



WEATHER/RAIN POLICY

According to the rules of Minor League Baseball, the home team is the sole judge as to conditions of the playing field, prior to the start of the game. The umpire-in-chief shall be the sole judge as to whether and when play shall be suspended during a game because of unsuitable weather conditions or the unfit condition of the playing field, as to whether and when play shall be resumed after such suspension and as to whether and when a game shall be terminated after such suspension. The umpire-in-chief shall not call the game until at least 30 minutes after he/she has suspended play, and may continue the suspension as long as he/she believes there is a chance to resume play. The umpire-in-chief shall at all times try to complete a game. The umpire-in-chief's authority to resume play following one or more suspensions of as much as 30 minutes each shall be absolute, and the umpire-in-chief shall terminate a game only when there appears to be no reasonable possibility of completing the ballgame. If a game is postponed or not played because of inclement weather or other reason, tickets may be exchanged for any regular season game in person at the BayCare Box Office.

A game is considered official after 4 1/2 innings have been completed if the Blue Jays are in the lead, 5 innings if the Blue Jays are losing or tied at the time of the delay.

Delayed, postponed and canceled games due to inclement weather are a part of baseball. Valid tickets may be exchanged for a ticket of equal or lesser value to any regular season Blue Jays home game. Valid rain out tickets may only be exchanged in person.
