FIRST HALF CHAMPS!: With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North’s first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals’ 2018 win.

THE NEW GUYS: With huge roster turnover leading to bullpen struggles, the FredNats got a much needed lift from last week’s roster additions. Zach Konstantinovsky, Tyler Papenbrock, Tony Neubeck and Cooper Carlgren all made their Single-A debuts last week, combining for 9.1 scoreless innings against Delmarva. The four struck out nine hitters, allowed just five hits, and collected a win (Konstantinovsky) and save (Papenbrock). Neubeck and Konstantinovsky combined for another four scoreless innings in the series opener with Wilson Tuesday.

RECORD WATCH: The 2026 FredNats have the chance for another record, aiming for the most wins in FredNat history. Twice winners of 70 games, the FredNats have tied the 75-win 2022 squad for most victories in the regular season. In addition, with a winning season secured, the FredNats have now been over .500 every year since 2022.

PITCHERS ON PITCHERS: This season has seen unprecedented turnaround amongst the FredNat pitching staff. In total, 10 pitchers have been released since July 11, and the FredNats have now rostered 60 pitchers this season.

POWER RECORDS: Already far past the franchise’s home run record as a team, six players with 10+ home runs are the most in franchise history (since 1978). The FredNats 158 homers is second in Single-A, and marks the most in the Carolina League since the 2005 Winston-Salem WarHogs blasted 178 home runs.

SHUTOUTS: FredNats pitching dominated for most of the Delmarva series, shutting out the Shorebirds in three of the FredNats’ four wins. The three shutouts were the most in a single series by the FredNats since 2024, when the club blanked the Shorebirds in three straight games in April. Pitching their 12th shutout of the year on Sunday, the FredNats are now tied with Hickory for the Single-A lead.

DELMARVA DOMINANCE: With Sunday’s win, the FredNats picked up their 19th victory over Delmarva this season, breaking the FredNat record for most wins over a single opponent in one year.

HOME STRETCH: Five games now remain in the regular season for the FredNats as they look to defend their second-half title from last year. The FredNats are guaranteed to host game two and three (if necessary) of both the division and league championship series.

ABOUT WILSON: Single-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, the Warbirds are in their first season in their new home of Wilson, North Carolina. Relocated from Zebulon, NC in the offseason, the Warbirds play in the brand new Wilson Ballpark. Previously owned and operated by the Milwaukee Brewers, Wilson was sold to the family of Brewers minority owner John A. Canning, Jr. this offseason.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON: Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half the following Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes’ 45-20 first half to break the franchise record.

ANOTHER RECORD FALLS: The FredNats broke another record earlier this year, as the fastest team in franchise history to 50 wins. The previous record (as far back as game-by-game data exists to 2004), was set by 2013 Potomac, who needed 80 games. The record since relocation belonged to the 2024 team, who needed 85 games.

ABOUT LAST YEAR: The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division’s second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats’ season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK: Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons, and are playoff bound again in 2026 after the team’s first-half division title.

Chris O'Neill - MANAGER

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.



Luke Dziados - PITCHING COACH

Dziados (D-Zay-Dis), 27, comes to the Nationals organization after spending the last two years as a pitching trainer at Driveline Baseball in Tampa, Fla. He capped his college pitching career at Villanova University in 2023 after pitching at Binghamton University from 2018-20. Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.

Scheiner, 30, played seven seasons (2017-23) in the Phillies and Mariners organizations. A native of San Mateo, Calif., Scheiner was drafted in the fourth round of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft by the Phillies out of the University of Houston.

1st Season | Previously: Player Development Assistant, California State University, Northridge

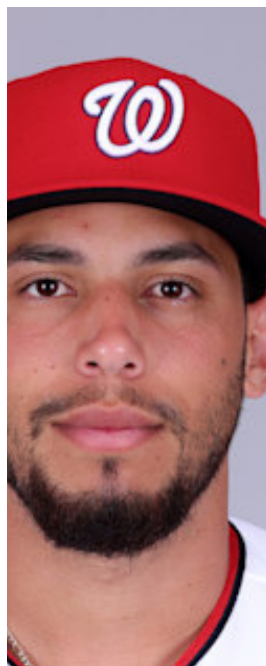

FredNats Career:

Yohandy Morales, drafted by Washington in the 2nd round of the 2023 MLB draft from the University of Miami, started his professional career with Fredericksburg right after the draft. The former Hurricane absolutely dominated, hitting .390 with 10 2B and 2 3B in just 18 games. Morales was quickly called up to High-A Wilmington in 2023, before ending the season in Double-A Harrisburg.

Current Success:

Since getting drafted, Morales has continued to impress at the plate. Over the last two seasons, he played 199 games with Triple-A Rochester. Yoyo hit .268 with an .808 OPS in his Red Wings career. This season, Morales has hit 25 home runs which is good for second on the team. With the 24-year-olds recent success, he earned his first call up to the Major Leagues as the rosters expanded on September 1.

- Began college career at Wingate, winning a D2 national championship in 2021. Spent 2022 and 2023 seasons as a teammate of former FredNat and Nationals no. 6 prospect Seaver King.
- Carried a sub-three ERA in first two seasons at Wingate, transferring after his junior year to Louisiana Tech, where he led the staff in strikeouts and was a CUSA First Team All Conference selection.
- Signed at slot for St. Louis for \$150k as a senior signee, debuting with Single-A Palm Beach with a 5.91 ERA in 2025. Began the year with High-A Peoria, allowing 9 ER in 8.0 IP, with an 9/11 B/K ratio before release.
- Made 10 relief appearances in his complex debut for the FCL Nationals, finishing four games and collecting two saves with a 3.00 ERA.
