Fireworks Started Early

The San Antonio Missions (6-5) exploded for eight runs in the first three innings to run away from the Amarillo Sod Poodles (4-7) with an 8-1 victory on America's 250th birthday in front of 6,241 fans at Wolff Stadium. Kai Roberts smashed a three-run homer, Albert Fabian tripled home two and Braedon Karpathios added a long ball to provide the offense while five pitchers combined to hold Amarillo to one run, including Landry Jurecka, who picked up the win in his Double-A debut.

We'll Have One of Everything

In the 2nd inning last night, the Missions hit for a team cycle with Braedon Karpathios's single, Tirso Ornelas's double, Albert Fabian's triple and Kai Roberts's home run. That's the first time since June 11, 2021 that the Missions have done that. Jack Suwinski singled, Taylor Kohlway doubled, Juan Fernandez tripled and Eguay Rosario homered against Midland.

Make it a Double

Tirso Ornelas hit another double last night. He is 2nd in the Texas League with 21 doubles, and he leads the Missions with 11 home runs and is tied for the team lead with 36 RBIs.

From the Jump

Francis Peña made his first career start in 5 years, and he faced the minimum through 3 clean innings. Peña now has 6 straight scoreless innings over his last 3 games.

Quite the Whirlwind

Landry Jurecka flew in from Arizona yesterday and pitched above Single-A for the first time ever, yet he held Amarillo to one run in three sharp innings.

What Can't He Do?

Kai Roberts hit his 2nd home run of the year last night, banging the ball off the left field foul pole. It's been a banner week for Roberts, who also broke the Texas League record with 28 consecutive stolen bases to start the season.

'Pen Doing Work

The Missions' bullpen has dominated this week, allowing just 4 runs in 21.1 innings (1.69 ERA).

This Ain't Hodgetown

San Antonio has limited Amarillo to 8 runs in 5 games. The Sod Poodles have stranded 37 runners while going 3-32 (.093) with RISP. Amarillo has yet to hit a home run this week and has just one this year in San Antonio.

Where the Season Really Started

After starting 6-20, the Missions are 31-23 since May 3.

17 Again

Over the last 17 games (before the 2 week road trip), the Missions have hit .269 as a team and scored 86 runs (5.05 R/G) while belting 28 doubles, 5 triples and 21 home runs. That .268 average is the 7th best in Double-A, and the Missions are 10-7 in those 17 games

Putting Them on the Board

San Antonio's 337 runs are the 2nd-fewest in Double-A, and their 65 home runs are the 2nd-fewest. However, over the last 54 games, they have scored 251 runs (4.64 R/G) and hit 49 home runs. They are 31-23 in that stretch.

Drove them Home Yesterday

The Missions have stranded 601 runners on base, the 3rd-most in Double-A, and their .204 AVG with RISP is the worst at the level. Yesterday, the Missions went 3-7 with RISP and stranded 6.

No One Throws More

Lefty Jagger Haynes tosses for the Missions today. The 23-year-old is 3-2 with a 4.24 ERA in 15 starts with 34 walks and 72 strikeouts in 80.2 innings. He leads the Texas League in innings thrown. On Tuesday, Haynes gave up 2 runs on 4 hits with 4 walks and 4 strikeouts against Amarillo. Haynes has completed at least 5 innings in all but 3 starts. The Whiteville, North Carolina native led the Missions in starts and innings last year, going 3-4, 4.11 ERA in 26 games (25 starts) with 62 BBs, 101 Ks and a .223 AVG against across 103 innings. This was Haynes's second straight season with over 100 innings after injury issues, including Tommy John Surgery, to begin his career. The San Diego Padres drafted Haynes in the 5th round of the 2020 MLB Draft when he was just 17-years-old, and MLB Pipeline ranks him as the No. 13 prospect in their system. This will be the 10th time Haynes faces Amarillo. He is 2-2 with a 4.34 ERA, 23 walks and 32 strikeouts in 37.1 innings.

Him Again

22-year-old Adonys Perez starts for Amarillo. He went 0-1 with a 3.09 ERA in 10 games for High-A Hillsboro with 4 walks and 24 strikeouts before getting called up to Double-A on June 2. He has started 5 games and gone 0-2 with a 6.05 ERA in 19.1 innings with 8 walks and 6 strikeouts. On Tuesday against the Missions, he went 5 innings and allowed 4 runs (3 earned) on 5 hits (2 homers) with 1 walk and 1 strikeout. In 2025, Perez went 7-7 with a 6.40 ERA in 21 games (13 starts) for Single-A Visalia, walking 35 and striking out 63 in 83 innings. The Arizona Diamondbacks signed Perez in 2022 out of La Romana, Dominican Republic. This will be his second time facing the Missions.

San Antonio Missions Coaches

Manager - Chris Tremie

Chris Tremie begins his first season in the San Diego Padres organization and as manager of the San Antonio Missions. He spent 13 seasons as a manager in the Cleveland Guardians organization and the last seven seasons as the minor league field coordinator for the Cincinnati Reds.

“Fans should expect to come out and see a team that’s going to compete on a daily basis,” Tremie said. “It will be a good brand of baseball. We’re going to play the game the right way.”

Tremie debuted as a catcher for the Chicago White Sox in 1995. He later played for the Texas Rangers, Pittsburgh Pirates and Houston Astros across a total of 22 Major League Baseball games. Tremie retired in 2005 as a member of the Round Rock Express, the Astros’ Triple-A affiliate at the time, and began his managing career in 2006 with the Cleveland organization. His time with Cleveland included two years of managing Double-A Akron and six years leading Triple-A Columbus.

The Houston native attended the University of Houston, where he helped lead the Cougars to two 40-win seasons before being drafted by the White Sox in the 39th round of the 1992 MLB Draft. As a minor leaguer in the White Sox organization, Tremie played with NBA legend Michael Jordan on the Double-A Birmingham Barons as Jordan attempted to play professional baseball.

Hitting Coach Eric Del Prado

Eric Del Prado returns for his second season as hitting coach in San Antonio. He previously worked as a hitting coach at the Arizona Complex League (ACL) in 2023 before taking on the hitting coach role with Single-A Lake Elsinore during the 2024 season.

A native of El Segundo, California, Del Prado attended Willamette University and coached for four years at Lewis & Clark College in Oregon.

Pitching Coach Erick Abreu

Erick Abreu, a native of Santo Domingo, Dominican Republic, pitched for nine years in the minor leagues with the New York Yankees and Houston Astros, even making a stop with the Texas League’s Corpus Christi Hooks. Abreu then became a pitching coach in the Astros’ system for nine seasons, spending time in six different levels.

Over the last two seasons, Abreu served as the major league bullpen coach for the Atlanta Braves.

Bench Coach Brian Burres

Brian Burres brings recent leadership acumen from within the Padres organization, working as the manager for Single-A Lake Elsinore in 2025, as a pitching coach at the Arizona Complex League in 2024 and as an assistant coach with High-A Fort Wayne in 2023.

Burres also boasts the most extensive major league playing career on the staff, pitching in over 100 games for the Baltimore Orioles, Toronto Blue Jays and Pittsburgh Pirates across six big-league seasons.

Strength Coach Chandler Craig

Chandler Craig continues for a second season with the Missions after two seasons as strength and conditioning coach with High-A Fort Wayne. This will be his fourth season in the Padres organization.

Craig previously spent two seasons with the Red Sox organization, including time with Single-A Salem. Craig is a native of Lubbock, Texas and graduated from Texas Tech University.

Athletic Trainer Juan Peña

Juan Peña embarks on his second season with the Missions and second with the Padres organization. In 2024, Peña won one of only 14 Minor League Baseball Athletic Trainer of the Year awards for his work with Single-A Lake Elsinore.

Peña worked in the Detroit Tigers organization from 2018-2023, with most of his time spent at the Florida Complex League. He is from Lakeland, Florida, and graduated from East Central University.
