THINKIN' BOUT LAST NIGHT: Quad Cities extra-inning struggles continued on Tuesday, as they fell to Great Lakes 7-6 in 10 innings ... the contest featured four lead changes, with nine of the game's 13 runs being scored in the second-half of the contest ... Shervyen Newton (2) and Jack Pineda (1) became the first Bandits to hit back-to-back homers this season, with the two pairing up for a two-run and solo shot respectively in the third inning ... despite the Quad Cities pitching staff allowing a season-high nine walks, starter Noah Cameron, didn't factor into the decision, but tossed 5.0 innings of one-run ball and struck out a season-high 11, the first pitcher in the Midwest League to record a 10+ strikeout performance this year (per Brad Tunney).

IF YOU'RE NOT FIRST, YOU'RE LAST: Through their first 21 games, the River Bandits are 9-0 when they score first and 0-12 when they score second (or not at all) ... Quad Cities has also been outscored 25-13 in the first two innings to start the season and is winless in extras.

NOAH K-AMERON: With his season-high 11 on Tuesday, former seventh-round pick Noah Cameron leads the Midwest League with 42 strikeouts and ranks third in the minor leagues ... his 15.32 SO/9 also ranks third in MiLB, just a couple ticks behind fellow Royals prospect and Columbia Fireflies' (A) ace Frank Mozzicato (16.11).

WALK IT OUT: Despite batting just .145 (9-for-62) on the season, Carter Jensen leads the Midwest League with 23 walks, a mark that also ranks tied for the top mark in High-A ... another catcher, Great Lakes' Dalton Rushing, has worked 21 walks this season, the second-most in the Midwest League.

CAPTAIN CAYDO: Although he saw his once Midwest League-best 18-game on-base streak come to an end last Sunday, Cayden Wallace has been red hot to begin his River Bandits career ... entering Tuesday, the former second-round pick leads the Midwest League and ranks third in High-A with 22 RBIs in 21 games ... he also ranks top-10 in the league in batting average (.299), on-base plus slugging percentage (.934), and total bases (41).

IT'S BEEN A MINUTE, MIDLAND: Quad Cities series against Great Lakes marks their first meeting with the Loons at Dow Diamond since 2018 ... with the Bandits sweeping the three-game series that year, QC has not lost a game in Midland (prior to Tuesday) since May 3, 2016 when the Loons topped the Bandits 3-2 in a 13-inning, three-hour and 58-minute affair.

A CENTURY OF BASEBALL: The 2023 season marks the 100th year of professional baseball in Davenport, dating back to the 1897 Davenport Brown Stockings of the Northwestern League ... since then, the franchise has been part of nine different leagues, affiliated with 12 Major League clubs, and sported 18 different monikers.

PROSPECTING THE RIVER: The River Bandits roster features seven of the Royals top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): Gavin Cross (1) (59 overall), Cayden Wallace (5), Carter Jensen (10), Mason Barnett (18), Noah Cameron (22), Chandler Champlain (26), and Luinder Avila (30) ... the last time Quad Cities started a season with seven of the Royals top 30 prospects was in 2021 when they would go on to win the High-A Central Championship.

PART OF THE ROYAL FAMILY: 2023 marks the River Bandits third season as an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals ... since joining the Royals organization, five River Bandits have made their Major League debuts with Kansas City: Angel Zerpa ('21), Michael Massey ('21), Vinnie Pasquantino ('21), Nate Eaton ('21), and Maikel Garcia ('21).

MANAGER BROOKS CONRAD

Brooks Conrad manages the River Bandits for the second-consecutive season, his seventh (sixth managerial) in the Royals organization, after managing the Columbia Firefiles in their first year as a Royals affiliate in 2021. The 43-year-old led the Lexington Legends to a South Atlantic League Title and was honored with the Dick Howser Award, which is given annually to one Royals player development employee for outstanding contributions to the organization. Conrad was slated to lead Lexington again in 2020 before the MiLB season was canceled. He joined the Royals organization as First Base Coach at Burlington in 2017, before serving as Manager there in 2018.
