

When the Hudson Valley Renegades became the High-A affiliate of the New York Yankees before the 2021 season, they had already been one of the most successful minor league teams for nearly a decade. Now entering their fifth year as a Yankees affiliate, the Renegades run of success has continued.

In the first four years of the Yankees era, the Renegades have won the South Atlantic League North Division title three times, sent over two dozen players to major leagues, and have been one of the winningest teams in Minor League Baseball.

The 2024 season finished with the Renegades posting a franchise-record 73 wins and reaching the South Atlantic League Championship Series for the second straight year. It was also the team's 12th consecutive winning season, and 15th winning season in the last 16 years.

Since 2012, the Renegades have a .573 winning percentage, tied for best in Minor League Baseball in that time. Maybe as impressive, the Renegades have been able to maintain that unsurpassed level of excellence with several different managers, including a new manager every year in the Yankees era.

In fact, the Renegades managerial position has become somewhat of a launching pad for great things. Matt Quatraro was the manager of the Renegades from 2006-07 before winning 2024 American League Manager of the Year with the Kansas City Royals. Craig Albernaz led the Renegades to the 2017 New York-Penn League championship and is currently the associate manager of the Cleveland Guardians under former Renegades catcher Stephen Vogt.

Renegades managers under the Yankees affiliations have all gone on to quickly find higher roles: 2021 'Gades manager Dan Fiorito is the Minor League Outfield/Infield Coordinator for the Yankees, 2022 manager Tyson Blaser is the Catching Coordinator for the Boston Red Sox, 2023 skipper Sergio Santos is the manager of the Triple-A Charlotte Knights in the White Sox organization, and 2024 manager Nick Ortiz has left the Yankees to be the Minor League Infield and Baserunning Coordinator with the Houston Astros.

As the calendar turns to the 2025 season, the Renegades turn to a new manager as they welcome James Cooper as their new skipper. Cooper is the 20th manager in the history of the Renegades, and is entering his third season overall as a minor league manager for the Yankees.

He spent the 2024 season as the skipper for the Single-A Tampa Tarpons of the Florida State League, and managed the FCL Yankees in 2023, where he was named Florida Complex League Manager of the Year. Under his guidance, the Tarpons led the FSL in Stolen Bases (242) ranked second in AVG (.239), Hits (982) and Doubles (204), and fourth in OPS (.701). That came on the heels of his FCL team pacing its league in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS in 2023.

Before managing in the Yankees system he was a defensive coach for one season with the FCL Yankees, where he won the FCL Championship in 2022 as part of a coaching staff that featured 2023 Renegades manager Sergio Santos, current Yankees assistant pitching coach Preston Claiborne, and 2024 Renegades hitting coach Rick Guarno.

"I'm extremely excited [for the 2025 season]," said Cooper, who speaks with the kind of infectious energy and enthusiasm that is present is so many great leaders. "Organization-wide, [2024] was a successful season. Although we didn't accomplish the ultimate goal of winning the World Series or winning enough Minor League championships, we did reach a ton of goals individually for some specific players, and that's what it's all about."

Unlike just about every other level of baseball, Minor League managers are not judged based on how many games they win – although Cooper has done plenty of that in his career – they are judged based on their ability to help players develop and meet objectives set out by the Yankees.

Before joining the Yankees, Cooper previously served as the head baseball coach at his college alma mater, Grambling State University, for 12 seasons from 2010 through 2021. He led the Tigers to the 2010 Southwestern Athletic Conference championship, and was named SWAC Head Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2017. He led the team to the SWAC Tournament 10 of the 11 years it was held in his tenure, and finished in the top two teams in the SWAC West Division in each of his final five full seasons at the helm.

Moving from the world of college sports where winning is paramount to professional baseball with its emphasis on development first has been something that Cooper has enjoyed. The true epitome of a coach and leader, he relishes in watching his players improve over the course of both a season and over several years.

"It makes you really feel proud to see some of the players that were 18 or 19 years old two years ago, develop into a player at the end of this past season where they've got green checks by all of the objectives that we set up for them this year," said Cooper with a smile while talking about his favorite parts of managing. "To see the development of like those guys making plays that they didn't once make, or even make adjustments quicker. Where now it takes them two pitches to make an adjustment where two years ago, it took them like, two weeks to make it. It's a culmination of just pouring into that player and seeing them graduate from this one objective, check the box, and move on to the next one."

That attitude is exactly the mindset that sets a successful Minor League manager apart. It is a job that asks the person in charge to put aside their ego and to an extent their own competitiveness for the good of helping others. There is still a fierce desire to win games in all the coaches and players, but they know that is secondary at times to developing as players so they can contribute to the Yankees one day.

If history is any indication, there will be plenty of both this year at Heritage Financial Park.



In many ways, Josh Grosz is built for the nomadic Minor League lifestyle. Growing up in a military family, Grosz had to grapple with frequent moves and learn to adapt to a variety of different environments across the country. As a kid, he didn't really think much of it.

"You don't really realize that's not normal for most kids," Grosz said. "Playing sports helped. Having siblings helped. It was fun as a kid moving around and seeing different parts of the country and playing sports all over the country."

As Grosz's father, Mathew, rose to the rank of Colonel in the United States Marine Corps, the family moved from California (in Twentynine Palms) to Virginia Beach, Virginia to Camp Lejune in Jacksonville, North Carolina.

These days, Grosz sees how that experience growing up has been beneficial for his career as a Minor League ballplayer. Life in affiliated baseball is defined by transitions, some expected and some unexpected. Grosz is more prepared than others for those difficulties.

"I think it helps being coachable," Grosz said. "Having 10 to 12 different coaches as a kid giving me advice, and with a bunch of different guys from all over the country, it helps with your perspective a little bit. It helps you be a sponge to the game and soak as much information as you can. Having coaches at every level now, taking bits and pieces with me wherever I go, it helps shape my career."

"I pitched pretty well, and the second day, the pitching coach who's now at Kentucky [Dan Roszel] pulled me aside and started that relationship," Grosz said. "I ended up committing at the end of that season. ECU was the best fit. I thought it was the best shot for me to play for a national championship. I'm super happy to have played with those coaches and those guys."

During his time with the Pirates, Grosz earned an All-American Athletic Conference Second Team honor in 2023. He also was roommates with Josh Moylan, who he was reunited with last year as his teammate with the Renegades.

This offseason, Grosz and Moylan returned to East Carolina to complete their college degrees. They got to relieve their college days, living together just like old times and training at the ECU facility to stay fresh.

"It's pretty cool to see both of us getting to play our dream and live it out together," Grosz said. "It's really cool to see him dominate college baseball and continue to dominate at the pro level."

After his junior season at East Carolina, where he notched a 3.66 ERA with 79 strikeouts in 76.1 IP, Grosz began getting professional attention. At first, it looked as if he would be selected at the end of day two in the 2023 MLB Draft. That turned into the beginning of day three, when the Yankees came calling. Grosz is so thankful things worked out the way they did.

"I couldn't be more happy," Grosz said. "The player development [in the Yankees organization] is unreal, and the pitching coaches are really on top of their stuff. It's been awesome to work with those guys and be exposed to the date and the technology that we have to offer."


In his first full pro season last year, Grosz underwent immense growth and improvement. He spent the majority of the season with Single-A Tampa. Grosz got a spot start opportunity with the Renegades in May, and he really struggled, allowing 5 ER in 3.1 innings against the Brooklyn Cyclones.

However, his season completely turned around when summer arrived. After 6.1 shutout frames in his final start of June, Grosz had a 0.55 ERA in July with the Tampa Tarpons before getting called up to the Renegades. He was arguably the best pitcher on the staff the rest of the season, playing a crucial role in Hudson Valley's postseason run.

In six starts during his second stint with the Renegades, Grosz put together a 1.77 ERA in 35.2 IP with a WHIP of 0.84. Grosz had the opportunity to pitch in the SAL Championship Series against the Bowling Green Hot Rods. Building habits was the biggest contributor to Grosz' late-season success in his eyes.

"I've been pounding the zone more," Grosz said. "I've added some new pitch grips and it's just been about trusting those in game. It's hard sometimes when you add a pitch in a bullpen and three days later, you gotta trust it in a game when it's high-pressure. I've worked on believing in myself. Having that confidence to know my stuff is going to play."

With the 2025 season underway, Grosz is looking to ride the wave of that end-of-season success into his second full pro season, both with the Renegades and beyond in the Yankees organization.

Top Dogs:

Inside MLB Pipeline's

Top 30 Yankees Prospects

As the 2025 season begins, MLB Pipeline has re-ranked the top talent in each organization. Inevitably, some players rise and some players fall. All, however, are ready to make their mark on the season and jump further up the charts.

Here is the latest update to the New York Yankees Top 30 List and a few excerpts from their prospect profiles courtesy MLB.com. On this list are 15 players who have already spent time with the Renegades before the start of the 2025 season, and several who project to join the team in the future.



Jasson Dominguez – OF

Domínguez's electric bat speed and prodigious strength give him well-above-average raw power from both sides of the plate, though he has done more damage as a lefty hitter throughout his pro career. After showing a disciplined approach that bordered on passive at times in the past, he was much more aggressive in 2024, getting more pull-happy and chasing more pitches out of the zone. He's at his best when he lets his pop come naturally, and he could produce in excess of 30 homers annually if he can learn to lift balls in the air more consistently.

2. George Lombard - 2B/SS

Not only does Lombard feature the potential for solid or better tools across the board, he has the high baseball IQ to make the most of them. He possesses a sound right-handed stroke, recognizes pitches well and uses the entire field, so he's equipped to hit for average. He had surprising issues making contact against in-zone fastballs last year but tightened that hole up as he gained more experience. He has more bat speed and strength than most players his age, which already gives him plus raw power that he'll tap into more often as he learns to lift balls in the air more frequently.

3. Spencer Jones - OF

With his bat speed and the strength and leverage in his 6-foot-6, 235-pound frame, Jones creates well-above-average power and upper-end exit velocities. But his naturally long left-handed swing makes him late on a lot of pitches and resulted in a 40 percent swing-and-miss rate in 2024, including even more alarming empty contact rates on all fastballs (36 percent) and in-zone heaters (33 percent). The Yankees are working with him on adjustments that would keep his bat on a more level plane and in the zone longer.

4. Ben Hess - RHP

Hess can overpower hitters with a four-seam fastball that parks at 92-96 mph and peaks at 99 with armside run, and the flat approach angle and extension in his delivery make it more difficult to barrel. While his curveball sits in the mid-70s, it gives him a second plus pitch with its ability to fool hitters thanks to its depth and sweep coming out of a low arm slot. His mid-80s slider can feature two-plane depth at times but lost some sharpness last year, and he no longer trusts a fading mid-80s changeup that once looked like a potential solid offering.

5. Will Warren - RHP

Warren barely used his slider in college but now sports a mid-80s beast with plenty of horizontal and vertical action and spin rates that can top 3,000 rpm. His fastballs average 93 mph and top out at 96, with his heavy two-seamer eliciting grounders but missing far fewer bats than his four-seamer with carry. New York had him focus more on his sinker in 2024, and it got crushed when he didn't command it down in the zone. His fading changeup can get too firm at 85-88 mph but has similar break to his slider in the exact opposite direction, so it's effective when he can harness it.

6. Bryce Cunningham - RHP

7. Roderick Arias - SS/2B

MLB Pipeline's No. 1 prospect in the 2022 international class, Arias signed for \$4 million out of the Dominican Republic. He struggled in his first taste of full-season ball, batting .233/.335/.393 with 13 homers and Single-A Florida State League highs in steals (37) and strikeouts (171) last summer. Arias will work counts and produces plus raw power with his bat speed and growing strength. He's a switch-hitter who has a much better stroke from the left side (.776 OPS in 2024, compared to .544 from the right side), and all 22 of his homers in his first three seasons came as a lefty. He still could produce 20-25 homers per season, more than most shortstops, but he has created serious concerns about his bat and ability to make adjustments. A plus runner who's aggressive on the bases, Arias stole 64 bags in his first 183 pro games. He has smooth actions and one of the strongest infield arms in the system.

8. Elmer Rodriguez-Cruz - RHP

9. Chase Hampton - RHP

10.Brock Selvidge – LHP

The Yankees had Selvidge lean heavily on his best pitch last season, when he threw his sweeping low-80s slider nearly half the time, and he'll also mix in an upper-80s cutter as well. That usage and his biceps injury may have contributed to the loss of a tick or two of fastball velocity, as he operated at 91-94 and peaked at 96, and his heater straightens out and gets hit when he doesn't locate it up in the zone. His mid-80s changeup has impressive fade but won't be a reliable option until he can land it for strikes consistently.

11. Henry Lalane - LHP

12.Cam Schlittler - RHP

Schlittler's fastball gained velocity last year, working at 93-96 mph and topping out at 98 with high spin rates, carry and cutting action that make it difficult to lift or pull. He spins a pair of effective breaking balls, with his sweeping mid-80s slider more reliable than his low-80s curveball. He lacks the same kind of feel for his changeup, which is too firm in the upper 80s but has good depth when it's on. With a strong 6-foot-6 frame, Schlitter has natural extension in his delivery and should have the durability desired in a starter. He's more physical than athletic but has gotten better at repeating his delivery. If he can continue to improve his control and command, he could develop into a No. 3 or 4 starter.

Smith's best attribute is his ability to spin the ball, which produces a plus mid-80s slider with two-plane depth and a solid low-80s curveball with similar depth. He also generates high spin rates on his fastball, which operates at 92-94 mph and touches 96 with carry but is also fairly straight and can get pounded when he doesn't command it. He doesn't have much trust in his mid-80s changeup with mild fade and doesn't throw it for strikes. While Smith is a bit smaller than a typical starter, he has a quick arm and a relatively clean delivery. He relies on chases more than landing his pitches in the zone, so he'll need to learn to command his fastball and control his breaking balls as he rises through the Minors. He has the ceiling of a mid-rotation starter and a sturdy floor as a multi-inning reliever.

Reyzelman has two plus pitches and the possibility of a third, starting with a 94-97 mph fastball that touches 99 with more ride than armside run. His tight low-80s slider has significant horizontal break and works against both lefties and righties. His changeup has similar velocity and big fade in the opposite direction, though it lacks the consistency of his other offerings. After throwing 94 percent fastballs at LSU, Reyzelman has changed his approach and cleaned up his mechanics in pro ball. He works out of the stretch, creating a flat approach angle with a low three-quarters arm slot. If he can do a better job of keeping his delivery in sync and providing more strikes, he could pitch in the Majors this season and fill a high-leverage role in New York's bullpen in the future.

Riggio has the build, bravado and max-effort swing of a lefty-hitting version of Dustin Pedroia, but he doesn't have the same feel for the barrel. He lives for launching balls in the air to right field and his solid raw power would play well at Yankee Stadium -- if he makes enough contact. He has a reasonably disciplined approach and draws walks, but his all-out stroke comes up empty too often against non-fastballs and when he does stray out of the strike zone. His aggressiveness is evident on the bases as well, as Riggio swiped 27 bags in his first full pro season despite below-average speed. His lack of quickness and fringy arm strength should limit his effectiveness at second base, but he has looked better than expected in the Minors and could become an average defender.

Stepping Up to the Plate:

Coby Morales enjoying every step of baseball journey

For much of the second half of the 2024 season, the playoffs didn't appear to be on the horizon for the Hudson Valley Renegades. They had come up short in the first half division race, and on July 27, Hudson Valley was 45-49 on the season. From that point on, the Renegades finished the campaign on a 28-11 stretch, earning the SAL North Division Second Half Championship and a playoff berth.

Reinforcements from Single-A Tampa in August gave the team tremendous life, adding a much-needed boost to the Renegades lineup. One of those key additions was outfielder Coby Morales. An 18th round pick by the Yankees in 2023, Morales took major strides forward at the plate with the Renegades.

Morales was called up on August 20 for the stretch run of the season, and played a key role in Hudson Valley's march to the postseason. In 15 games with the Renegades, Morales went 14-for-49 (.286) with a .417 on-base percentage. He loved the opportunity to play in High-A to end his season, and kept a similar approach to what was working for him earlier in the season despite the change in scenery.

"It's a lot cooler up here than it is in Tampa," Morales said with a laugh shortly after his promotion away from the oppressive Florida summer to the Hudson Valley. "I love playing outside when it's not 100 degrees and 100% humidity, and you don't have to deal with rain delays and everything. I attack every day like it's my last. I leave everything out on the field. I'm still playing the same game."

Morales arrived in the days after George Lombard Jr., Jackson Castillo, Brendan Jones, and others, all of whom provided key offensive and defensive assistance to the Renegades. Morales feels a special bond with that group, having spent nearly the entire 2024 season together between Single-A Tampa and High-A Hudson Valley.

"It's awesome," Morales said. "These guys are great players. They are more than likely going to play in the big leagues one day, and I can't wait to see that for them. They're awesome. I love these guys. They're like my new brothers."

In college, Morales was a standout performer at the University of Washington. He was a Pac-12 Honorable Mention in 2023, hitting .332 with 52 RBIs and a .548 slugging percentage. A high-contact hitter in college, Morales has been able to translate that skill set to the Yankees organization, who have also tried to get him to tap into his power as a professional. As a strong lefty swinger, Morales is primed to take advantage of the friendly right field dimensions at Yankee Stadium. However, he feels his biggest improvement last year came on the defensive side.

"I've really honed in on my outfield skills," Morales said. "All the coaches here do a really good job prepping us before the game, giving us all the training and everything that we need to get prepped to play our best games."

Morales played 113 games together across Tampa and Hudson Valley. This type of grind takes its toll on an athlete's body, and even young players need to develop new strategies to take care of themselves. One thing in particular has been extremely helpful for him, even if it wasn't the most comfortable at first.

"[I've started taking ice baths] in the cold tub," Morales said. "The cold tub has been my new best friend. Before my first full season, I hadn't been in the cold tub. But man, you learn to love that thing."

He also has emphasized stretching at home in the evening to prepare for the following day's work.

"I invested in a yoga mat," Morales said. "It's a long season, so you gotta keep your body right, so at home, right before I go to sleep, do a couple of stretches so I'm ready to go for the next day."

Like many Yankees prospects, Morales was extremely grateful to the Renegades fanbase for creating such a wonderful atmosphere every night. Playing in high-pressure environments in front of sellout crowds is what many players dream about Morales cherished the experience of reaching the SAL Championship Series.

"Being in a playoff race is electric," Morales said during the heat of the run in 2024. "The fans, they know too, so back at home the fans get chirpy and rowdy for us. It's awesome. I love it."

As he continues his career in professional baseball, Morales never wants to take anything for granted. He feels fortunate to get an opportunity and he displays that with the way he carries himself on the field.

"I love playing in front of fans," Morales said. "I love playing with a smile on my face like it's my last game ever playing. So I try not to let the highs get too high, and the lows get too low, but still remember when I got to show that emotion."





Cooper, 42, begins his first season as the manager of the Renegades in 2025, and his third season overall as a minor league manager in the Yankees organization. He spent the 2024 season as the skipper for the Single-A Tampa Tarpons of the Florida State League, and managed the FCL Yankees in 2023, where he was named Florida Complex League Manager of the Year. Under his guidance, the Tarpons led the FSL in Stolen Bases (242) ranked second in AVG (.239), Hits (982) and Doubles (204), and fourth in OPS (.701). That came on the heels of his FCL team pacing its league in runs, hits, triples, RBIs, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS in 2023.

Before managing in the Yankees system he was a defensive coach for one season with the FCL Yankees, where he won the FCL Championship in 2022 as part of a coaching staff that featured 2023 Renegades manager Sergio Santos, current Yankees Assistant Pitching Coach Preston Claiborne, and 2024 Renegades hitting coach Rick Guarno.

Before joining the Yankees, Cooper previously served as the head baseball coach at Grambling State University for 12 seasons from 2010 through 2021. He led the Tigers to the 2010 Southwestern Athletic Conference championship, and was named SWAC Head Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2017. He led the team to the SWAC Tournament 10 of the 11 years it was held in his tenure, and finished in the top two teams in the SWAC West Division in each of his final five full seasons at the helm.

Code of Conduct





In order to provide a welcoming experience for all, the Hudson Valley Renegades have implemented a Fan Code of Conduct. Out of respect for fellow guests, players, coaches, and ballpark staff, all guests are prohibited from...

- Trespassing on the playing field at any time
- Interfering with baseballs that are in play
- Throwing or tossing objects
- Using foul, obscene or derogatory language (see below) or gestures
- Misusing or overconsuming alcohol, Including underage consumption
- Behaving in a manner that is disruptive, unruly, or abusive
- Accessing areas of the ballpark without a proper ticket, pass, or credential
- Misuing tickets, passes, or credentials in any way
- Bringing prohibited items into the ballpark

Derogatory language is defined as offensive language concerning a person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation, or national origin. Anyone using such language is subject to automatic ejection from the ballpark.

Violations of the Fan Code of Conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to ejection from the ballpark, a ban on attending future games, or other consequences. Guests who are found to have used derogatory language will be ejected from the ballpark.

Guests are encouraged to report violations of the Fan Code of Conduct to the nearest ballpark staff member. This can be done in person, at the nearest Quest Services location, or directly with Ballpark Security.


