Buffalo Bisons RHP Max Scherzer (0-0, 4.15) vs. Worcester Red Sox RHP Tanner Houck (NR) then...
RHP Isaac Coffey (1-0, 2.16)

Marquee Matchup – The Worcester Red Sox – winners of 8 straight home games and winners of 11 of their last 14 games overall – send rehabbing Boston Red Sox RHP Tanner Houck to the mound to face rehabbing Toronto Blue Jays RHP Max Scherzer in a Minor League pitching matchup for the ages tonight at Polar Park when the Worcester Red Sox host the Buffalo Bisons (AAA-Toronto) at 6:45 pm in game two of their 6-game series. Houck, a 2024 American League All-Star, is expected to throw approximately 35 pitches, while Scherzer, an eight-time Major League All-Star, will go approximately 5 or 6 innings. Tonight's game is live on NESN+ and can be heard on NASH 98.9 FM, The Pike 100.1 FM, and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

Mad Max vs. the Houckster at Polar Park – Not sure Tanner has ever been called the Houckster, but we needed to nickname him to combat the Mad Max moniker for the incomparable **Max Scherzer**. Boston Red Sox RHP **Tanner Houck** will start for the WooSox in his first outing on rehab (right flexor pronator strain) while Scherzer will be making his second rehab start for Buffalo since being placed on Toronto's injured list on March 30 with right thumb inflammation. In our humble opinion, Scherzer becomes the third future Hall of Famer to play at Polar Park following former Boston Red Sox LHP Chris Sale, who rehabbed with the WooSox here at Polar Park in 2021 & 2022, and former Cincinnati 1B Joey Votto who rehabbed at Polar Park with Buffalo in 2024.

The 40-year-old Scherzer is an 18-year Major League veteran, a three-time Cy Young Award winner, a two-time World Series Champion, and an eight-time All-Star. He has a career record of 216-112 with a 3.16 ERA in 467 big league games (458 starts) with 3,408 strikeouts in 2,881 innings pitched for seven teams...Arizona (2008-09), Detroit (2010-14), Washington (2015-21), the Dodgers (2021), the Mets (2022-23), Texas (2023-24), and Toronto (2025).

Max has been on Toronto's injured list since March 30 with right thumb inflammation. He made a rehab start for Buffalo on Friday night vs. Columbus and gave up 2 runs in 4.1 innings. Scherzer made his Blue Jays' season debut on March 29 vs. Baltimore - 3.0 IP, 3 H, 2R/ER, 0 BB, 1 SO – but suffered the injury and was placed on the 15-day injured list on March 30 with right thumb inflammation. He was transferred from the 15-day IL to the 60-day IL on May 5.

Max is one of six pitchers to win the Cy Young Award in both the American and National Leagues...with Detroit in 2013 and Washington in 2016 & 2017. He won the World Series in 2019 with the Nationals and in 2023 with the Texas Rangers. He is an eight-time All-Star selection...2013-2019, 2021.

Houck, 28, starts tonight as he comes back from a right flexor pronator strain that put him on the injured list on May 13. He is scheduled to throw approximately 35 pitches. Tanner last pitched for Boston on May 12 at Detroit and was charged with 11 runs in 2.1 innings. He went on the IL the next day. In 9 starts for the Red Sox this season he is 0-3 with an 8.04 ERA – 43.2 IP, 57 H, 41 R, 39 ER, 17 BB, 32 SO. Houck was an American League All-Star last season when he went 9-10 with a 3.12 ERA in 30 starts – 178.2 IP, 156 H, 75 R, 62 ER, 48 BB, 154 SO. His 3.12 ERA was 7th best in the American League and 12th best in MLB and he allowed just 0.55 HR/9 IP which was best in the AL and 4th best in MLB. Selected by Boston in the 1st round (#24) overall of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Missouri, Houck has compiled a 24-32 mark with a 3.97 ERA in 113 big league games (80 starts) with the Red Sox. He made 6 starts for Worcester in 2021 including one almost exactly four years ago tonight (June 17, 2021) when he fired 3 hitless innings with 6 strikeouts vs. Lehigh Valley at Polar Park. Tanner also made 3 rehab starts for the WooSox in 2023.

Elite Eight – The WooSox have won a Worcester club-record 8 straight at home dating back to their last Polar Park loss on May 24 in Game 2 of a doubleheader to Durham, 7-3. Since then at home, they beat Durham in that series finale on May 25, swept a 6-game series vs. Rochester from June 3-8, and took the opener of this current 6-game set over Buffalo last night. The Pawtucket Red Sox record for longest home winning streak was 10 games during the 2017 when the PawSox won 10 straight at McCoy Stadium in Pawtucket, RI from May 24 – June 9. That the longest home winning streak for a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate in more than 50 years.

This Series - The WooSox got the jump in this 6-game series last night with a 5-3 victory over Buffalo. Buffalo now is a league-worst 10-25 on the road this season. Richard Fitts made his third start with the WooSox after being optioned from Boston on June 4 and tossed 5 shutout innings to earn the win and even his record at 1-1. Isaiah Campbell got the last four outs to record his 6th save. SS Nick Sogard blasted a solo HR (#3) going 1-for-2 with 3 walks and 2 runs scored.

The Rest of The Series - The games this week from tonight through Friday will all be 6:45 pm starts as the WooSox transition to their traditional Polar Park summer weeknight game times while the weekend starts remain at 4:05 pm on Saturday and 1:05 pm on Sunday. This is Buffalo's first visit to Worcester this season – they will return for another 6-game set from August 5-10. These two clubs split a 6-game series in Western New York from May 13-18 in what was Worcester's only trip to Buffalo this year. Worcester is 4-4-4 in their first 12 series played this season...four wins, four losses, and four splits.

Nearing the Halfway Point - Sunday afternoon's series finale will put a wrap on the International League's first half of the schedule. Sunday will be Game #74 of the season for the WooSox (they had one game cancelled due to snow back on April 14 at home vs. Columbus). All 20 IL teams will start anew with a clean slate on Tuesday, June 24 when the second half and the final 75 games begin. This is the third year the International League has used the split season format. In 2023 the WooSox went 39-36 in the 1st half and 40-32 in the 2nd half to post a 79-68 overall record. And in 2024 the WooSox were 35-40 in the 1st half compared to 44-31 in the 2nd half for an overall record of 79-71.

A Strong Stretch Run – Worcester has won 11 of their last 14 games to clinch a winning 1st half record as the first half of the International League schedule will conclude this Sunday. Lehigh Valley's once comfortable 1st half lead has been cut to just 2-games over hard-charging Jacksonville with five games remaining for each team in the 1st half. The team with the best overall record in the 20-team IL is declared the 1st half champion and earns the right to host a best 2 out of 3 playoff series vs. the second half winner from September 23-25. The IronPigs are 46-24 while the Jumbo Shrimp are 44-26 as it appears either a Pig or a Shrimp will clinch the first post-season spot this weekend.

Hot June – Worcester is off to a 11-3 start in June that began with their 9-game winning streak from June 1-11. The WooSox have out-scored their opponents, 90-58 this month. The Sox are batting .254 in June (118-for-464) with tremendous production including 31 doubles, 2 triples, 22 HR and 90 runs scored. Sox pitchers are 11-3 with a 3.70 ERA (52 ER in 126.1 IP) with 11 HRA and 58 runs allowed.

Sox Appeal

-OF **Jhostynxon Garcia** had his 8-game hitting streak snapped on June 7 but has hit in 18 of his first 23 games since joining the WooSox on May 20 going 28-for-92 (.304) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 6 HR, 14 RBI, and 16 runs scored.

-INF **Vaughn Grissom** is hitting .286 in his last 11 games (12-for-42) with 2 HR & 5 RBI.

-INF **Blaze Jordan** had his 8-game hitting streak stopped on June 12. Has still hit safely in 11 of his first 13 games with the WooSox since joining the club on June 3 going (17-for-54, .315) with 8 2B, 1 HR, 5 RBI, and 9 runs scored.

-INF/OF **Tyler McDonough** in his last 23 games is hitting .286 (24-for-84).

-INF **Nick Sogard** has reached base in 27 of his last 51 plate appearances with 16 hits & 12 walks. He has hit in 9 of his last 10 games (15-for-36, .417) with 1 2B, 3 HR, 5 RBI, and 9 runs scored.

-OF **Trayce Thompson** in his last 26 games is batting .280 (26-for-93) with 5 2B, 1 3B, 4 HR, 15 RBI, and 16 runs scored.

Rank and File – The WooSox rank in the Top 6 in a host of offensive categories among the 20 teams in the International League... 6th in **batting** (.259), 5th in **hits** (586), 5th in **runs** (364), 2nd in **walks** (313), 3rd in **2B** (129), 5th in **OBP** (.353), 4th in **OPS** (.782), and 4th in **LOB** (511). WooSox pitchers are 10th in the league in **ERA** (4.47). Buffalo is 13th in batting (.248) and 14th in ERA (5.03).

What Have You Done For Me Lately – The WooSox have won 11 of 14 and 13 of their last 18 overall. Worcester has also won a season and franchise-best 8 straight at home while also coming up winners in 10 of their last 11 games at Polar Park. Furthermore, the WooSox are 16-8 in their last 24 games and 20-11 since May 13.

Highs and Lows – Worcester is 38-31 on the year after reaching a season-high of 8-games over .500 on June 11 (at 36-28) for the first time since finishing last year with a 79-71 record.. The WooSox have been at the .500 mark 15 different times this season...1-1, 2-2, 3-3, 8-8, 9-9, 14-14, 16-16, 18-18, 20-20, 21-21, 24-24, 25-25, 26-26, 27-27, and 28-28. The Sox were a season-low 4-games below .500 (4-8) on April 11, but turned things around to reach 5-games above .500 on April 24 (14-9).

Better Being Home But Road OK – Worcester is 20-13 at home compared to 18-18 on the road. Their 38-31 record overall puts them in 4th-place and 7½ GB of 1st-place Lehigh Valley who have the best overall record in the league at 46-24.

May June Be Better and not Wetter – Worcester is off to a 11-3 start in June and they are scheduled to play 25 games in the 30 days in June (12 at home and 13 on the road). The Sox finished 13-14 in the month of May after going 1-1 in March and 13-13 in April.

Month to Month - WooSox hitters batted .246 in May with 29 HR & 114 runs scored while Sox pitchers were 13-14 with a 4.84 ERA during the month with 32 HRA and 132 runs allowed. Worcester hit .273 in April with 25 HR & 145 runs scored and WooSox pitchers were 13-13 in April with a 4.74 ERA along with 26 HRA and 128 runs given up.

Season Series vs. Buffalo - The WooSox lead the season series over Buffalo, 4 games to 3. The Sox and Bisons split a 6-game series in Buffalo a month ago. The WooSox won the first two games of that series in come-from-behind fashion (10-7 on May 13 and 8-4 on May 14). The teams traded routs the next two nights with Buffalo romping, 12-1 before the Sox rebounded with a 10-3 victory. Buffalo earned the split with 6-5 and 8-4 victories on May 17 & 18.

Stats vs. Bisons in 2025 – WooSox batters are hitting .267 (64-for-240) in the first 7 games vs. Buffalo this season with 11 HR and 43 runs scored while Sox pitchers are 4-3 with a 6.30 ERA (42 ER in 60 IP) allowing 11 HR and 44 runs to the Bisons.

Buffalo Bites – The Bisons won the season-series over Worcester by a 15-9 count last year including an 8-5 mark at Sahlen Field in Buffalo along with a 7-4 record at Polar Park in Worcester. The 15 losses were the most the WooSox suffered to any opponent last season. Ironically the year before, Worcester went 15-8 vs. the Bisons (including a 10-2 mark at Polar Park compared to 5-6 in Buffalo) as those 15 victories were their most over any IL foe in 2023.

Ups and Downs – Worcester's current stretch of winning 11 of 14 from June 1-17 is their second best of the season thus far behind an April 13-24 stretch when they won 10 of 11 games. Their worst stretch came from April 25 – May 11 when they lost 11 of 15 games.

Doing One Better – The WooSox have won seven of their last eight 1-run decisions since May 23 and are now 11-9 in 1-run games on the year after starting the season by dropping 8 of their first dozen 1-run decisions.

Home Run Derby – Worcester has won 11 of the last 13 games during which they have hit a homerun. The WooSox have maximized their use of the long-ball all season as 38 of their total 80 HR on the year have come with runners on base. Worcester batters have belted (42) solo HR, (23) 2-run homers, (9) 3-run blasts & (6) grand slams.

Streaks Appeal – The WooSox enjoyed a season-high and Worcester club-record 9-game winning streak June 1-11. They fell two wins shy of matching the longest winning streak for a Red Sox Triple-A affiliate in 55+ years...since the Pawtucket Red Sox won 11 straight in 2014. The WooSox have also had two 5-game winning streaks (from April 13-18 and again from April 20-24). Worcester had a season-high 5-game losing streak from April 25-30.

A Winning Tradition – The 2024 Worcester Red Sox went 79-71 to post a winning season for the fourth time in as many years of existence and for the third year in a row under manager Chad Tracy. Trace is only the second Red Sox Triple-A manager to ever post three consecutive winning seasons. Darrell Johnson did so from 1971-73 (the first two years when the Red Sox Triple-A club was in Louisville before moving to Pawtucket in 1973). Worcester finished 35-40 during the first half last year but then improved to 44-31 in the second half. Overall the 2024 WooSox went 40-34 at home and 39-37 on the road. The 2021 WooSox had a 74-54 record during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73, and the 2023 club posted a 79-68 mark.

2024 WooSox Batters Led the Way – Worcester led all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories last season. The WooSox led the league with 869 runs scored (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre was next with 846 runs scored). The Sox also led the IL with 786 walks (Toledo was a distant 2nd with 676 walks). Worcester paced the league by a wide margin with an impressive .369 on-base pct. as the WooSox were the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .359 (Scranton/WB was 2nd at .358). Furthermore, Worcester had the 2nd best OPS in the league at .795 (Columbus was 1st at .804).

2024 Rankings – Worcester finished 5th in the IL in team batting with a .259 average. On the pitching side, the Sox were 10th in team ERA (4.84). Sox pitchers allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league (141 HRA while Nashville had 139 HRA). Defensively, the WooSox were 11th with a .979 field pct. (107 errors in 5126 total chances).

Players Aplenty – The 2024 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records (previously set by the 2023 WooSox) as they made 281 player transactions during the 2024 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used 84 different players in 2024 (37 position players and 47 pitchers) to better the mark of 79 players in 2023. Ironically, the 2021 WooSox broke a long-standing Red Sox Triple-A record when they used 72 different players to beat the 1995 Pawtucket Red Sox (during a strike year when replacement players were used for the first month+ of that season) and the 2006 PawSox who each employed 70 different players. When Chad Tracy made his Worcester debut in 2022, the WooSox quickly set a new record using 75 different players (that was immediately topped first in 2023 and again in 2024).

WooSox to BoSox – The WooSox sent 28 different players to Boston during the 2024 season (not counting rehab players). A total of 22 different players were promoted from Double-A Portland to Triple-A Worcester last season.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) GAME RECAP – The Portland Sea Dogs (31-31) were held to just one hit and blanked at home by Akron last night, 1-0. Connolly Early (5-1) was the tough-luck loser allowing the game's only run in the 5th-inning – 6 IP, 5 H, 1 R, 1 ER, 0 BB, 8 SO. Ronald Rosario singled with two outs in the bottom of the 7th-inning for the only Portland hit as four Akron pitchers combined on the 1-hit shutout.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – The Boston Red Sox today sent RHP **Tanner Houck** to Worcester on an injury rehab assignment. See info on Tanner on page 1 of these Game Notes.

LHP **Kyle Harrison**, acquired from San Francisco in the Rafael Devers trade on Sunday, will soon make his WooSox debut. Harrison, 23, who was scheduled to start for the Giants on Sunday night in Los Angeles, pitched in eight games (four starts) for the San Francisco Giants this season going 1-1 with a 4.56 ERA – 23.2 IP, 21 H, 12 R, 12 ER, 9 BB, 25 SO. He has also made six starts for Triple-A Sacramento going 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA – 26 IP, 26 H, 13 R, 10 ER, 8 BB, 38 SO. Selected by San Francisco in the third round of the 2020 First-Year Player Draft out of De La Salle High School in Concord, CA, the left-hander entered 2024 ranked by MLB.com as the Giants' No. 1 prospect and baseball's No. 23 overall prospect. He made his Major League debut in 2023, making seven starts, before spending all of 2024 with San Francisco making 24 starts for the Giants and posting a 7-7 record with a 4.56 ERA (63 ER/124.1 IP). He owns a 4.48 ERA (91 ER/182.2 IP) with 178 strikeouts in 39 career Major League games (35 starts), along with a 3.33 ERA (113 ER/305.1 IP) in 75 career minor league games (all starts).

Worcester has made 39 player moves in the first 18 days of June.

Tonight, Tanner Houck will become the 57th different player used by Worcester already this season (33 pitchers and 24 position players) while LHP Kyle Harrison will be #58 when he makes his official WooSox debut this week. Last year at the end of the first half of the season (June 23, 2024), the WooSox had used 57 different players (30 pitchers and 27 position players) on their way to a Red Sox Triple-A record 84 players used during the 2024 season.

Since the start of the season (11½ weeks) the WooSox have sent RHP Hunter Dobbins (three times), RHP Robert Stock (twice), C Blake Sabol, RHP Josh Winckowski, RHP Michael Fulmer, NF Nick Sogard (twice), RHP Luis Guerrero (three times), RHP Cooper Criswell (four times), INF Abraham Toro, RHP Nick Burdi (twice), Marcelo Mayer, Zack Kelly (twice), Nate Eaton (twice), Brian Van Belle, and Roman Anthony to Boston. Criswell, Sabol, Sogard, and Stock are all back with Worcester. The Red Sox have also recalled rehabbers RHP Lucas Giolito, C Connor Wong, and INF/OF Romy Gonzalez from Worcester thus far this season.
