"FUN IS GOOD" FACTOIDS

BACK TO WINNING WAYS: The Saints snapped out of their five-game slide with a 3-2 bounce-back in game two of the series Wednesday night at CHS Field. Right-hander Andrew Morris fired his second consecutive start of 5.0 scoreless frames to set the tone and two St. Paul homers stood up, a two-run blast from C Jair Camargo and a solo shot from OF Carson McCusker, each their first of the season. After taking over with a 2-0 lead, Cory Lewis saw the advantage slip away in the 6th, but settled in to retire six straight to end his outing. Anthony Misiewicz pinned down the first St. Paul save of the year with a scoreless ninth. The five-game losing skid was the Saints' longest in franchise history in the month of April and tied for their fifth-longest at any point as a Triple-A club.

RISP AVERSE: Since going 9-for-20 in their season-opening win with runners in scoring position on March 28 against Indianapolis, the Saints are hitting just .140 (8-for-57) in such situations since then, the worst in the International League and the [2nd-worst in Triple-A in that span](#). The Saints do not have a single extra-base hit with runners in scoring position in that stretch after smacking three doubles and a triple in such situations on Opening Night at CHS Field, an 11-0 drubbing of the Indians. Despite slugging two homers yesterday, the Saints went just 1-for-6 w/ RISP, and their only hit in such scenarios came off the bat of Austin Martin (a single), but led to an out when Emmanuel Rodriguez overran second and was tagged out with two runners occupying the same base.

MCCUSKER MASHING: Saints outfielder Carson McCusker is crushing the ball to open the season and currently ranks 4th in Triple-A in average exit velocity to start the season (see below), averaging 97.8 mph on his batted balls this year. The 6-8 slugger crushed his first home run of the season on Wednesday night and also tallied a single that was tattooed for an exit velocity of 112.9 mph, the third hardest-hit ball by a Saint so far this season. McCusker now has three of the top-5 hardest hit balls by a St. Paul hitter this season and four of the top-10, including a 114.2 mph single on April 2 in Columbus that ranks 9th in exit velocity in Saints history. Since making his Triple-A debut on August 24 last season, his average exit velo is [tops among Saints hitters with at least 25 AB](#) (91.3). Now just 29 games into his short Triple-A tenure, he already has seven batted balls registered at 110 mph or harder (three so far this season).

NO CHEAP ONES: After producing nine "hard hit" balls on Wednesday night against Omaha, the Saints now rank [3rd in Triple-A in average exit velocity](#) with an 89.3 mph average exit velo as a team. In Friday, March 28th's season opener, the Saints lineup produced a season-high 14 "hard-hit" balls and have had at least 6 in 7-of-8 contests so far this year. Carson McCusker (3x), Emmanuel Rodriguez, and Jair Camargo (2x) have all have peaked with exit velocities over 110 mph already this year, all ranking among the [top-75 hardest hit balls in the International League](#) this season.

GET IN THE GAP, BALL!!: Despite the Saints' eye-popping exit velos (see above), it hasn't necessarily translated to much power yet this season. Entering Thursday, the Saints ranked second-to-last in the International League with 15 extra-base hits and 14th/20 in slugging% (.340). The Saints are tied with Buffalo for the fewest home runs in the league even after popping a pair out on Tuesday night at CHS Field. The Saints are tied-for-last in the IL in runs scored (24), and have scored just eight in their last six games (1.3/game) after scoring 16 in the first two games of the season.

START ME UP: The Saints starting rotation has gotten off to a tremendous start to the year, spinning a 1.77 ERA among starters that ranks second in the International League, trailing only Durham (TBR). Saints starters have struck out 61 batters (25% K-rate) against 11 walks (8% BB-rate) in 48.1 innings this year. If you throw out David Festa's rocky outing last Friday in game two of a doubleheader in Columbus (3.1 IP, 6 runs, 5 ER), the Saints starting staff have a 0.80 ERA (4 ER, 45.0 IP). The rotation went off with a bang to start the season when David Festa, Zebby Matthews, and then Andrew Morris all went at least 5.0 shutout in three consecutive starts, the first time in Saints history that three consecutive St. Paul starters have done so (It's only the [second time ever](#) that Saints starters did not allowed a run in three consecutive games with the last coming from June 29-July 1, 2023 when Randy Dobnak and Blayne Enlow threw 5.0 shutout in back-to-back games before Dallas Kuechel went 4.1 scoreless the following night, all against Gwinnett).

HOME SWEET HOME: During the past five seasons as a Triple-A club (2021-25), the Saints are [fifth in all of Minor League Baseball](#) with 165 home wins, trailing only Nashville (181), Bowling Green (174), Durham (174), and Tacoma (170). Their .571 Win% at home is fourth-best in Triple-A and third in the IL in that span. Last year's 35-38 record was the 1st season the Saints played below .500 at home in 4 years as a Triple-A club.

THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY: The Saints Opening Day roster features nine of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseball America while also touting five of Minnesota's top-10 prospects on the MLB Pipeline list. The Twins prospects in the rankings include OF Emmanuel Rodriguez (No 2. MLB.com, No. 2 BA), INF Luke Keaschall (3/3), RHP Zebby Matthews (-/4), RHP Marco Raya (6/8), RHP Andrew Morris (9/10), RHP Cory Lewis (11/20), INF Payton Eeles (23/17), RHP Travis Adams (22/22), C Diego Cartaya (24/21), & C Jair Camargo (-/23). Both Rodriguez (19/37) and Keaschall (45/60) rank among the top-100 overall lists of both publications.

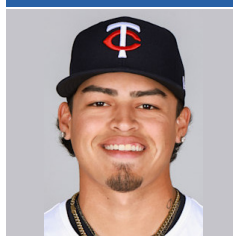

LAST APPEARANCE: Struck out five the first time through the lineup, pitching around three singles in the first two innings before running into trouble and reaching his pitch count in the third. After issuing his first walk to load the bases in the third, made way for Kody Funderburk, who induced an inning-ending 1-6-3 double play to leave Raya's line unblemished.

A LONG WAIT: A fourth-round pick in 2020, Raya had to wait a while to make his professional debut. After entering the year as a 1st Team Preseason All-American, his senior season at United South High School in Laredo, Texas was limited to just 18.0 innings in which he struck out 36 batters. His final high school outing was a complete-game, one-hit shutout. However due to the COVID-19 shutdown, followed by a right rotator cuff strain, Raya threw his first professional pitch on April 12, 2022, 670 days after hearing the Twins call his name in the Draft.

THAT'S MARK, WITH A K: Raya, who's full legal name is Marco Antonio Raya, goes by Mark, despite not having a "K" in his legal name. He said you'd have to ask his dad as to why --- he's listed as "Marco" everywhere on Major League Baseball's websites.

GOOD GENES: Athletes run in the Raya family. Mark's mother played college tennis, his father played baseball at Nixon, while his sister made it to regionals as a junior and senior at United South HS in hurdles. Raya's brother also holds the Texas A&M International career strikeout record (127) despite only pitching two years for the Dustdevils in Division 2.

LAST APPEARANCE: Piggybacked off of Randy Dobnak's five scoreless innings on Sunday in Columbus, and yielded just one run over 3.0 innings of relief, leaving the game at the End of 6 with the Saints up 2-1 in an eventual 3-2 walk-off defeat in the 10th. Only induced three swings-and-misses, but all resulted in strikeouts (two on the four-seamer, one on a changeup).

PITCHING LAB PAYING DIVIDENDS: Adams credits his success to a relationship built on trust with the Twins player development staff, who helped him add a cutter as well as convert his sweeper into a true slider with big swing-and-miss numbers (a 40.6% whiff-rate in four Triple-A appearances last season), helping him round out his six-pitch arsenal in 2024.

NOT ALL HEROES WEAR CAPES: Travis helped save the life of a stranger from a burning house in Fort Myers in March of 2024 during Spring Training. He heard a loud bang from the house across the street from where he was staying. He and another man ran out, and saw that the hosue was on fire. They started to bang on the door to see if anyone was inside. Three other people came out who knew the man inside and started yelling, "Howard, your house is on fire , get out!" Gaining entrance to the house was difficult because of so many objects around the outside of the house, but Travis went around the side of the house, tearing up a part of the fence down to get back to the area where another door was. He ended up opening the door, and safely escorting the man out of the burning building.

SIGHT-SEERS: Adams traveled through Kyoto, Osaka and the outskirts of Japan with fellow Twins minor leaguer Jaylen Nowlin following the 2024 season. It was a leisure trip, but the duo took time away from their vacation to travel two hours from Shibuya (on the outskirts of Tokyo) to meet their old coach in the Twins organization, Takashi Miyoshi (now a Minor League instructor with the Reds) at his youth clinic. Adams and Nowlin spoke to a group of 8-16 year olds about their journey through American baseball and the mental side of the game.

HORNET PRIDE: Adams played his college baseball at Cal-State Sacramento in the Western Athletic Conference. He was a three-year starter for the Hornets, regularly pitching as their Saturday night guy as a junior and forming a dynamic 1-2 punch atop the rotation with Scott Randall, who went nine picks after Adams in that summer's June 2021 Amateur Draft to the Pirates (the two have yet to face each other in a professional game entering the season). While at Cal-State Sacramento, Adams was known for his pinpoint control, issuing just 25 walks in 151.0 career innings, the lowest BB/9 rate in program history (min. 100 IP). The program has produced nine Major Leaguers entering the 2025 season, headlined by Rhys Hoskins and James Outman.
