### RIDERS BATS FALTER IN LOSS TO ARKANSAS:

The Frisco RoughRiders traded runs in the first inning with the Arkansas Travelers on Saturday but didn't score in the remainder of a 3-1 loss at Riders Field. Following Arkansas' (10-4) solo home run in the top of the first, Frisco (7-7) scraped back with a two-out RBI single by **Thomas Saggese**. The 1-1 tie held until the sixth inning. **Ryan Garcia** pitched four innings in his home debut at Riders Field with two hits and just the solo homer. **Theo McDowell** (0-1) tossed a scoreless fifth inning but surrendered a pair of bloop singles in the sixth that led to the go-ahead run. Arkansas' A.J. Puckett (2-0) pitched in the fifth and sixth innings for the win. Juan Then pitched a clean ninth inning for the save. Frisco now trails the series three games to two, while scoring one run in each of the last two games. This followed a 13-run outburst in Thursday's victory. Frisco right-hander **Marc Church** helped keep Saturday's contest close, entering in the seventh inning and striking out the first four batters he faced. He allowed one run before striking out a fifth batter and keeping the deficit at two runs. **Triston Polley** followed, taking down the Travelers in order in the ninth. Frisco is now .500 on the year but has a plus-28 run differential, tied for tops in the Texas League. The loss puts the RoughRiders in a four-team tie for first place in the five-team Texas League South Division.

### DEJA VU ALL OVER AGAIN:

RoughRiders infielder **Dio Arias** crunched two home runs on Wednesday for his second multi-home run game of his career. His first, also with Frisco, took place 363 days earlier on April 21st, 2022 against Northwest Arkansas. On Thursday, Arias hit another long ball. Over his last five games, he is hitting .333 (7-for-21)/.391/.857 with two doubles, three home runs and five RBIs.

### THIS PEN IS NO BULL...:

To start this season, the RoughRiders bullpen had been brilliant, but they have faltered against a strong Arkansas offense. Through nine games, the Riders allowed zero home runs and owned a 1.76 ERA, which was second-best in Minor League Baseball. In the first four games of this series, the Riders pen owns a 5.14 ERA. On the season, two different Frisco relievers have thrown at least four times without allowing a run (**Grant Wolfram**, **Triston Polley**). Overall, the RoughRiders have a team ERA of 3.32 which is the third-best in the Texas League (Tulsa and Northwest Arkansas are tied for first with a 3.27 ERA).

### LOAD UM UP:

The RoughRiders have had a league-high 19 at-bats with the bases loaded this season. As a team, they are hitting .368 (7-for-19)/.348/.947/1.295 with three grand slams and 22 RBIs. They are one of just two teams in Minor League Baseball with at least three grand slams this season already (Triple-A Round Rock) as **Trevor Hauver** hit one on Opening Day, **Dustin Harris** added another on Sunday in San Antonio and **Luisangel Acuña** blasted one on Thursday.

### DEFENSE WINS CHAMPIONSHIPS:

The RoughRiders have just committed six errors through 14 games and committed their first position player error on Sunday in San Antonio. The team's .988 fielding percentage is fifth in Minor League Baseball (Memphis leads at .991).

### WALK THIS WAY:

The Riders hitters worked 40 walks in the six games against the San Antonio Missions, which was the sixth-most in the minors last week. On the season, Frisco's 75 walks lead the Texas League while their .354 team OBP is third in the Texas League. **Evan Carter** is second in the Texas League with 13 walks and is second in OBP (.525).

### I LIKE BIG WINS AND I CANNOT LIE:

The RoughRiders seven wins this season have come by eight, six, seven, seven, 10, four runs and eight runs, respectively, while their seven losses have come by a combined 22 runs. That gives Frisco a +28 run differential through 14 games, which is tied for the best in the Texas League despite being tied with Amarillo, Midland and San Antonio for first in the South Division, all of which have negative run differentials. The only team with a +20 run differential in the league is Tulsa, which is 9-5 (+28). The RoughRiders have scored at least seven runs seven times (7-0) and scored three or fewer runs seven times (0-7).

### EVAN ALMIGHTY:

Outfielder **Evan Carter** has reached safely in 11 of his 12 games this season, batting .378 (17-for-45)/.525/.600/1.125 with a double, three home runs, 13 walks, 15 RBIs and three stolen bases. Carter is fifth in the Texas League in average (.378), sixth in hits (17), tied for sixth in home runs (3), tied for second in RBIs (15), second in walks (13) and sixth in OPS (1.125). On Wednesday in San Antonio, Carter crushed a three-run home run and a solo homer for his second two-home run game of his Minor League career before adding another home run on Sunday. The No. 1 prospect in the Rangers system won a MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove in 2022. The reigning Tom Greve Rangers Minor League Player of the Year, Carter joined the RoughRiders for the last week of the 2022 season and the playoffs. Carter is also the second-youngest player in the Texas League this season, trailing on 19-year-old Devonson De Los Santos of Amarillo.

### ABOUT JACK

-Leiter was drafted in the first round (No. 2 overall) in 2021 by the Rangers out of Vanderbilt University. With the Commodores, Leiter was a unanimous First Team All-American and a finalist for both the Golden Spikes Award and the Dick Howser Trophy.

-Threw first regular-season, complete-game no-hitter to start SEC play since 1971 against No.16 South Carolina on March 20th, 2021. He walked the first batter of the game before retiring the last 27 he saw with 16 strikeouts on 124 pitches. Followed up that no-hitter with 7.0 no-hit innings in his next start (20.2 consecutive no-hit innings over three starts from March 20th - April 2nd).

-Drafted in 20th round in 2019 by NYY out of Delbarton School (NJ). Named 2019 New Jersey Gatorade POY, striking out 95 in 57 innings as a senior.

-The family lineage is strong with Jack. His father, Al, pitched in 19 MLB seasons (1987-2005), making two All-Star teams and winning both the 1993 and 1997 World Series. His uncle, Mark, played 11 seasons in the majors (1990-99; 2001) and his cousin, Mark Jr., pitched two seasons (2017-2018) with Philadelphia and Toronto. Al now works as an analyst for MLB Network.

### 2023 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2023 season as the No. 78 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No. 5 prospect in the Rangers system.

### 2022 SEASON

-Leiter entered the 2022 season as the No. 17 prospect in baseball according to MLB.com and the No.1 prospect in the Rangers system.

-Leiter dazzled in his professional debut, striking out seven over his three innings against the Arkansas Travelers on April 9th. The righty helped draw the largest crowd since 2019 at Riders Field for the debut (9,322).

-Threw the Riders first quality start of the season on May 7th against Arkansas. Leiter retired the last 15 batters he saw, allowing just two hits (one in the first and one in the second inning).

-Leiter came out of the bullpen as a "start" to finish a suspended game on May 31st (game was finished on June 1st) and recorded a career-best eight strikeouts against Wichita over 5.2 innings. The game resulted in a 3-0 win for Frisco, the Riders second shutout win of the season to that point.

-The righty allowed just one home run over his first nine outings before allowing two against Amarillo on June 7th. The two home runs were a grand slam and a two-run shot in a 7-4 loss to the Sod Poodles.

-Leiter was placed on the Development List on June 28th and was activated on July 10th before his start against San Antonio.

-Pitched a 1-2-3 inning on nine pitches in The SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game from Dodger Stadium on July 16th.

### 2021 SEASON

-After being drafted second overall in the 2021 draft, Leiter did not pitch in the minor leagues. Instead, he returned to Vanderbilt to workout, continue college and prepare for 2022. Did not finish degree, but got closer.

### MORE INFO

-Leiter was high school teammates with Yankees No. 1 prospect (No. 8 in baseball) Anthony Volpe at Delbarton School (NJ).
