BROCK GETS THE ROCK: Patriots starter Brock Selvidge enters today having won four of his last five starts. In those four winning decisions (excluding 5/16 vs. POR), Selvidge holds a 2.25 ERA (6 ER / 24.0 IP) with 26 K, 10 BB and 13 H allowed.

MARTIAN MASH: Jasson Dominguez enters today on the 10th game of his MLB rehab assignment (Tommy John Surgery recovery) and his sixth with Double-A Somerset. Upon joining the Patriots, Dominguez started the first two games by going 0-for-8. Since then, over his last four games, Dominguez is 6-for-14 (.429 BA) with 1 HR, 3 RBI and 2 R. Over the Patriots' last two games, Dominguez has driven in their last three runs, including a game-winning two-run homer in the top of the seventh inning of a 5-3 win on Saturday. The home run signaled Dominguez's first homer for the Patriots since August 18, 2023 @REA. It was also Dominguez's first home run of any kind since September 8 vs. MIL with the Yankees.

HEAVY HITTERS: This week's series features a matchup between the two teams that lead the Eastern League in home runs (Bowie-45, Somerset-44). Somerset's home run total stands atop the Eastern League leaders in spite of the Patriots only hitting nine home runs over their last two series (13 games). Over this same span, the Baysox have hit 13 home runs (12 games).

WHERE'S THE CATCH? Somerset's two primary catchers, Agustin Ramirez (12 HR, 86 TB) and Ben Rice (11 HR, 75 TB) have combined for 23 home runs and 161 total bases this season, with Ramirez leading the league in both categories. Their 23 HR make up for 52.3% of Somerset's as a whole.

AGUSTIN IS AWESOME: Following back-to-back multi-RBI performances on Friday and Saturday, Ramirez now leads the league with 12 HR, 86 TB, 35 R and 34 RBI. His .577 SLG and .962 OPS both rank 2nd in the league. Additionally, Ramirez's 11 stolen bases are two shy off a season-long career-high mark, tying for the most on the Patriots (Spencer Jones) and tied for the third-most in the Eastern League.

RICE, RICE BABY: During the road trip in New Hampshire, from Wednesday into Thursday, Ben Rice had a stretch of three straight at-bats with a home run and seven straight plate appearances having reached base. Rice reached base safely in 6/7 games during the series, going 6-for-20 (.300 BA) with 7 RBI, 6 R, 3 HR, 2B, 5 BB, HBP and 2 SB (.461 OBP).

BIG THREE: During the road trip in New Hampshire, Ben Cowles, Agustin Ramirez and Ben Rice combined to go 18-for-66 (.272 BA) with 17 RBI, 19 R, 4 HR and 12 BB (.385 OBP).

BAYSOX BANTER

The Bowie Baysox enter this week's series in Somerset at an even 22-22 record on the season, sitting 4th in the Southwest by 4.5 games. Following a series win (4-2) over the Northeast Division's 1st place Binghamton Rumble Ponies from 5/14-19, the Baysox have since lost six of their last seven games, including a series loss vs. fifth place Richmond last week.

Two seasons after the Orioles' graduated catcher Adley Rutschman to the big league club, the Baysox roster is led by the organization's now-top catching prospect and No. 2 overall prospect (behind Jackson Holliday) per MLB Pipeline, Samuel Basallo.

Overall, the Baysox roster features nine of the Orioles' top-30 MLB Pipeline prospects: Basallo (No. 2), OF Dylan Beavers (No. 7), RHS Seth Johnson (No. 10), OF Jud Fabian (No. 12), INF Max Wagner (No. 14), RHS Trace Bright (No. 16), OF John Rhodes (No. 23), RHS Alex Pham (No. 24) and INF Frederick Bencosme (No. 27). Bowie's starting rotation this week features 3/5 pitchers in the Orioles' top-30 list, while the team's traditional starting lineup includes six position players from the list. Entering this week, the Baysox are the only Eastern League team with more homers than the Patriots (45-44).

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

2024: Prior to the regular season, Selvidge started for the Yankees in their inaugural Spring Breakout game on 3/16 vs. TOR. He earned the win in the game, after going 4 IP, allowing 1 H and 1 BB with 8 K, en route to being named to MLB Pipeline's All-Spring Breakout First-Team.

2023: Began the season with Single-A Tampa, making 15 appearances (14 starts) and posting a 3.38 ERA with 91 K compared to 21 BB in 77.1 IP. On 7/18/23, he was assigned to High-A Hudson Valley. Selvidge ended the regular season with nine starts, going 4-1 with a 3.58 ERA and 46 K compared to 14 BB in 50.1 IP. In the postseason, Selvidge was the winning pitcher for Hudson Valley in the team's decisive third game of the South Atlantic League Division Series on 9/15/23. Selvidge started the game with 6.2 IP, allowing 2 ER on 5 H with 7 K in what was the Renegades' final win of the 2023 season. Following the season, Selvidge was named a 2023 Florida State League Postseason All-Star, as well as a 2023 MiLB.com Yankees Organization All-Star.

2022: Spent all of his 2022 season with the FCL Yankees, appearing in 11 games (nine starts), going 3-1 with a 2.95 ERA in the regular season. His 53 strikeouts were tied for fifth in the FCL regular season. Selvidge helped the Yankees to win the 2022 FCL Championship, including a post-season start vs. the FCL Rays on 8/26/22 in which Selvidge began the game with three hitless innings.

2021: Made his pro debut across three appearances (two starts) in September for the FCL Yankees, going 3.2 total innings and allowing 1 ER with 4 K and 2 H.

Personal Notes: Full name is Joshua Brock Selvidge. Attended Hamilton High School (Chandler, AZ), the same school as 2019 NL MVP Cody Bellinger. As a senior at Hamilton, he went 5-2 with a 2.41 ERA in 11 appearances as a pitcher, while also hitting .304 with 17 R, 6 HR and 21 RBI in 23 games as a batter. During his junior year at Hamilton, Selvidge was named the 2020 Arizona High School Baseball Player of the Year. Coming out of high school, he was ranked by Perfect Game as the top pitcher in Arizona and the No. 2 overall prospect in the state. He had committed to play college baseball at LSU prior to being drafted by the Yankees. An only child, Selvidge was born in Carrolton, TX, spent his youth in Castle Rock, CO and went to high school in Chandler, AZ.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2021 MLB Draft.

2023: Began the season with 15 games playing for High-A Hudson Valley. Placed on the 7-day IL on 5/6 with a lower back injury. Following a 10-game rehab assignment in Single-A Tampa, Rice was assigned to Somerset on 7/18. In 25 combined games prior to his promotion, Rice was slashing 341/.559/.523 with 2 HR, 10 RBI, 15 R, 18 BB, 10 BB and a 1.082 OPS. During his first week at Double-A, Rice played in four games, collecting multiple hits in all four, going 10-for-20 with 10 RBI, 6 R and 3 HR. Making his Double-A debut in Hartford, during his third game for Somerset on 7/22, he collected a career-high 4 H in his first career 2 HR game, while adding 4 RBI. During 8/8-13 vs. BNG, Rice was awarded his first career Player of the Week honors for going 12-for-23 with 9 RBI, 7 R, 2 HR, 4 2B, 2 BB, HBP and 2 SB.

2021-22: Over his first two minor league seasons in 2021-22, Rice combined to play 90 games between the FCL Yankees and Single-Tampa, where he hit .250 with 12 home runs in 326 plate appearances.
College: Attending Dartmouth from 2019-21, Rice played in only 29 college games. Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, most of his 2020 season and all of his 2021 college baseball seasons were canceled by the Ivy League. During his summers of 2019-2020, Rice played for the Worcester Bravehearts of the Futures Collegiate Baseball League alongside top draft prospects who were bound for the Cape Cod League in 2020 when there was no CCBL season. It wasn't until he was named the FCBL MVP in 2020, that Rice started garnering interest from MLB scouts. In anticipation of his 2021 season being canceled, Rice teamed up with his Ivy League peers to organize showcase scrimmages and workouts at local sandlot fields during the spring, inviting scouts to watch them. This is where Yankees northeast area scout Matt Hyde learned of Rice, calling these games "the Ben Rice showcases." Rice played 13 games for the Cape Cod League's Cotuit Kettleers in 2021 before being drafted by the Yankees. He wound up playing in 75 summer college games, compared to 29 Ivy League games.

Personal Notes: Growing up, Rice says his "best sport by far" was hockey until late in high school. His freshman year at Noble & Greenough School he didn't make the varsity baseball team, but he did make the varsity hockey team. He played hockey all four years, including his senior year when he scored eight goals in 27 games. Despite growing up just south of Boston, Rice was a big fan of Derek Jeter and as a result, was a Yankees fan until late in his youth. As a kid going to games at Fenway Park, Rice wrote "Yankees rule!" on the Pesky Pole in right field. By the time Jeter retired, Rice had become a Red Sox fan. Ben's older brother, Sam, was a distance swimmer at the University of Tennessee. His younger sister, Sarah is a senior swimmer at William & Mary. His father, Benjamin, pitched at Brown. His mother, Sophie was a figure skater, who now plays in a women's hockey league.
Career Notes: Selected in the 12th round of the 2021 MLB Draft by the Yankees.

2022: Began his second pro season with Single-A Tampa, playing in 55 games for the Tarpons and hitting .253/.350/.421 with 6 HR, 32 RBI and 28 R. He was promoted to High-A Hudson Valley alongside teammate Jasson Dominguez on 7/15/22, when he broke the news to Dominguez in a viral social media video on the Yankees' Player Development X account. Finishing the season with the Renegades, Richardson hit .208/.288/.477 over 35 games in which he collected 10 HR, 28 RBI and 19 R.
 2021: Made his professional debut across 27 games with the FCL Yankees, slashing .269/.376/.516 with 3 HR, 18 RBI and 24 R.

College: Played three years (2019-21) at the University of Indiana, alongside fellow Yankees farmhand Elijah Dunham for the 2019 and 2020 seasons. One of the unpaid volunteer hitting coaches at Indiana in 2019 was the Yankees' now assistant hitting coach, Casey Dykes. During his final college season in 2021, Richardson hit .320 with 33 RBI, 32 R and 7 HR en route to being named First-Team All-Big Ten.
Personal Notes: Attended Bishop Dwenger High School (IN) as a three-year letterwinner, then transferred to Fishers High School (IN) where he played his senior season. In 2018, he went 5-0 on the mound with a 2.75 ERA, striking out 78 batters in 43.1 innings, winning a state championship.
Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 17th round of the 2021 MLB Draft.

 2023: Spent the full 2023 season in Somerset, playing in 67 games and posting a .166/.333/.263 slash line with 5 HR, 27 RBI and 33 R. After catching for his entire professional career, Seigler transitioned to play second base by mid-season and went on to play 15 games at the position. He also appeared at left field in one game.

2022: Put together a career season in every offensive category, spending the majority of the year in High-A Hudson Valley (72 games), after starting out with Single-A Tampa (25). Across 97 total games, Seigler hit .236/.405/.369 with 7 HR, 45 RBI and 61 R.

2018-2021: Spent all of his 2021 season with High-A Hudson Valley, slashing .219/.324/.391 across 41 games. On 7/27/21 vs. Wilmington, he accomplished his first career two-home run game. Seigler was limited to 30 games in his second season (2019), all with Single-A Charleston, when he hit .175 with 10 R and 6 RBI, before his season was cut short in July due to a broken left patella. Split his first pro season (2018) evenly between the GCL Yankees West and Pulaski Yankees. In 24 total games, he slashed .266/.379/.342.

Personal Notes: Attended Cartersville High School (GA), where as a senior he was ranked by Baseball America as the No. 41 prospect in the 2018 MLB draft class. In addition to catching, Seigler was also an ambidextrous pitcher and posted a 1.09 ERA in 25.2 IP as a senior, with 29 K. Seigler graduated from Cartersville with Jacksonville Jaguars quarterback and 2021 No. 1 overall draft pick Trevor Lawrence, whom he played football with during elementary school. During high school, Seigler also played for USA Baseball's U18 National Team, winning the 2017 U18 World Cup. He was committed to play at the University of Auburn prior to signing with the Yankees. Seigler is of Navajo descent and would join Jacoby Ellsbury as the second Navajo to play in the Majors. Named after the late Tony Phillips, an 18-year Major League veteran infielder and friend of his father's. Growing up in Cartersville, GA, Seigler's favorite plater was Chipper Jones.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 1st round of the 2018 MLB Draft, making him the third catcher to be chosen by the Yankees in the first round of the MLB Draft (David Parrish, 28th overall and Thurman Munson, fourth overall).

2023: Began his professional career as a member of FCL Yankees. Wegner homered in his first two professional games on 7/29 and 7/30. After going 4-for-9 with 2 HR and 6 RBI over two games with the FCL Yankees, Wegner was promoted to Single-A Tampa on 8/2. He played three games with Tampa, going 3-for-12 with 2 RBI before being promoted to High-A Hudson Valley. Wegner rounded out his debut campaign with 19 games for the Renegades, over which he hit .254 with 2 HR and 6 RBI.

College: Wegner was a four-year starter at Creighton from 2019-22, before transferring to Arkansas for his fifth year of eligibility. As a freshman, he earned All-Big East 2nd Team honors, batting .264 with 20 RBI and 1 HR, which came in the form of a grand slam in his first collegiate game. As a senior, he slashed .343/.459/.635 with a team-leading 11 HR and 53 RBI, earning All-Big East 1st Team honors. Overall in his four seasons for Creighton, he posted a .306 average and 14 HR. Within 30 minutes of entering the NCAA transfer portal, he was contacted by Arkansas assistant coach Nate Thompson. During his fifth college season at Arkansas in 2023, Wegner played in 43 games, missing 18 games due to a fractured thumb, and hit .313 with an 1.130 OPS, 15 HR, and 51 RBI. In his lone season as a Razorback, Wegner's team won the 2023 SEC Championship in 2023, the school's fourth in program history, leading Arkansas to the No. 3 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. He hit home runs in his final two college games in the Fayetteville Regional of the NCAA Tournament and was named a midseason All-American by D1Baseball.

Personal Notes: Three-sport athlete at Kearney High School (Kearney, NE), Wegner was ranked the No. 13 overall prospect in the state of Nebraska by Prep Baseball Report. Prior to high school, he represented Nebraska (Kearney Little League) in the 2012 Little League World Series with his father, Brad, serving as the team's head coach. He went 3-for-4 with a homer and 5 RBI in the state's first ever LLWS win, coming over Germany. During his graduate year at Arkansas, Wegner earned the nickname "Pops" from his teammates.

Career Notes: Selected in the ninth round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$72,500 as a senior-sign.

2024: Returned to High-A Hudson Valley to start the 2024 season, where he played in five games and went 3-for-15 with 5 RBI. On 4/17, he was assigned to Double-A Somerset.

2023: Played a career-high 103 games for High-A Hudson Valley, batting .206 with 9 HR, 53 RBI, and a .590 OPS. He hit a walk-off home run in 12th inning vs. JS on 8/12 to finish the night with four hits and four RBI. By the end of the season, Vargas led all Yankees farmhands with six triples. During the season, he saw action at second base for the first time in his career, playing in nine games at the position.

2022: Entering the 2022 season ranked as MLB Pipeline's No. 17 Yankees prospect, Vargas spent his first full season with Single-A Tampa, hitting .203 in 100 games with a .583 OPS, 33 RBI, and 8 HR. He led the Tarpons in stolen bases (27) and runs (59).

2021: Ranked as the Yankees' No. 13 prospect by MLB Pipeline, Vargas spent all of 2021 season with FCL Yankees, playing in 42 games, hitting .273 with a .755 OPS, 3 HR, and 26 RBI. Vargas led the FCL in runs (37) and ranked fourth in stolen bases (17).

2019: Made professional debut for the Dominican Summer League Yankees on 6/1, where he played eight games and hit .289, ahead of a promotion to the Gulf Coast League on 6/24. Played in 40 games for the GCL Yankees-East, hitting .219 with 1 HR, 16 RBI and 14 BB to only 22 K. Vargas went a perfect 13-for-13 on the base paths in the GCL and he led the league with five triples. Vargas was promoted to Rookie-Advanced Pulaski for the 2019 Appalachian League Playoffs, appearing in one game: Game Three of the league's semifinals vs. the Burlington Royals, which was a 17-inning, five-hour, 19-minute game that the Royals won to send them to the league championship.

Career Notes: Vargas was expected to sign with the Reds as an international free agent, but Cincinnati was penalized for exceeding their bonus pool money the prior signing period leaving them unable to sign a prospect to a contract above \$300,000. The Yankees swooped in to ink Vargas for \$2.5M on 8/1/18, dishing out the third-highest bonus in the class. The Yankees acquired the extra international pool money they needed for Vargas, the 8th-ranked prospect in the class, by sending Caleb Frare to the White Sox, and both Giovanni Gallegos and Chasen Shreve to the Cardinals. Vargas played for Matanzas in Cuba's 15th national league in 2016, batting .296/.395/.449 with 14 walks and eight strikeouts in 116 plate appearances. In 2017, he jumped to the 18U league as a 15-year-old. Vargas was part of the first signing class which allowed Cuban players to be signed by MLB teams without having to defect.
