BULLISH ABOUT THE PEN: Game 2 of Saturday night's doubleheader signaled Somerset's first scoreless outing by the bullpen of the season, when Indigo Diaz and Kelly Austin combined on four scoreless innings to end the game. Austin earned the first save by any Patriots reliever this season and extended his season-commencing scoreless streak to 4.1 innings. Both of the losing pitchers from Somerset's first two losses of the season in Hartford, Diaz and Colby White, earned the wins on Saturday, marking the first two wins by Patriots relievers this season.

STARTING STRONG: Through eight games this season, Somerset starting pitchers have posted a 2.43 ERA (4th in the Eastern League) over 29.2 IP. Somerset's bullpen has pitched to a 6.63 ERA over 36.2 IP, which ranks 11th in the league.

NERVES OF STEAL: During Saturday's doubleheader, baserunners managed five stolen bases to extend their lead atop the Eastern League with 16 stolen bases as a team. Cole Gabrielson's three steals lead the team and tie for fourth in the Eastern League.

COLE'S ON A ROLL: After starting the season 0-for-10 with 8 K over his first three games this season, in has last three games, Gabrielson is now 4-for-7 (.571BA) with 3 BB (.636 OBP), 3 RBI and 3 R (1.493 OPS). Gabrielson has scored runs in three straight games, had 3 RBIs in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader and 3 BB in the second game.

BACK ON THE WEGON: Jared Wegner launched his first home run of the season in the second game of Saturday's doubleheader. In the game, Wegner went 2-for-3 with 2 RBI and 2 R.

5K CAM: On Thursday night, RHP Cam Schlittler came in to polish off Somerset's win. The Patriots' Opening Day starter earned his first win of the season by throwing five innings, allowing two hits and punching out five batters. Schlittler enters today as the Eastern League leader in innings pitched (10.2), while ranking 5th in WHIP (0.66) and 7th in strikeouts (12).

2025 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (3rd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his third consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 11th overall as a manager and 19th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2024, Dominguez led the Patriots to their third consecutive playoff berth and their second appearance in the Eastern League Championship Series with an overall record of 75-62. Dominguez's Patriots erased a 6.0-game deficit in the final 30 games of the regular season by going 22-8 to end the campaign and clinching the Eastern League Northeast division's second half title with a second half record of 43-25. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). He gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). An outfielder during his playing career, Dominguez spread four minor league seasons for with the Yankees between the DSL and the GCL. He began his coaching career in 2008 with the DSL Yankees 2, after spending 2007 as a Yankees' tryout scout in the Dominican Republic.

MIKE FRANSOSO: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Mike Fransoso enters his first season as a Double-A coach in Somerset and with the Yankees organization. He spent the past five years as a member of the Seattle Mariners organization, most recently with the Double-A Arkansas Travelers as the team's hitting coach. On 8/13/24, Fransoso took over as the Travelers' interim manager and led the team to clinch a second-half playoff berth en route to winning the 2024 Texas League Championship. He also previously served as the hitting coach for High-A Everett (2023), Class-A Modesto (2022) and the AZL Mariners (2021). During his playing career, Fransoso played for the Somerset Patriots in 2018 and 2019 when the team was independent. Prior to his stint playing for the Patriots, he spent three seasons in the Pittsburgh Pirates organization after being a 27th round pick of the team in 2013 MLB Draft out of the University of Maine.

PETER LARSON: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Peter Larson enters his first season in Somerset and with the Yankees organization. He spent the past six seasons as a member of the Minnesota Twins organization, including the last two with the Triple-A St. Paul Saints (2023-2024). For Minnesota, Larson also previously served as the pitching coach for Double-A Wichita (2022) and Low-A Fort Myers (2019). In 2020, he was slated to be the pitching coach for Low-A Cedar Rapids, before the Covid cancellation of the minor league season. His first season with the Twins, he served as the minor league rehab pitching coach (2019). Prior to his professional career, Larson worked as a pitching coach at the collegiate level for Fordham University (2018) and the University of Albany (2017). He also served as an assistant coach for Siena College (2016) and King University (2015).

DEREK WOODLEY: Defensive Coach (1st year)

Derek Woodley enters his first season in Somerset and his third with the Yankees organization. He spent the last two seasons as the defensive coach for High-A Hudson Valley (2023-2024). Following the 2024 season, he represented the Yankees at the Arizona Fall League as an extra coach for the Salt River Rafter. Prior to joining the Yankees organization, Woodley spent 30 seasons as a college baseball coach, racking up over 300 wins and most recently as the head coach for Defiance College for 15 seasons from 2008-2022. He also served as the school's athletic director from 2019-2022.

UZIEL VILORIA: Defensive Coach (1st year)

Uziel Viloria enters his first season in Somerset and in the Yankees organization. He began his coaching career in 2024 as a coach in the Phillies organization. During his playing career, Viloria signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019 and went on to play 112 games in four seasons as an infielder in the organization (2019-2023), making it as high as High-A Jersey Shore.

Broke camp with High-A Hudson Valley, where he spent all but one game during his first professional season. Sellers made one spot appearance in relief for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on 5/24, earning the win after he allowed two earned runs in 1.2 innings pitched. Sellers' first 21 High-A appearances of the season came in relief, when he posted a 7-2 record and 3.33 ERA with 29 BB and 56 K over 46.0 IP. On 7/14, Sellers transitioned to become a starting pitcher, starting nine of his final 10 appearances to end the regular season. Over these last 10 appearances, he allowed only 2 ER over 36.0 IP with 8 BB and 42 K, equating to a 0.50 ERA, 0.50 WHIP and .088 BAA. Sellers was named the South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Month for July, when he led all qualified full-season MiLB pitchers in ERA (0.00), BAAA (.067) and WHIP (0.41) over six appearances (three starts), totaling 4 BB and 24 K in 19.1 IP (36.9 K%, 6.2 BB%). During July, Sellers has a stretch of four appearances from 7/11-7/30 where he retired 35 consecutive batters over 12.0 IP with 16 K. Sellers was the only pitcher on Hudson Valley's roster to pitch in both of the team's no-hitters in 2024. He pitched three perfect innings of relief in the Renegades' no-hitter on 7/19, while starting the team's final no-hitter of the season on 8/22 (G2) with a then-career-high 4.2 IP. Sellers started Hudson Valley's first playoff game vs. Greensboro with 4.0 IP, 1 H, 0 R and 1 BB. Sellers struck out six batters in the game's first two innings en route to a career-high nine strikeouts in the performance on a career-high 76 pitches. He started the Renegades' final game of the season on 9/18 vs. Bowling Green, taking the loss in the winner-take-all Game 3 of the South Atlantic League Championship Series with 2 ER allowed over a career-high 5.0 IP.

Pitched at four different colleges in five years, including Washington State University (2019), Columbia Basin College (2020), Lewis & Clark State (2021-22) and Oregon State University (2023). At Lewis & Clark State, he helped lead the school to back-to-back NAIA World Series in 2021 and 2022, being named to the All-NAIA World Series team in both years. In 2022, he was named an NAIA Second Team All-American and Cascade Conference Pitcher of the Year, after going 14-0 with a 1.98 ERA with 140 K and 22 BB in 109.0 IP. After transferring to Oregon State for his final college season in 2023, Sellers was named an All-Pac-12 Honorable Mention, having went 7-5 with a 4.86 ERA in 74.0 IP with 106 K and 32 BB in 15 starts.

Attended Kennewick High School (WA), where as a senior he posted an 8-3 record with a 1.90 ERA, while also batting .419 with 4 HR and 25 RBI at the plate. He also lettered in football during high school and played hockey growing up until he was 14 years old.
