Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Trenton Denholm** to the mound today, looking to salvage a series split (9-3 in game six when the series sits at 2-3) this year. The Indians will counter with RHP **Thomas Harrington**. Columbus is 53-39 (.576) versus right handers this year. Harrington has pitched against the Clippers nine times in his career, going 1-4 with a 4.54ERA (35.2IP, 32H, 19R, 18ER, 16BB, 36K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus is 9-11 against Indianapolis this year, posting a -22run margin (9-9, +13 in 2025; 12-5, +45 in 2024; 10-8, -23 in 2023; 12-8, +53 in 2022). Since the start of 2022, the Clippers are 18-10 (.643) in games against Indianapolis that are decided by at least five.

Daniel Schneemann has hit .340 (2HR, 5RBI) in 14G versus Indy in his career and **Kyle Manzardo** has hit .309 (1HR, 11RBI) in 15G.

Start with a Bang

Over the last 27G, the Clippers have plated 198 runs (most in the IL, 7.3 per), with 138 (70%) tallied in the first four innings of the game, including runs in the 1st of each of the last 6G. The opposition has only 64 in the first four innings of the last 27G, but is outscoring the Clippers 97-60 thereafter. Columbus is the only undefeated team in the IL when leading after the 7th (50-0, 60 straight since 8/22/25).

Power Outage

Last night was the first completely homerless game played by the Clippers since 8/15 vs. Omaha, yet they still lead all of professional baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (59) and have allowed the 4th most (53; leads IL). Columbus came into the series averaging 2.6 per game over the previous 22G (allowed 2.1 per), but has gone deep just twice this week (7HR in 11G at Indy this year), while allowing 6HR.

Chasing Down the Walks

The lineup drew 8BB last night to pull within striking distance of the 2nd most walks in franchise history (673 in 128G, the 2023 squad had 680BB in 147G). The Clippers are pacing for 773BB, a total that would obliterate the club record set in 1983 (741 in 140G). On the mound, the staff is pacing to allow 641BB, a number that would place 4th on the all-time list (top three seasons have been the last three).

Master of the Universe

Daniel Schnee-mann has eight multi-hit games since 8/15 (19x41, .463) and, dating to 4/25/24, he has played 56G in the IL, batting .335/.454/.591 with 55 runs scored (31 since 7/28, most in the IL). Since getting optioned at the end of July, Schneemann has drawn 22BB in 24G (20% of PA), while reaching base in 22 of 24 (.459OBP, 2nd in the IL; current 14G on base streak: .523OBP since 8/12).

Big Time Production

Kyle Manzardo has hit safely in each of 12G since 8/15 (.347, 17x49, 2HR), while collecting 17RBI (RBI in 9G of streak). In his Columbus career, Manzardo has played only 123G (541PA), but he has still managed 68XBH (.562SLG), including 30HR, against just 52 singles. Additionally, he has scored 98 times with 87RBI, while keeping his strikeout rate under 20% (103K, 19%; 83BB, 15%).

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralph Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (17, +6), RBI (39, +11) and SLG (.880, +144) and, aside from going 0x21 in 6G at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .341/.414/.698 since 6/18 (20HR, 53RBI). Friday night's 3-run homer snapped a 16AB homerless streak (5.9AB per in last 26G), while establishing a new career high with 87RBI between Columbus and Akron (50HR and 172RBI since 2025).

Out of a Slump

After doubling twice on 6/25 at Omaha, **George Valera** hit .111 (8x72) with a .139SLG in his next 20G (6/27-7/28). On 7/30, he was 2x3 with a HR (snapped 124AB homerless streak) and he has hit safely in 10 straight (.359, 14x39, 4HR, 12RBI, .821SLG). Thursday night marked his 300th game in a Clipper uniform (29th all-time; also missed 184G due to six injuries), as he sits 3HR short of 50 in his career.

Rough Stuff

In the last 14 days, **Milan Tolentino** (.098, 4x41), **Blake Perkins** (.138, 4x29), **Alfonsin Rosario** (.161, 5x31), **Dayan Frias** (.040, 1x25) and **Dom Nunez** (.000, 0x3; 2x33 in 10G since 6/14) have combined to hit .109 (14x129), though Tolentino has a pair of bombs (38 since start of '25, 2nd most in IL). The quartet has managed only 14BB (10%) against 61K (42%) in 145PA (0x10 with 3BB and 7K last night).

This Date in Clipper History

8/30/1992

The Clippers tied a then record for runs scored in a game with 21 against Syracuse. **Gerald Williams** powered the victory with 2HR and 7RBI while **Torey Lovullo** added 5 hits. Both players would be named to the post season All-Star team (the Clippers had a record eight selections). Williams also set the franchise record for most games played in a season, suiting up for 142 regular season contests.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,494 to 1,439).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 178-144 (.553) in pitch reviews, with batters going 92-87 (.514) and pitchers/catchers going 86-57 (.601). They have run out of challenges in 48G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 843, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 150 through 128G (on pace for 172SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 44CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 176 runs while crafting a .878OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 120 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +56 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 295-184 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 80 grand slams and 1,991RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.47 through 128G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 210HR (would be 2nd most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 69G this season (40-29, .580), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 8th most last at bat wins this year (14, four off the lead) while playing in the 12th most games decided in the last at bat (27, Norfolk has 39). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 101G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-53 (.475, 16th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 454-466 (.493), 424-420 with Columbus (.502).
