor Werner (2) joins Tyler Tolbert (2) as the only Bandits to steal multiple bases on Opening Night in the Bandits' four-years as a Royals affiliate ...

HOW IT'S MADE: 18 members of the River Bandits roster return to Davenport after having spent some time with Quad Cities previously in their career ... 18 are former Royals draft picks, 5 were signed as undrafted free agents, 3 were signed as international free agents, and 3 were acquired by Kansas City via trade.

WE KNOW RONEL: Five days ago, on April Fools Day, former River Bandit Ronel Blanco tossed the first no-hitter of the 2024 Major League season, blanking the Blue Jays in a 10-0 Astros win ... the right-hander appeared in 22 games (11 starts) for the Bandits in 2017, posting a 3.30 ERA, to help lead Quad Cities to its 11th league title and its lest as an Astros affiliate. title and its last as an Astros affiliate.

A BANDIT IN THE HALL: During the offseason, former River Bandit Joe Mauer became just the third catcher in baseball history to become a first-ballot Hall of Famer and was inducted alongside Adrian Beltre and Todd Helton as part of the Class of 2024 ... prior to a 15-year Major League career with Minnesota (which included 6 All-Star selections, 5 gold gloves, 5 Silver Slugger Awards, and 3 batting titles) the 2009 American League MVP spent four seasons in the minor leagues after being selected by the Twins first overall in the 2001 Draft ... with the River Bandits in 2002--his age 19 season-Mauer batted, 302 with 23 doubles, 62 RBls, and a team-high 61 walks, while also throwing out 42% of baserunners who attempted to steal with him behind the plate.

A CENTURY AND COUNTING: The 2024 season marks the 101st year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 different Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2024 marks the River Bandits fourth season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, nine River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), Maikel Garcia ('21), John McMillon ('23), Nick Loftin ('21), Logan Porter ('21), and Anthony Veneziano ('21).

#### **MANAGER BROOKS CONRAD**

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the third-consecutive season, his eighth (seventh managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 44-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.

# **35** AJ Block (Anthony Jacob)

LHP | 25 YRS | Born: Salt Lake City, Utah | Acquired: UDFA, June 23, 2020 (Washington State)

2022-23: Missed back-to-back seasons due to left arm injury.

2021: Posted a 3.30 ERA (37 ER in 101.0 IP) in his first professional season with competition, the fourth-best among Royals farmhands, making 4 appearances for Columbia (A) and 19 (16 starts) for Quad Cities (A+) ... among Royals minor leaguers, his 124 strikeouts ranked second only to Anthony Veneziano's 127 ... got the start and threw 3.2 one-hit, shutout innings in title-clinching Game 5 of the High-A Central Championship Series for the River Bandits.

2020: Went 2-0 with a 3.25 ERA (10 ER in 27.2 IP) and 34 strikeouts (11.1 K/9) to just 5 walks (1.6 BB/9) in 4 starts at Washington State, prior to the season being suspended due to the COVID-19 pandemic ... led all Pac-12 pitchers in innings, tied for second in strikeouts, and had double-digit strikeout performances in each of his last 3 starts, becoming the first Cougar to accomplish that feat in at least 33 seasons.

2019: Was selected by the Detroit Tigers in the 17th round of the MLB Draft, but returned to Washington State for his senior season.

2016: Graduated from Newport High School (Washington) and was selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 39th round of the MLB Draft, but did not sign.

2024: Acquired by Kansas City from Seattle as the player-to-be-named-later in the Samad Taylor trade (January 30).

2023: Made 39 appearances (1 start) for Modesto (A) and posted a 4.02 ERA (18 ER in 40.1 IP) with 54 strikeouts, while holding opposing batters to a .175 average ... his 12.05 SO/9 was tops among all Nuts arms with a minimum of 40.0 IP ... from June 29 to August 31, allowed earned runs in just 1 of his 19 appearances and struck out 29 batters in 19.1 innings.

2022: Worked exclusively out of the bullpen in his full-season debut, making 35 relief appearances for Modesto (A) ... was teammates with former River Bandit hurler William Fleming,

LHP | 27 YRS | Born: Mandan, North Dakota | Acquired: UDFA, July 25, 2021

2023: Spent the entire season with Quad Cities (A+), making 33 relief appearances and totaling 44 strikeouts in 38.0 innings ... held opposing hitters to a .204 batting average.

2022: Made 2 appearances with the ACL Royals (R) before making 15 relief appearances with Quad Cities (A+) where held opposing hitters to a .187 batting average across 21.2 innings ... pitched in 11 games and posted a 3.21 ERA (5 ER in 14.0 IP) for the Brisbane Bandits in the Australian Winter League where he was teammates with former River Bandits infielder Tyler Tolbert.

2016-21: Played five seasons at North Dakota State University, posting a 3.73 ERA (67 ER in 161.2 IP) with 189 strikeouts ... as a senior in 2021, he recorded a 1.70 ERA with 62 strikeouts in 37.0 innings and earned All-Summit League First Team honors as a relief pitcher ... was named to the Summit League Championship All-Tournament Team, voted to the ABCA/Rawlings All-Central Region First Team, and named to the ABCA/Rawlings All-America Third Team, becoming the first baseball player of NDSU's NCAA Division I era to earn All-American honors and the fourth overall in program history ... appeared in 10 games with the ACL Royals (R) in his professional debut.

2021-22: Played two seasons at Ole Miss, punctuated by a national title as a senior in 2022, in which he threw the title-clinching pitch of the College World Series to Hayden Dunhurst, who the Royals selected in the 6th round of the 2022 Draft ... recorded 12 saves in 24 outings for the 2022 College World Series champion Rebels and racked up 71 strikeouts in 41.2 innings (15.3 K/9) ... pitched 6.0 innings between the ACL Royals (R) and Columbia (A) in his professional debut.

2018: Attended the University of Alabama Huntsville, but did not play.

2017: Graduated from Brookwood High School (Alabama), where he was a four-year letter-winner in baseball, football, and basketball and was named All-Region in both baseball and football as a senior.

RHP 21 YRS | Born: Shawnee Mission, Kansas | Acquired: 2nd round, 2021 Draft (Blue Valley Southwest High School, Kansas)

2024: Opened the season ranked No. 4 on MLB Pipeline's list of top 30 Kansas City Royals prospects.

2023: Began the season with Columbia (A), pitching to a 3.56 ERA (27 ER in 68.1 IP) in 14 appearances (13 starts) with 70 strikeouts ... led the Fireflies and ranked fourth in the Carolina League in innings pitched (68.1) prior to his promotion to Quad Cities ... was part of a Columbia pitching staff that posted a 3.19 first-half ERA, the top mark in Minor League Baseball ... struck out 6 and tossed 6.0 shutout innings in his Quad Cities (A+) debut on July 20 at Beloit ... made 8 starts for the River Bandits to close out the season, going 5.0 or more innings in all but one ... along with former River Bandit Luinder Avila, pitched 108.2 total innings, the most of any Royals farmhand 21 or younger.
