End of the Regular Season

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Justin Campbell** to the mound tonight, looking for his first win as a Clipper (has not recorded 5.0IP in any of 4GS). The Saints will counter with LHP **Kendry Rojas**. Columbus is 18-26 (.409) versus left handers this year. Rojas has pitched against Columbus twice in his career, going 0-0 with a 7.20ERA (5.0IP, 7H, 4R, 4ER, 4BB, 4K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus is 4-5 against the Saints in Ohio this year, producing a 9-12 series record, and has won 55 of the last 92 overall opposing the Saints (505-417 run differential; 16 of 37 losses by a single run, only 13 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Kody Huff** has hit .296 (29x98) with 5HR and 20RBI in 29G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 23G).

Two 800 Numbers

Giving up 16 last night, the Clippers surpassed 800 runs allowed on the season (804), to go along with 816 runs scored. Despite being the only team in the IL scoring and allowing 800+ (first since four teams in 2023; once from 2000-22), Clipper games have seen only the 2nd most runs this year (1,620, Iowa has 1,622). If the Clippers score 16 over the last 3G, they will push the Saints into the 800-800 club.

Bombs Away

Despite hitting a single homer in the last 3G (George Valera last night), Columbus still leads all of pro baseball in homers hit since 7/28 (84), entering today with the 2nd most in franchise history (201; club record is 213 in 2019). The 280 runs scored by Columbus in the last 43G (17 in last 5G) are 3rd most in pro ball (leads IL). The Clippers are 24-19 (.558) in those 43G, but 2-7 since the start of last week.

At the Top

Blake Perkins is taking over the leadoff spot tonight, having drawn 24BB in 119PA since joining the Clippers on 8/4 (only 29K). That 20% walk rate is 2nd only to normal leadoff man, **Cooper Ingle** (22%). As a team, Columbus leads the IL with a franchise best 751BB (+73 on 2nd), but the leadoff batter ranks 5th with 97BB (batters #2, #5, #6 and #7 lead the IL; #8 is 2nd, #4 and #9 are 3rd, #3 is 14th).

Power and Speed

Kahlil Watson is sitting at 19HR, as the Clippers have five batters with at least 19HR for the second time (2019). His next bomb will not only give them five players with at least 20HR for the first time ever, but will mark the third 20-20 season in franchise history (**Milan Tolentino** has done so twice, 2025-26). Unfortunately, he is homerless in his last 38AB (1RBI; hit 3HR with 8RBI in 12AB prior).

Kentucky Blues

Kyle Manzardo has hit .182/.270/.212 with 0HR and only 3RBI in 8G since the start of last week's roadtrip to Louisville (went into trip on a 19G hit streak: .347/.412/.587 with 3HR and 23RBI). Since 8/30, Manzardo has advanced only one base on 13 of his last 15 hits (HR on 9/3 vs. Iowa, double on Wednesday), as his Columbus single total has crept up to 65 (70XBH, slugging has dipped from .562 to .534).

Finishing Strong

Over his last 20G, **Kody Huff** is hitting .333 (25x75) with 3HR and 12RBI (.573SLG on 11XBH). Huff slumped heavily after leaving St. Paul with an 0x4 on 7/26 (.134, 9x67 in 19G), but he still managed to pop 5HR in that time, as he enters tonight's contest with 22HR (18 in career prior). Those homers have been split perfectly between Huntington Park (180AB, .511SLG) and the road (227AB, .515SLG).

Capitalizing

George Valera has played sparingly since 7/28, appearing in only 20 of 43G, but he has slashed .403/.483/.844 with 8HR and 19RBI when he does take the field (hit .148/.250/.182 with 0HR and 7RBI in 26G prior, 6/10-7/26). The hot streak includes hits in 18 of 20G and, dating to a game prior, he has reached base in 21 straight (.473OBP). In his Clipper career, he has hammered 51HR (16th all time).

Dom-ination

Dom Nunez made his pitching debut last night, turning in the only scoreless performance among all 10 players to take the mound. At the plate, Nunez is 7x21 (.333) with a HR and 6RBI in 6G since 8/30 (was 2x33 with an RBI in 10G prior, 6/14-8/20). He has 1HR at catcher this year, as Clipper catchers rank 2nd in the IL with 28HR (St. Paul has 29), while hitting .294/.414/.531 (leads IL in all three categories).

This Date in Clipper History

9/18/1992

Down 2-1 to Scranton/WB in the Governors' Cup Finals, Columbus stormed out of the gate in game four, taking a 9-1 lead after the 3rd. However, they would need to tack on a run in the 10th to even the series, marking their second extra-inning win of the Finals. The best team in Clipper history would play with fire again the next night, needing a 3-run 9th to cement their second straight Cup (101st win of the year).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,498 to 1,451).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 198-155 (.561) in pitch reviews, with batters going 100-90 (.526) and pitchers/catchers going 98-65 (.601). They have run out of challenges in 49G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus has topped 800 again this year (on pace for 833, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 172 through 144G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 52CS so far, the Clippers have the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (2024; on pace for 53CS).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 194 runs while crafting a .874OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 138 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +56 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 326-213 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,005RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.39 through 144G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 195HR (would be 4th most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 80G this season (45-35, .563), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 11th most last at bat wins this year (15, six off the lead) while playing in the 14th most games decided in the last at bat (29, Norfolk has 42). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 103G decided in the last at bat (3rd most in the IL), going 49-54 (.476, 17th best winning percentage; 6th most wins, 3rd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 462-474 (.494), 432-428 with Columbus (.502).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). He gave up multiple runs in each of 5G in June (17.1IP, 15ER) and struggled in July also (22.0IP, 12ER), as he posted a 6.18ERA (39.1IP, 27ER) over the two months. Opposing hitters batted .294 (48x163) with 10HR in 10G from June-July (9HR to last 107BF). Since the calendar has flipped to August, Maltud has regained his early season form, turning in a 2.78ERA (35.2IP, 11ER) through 7G (2HR against 149BF).

Undecided:

Through the month of June, Maltud was the only pitcher in the IL with at least 10GS that had not taken a loss and his lone win (4/11 at Worcester) made him the only starter with a single decision. He is 7-1 in 12G since the start of July, winning back to back starts to begin the month and suffering his only loss of the year in his 17th start (7/22 at St. Paul). Despite a 3.77ERA as a starter and run support of 5.9 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only 12 times because the offense is averaging 2.8 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 12G with two runs or fewer (5G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 131 innings started in 27G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 17 occasions, including 4-pitch innings on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis and 8/28 at Indy, while turning in 26 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ four times, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.6 pitches per inning.

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 2nd in the IL with a 3.80ERA (12 qualifiers, dropped out of the top five after allowing 7ER in 3.2IP at St. Paul on 7/22). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.23WHIP on the season places 4th).

Stepping Up:

With runners in scoring position this season, Maltud has held the opposition to a line of .157/.262/.206, surrendering just 1HR in 102AB. With a runner at first base, he has struggled to a line of .292/.357/.517 while allowing 4HR (89AB) and with the bases empty, the bad guys have hit .234/.300/.385 with 11HR in 286AB.

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched five times in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches), **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches), **Austin Peterson** on 8/9 at Syracuse (3.1IP, 47 pitches) and **Justin Campbell** twice, on 8/28 at Indianapolis (5.1IP, 80 pitches) and 9/10 at Louisville (5.0IP, 84 pitches). He owns a 3.92ERA out of the bullpen (20.2IP, 20H, 9R, 9ER, 7BB, 25K).
