Today: The Lansing Lugnuts, High-A affiliate of the Oakland A's, play the fifth game of a season-ending six-game series against the Lake County Captains, the High-A affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians, the 226th all-time meeting between the two teams. The Lugnuts are 9-13 vs. the Captains this season and 2-7 in games played at Classic Auto Group Park, losing four of five games in Eastlake in April before winning four of seven games in Lansing in May and splitting a six-game series in July.

Yesterday: Lugnuts 3, Captains 1. CJ Rodriguez, Casey Yamauchi and Colby Thomas delivered RBI doubles, and Luis Morales, Jake Garland and John Beller held Lake County to a lone eighth-inning Cooper Ingle RBI single, eliminating Lake County from postseason contention. Yamauchi finished 3-for-3 with two singles, a double, a walk and a stolen base in his High-A debut.

Starting Matchup: Ole Miss product Gunnar Hoglund, the Athletics' No. 18 prospect, takes the mound against former makes his second Midwest League start. Lake County counters with FSU Seminole lefty Parker Messick, the Guardians' No. 17 prospect.

On the Air: Jesse Goldberg-Strassler calls the action on StreamGuys while Logan Potosky has the call on Bally Live and MiLB.TV.

LUG•NOTES

Sizzling at the Plate: SS Euriel Ángeles has collected 13 hits in his last 31 at-bats, while 1B Brennan Milone has 14 hits in his last 28 at-bats. Milone has reached base 10 times in 15 plate appearances in this series with three doubles.

More on Milone: As Mike Snyder observed, the Oregon Duck is one of 16 qualified MiLBers with a BB% over 10%, a K% under 20% and with isolated power over .200.

Transaction: OF Clark Elliott was activated from the Injured List yesterday, replacing SS Jacob Wilson, who was placed on the IL retroactive to September 7.

Among the League Leaders, Individual: The promoted Daniel Susac leads the Midwest League in qualified batting average with a .303 average and is tied for 6th in hits (111), 8th in OPS (.810) and 9th in OBP (.373). Danny Bautista, Jr. is 3rd in base hits (116) and 9th in batting average (.271). Junior Pérez is tied for 3rd in stolen bases (41), tied for 6th in doubles (26), 9th in total bases (168) and 10th in extra-base hits (40).

Among the League Leaders, Team: The Nuts' offense is 3rd in the MWL in team batting average (.250), 2nd in fewest strikeouts (1049), 2nd in stolen bases (189), tied for 2nd in sacrifices (15), tied for 3rd in sacrifice flies (46), 3rd in base hits (1061), 3rd in doubles (215) and 4th in triples (30). The Nuts' pitchers are 1st in GO/AO ratio (1.00) and GIDP (99) and 3rd in saves (38). Lansing leads the league with 117 double plays turned, five more than second-place Peoria.

Record-Setter, Individual: Reliever Brock Whittlesey owns the career appearances record at 103 games pitched. Whittlesey appeared in 32 games in 2021, 33 games in 2022 and 38 games thus far in 2023. Of those 103, one – in 2021 – was a spot start. Whittlesey has allowed just two earned runs in his last 17 innings.

Record-Setter, Team: The Lugnuts have committed only 102 errors through 129 games, on pace to break last season's franchise record low of 111 errors. Lansing has played 64 error-free games, 30 in the first half and 34 in the second half, with only one error in the first four games of this series.

Keeping it Close: Of the Lugs' 129 games played this year: 45 have been one-run games, 35 have been two-run games, 16 have been three-run games, 10 have been four-run games, and 23 have been games decided by five or more runs. 30 of the Lugnuts' 35 losses this half have been decided by three runs or fewer.

Consistent Faces: Lansing has used the same outfield of LF Danny Bautista, Jr., CF Junior Pérez and RF Colby Thomas for 16 straight games, every game since August 20th, since Clark Elliott was placed on the Injured List. Bautista, Jr. has played in 61 of the last 62 Lugnuts games dating back to June 24, while Pérez has played in 57 of the last 58 games and Thomas has played in 51 consecutive games since joining the Nuts on July 7.

They Know Their Trade: Lansing has four players acquired via trade by the Oakland Athletics on its roster. Chronologically, working backwards: Christian Fernandez (Tampa Bay Rays, 7/9/22, for Christian Bethancourt); Euriel Ángeles (San Diego Padres, 4/3/22, for Sean Manaea, and a 2021 member of the Fort Wayne TinCaps); Gunnar Hoglund (Toronto Blue Jays, 3/16/22, for Matt Chapman); and Junior Pérez (San Diego Padres, 6/30/20, for Jorge Mateo).

First-Round Pedigrees: The Lugnuts' roster has two current first-rounders: shortstop Jacob Wilson, the sixth overall pick this year from Grand Canyon University, and the Blue Jays' 2021 first-round selection, 19th overall, Gunnar Hoglund, acquired via trade in March 2022 for Matt Chapman. The A's 2021 first-round selection, shortstop Max Muncy, and 2022 first-round selection, catcher Daniel Susac, are both currently excelling with the Double-A Midland RockHounds in the Texas League.

TODAY IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2003: Game 2 of the Midwest League Championship Series. The Lugnuts defeated the Snappers, 3-2, moving within one victory of the title. Right fielder J.J. Johnson left the game with an injured shoulder after running into the right-field wall making a threat-squashing catch in the seventh inning, stranding two runners aboard.

2015: It was the Lugnuts' first walk-off win all year, and it came on a Ryan McBroom sac fly in the bottom of the 9th, helping the Nuts sweep the Great Lakes Loons out of the playoffs with a 5-4 win. The Loons had scored two runs with two outs in the top of the ninth to take the lead, only to see the Nuts rally behind back-to-back one-out doubles from Danny Jansen and Chris Carlson, followed by walks to Richard Ureña and Jason Leblebjian from Tommy Bergjans. The Nuts advanced to face West Michigan (who would subsequently eliminate Lansing, 2 games to 1, on their way to winning the MWL title).

2022: In his third and final Lugnuts appearance, Mason Miller struck out seven Dayton Dragons in three hitless innings and Lawrence Butler went 4-for-4 with a walk, single, double and two home runs in a 9-5 win on Fan Appreciation Night.

In a Nutshell: Gunnar’s surname is pronounced “HO-glund,” with a long ‘oh’ sound... debuted against Dayton with five nearly perfect innings, striking out seven Dragons on August 26 at Day Air Ballpark... only base runner was a two-out HBP of Trey Faltine in the 3rd inning... honored as the **Midwest League Pitcher of the Week**... followed up with five strikeouts in 3 2/3 IP, 9/2 vs. WM.

Prospecting: Hoglund is ranked the A’s no. 18 prospect by MLB Pipeline, which grades his fastball at 55, his curve at 50, his slider at 50, his change at 45 and his control at 60. They write, “The A’s haven’t seen much of Hoglund, the 19th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft, since acquiring him last year from Toronto as part of the return for Matt Chapman while he was still recovering from Tommy John surgery. Returning to the mound in July 2022, he logged just eight innings combined in the ACL and with Single-A Stockton before a biceps strain kept him out the rest of the season. The A’s hoped to finally get a good look at the right-hander in 2023, though he didn’t pitch until late May and was on a strict innings limit.

“The pure stuff Hoglund possesses when healthy is rivaled by few in the A’s organization. It includes a fastball that sits 92-95 mph, though the velocity on the heater was a couple of ticks below that just before the biceps issue. He also brings a hard slider that he throws around 84-86 mph as his main secondary pitch, while his low-80s changeup and curveball are useful in providing a different look against hitters.”

Entering the Draft, Part I: Hoglund was first selected 36th overall by the Pirates out of Fivay High School in Port Richey, Fla., in 2018, but, as Pipeline writes, “the two sides had differing views of his post-Draft physical, which killed any chances of a deal.” Gunnar’s career high school stats: .312 avg., seven home runs, 16-10, 1.31 ERA, 310 K... as a senior, he was 7-0 with a 0.27 ERA... he also starred on the basketball court... while he played athletically at Fivay, he attended Dayspring Academy.

Life as a Rebel: Onward to Ole Miss, where Gunnar served as the Rebels’ Sunday starter as a freshman in 2019 (68 IP, 5.29 ERA, 14 BB, 53 K)... sophomore season was ended early by COVID-19, though he ascended to Saturday starter and had posted a 1.16 ERA with four walks and team-leading 37 strikeouts in four starts (23 1/3 IP) before the season was truncated... earned bachelor’s degree in May 2020... entering 2021 was considered one of the nation’s top pitchers and was named consensus Preseason All-American, but had season ended early by torn UCL on May 7, 2021; at the time, was ranked in SEC Top 5 in strikeouts (96), K/9 IP (13.79) and WHIP (0.91); overall, was 4-2, 2.87, 11 GS, 62 2/3, 40 H, 17 BB, 96 K, .178 avg. ... posted double-digit strikeouts in five of first six starts.

Entering the Draft, Part II: Hoglund had entered the season as a top-five draft prospect, but slipped to MLB Pipeline’s No. 22 draft prospect due to his UCL tear... Toronto rolled the dice on him with pick 19 in 2021, signing him for \$3,247,500... director of amateur scouting Shane Farrell said, “We’re really excited about how it shook out for us, knowing some of the different strengths of the Draft and especially how it relates to Gunnar. His trajectory along the year, he was pitching his way into a top-10 pick. Unfortunately, the injury kind of derailed that. We were extremely fortunate for him to be there when we selected today. He’s a strong, physical kid with above-average control and command of his fastball and an above-average slider as well,” Farrell said. “The changeup is a pitch that was good for him in high school, and we saw a little bit less of it at the college level, but I’m sure that will develop more as a pro. We saw a tick up in fastball velocity this year, combining that with an upper-level ability to command the ball on both sides of the plate and command the slider off the fastball. That’s what really drove us to make this selection.”

Onward to Oakland: But Hoglund did not throw a single pitch in the Blue Jays’ organization. After missing the rest of the 2021 season due to his recovery from Tommy John surgery, he was traded on March 16, 2022, with former Lugnuts Zach Logue, Kevin Smith and Kirby Sneed to the A’s in exchange for third baseman Matt Chapman...he made his professional debut on July 23, 2022, in the Arizona Complex League, striking out five batters while allowing one unearned run in two innings for the AzCL A’s against the AzCL Cubs... after three scoreless innings on July 30 vs. the Cubs, he was moved up to Stockton for one start, twirling three innings and allowing one unearned run against Modesto on August 6.

2023 Season: Gunnar’s 2023 debut was pushed back to May 29, when he joined Stockton’s rotation and allowed four runs on six hits in three innings vs. Modesto... he made 11 more starts for the Ports, firing four perfect innings against Lake Elsinore on July 29 and topping out at five innings in his Ports finale on August 19... on August 22, he was promoted to Lansing, replacing Stevie Emanuels.
