TODAY'S GAME: The Express hold a 1-0 series lead after a 5-4 come-from-behind, walk-off victory last night ... Albuquerque has lost 10 of its last 12 games and been outscored 75-55.

WALK-OFF: Last night was the sixth walk-off loss of the season (last: July 12 at Sugar Land, 3-1) and second against Round Rock (other: July 1, Keyber Rodriguez two-run homer, 6-5).

-Is the 11th season the club has recorded six-plus walk-off losses in a campaign (last: 2024, eight).

-Is the 11th all-time walk-off loss against Round Rock and the second time the Express have recorded two walk-off victories over Albuquerque in the same season (also: 2023).

AGAINST RR: Albuquerque has lost five-straight to Round Rock—the fifth-straight season the club has compiled at least a five-game losing streak to the Express ... Since 2022, Albuquerque is 14-31 in Round Rock.

BB: Bryant Betancourt went 2-for-4 Tuesday with two doubles and an RBI, his second-straight contest with two doubles and his 10th career game with two doubles, tying a career high.

-Has four-straight multi-hit games for the second time this season (also: April 21-25 with Double-A Hartford) ... During stretch, is 9-for-17 with five doubles and six RBI ... His five doubles since August 19 are the most in pro ball.

-Over eight games in August, is slashing .414/.433/.690 with five doubles, one homer and 10 RBI.

STER IT UP: Sterlin Thompson went 2-for-3 yesterday with two singles and two walks, his 13th game of 2026 with multiple free passes and third in his last five contests.

-Since coming off the injured list on August 18 (five games), is slashing .444/.630/.833 with one double, two homers, eight walks and five RBI (8x18).

AMADOR: Adael Amador went 1-for-5 last night with a triple and RBI, his third triple of the year and first since May 29 vs. El Paso.

-Has an extra-base hit in nine of his last 16 contests. During that stretch, he is slashing .324/.407/.634 with five doubles, one triple, five homers, 10 walks and 14 RBI.

CHAD: Chad Stevens went 1-for-3 Tuesday with a walk, his fifth-straight game with a hit ... During stretch is 7-for-19 with two doubles, five walks and three RBI.

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 0-for-1 as a pinch-hitter last night ... Over his last 34 games, is slashing .200/.309/.285 with three doubles, a triple, two homers, 16 walks and 16 RBI ... Has been hit by 16 pitches this year, most in the PCL.

EL MACHIN: Vimal Machin went 1-for-4 yesterday with a walk, his third-straight contest with a hit after going hitless in four of his previous six games (2x22 stretch) ... Is 5-for-14 in his last three contests.

T-FREEMAN: Tyler Freeman went 0-for-4 last night with a sac fly ... Over his first four games with Albuquerque, is 4-for-15 with four singles, a walk and RBI.

PCL LEADERS: Vimal Machin: T-9th, hits (115); 12th, TB (178) & RBI (66) ... Chad Stevens: 5th, OBP (.407); 6th, AVG (.315); 12th, OPS (.868); T-13th, 3B (4) ... Nic Kent: T-15th, HR (13).

-Adael Amador: T-10th, BB (59) ... Drew Avans: 6th, SB (25) and T-10th, BB (59)

-Charlie Condon: 3rd, runs (88); T-3rd, XBH (48) & TB (209); 4th, HR (22) & 3B (7); 6th, RBI (75); 7th, BB (65); 9th, OPS (.892); 10th, SLG (.507).

RUNS SCORED: The Isotopes have been held to four runs or fewer in eight of their last 12 contests, totaling 55 runs, the fourth-fewest in the PCL

ONE RUN GAMES: The Isotopes fell to 13-19 in one-run games and 5-11 on the road. The club has lost two-straight one-run contests (last win: August 5 vs. Sugar Land, 7-6).

-The club has also dropped eight of 10 one-run contests in the second half.

.500: With a loss tonight, the Isotopes will be a four games below .500, tying the season low (49-53 on July 26).

DUBS IN A SEASON: With 23 games remaining in the season, the Isotopes are nine wins away from tying for the most victories in a campaign since the club became a Rockies affiliate in 2015 (71, 2016)

-The club needs 14 wins down the stretch to finish above .500 for the first time since 2013 (76-68).

UP AND DOWN: The Isotopes have allowed three runs or fewer 35 times this year (16 at home) while relenting double-digits tallies 32 times.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB season from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

CHECK-SWING CHALLENGE: Starting May 5, the Check-Swing Challenge will be used in the PCL. In addition to being able to challenge ball/strike calls, players will also be able to challenge the umpire's call of swing or no-swing. A batter will be judged to have offered at a pitch when the bat head gets ahead of the knob and creates an angle greater than 45 degrees. The 45-degree threshold allows umpires to use the baselines as a visible point of reference.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
