**Aviators vs. Space Cowboys:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Athletics, will face the defending PCL & Triple-A champions, the Sugar Land Space Cowboys, Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, tonight in game three of the six-game series in Pacific Coast League action at Constellation Field (7,500)...Las Vegas is 1-1 in the series...the road trip against Sugar Land will conclude on Memorial Day (May 26)...the Aviators will then host the Oklahoma City Comets, Triple-A affiliate of the 2024 World Series Champions Los Angeles Dodgers, in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, May 27 – June 1.

**Las Vegas defeats Sugar Land 16-3 in game two of series:** The Aviators defeated the Space Cowboys 16-3 last night in game two of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 2,576 at Constellation Field.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded a season-high 19 hits and stranded three runners on base. Seven players recorded multiple-hit games: Designated hitter **Max Muncy** was 4-for-5, double, triple, 5 RBI, run scored. Center fielder **Drew Avans** was 3-for-6, RBI, three runs scored to extend his hitting streak to 22 games; third baseman **Alejo Lopez** was 3-for-5, RBI, three runs scored and left fielder **Colby Thomas** was 2-for-5, HR, 4 RBI, two runs scored.

**Sugar Land Offense:** The Space Cowboys recorded 8 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Designated hitter **Zack Short** was 2-for-2, three walks, double. Right fielder **Jacob Melton** was 2-for-4, double, walk, RBI, SB, run scored.

**Aviators Starting Pitcher:** Right-hander **Osvaldo Bido** pitched 4.1 shutout innings in the no decision. He allowed 5 hits, walked 4 and struck out 2 on 89 pitches (44 strikes).

**Las Vegas defeats El Paso 14-4 in series finale (Sunday, May 18):** The Aviators defeated the Chihuahuas 14-4 in the finale of the six-game homestand before a crowd of 5,770 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Sugar Land defeats Las Vegas 5-2 in series opener (Wednesday, May 21):** The Space Cowboys defeated the Aviators 5-2 in game one of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 2,881 at Constellation Field.

**Las Vegas Offense:** The Aviators recorded 5 hits and stranded 10 runners on base. Left fielder **Drew Avans** was 2-for-4, walk, stolen base, RBI to extend his hitting streak to 21 games. Designated hitter **Max Muncy** was 1-for-2, two walks, run scored and first baseman **Logan Davidson** was 0-for-2, three walks, two stolen bases, run scored.

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS** – Las Vegas is 1-1 in the series...the six-game road trip against the defending PCL & Triple-A champions, Space Cowboys, Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros, will conclude on Memorial Day (May 26)...Sugar Land and Las Vegas will play each other a total of 18 times in '25...Lehigh Valley, Triple-A affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies, (International League) has the best record in Triple-A (33-14, .702)...Las Vegas has the second-best record at 31-16 (.660)...following the road trip, the Aviators will then host the Oklahoma City Comets, Triple-A affiliate of the 2024 World Series Champions Los Angeles Dodgers, from Tuesday-Sunday, May 27 – June 1...the 2025 season will feature six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday and off days on Mondays (**one exception, May 26 Memorial Day at Sugar Land**)...the '25 campaign will feature 150 games for the fourth consecutive season (75-home- 75-away).

**2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE WEEK:** Right-hander **J.T. Ginn** from March 24-30...defeated Reno on March 28 in the season opener at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, eight strikeouts on 69 pitches (44 strikes).

**2025 PCL PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** Catcher **Daniel Susac** from April 14-20...in four games, batted .625 (10-for-16) with three doubles, two home runs and 6 RBI, including a season-best 4-for-4 performance with two doubles, 2 RBI and walk-off home run vs. Sugar Land on **Jackie Robinson Day** (April 15).

**2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH (APRIL):** Right-hander **Gunnar Hoglund** was named PCL Pitcher of the Month (April) on May 5...he appeared in five starts and posted a 1-2 record with a 2.10 ERA...allowed six earned runs on 20 hits and four walks over 25.2 innings pitched...struck out 27 and held opponents to a .222 average.

**42<sup>nd</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024)** – The Aviators are playing in their 42<sup>nd</sup> season (43<sup>rd</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League... **the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL is in its 122<sup>nd</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**INTERLAGUE PLAY IN 2025:** The Aviators will host the Iowa Cubs, Triple-A affiliate of the Chicago Cubs, and member of the International League in a six-game series from Tuesday-Sunday, August 26-31 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2024 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2023 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2022 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH) announced on **October 10, 2017** its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on **Friday, February 23, 2018** before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,196-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark provides a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall. Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site is landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites. The grand opening took place on **Tuesday, April 9, 2019** before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION HISTORY:** Howard Hughes Holdings Inc. (NYSE: HHH), then-owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of the Pacific Coast League, and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on **December 8, 2018** the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51<sup>st</sup>) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

#### **AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

**NEW YORK, NY (AUGUST 1, 2024)** – Seaport Entertainment Group Inc. (NYSE American: SEG) (the "Seaport Entertainment Group" or "Company"), a newly formed company positioned at the intersection of entertainment and real estate, announced that it has completed its previously announced separation (the "Separation") from its predecessor **Howard Hughes Holdings Inc.** (NYSE: HHH) ("Howard Hughes") and is now an independent, standalone publicly traded company. The Company began its common stock trading (August 1) on the NYSE American LLC under the ticker symbol SEG.

Seaport Entertainment Group's portfolio is anchored by the historic Seaport neighborhood in Lower Manhattan, which includes 478,000 square feet of primarily retail, restaurant and entertainment offerings, the 3,500-person concert venue on The Rooftop at Pier 17, a mixed-use development site at 250 Water Street, and the Tin Building by Jean-Georges, an immersive culinary marketplace. The Company's portfolio also includes **Las Vegas Ballpark in downtown Summerlin, NV; the Las Vegas Aviators, the Triple-A Minor League Baseball Affiliate of the Athletics**; a 25% ownership interest in Jean-Georges Restaurants; and an interest in and to 80% of the air rights above the Fashion Show mall in Las Vegas.
