### RHP NOAH DAVIS (0-0, 0.00) vs. RHP COLE WINN (0-0, 0.00)

**TODAY'S GAME:** Today's Opening Day matchup is the first time the Isotopes and Express have met to begin a campaign. However, the Isotopes have started a campaign against the Rangers Triple-A affiliate, splitting four games at Oklahoma City in 2010.

**DAVIS GETS THE NOD:** Right-hander Noah Davis will make his first career Opening Day start as a professional. In his lone Triple-A start of 2022 and career, Davis tossed 4.2 innings and allowed just one run on six hits in a no decision against El Paso.

**OPENING DAY:** All-time, Albuquerque is 10-9 on Opening Day but have dropped seven of their last eight season openers. They are 9-10 in road openers, having lost nine of their last 11.

**TEXAS TIES:** Round Rock left-handed pitcher **Bernardo Flores Jr.** started three games for Albuquerque in 2021. Isotopes reliever **Fernando Abad** worked in five games for the Express in 2010 as an Astros farmhand. **Phillips Valdez** spent the 2019 campaign in the Rangers organization, appearing in 11 big league contests. Outfielder **Jameson Hannah** hails from Flower Mound, Texas, and attended Dallas Baptist University.

**SPECIAL CONNECTION:** Express bench coach Chase Lambin played for the Isotopes in 2008, and was teammates with current Topes pitching coach Chris Michalak.

**2022 ROUND ROCK RECAP:** The Express won the 2022 season series, 16-8, over Albuquerque in 2022, and outscoring the Isotopes, 192-123. At the plate, the Topes batted .253 with 37 homers in the 24 contests, while compiling a 7.71 ERA with 46 long balls surrendered on the mound. At Dell Diamond, the Express won eight of 12. Currently, Round Rock has won five-straight in the series.

**MARCH MADNESS:** Today's game is the first time the Isotopes will play in the month of March.

**ABOVE .500:** The Isotopes will look to get above .500 for the first time since May 20, 2019, when they had a record of 23-22.

**VS. WINN:** The Isotopes faced RHP Cole Winn five times last season, three in Round Rock and two in Albuquerque. He compiled a 6.65 ERA (23 IP, 17 ER) and 3-1 ledger. Winn allowed five or more runs twice last year while also holding the Isotopes to one run in two starts. He also established a season-high in strikeouts with nine on May 25 in Albuquerque.

**PROSPECTS:** According to MLB.com, 1B/OF Michael Toglia is the highest rated prospect, 12th, in the Rockies system on the Isotopes Opening Day roster. He is joined by OF Brenton Doyle, 16th, OF/3B Nolan Jones, 17th, RHP Jeff Criswell, 21st, and RHP Gavin Hollowell.

**MLB EXPERIENCE:** The Opening Day roster features 14 members who have seen time in the Major Leagues: Fernando Abad, Logan Allen, Matt Carasiti, Noah Davis, Matt Koch, Peter Lambert, Phillips Valdez, Grayson Greiner, Michael Toglia, and Cole Tucker, Gavin Hollowell, Nick Mears, Josh Rogers and Nolan Jones.

**TRIPLE-A DEBUTS:** Just six players slated to begin the season with Albuquerque have yet to make their Triple-A debuts: pitchers Blair Calvo, Stephen Jones and Gavin Hollowell along with infielders Aaron Schunk, Hunter Stovall and outfielder Jameson Hannah.

**RUN IT BACK:** The 12 returnees are headlined by first baseman Michael Toglia, a first-round pick from UCLA in 2019. Last year's 2022 Defensive Player of the Year Jonathan Morales and Mr. Hustle award winner Coco Montes also return to the club.

**HOW OLD ARE YOU?:** Fernando Abad is the elder statesman on the Opening Day roster at 37-years-old. He is beginning his 20th season in pro ball with his 12th different organization. He has the most amount of Major League service time on Albuquerque's roster with six years and 169 days ... Jeff Criswell is the youngest member of Albuquerque's Opening Day roster at 24 years and 20 days old.

**THREE GAME SETS:** This is one of two three-game series the Isotopes will play this year. The other coming right after the All-Star break against Salt Lake July 14-16.

**FREAKY FRIDAY:** Today's contest marks just the third time the Isotopes will open a season on a Friday, and the first time not due to a postponement. The two other occasions were 2008 at Omaha (rain and snow) and 2014 in Tacoma (rain).

**WARM FRONT:** Round Rock is forecasted for temperatures in the high-80s today. The previous high for an Isotopes opener was 82 degrees, which occurred last year in Oklahoma City and 2021 in Albuquerque.

**RADIO WAVES:** Due to the Final Four being broadcasted on KNML Saturday night, the Isotopes game will be aired on KTBL 1050am/94.5FM The Pit.

Tonight starts the 20th season of Isotopes baseball. Albuquerque has an all-time record of 1313-1393, including 727-630 at Isotopes Park and 586-763 on the road.

The Isotopes have dropped their last four season openers, recording their last win in a 7-4 decision vs. Salt Lake on April 6, 2017. They have not won their first road game since April 17, 2015, an 11-2 triumph at Reno.

### THIS DAY IN BASEBALL HISTORY

**1969:** The \$1.4 million Albuquerque Sports Stadium was christened with an exhibition game between the San Francisco Giants and Cleveland Indians before a crowd of more than 13,000 fans. The game ended in a 5-5 tie, due to darkness. It started at 4pm because the commissioner ordered no baseball activities until one hour after the funeral ended for former president Dwight Eisenhower. Bobby Bonds scored the ballpark's first run. Future Hall of Famer Willie Mays hit leadoff, batted three times, and declared it was, "the greatest minor league ballpark I've ever played in." A foul ball hit 12-year-old Mike Garcia squarely in the right eye, knocking him to the ground and his face bleeding. Willie Mays rushed to the boy's aide, putting his warmup jacket under Mike's head. Willie McCovey ran to get the Giants trainer. Garcia was unconscious as police put him in a car for the hospital. Garcia's friend, Greg Russell, retrieved the ball that hit Mike, and Mays signed it, "Mike, With best wishes. Willie Mays." The Say Hey Kid also sent Mike a get-well note on Candlestick Park stationery.

**HOMETOWN KID:** Jordan Pacheco begins his second season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... A 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

**CHRIS MICHALAK:** Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000.

**BOBBY MEACHAM:** Third stint with Rockies organization; served as hitting coach for Triple-A Colorado Springs (1993) and a minor league infield instructor (2005) ... Spent 10 seasons on MLB coaching staffs: Florida Marlins (2006), San Diego Padres (2007), Yankees (2008), Houston Astros (2009-12) and Phillies (2020-June 2022) ... Helped get Tony Gwynn onto the baseball team at San Diego State.

**SHIFT RESTRICTIONS:** In addition to the pitch clock (14 seconds no runners on, 19 seconds with runners on), 18 square inch bases and disengagement rules already implemented, MLB is instituting shift restrictions for infielders. There must be two infielders on either side of second base with both feet no deeper than the infield dirt.

**SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT:** For the first time since 1997, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. Moving from two five-team divisions to one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 25) will host the second half winner (beginning June 28) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 30.

**PCL PLAYOFF FORMAT HISTORY:** Founded in 1903, the Pacific Coast League has used the split-season format on three separate occasions prior to 2023. The PCL used first-half and second-half winners from 1928-31, 1935 and 1979-97. In 1928, the split-season system with one division, a first and second half winner and best-of-seven playoff series was used until 1931. After a three-year postseason hiatus, the same split-season format returned for the 1935 season. The third iteration of the split-season format began in 1979 with the four first and second half winners from two divisions meeting in a two round, best-of-five series to determine a victor.

**AIN'T LIFE GRAND:** In 2022, the Isotopes blasted 14 grand slams—breaking the previous minor league record of 13 held by the 1995 Indianapolis Indians while tying the MLB record with the 2000 Oakland Athletics and 2006 Cleveland Indians
