End of Regular Season

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, looking to extend his personal winning streak to 6G (started year with 8G losing streak). The Saints will counter with RHP **Trent Baker**. Columbus is 58-41 (.586) versus right handers this year. Baker has pitched against the Clippers six times in his career, going 1-0 with a 1.98ERA (13.2IP, 11H, 3R, 3ER, 1BB, 22K).

vs. the Saints

Columbus is 4-4 against the Saints in Ohio this year, producing a 9-11 series record, and has won 55 of the last 91 overall opposing the Saints (499-401 run differential; 16 of 36 losses by a single run, only 12 losses by more than two runs). Individually, **Kody Huff** has hit .301 (28x93) with 5HR and 18RBI in 28G against St. Paul in his career (**Kahlil Watson** has 6HR and 20RBI in 22G).

Buckle Up

The first 18G between Columbus and St. Paul saw an average of 12.1 runs on 4.1 homers, but 2G this week have seen six runs and not a single homer (first consecutive home games with 0HR since 6/30-7/1 vs. Louisville). The Clippers are using the longball to score 51% of their runs against the Saints this year (34HR, accounts for 59 of 115) and St. Paul owes 58% to the bomb (39HR, 63 of 108 runs).

Back in Business

Following Tuesday's shutout (first since 4/11 at Worcester, snapped IL-long 127G streak allowing a run), the pitching staff allowed only 3ER last night to drop the season ERA to 5.31 (first time under franchise worst of 5.32, set in 2023, since 7/18; have spent 30G below 5.32 this year). Assuming 9-inning games the rest of the way, as long as the Clippers allow fewer than 23ER, they will finish under 5.32.

Rehab Situation

Colin Holderman has joined the Clippers on rehab today (sore right wrist, out since 9/4). He was 2-0 with a 7.45ERA (9.2IP, 8ER) in 6G with the Clippers earlier this season (3/31-4/25), but excelled with Cleveland, going 6-4 with a 2.73ERA (52.2IP, 16ER) in 54G. **Shawn Armstrong** is also on rehab with the Clippers (left calf strain, 8/3), having pitched with Columbus for the first time since 2017.

Always On

Cooper Ingle has lost 38 points on his average over his last 20G (.200, 22x110) and 83 points from his slugging, with only 8XBH (6XBH in last 9G), but his OBP has dipped only 18 points (31BB in 141PA) and he still leads the IL in OPS by 21 points (.941). Ingle has not been kept off the bases in consecutive games this year, but saw his 14G on base streak snapped last night (.394OBP, 8/27-9/15).

Power and Speed

Milan Tolentino swiped a pair of bases on Tuesday (20SB on the year), securing the second 20-20 season in franchise history (21HR). He scored the first such season last year (21HR, 20SB) and, since the start of 2025, he is tied for 2nd in the IL with 42HR and 25th with 40SB (only 40-40 guy). **Kahlil Watson** is sitting at 19HR (career high) and 23SB, looking to become the fourth to reach 20-20 in the IL.

King Ralph

Dating to 7/28, **Ralpy Velazquez** leads the IL in HR (18, +4), RBI (43, +6) and SLG (.778, +106) and, aside from going 0x21 at St. Paul (7/21-7/26), is hitting .327/.410/.659 since 6/18 (21HR, 57RBI). Those leads held up despite Velazquez missing 7G with a lower body injury (9/8-9/15) and a relative power slump (2HR in 50AB since 3HR game on 8/22 vs. St. Paul; 9BB in last 39PA, 9BB in prior 122PA).

Capitalizing

George Valera has played sparingly since 7/28, appearing in only 19 of 42G, but he has slashed .389/.476/.806 with 7HR and 17RBI when he does take the field (hit .148/.250/.182 with 0HR and 7RBI in 26G prior, 6/10-7/26). The hot streak includes hits in 17 of 19G and, dating to a game prior, he has reached base in 20 straight (.466OBP). In his Clipper career, he has hammered 50HR (t-16th all time).

Twenty Town

Kody Huff crushed his 22nd homer on Sunday (.343, 24x70, 3HR, .586SLG since 8/23), four more than the prior four years combined. **Cooper Ingle** poked his 20th on Friday, as Columbus has four players with at least 20 and one more with 19 (**Kahlil Watson** hit 19th last Sunday), marking the second time in history (2019) the Clippers have five players with at least 19HR (never had five with at least 20HR).

This Date in Clipper History

9/17/2010

Jason Kipnis hit for the cycle, while **Jerad Head** was 4x4 and **Josh Rodriguez** tallied 4RBI in a Governors' Cup clinching beatdown of the Durham Bulls, 13-2 (outscored Durham 37-10 in the series). On the mound, **Paolo Espino** picked up the win, tossing a quality start to his cousin, **Damaso**. Espino would win the clinching game of the 2011 GC Finals 364 days later, in a much tighter game at Lehigh Valley (4-1).

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,496 to 1,450).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 197-154 (.561) in pitch reviews, with batters going 99-90 (.524) and pitchers/catchers going 98-64 (.605). They have run out of challenges in 49G and have not challenged in 8G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .570), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 833, would rank as 4th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 171 through 143G (on pace for 176SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 52CS so far, the Clippers have the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (2024; on pace for 53CS).

Crazy Eighthths

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 192 runs while crafting a .871OPS (over 60 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 131 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +61 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 320-210 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 81 grand slams and 2,005RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.31 through 143G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). Additionally, the staff is pacing to give up 194HR (would be 4th most in franchise history; 214HR allowed in 2023).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 6th in the IL this year (.981), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 79G this season (45-34, .570), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the 11th most last at bat wins this year (15, six off the lead) while playing in the 14th most games decided in the last at bat (29, Norfolk has 42). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 103G decided in the last at bat (3rd most in the IL), going 49-54 (.476, 17th best winning percentage; 6th most wins, 3rd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's seventh year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 462-473 (.494), 432-427 with Columbus (.503).

June Swoon:

In his first 10G of the year (March-May), Maltud gave up 15ER in 50.2IP (2.66ERA), holding the opposition to a .195 average (38x186, 4HR). He gave up multiple runs in each of 5G in June (17.1IP, 15ER) and struggled in July also (22.0IP, 12ER), as he posted a 6.18ERA (39.1IP, 27ER) over the two months. Opposing hitters batted .294 (48x163) with 10HR in 10G from June-July (9HR to last 107BF). Since the calendar has flipped to August, Maltud has regained his early season form, turning in a 2.78ERA (35.2IP, 11ER) through 7G (2HR against 149BF).

Undecided:

Through the month of June, Maltud was the only pitcher in the IL with at least 10GS that had not taken a loss and his lone win (4/11 at Worcester) made him the only starter with a single decision. He is 7-1 in 12G since the start of July, winning back to back starts to begin the month and suffering his only loss of the year in his 17th start (7/22 at St. Paul). Despite a 3.77ERA as a starter and run support of 5.9 per game, Maltud has left with the lead only 12 times because the offense is averaging 2.8 runs while he is the pitcher of record, including 12G with two runs or fewer (5G with zero runs).

Efficiency is Key:

Through 131 innings started in 27G, Maltud has retired the side with fewer than 10 pitches on 17 occasions, including 4-pitch innings on 4/3 vs. Indianapolis and 8/28 at Indy, while turning in 26 innings of more than 20. He has hit 30+ four times, thanks to an 11-pitch battle vs. Iowa's **Pedro Ramirez** on 4/17 (walk, 34 in the inning) and a 14-pitch skirmish with Buffalo's **Yohendrick Pinango** on 4/23 (groundout, 30 total). He ranks 4th in the IL with 15.6 pitches per inning.

Among the Leader Beans:

Entering today's game, Maltud is 2nd in the IL with a 3.80ERA (12 qualifiers, dropped out of the top five after allowing 7ER in 3.2IP at St. Paul on 7/22). From his quality start win on 4/11 at Worcester through his quality start on 5/25 at Toledo, he crafted the 2nd best ERA in the IL, at 2.14ERA (42.0IP, 10ER). Additionally, Maltud's 0.95WHIP in that time ranked 2nd best (1.23WHIP on the season places 4th).

Stepping Up:

With runners in scoring position this season, Maltud has held the opposition to a line of .157/.262/.206, surrendering just 1HR in 102AB. With a runner at first base, he has struggled to a line of .292/.357/.517 while allowing 4HR (89AB) and with the bases empty, the bad guys have hit .234/.300/.385 with 11HR in 286AB.

In Relief:

Maltud has pitched five times in relief this season (previous 5G out of the bullpen came among first 7G as a pro), piggybacking **Trenton Denholm** on 4/30 vs. Toledo (3.0IP, 40 pitches), **Daniel Espino** on 6/2 vs. Omaha (4.0IP, 81 pitches), **Austin Peterson** on 8/9 at Syracuse (3.1IP, 47 pitches) and **Justin Campbell** twice, on 8/28 at Indianapolis (5.1IP, 80 pitches) and 9/10 at Louisville (5.0IP, 84 pitches). He owns a 3.92ERA out of the bullpen (20.2IP, 20H, 9R, 9ER, 7BB, 25K).
