### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Logan Allen** to the mound tonight, looking to bounce back from a half opening loss (went 5-0 after losing first game of first half). Omaha will counter with RHP **Henry Williams**. Columbus is 35-19 (.648) versus right handers this year. Williams has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career (both three weeks ago), going 0-0 with a 6.30ERA (10.0IP, 9H, 7R, 7ER, 4BB, 13K).

### vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus has lost 48 of the last 77 regular season games against Omaha, dating to 5/5/22. Of those 77G, the Clippers are 10-45 (.182) when they allow at least four runs to Omaha (3-2 in last 5G), while going 19-3 (.864) when they hold the Storm Chasers to three or fewer. Individually, **Kody Huff** has played 17G against Omaha in his career, hitting .298 (17x57) with 4HR and 10RBI.

### Down Early

Last night's loss marked the second straight series opening loss for Columbus (8-6 in lid lifters). After each of the previous five opening losses, the Clippers came back to win game two (last series to start 0-2 was 8/26-8/27/25 at Louisville), while going on to win the series twice (three ties). Since going 2-4 at Worcester from 4/7-4/12, Columbus is 3-0-7 in the last 10 series.

### Close-ing the Gap

Each of the last two Clipper losses have been by a run, following a 6G winning streak (10-9 on the year, .526, t-9th in the IL). They are now 15-7 in the last 22G with a margin of three or fewer (29-21, .580, 4th). Regardless of the margin, the Clippers are 20-12 over the last 32G, going +5 in the run column (166-161). On the year, Columbus is -10 (14th; all other IL teams with more than 40 wins average +60).

### Getting There

**Cooper Ingle** reached the qualification level for rate statistics in the IL on 6/7 and his .417OBP ranks 7th in the IL (debuted at 1st), after slumping to a .291OBP over the last 22G (20x90, .222, 10BB, 25K). Ingle was 4x4 with a double and 3HR on 6/18 vs. Scranton/WB to hop back over .300, but is 1x12 since. At catcher, Ingle has a 1.293OPS (11HR) in 31G (.439OPS and 1HR in 18G between DH and LF).

### Naying It

**Bo Naylor** has reached base in 18 of 20G, posting a .398OBP (14BB in last 65PA; also has 4HR and 21K, yielding a 60% three true outcome rate). Since joining the team on 5/27, he has the 2nd most RBI (14), while scoring the 2nd most runs (15). Columbus catchers are hitting .304/.438/.577, leading the IL in all three categories by a wide margin (2nd in all is Memphis: .286/.395/.500).

### Back to Back Streaks

**Ralph Velazquez** is bringing a 16G on base streak to the cleanup spot tonight (.382OBP since 6/3, tied for 13th longest active streak in the IL), while **Kody Huff** follows with a 15G run (.400OBP since 6/2, tied for 15th longest active streak; tied for personal best, set in 2024). Velazquez has 5RBI on the streak, as he is hitting just .143 (4x20) with runners in scoring position with Columbus.

### Run Production

**Kody Huff** tied a career high with his 47th RBI on Saturday (59th game, had 47RBI in 101G last season), while embiggening his career high for homers (10). He scored his 45th run on Sunday, tying his career high there (60th game, 45 in 98G with Akron in 2024). Since 5/3, Huff has 26BB to 20K in 34G (12BB and 24K in first 27G), as his 38BB in 250PA have surpassed last year's total (37BB, 407PA).

### Tough Way to Go

**George Valera** saw his 21G on base streak snapped with a pinch-hit strikeout on 6/11 (5/5-6/10, .418OBP). Over the first 8G of the streak, Valera had a .250OBP (36PA; hit .182, 6x33 with 3BB and 11K), but reached over half the time in the last 13G (.527OBP in 55PA; hit .366, 15x41 with 14BB and 6K). Valera responded with a hit in each of 3G since (3x9), including a pinch-hit RBI single on 6/13.

### I Love Lampe

**Joe Lampe** has an extra base hit in each of 3G with a plate appearance since joining Columbus, following 4XBH in his final 21G with Akron (.289SLG). His game-tying homer on 6/19 vs. Scranton/WB was his first in Triple-A and first since going deep on 9/11/25 with Akron at Harrisburg. Starting in center tonight, it will mark his third game there with Columbus (once with Akron among 24G).

### This Date in Clipper History

6/24/1995

**Derek Jeter** propelled the Clippers to 6-2 victory over the Scranton/Wilkes-Barre Red Barons, going 3x5 with a run, 2RBI and a HR. In 1995, Jeter was the only Clipper selected to represent the IL in the Triple-A All-Star Game and was also named to the postseason team after hitting .317 with a league-leading 96 runs. He currently ranks 3rd in franchise history with a .324 career average with the Clippers.

### First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

### Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,447 to 1,396).

### Challenging Times

The Clippers are 107-93 (.535) in pitch reviews, with batters going 56-62 (.475) and pitchers/catchers going 51-31 (.622). They have run out of challenges in 35G and have not challenged in 3G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

### Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 4-3 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 54-36 when playing past regulation (.600, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 90G to require extra play, 71 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

### On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to easily top 800 again, with an outside chance to establish a new team high (on pace for 828, would rank as 4th most all-time; 898 scored in 1983).

### On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 94 through the first 75G (on pace for 191SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 24CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the 3rd most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (48; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

### Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 118 runs while crafting a .936OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 50 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +68 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 187-121 from innings 5-7).

### Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,945RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

### In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.33 through the first 75G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 175HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

### Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 8th in the IL this year (.979), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 40G this season (25-15, .625), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

### Good Baseball

**Milan Tolentino** bunted the winning run into scoring position in an extra-inning win at Indianapolis on 6/14. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 88-23 (.793) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 5-2 mark this season (.714, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

### To the End

The Clippers have the 2nd most last at bat wins this year (12, Syracuse at 13) while playing in the 2nd most games decided in the last at bat (20; Scranton/WB has played 21). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 94G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 46-48 (.489, 15th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

### Manager Profile

**Andy Tracy** made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 427-440 (.493), 397-394 with Columbus (.502).

### Workhorse

Allen is the only Clipper averaging over 80 pitches a start this season, at 87.6 (along with **Ryan Webb**, only pitchers to throw more than 90 in a game multiple times). Averaging almost 93 pitches per outing in the Majors last season, Allen hit triple digits six times (Columbus has not had a pitcher reach 100 since **Peyton Battenfield** on 9/2/22, 539G ago)

### On Guard(ians):

In two stints in the Majors this season (27th man in a DH on 4/5 and a two day excursion from 5/24-5/25), Allen has appeared once for Cleveland, closing out the game on 5/25 vs. Washington (4.0IP, 5H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). The game was his second in relief at the Major League level (once last season) and he has just 4G out of the bullpen in the minors (all on starter's rest, three piggybacking rehabbing Major Leaguers).

### Stellar Support:

Through 12GS, the bullpen has graced Allen with a 2.03ERA in relief (44.1IP, 10ER), stranding three of six runners inherited. The defense has committed only 10E in Allen's starts, while the offense has put forward 5.6 runs per game. That all adds up to a 10-2 record for Columbus when he takes the hill.

### Tough Split:

In his first 5GS (103BF), Allen recorded 32K (31%) against only 10BB (10%), while painting the zone with strikes on 63% of his offerings. Once the calendar flipped to May, however, he made 4GS (87BF), watching his strikeout rate dip to 16% (14K) and his walk rate inflate (14%, 12BB; strikes on 57% of pitches). He has found his groove in June, starting with a 10K outing (fifth of career) on 6/6 vs. Omaha (22K to 72BF this month, 31%; 4BB, 6%, 66% of pitches have been strikes).

### Cleaning Up:

Opposing cleanup hitters have just one hit off Allen in 28AB this season, though the hit went over the wall (**Charles McAdoo**, 4/26 at Buffalo). Looking at the lineup as a whole, the top five in the order have slashed .227/.314/.404 with 5HR in 141AB against Allen, while batters 6-9 have hit .379/.451/.644 with 5HR in 87AB.
