LAST NIGHT: Tennessee third baseman Levi Jordan went 3-4 with a homer, two runs scored and three RBI as the Smokies thumped the Trash Pandas 10-1 Thursday night at Toyota Field. The visitors plated a run in the first on a RBI single from Luis Vazquez, then exploded for four in the third on an RBI double by Alexander Canario and an RBI single from Bryce Ball before Yonathan Perlaza ripped a two-run homer to put the Smokies up five. Vazquez added a solo homer in the fourth, which preceded the three-run blast from Jordan in the sixth. Rocket City gained its lone run in the bottom-half on a bases-loaded double play by Preston Palmeiro. Tennessee's final run came on a bases-loaded walk from Matt Mervis in the ninth. Rocket City got two hits apiece from Orlando Martinez and Kevin Maitan, with Martinez scoring the team's lone run, however the Trash Pandas left 12 men on base. The loss fell to Brett Kerry of the Trash Pandas after he allowed five runs on seven hits over three frames. Rocket City hurlers struck out 15 Smokies for the game.

SMOKIN' SOTO: Over the last 20 games, infielder Livan Soto is 35-116 (.302). He entered play on 4/20 with a .167 average, but now is batting .270 following his recent surge. Known for his glove, Soto joined the Angels before the 2018 season from the Braves as part of MLB's punishment to Atlanta for their illegal signings of international free agents. Known mostly for his glove, Soto is a career .237 hitter who is currently in his fifth professional season.

PICKING UP THE SLACK: With slugging first baseman Trey Cabbage injured, Rocket City has been looking to others to pick up the slack. Along with Soto, catcher Zach Humphreys has provided a boost by picking up a hit in 19 of his last 23 games, going 26-72 (.361) with five homers and 11 RBI. A former high school quarterback and wrestler, the backstop has shown good speed, going 5-5 in stolen bases.

ARMS RACE: At the 2021 MLB Draft, the Angels used all 20 of their selections on pitchers. Seven of those pitchers are currently with the Trash Pandas, led by first round pick and Angels No. 1 prospect Sam Bachman. Joining him in the rotation are second round selection Ky Bush, fifth round selection Brett Kerry, and newly promoted ninth round pick Braden Olthoff. In the bullpen are fourth round pick Luke Murphy, eighth-round selection Nick Jones, and 14th-rounder Eric Torres. Eleventh round selection Chase Silseth began the season in Rocket City before being promoted to the Angels for his MLB debut on 5/13 and 17th round pick Mason Erla made one start for Rocket City in April before being placed on the Injured List.

ON THE RUN: Rocket City has been off like a rocket on the basepaths, stealing 54 bases in only 40 games, starting with five bags on 4/12 in the home opener. Outfielder Aaron Whitefield was especially lethal going 6-7 for the opening home series against Pensacola in April and 14-16 for the year. His 13 stolen bases were tied for first in the Southern League before his promotion to Los Angeles. To show how aggressive they have been the Trash Pandas lead AA in most times caught stealing with 19.

TONIGHT'S G1 STARTING PITCHER: RHP Braden Olthoff will make his AA debut for the Trash Pandas. The Tulane product was drafted by the Angels in the ninth round of the 2021 Draft. He was 2-1 with a 1.38 ERA in seven starts and 39 innings pitched at Tri-City where he struck out 40 and held batters to a .163 average. Earned Second Team All-American Athletic Conference honors in 2021 with the Green Wave where he struck out 91 in 78.2 innings. Was Second Team All-America in 2020 and was named American Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Week in back-to-back weeks.

TONIGHT'S G2 STARTING PITCHER: RHP Sam Bachman will return to the bump and look to continue his good work. In three AA appearances he has combined for 11 shutout innings while allowing only five hits. That includes four no-hit innings on 5/13 against Pensacola, then followed that with four shutout innings against Birmingham on 5/20. The number nine overall pick in the 2021 draft was slated to start for Rocket City in the final week of last season before COVID issues on the Trash Pandas team forced the postponement of the team's final games. Injuries have forced Bachman to miss the first month of this season. He went 0-2 with a 3.77 ERA in five starts last season at Tri-City, striking out 15 in 14.1 innings. In three seasons at Miami-Ohio, the right-hander went 12-7 with a 3.06 ERA and 199 strikeouts in 159 innings. He saved his best season for last as a junior in 2021 when he had a 1.81 ERA and K'd 93 men in 59.2 innings with opponents' batting .147 against him.

WHAT IS A TRASH PANDA?

The name was chosen in a name-the-team contest and is a reference to the area's association with the space industry and the determination and ingenuity of raccoons, aka trash pandas.

Trash Pandas, slang for raccoon, was included in the original 10 nominations following several Brandiose-led focus groups in Madison and Huntsville. The ballot descriptor read: Our community is known for engineering, and no creature in our galaxy is as smart, creative, determined and ingenious a problem solver - dedicated to the challenge at hand - as our local raccoons!

In July 2018, after the results from several focus groups in Madison and Huntsville, 10 names were selected, based on their uniqueness and how each name relates to the characteristics of the area: (Alphabetically) Army Ants, Comet Jockeys, GloWorms, Lunartics, Moon Possums, Puffy Head Bird Legs, Space Chimps, Space Sloths, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas. The focus groups were led by San Diego-based Brandiose, the Minor League Baseball industry's premiere branding partner.

Over the next few weeks, two rounds of online voting took place. The first round narrowed the list to Comet Jockeys, Moon Possums, Space Chimps, ThunderSharks and Trash Pandas.

Trash Pandas won the final round with 44.75 percent of the vote to ThunderSharks 19.25 percent. Moon Possums was third (12.57 percent); Space Chimps fourth (12.05 percent); and Comet Jockeys fifth (11.38 percent).

By the way, Trash Pandas dominated both rounds.

More than 28,500 nominations and votes were recorded. According to Brandiose, this represented - by far - the largest community participation in a Name the Team contest in the history of Minor League Baseball.

The team name was announced in a local microbrewery in September 2018 with nearly 1,500 fans on hand. Trash Pandas was nominated by Matthew Higley of Lacey's Spring, Ala. He received two box seats for the first five seasons and will throw out the ceremonial first pitch at a Trash Pandas home game.

The regional identifier was also chosen by the community. Out of 13,559 votes cast, 67.4 percent chose Rocket City over North Alabama (18.09 percent) and Madison (14.51 percent).



NEW MiLB RULES FOR 2022

Press Release From Major League Baseball - March 14, 2022

Major League Baseball announced a variety of experimental playing rules that have been approved by the Competition Committee and the Playing Rules Committee for use during the 2022 Minor League season. Consistent with the preferences of fans, these rules are designed to improve the pace of play, create more action on the field, and reduce player injuries.

Many experimental rules were first tested on a limited basis in 2021. The use of the most promising rules has been expanded to additional levels of play, providing more players and fans with exposure to the rules and allowing the Competition Committee to better evaluate the impact of each on game play. Below is a summary of the experimental rules that will be tested during the 2022 Minor League season:



PITCH TIMER: On-field timers will be used at all full-season affiliates to enforce regulations designed to create a crisp pace of play, with batters required to be ready to hit and pitchers required to deliver the pitch within allotted periods of time. With runners on base, pitchers will have additional allotted time for each pitch but will risk automatic baserunner advancement if a third pick-off attempt or step-off within the same plate appearance is made without recording an out. These rules were used in tandem in the Low-A West and in the Arizona Fall League in 2021 and led to a significant improvement in pace of play and a reduction in average game time of more than 20 minutes.

LARGER BASES: The size of first, second and third base will be increased from 15 inches square to 18 inches square at all full-season affiliates to reduce player injuries. Bigger bases were used in 2021 at the Triple-A level and in the Arizona Fall League, and were associated with a decrease in the severity of base-related injuries. In addition, the reduction in distance between bases led to a modest increase in the rate of successful stolen base attempts.

DEFENSIVE POSITIONING: In Double-A, High-A and Low-A, the defensive team must have a minimum of four players on the infield, with at least two infielders completely on either side of second base. These restrictions on defensive positioning are intended to allow infielders to better showcase their athleticism, to increase batting average on balls in play, and to restore a more traditional set of aesthetics and outcomes on batted balls.

Was slated to debut with Rookie-Level Orem in 2020, but the season was cancelled due to the pandemic ... Prior to joining the Angels, Schatzley spent eight seasons as an Associate Head Baseball Coach at Harding University in Searcy, Arkansas ... Previously, he came to Harding from Emporia State University in Emporia, Kansas where he worked as an assistant in 2011 ... During the 2009-10 seasons, he was a Graduate Assistant at Lubbock Christian University, where he won a NAIA title in 2009 ... Also was the Head Coach of the Outer Banks Daredevils of the Coastal Plain League, a summer wood bat league for collegiate players ... Served as Head Coach of the El Dorado Broncos of the Jayhawk League from 2009-10, including a National Baseball Congress World Series title in 2009.

Playing Career: Played at Pratt Community College in Pratt, Kansas from 2004-06 and Lyon College in Batesville, Arkansas (2006-08) ... Earned a master's at Lubbock Christian University in organizational leadership in 2010.



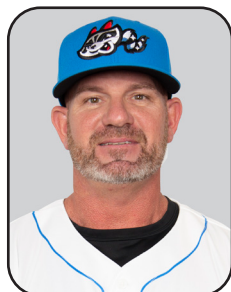
MICHAEL WUERTZ — PITCHING COACH

Coaching Highlights: The first pitching coach in franchise history, Wuertz returns for his second season with the Trash Pandas after 10 former Rocket City pitchers made their MLB debut for the Angels in 2021 ... He spent three of the previous four seasons played with High-A Inland Empire ... In 2018, he was the Pitching Coach for Rookie-level Orem ... Was scheduled to return to Inland Empire in 2020 before the MiLB season was cancelled.

Playing Career: Pitched in 426 Major League games over eight seasons between the Chicago Cubs (2004-08) and Oakland Athletics (2009-11) ... Posted a 21-11 record and 11 saves with 444 strikeouts over 414.1 career innings for a solid 9.6 strikeouts per nine innings ... Led American League relievers and tied for second in the Majors with a career-high 102 strikeouts in 2009, becoming the third A's reliever after Rollie Fingers (1972-73, 75-76) and Dennis Eckersley (1987) to fan 100 in a season ... Made MLB debut for the Cubs in 2004 and spent all or parts of five seasons in the Cubs bullpen from 2004-08 ... Appeared in a team-leading 75 games for Chicago in 2005 ... His 265 relief appearances for the Cubs ranked eighth-most in franchise history prior to his trade to Oakland in February 2009 ... Finished his playing career with parts of two seasons for the York Revolution of the Independent Atlantic League from 2013-14.



KENNY HOOK — HITTING COACH

Born: July 6, 1975, Houston, Texas

Resides: Kansas City, Missouri

Managerial/Coaching Highlights: The first hitting coach in Trash Pandas history, Hook begins his second season in Rocket City and third with the Angels after leading a powerful Trash Pandas offense to a Double-A South best 152 home runs in 2021 ... Was scheduled to be the hitting coach for High-A Inland Empire in 2020 ... Spent the previous six seasons played in the Texas Rangers organization ... Started as the hitting coach for the Arizona Rookie League Rangers from 2014-15 before moving up to Class-A Short Season Spokane in 2016, followed by a season with both Class-A Hickory in 2017 and Class-AA Advanced Down East in 2018 ... He returned to Spokane in 2019 for his first season managing in affiliated baseball and led the Indians to the Northwest League playoffs after posting a 45-31 record. However, the Indians were eliminated in the first round of the postseason ... Prior to his stint with the Rangers, he began his coaching career as the hitting coach for the Kansas City T-Bones of the Independent American Association in 2011 while also working as an assistant head coach at Maple Woods Community College ... Became manager of the T-Bones in 2012 and in his first season as a manager at any level, he led Kansas City to a 51-49 record in 2012 before posting a 40-60 record in 2013.

Playing Career: Played collegiately for Crowder College (Neosho, MO) and Benedictine College (Atchinson, KS) ... Made his pro debut for the Amarillo Dillas from 1997-2000 and was a part of their 1999 Texas-Louisiana League Championship club ... After a year off, played in 38 games as a player/coach for the Central League's Rio Grande Valley WhiteWings in 2002 ... Over 351 games in his five-year pro career, hit .277 (360-1300) with six HR and 192 RBI.

Managerial/Coaching Highlights: Enters his first season in the Angels organization after spending most of the last 15 years in the Cardinals system ... Won a Pioneer League Championship in his managerial debut for the Great Falls Dodgers in 2002 ... Stayed in Dodgers system from 2002-04 before a season in Red Sox organization in 2005.

Playing Career: Appeared in 382 MLB games over eight big league seasons from 1978-1994, playing for the Cincinnati Reds, Montreal Expos, Pittsburgh Pirates, and San Diego Padres ... Hit .204 with 18 home runs, 91 RBI, and 79 RBI in his MLB career ... Also played in over 800 minor league games, hitting .260 with 90 home runs, 385 RBI, and 347 runs ... During his big league career, was teammates with Hall of Famers Tony Gwynn, Johnny Bench, and Andre Dawson.

TRASH TALK

THE OLTHOFF FILE: RHP Braden Olthoff will make his Double-A debut in his 13th professional start in game two of his six-game series with the Smokies. Olthoff joined Rocket City on 5/23 after a dominant start to the 2022 season with High-A Tri-City. In his seven starts for the Dust Devils, Olthoff gave up three or fewer runs each time and did not allow more than four hits in any start. He earned Northwest League Pitcher of the Month honors for April after going 1-0 with a 1.80 ERA in four starts. He scattered 12 hits over 20 innings that month while striking out 26 and holding opponents to a .171 average. In his final High-A start on 5/18 at Vancouver, he allowed three hits and walked one while striking out six over seven scoreless innings to earn his second win of the year. His first win came on 4/26 vs. Eugene, when he also threw seven scoreless innings, this time striking out eight and giving up two hits while walking none. At the time of his promotion to the Trash Pandas on 5/23, he ranked among the Northwest League leaders in innings pitched (1st, 39.0), ERA (2nd, 1.38), strikeouts (T-4th, 40), and wins (T-10th, 2). He made his pro debut in 2021, combining to go 0-2 with a 5.94 ERA while striking out 26 over 16.2 innings between the ACL Angels and Low-A Inland Empire. Olthoff began the 2021 season as a Redshirt Junior at Tulane University and was selected by the Angels in the ninth round of the draft.

VS. TENNESSEE: Making his Double-A debut, Olthoff will face the Tennessee Smokies for the first time in his career tonight at Toyota Field.

MORE NOTES

COLLEGE NOTES: Olthoff pitched two seasons for Tulane University (New Orleans, LA) from 2020-21, going 10-3 with a 2.87 ERA over 17 starts, striking out 138 over 106.2 innings with one shutout. In 2021, he earned Second Team All-American Athletic Conference honors after leading the team with six wins. His 91 strikeouts and 78.2 innings pitched ranked second on the team. He was masterful against eventual national champion Mississippi State on 2/26, working eight innings and striking out six to earn the win. In 2020, he was named to the Collegiate Baseball All-America Second Team and was named American Athletic Conference Pitcher of the Week in consecutive weeks and one of the Collegiate Baseball Newspaper National Athletes of the Week. He ranked second in the NCAA in wins with four, third in strikeouts with 47, sixth in WHIP at 0.54.

BEFORE HE RODE THE WAVE: Prior to joining Tulane in 2020, spent two seasons at Palomar College in California, appearing in 30 games with 13 starts. He went 6-1 with five saves and earned a First-Team All-Conference selection as a sophomore, allowing 19 runs on 41 hits with 75 strikeouts and 23 walks in 68 innings for a 2.51 ERA in 16 appearances (eight starts). As a freshman, he appeared in 14 games with five starts, posting a 4.10 ERA with 47 strikeouts and six walks in 37.1 innings.

HIGH SCHOOL NOTES: Was a two-year letterman at El Camino High School (Oceanside, CA) while playing as both an outfielder and a pitcher. He was a first team All-Avocado West conference selection as a senior, going 5-3 on the mound with a 1.56 ERA for the season, striking out 75 and holding opposing hitters to a .187 average. He was named team captain as a senior, while also being named the El Camino Player of the Year, Team MVP, and Pitcher of the Year. Also was a scholar athlete selection as a freshman, sophomore, and as a senior.

THE BACHMAN FILE: RHP Sam Bachman will make his fourth Double-A start in his ninth professional outing tonight after starting the 2022 season on the Injured List. Currently ranked as the Angels' number one prospect by MLB.com, Bachman extended his scoreless inning streak to 11 last Friday in Birmingham, throwing four scoreless innings as Rocket City won 8-2. He made his first road start on 5/13 in Pensacola, pitching four hitless innings as Rocket City eventually fell 4-2. He made his Double-A debut with three scoreless innings on Friday 5/6 against Chattanooga, striking out one as Rocket City went on to win 6-2 on a walk-off grand slam from Trey Cabbage. For the season, lefties are hitting just .083 off Bachman while righties are faring slightly better at .167. The Angels' first round (ninth overall) draft pick in the 2021 draft made his pro debut with High-A Tri-City on 8/8 at Eugene and pitched two scoreless innings, allowing one hit with no walks and two strikeouts. Three of his first four starts in August were scoreless, with the longest one being four clean innings vs. Eugene on 8/26. In his final High-A start on 9/1 at Spokane, he allowed five runs, four earned, on seven hits with three walks and four strikeouts.
