YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Baysox, 8-2, for their eighth straight defeat. **Sabin Ceballos** opened the scoring with a solo homer in the second inning. The Baysox took a 3-1 lead with a three-run homer by Frederick Bencosme in the third. Chesapeake added runs in the fifth and sixth before **Maui Ahuna** hit an RBI single in the bottom of the to close the score to 5-2. The Baysox scored a run in the seventh and added two in the ninth on a double by Ethan Anderson.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half Southwest champion Erie SeaWolves in the Division Series. Game 1 will be in Erie on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

PACKING THE HOUSE: The Flying Squirrels are on the verge of leading the Eastern League and all 30 Double-A MiLB clubs in total and average attendance for the fifth consecutive year. Among the 120 MiLB clubs, the Flying Squirrels rank fifth in average attendance (7,063) in 2026. The Flying Squirrels are 11,790 fans shy of surpassing the highest total attendance in franchise history (463,942 in 2010). Richmond is also on pace to break the team record for the highest average attendance in franchise history, which was set in 2025 (6,768).

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles, in the fourth of a six-game series. This is the Baysox first trip to CarMax Park. Richmond went 2-4 in Bowie from June 16-21 for their first series loss of the year opening the second half. The Flying Squirrels won four-of-six in Bowie from August 18-23. Richmond is looking to snap a season-high eight-game losing streak.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 73-60 record is tied for the second-best in team history through 133 games, trailing only a 74-59 mark in 2014. Richmond has won eight series, split 10 and lost five so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 46-53 in their last 99 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 73 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 37 of them. In 26 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 12 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in all but one home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has five wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .277 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is sixth in MiLB. The Flying Squirrels have won 31 one-run decisions this year, the most in the EL and a franchise record. They are 11-2 in extra innings.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie. For the year, Richmond is second among all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.265), second in sacrifice flies (53) and have the fewest strikeouts (1,062). The team has combined for 121 homers this year, surpassing 12 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. On Aug. 18 at Chesapeake, the Flying Squirrels set new single-season record for stolen bases, passing 168 in 2014. On August 26, the Flying Squirrels recorded their 50th sacrifice fly of the season off the bat of **Lisbel Diaz**, passing 49 in 2012 for a new team record. With an RBI single by **Zane Zielinski** in the seventh inning on August 29, the Flying Squirrels set the single-season RBIs record (previously 604, 2023). Diaz hit a three-run homer in the first inning on August 30 to pass the single-season team runs record (previously 538, 2023). The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, total bases, OBP, SLG and OPS. Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .304 this year, which leads the minors. The Flying Squirrels have scored 10-or-more runs 13 times this year, passing 2023 (11) for the most in a season in franchise history. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown 10 shutouts this season, which is second in the Eastern League and tied for ninth in MiLB.

THE BAYSOX were eliminated from postseason contention on Sunday. The Baysox roster features nine players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including RHP Anthony Eyanson (No. 1), LHP Joseph Dzierwa (No. 3), LHP Caden Hunter (No. 4), RHP JT Quinn (No. 13), SS Wehiwa Aloy (No. 15), C Ethan Anderson (No. 23), LHP Sebastian Gongora (No. 24), 2B/OF Aron Estrada (No. 25) and RHP Brock Moore (No. 28). There are seven Baysox players featured in MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list, including Eyanson (No. 2), Dzierwa (No. 3), Hunter (No. 4), Aloy (No. 8), Estrada (No. 13), Quinn (No. 14) and Anderson (No. 16).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jacob Bresnahan** makes his third Double-A start and his first against the Baysox. He last pitched on Saturday in Akron, facing his former organization for the first time, and allowed six runs over four innings on a career-high 10 hits. In his Double-A debut on August 30 against the Sea Dogs and allowed three runs over five innings, striking out eight. He spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 7-3 with a 2.92 ERA in 20 starts. At the time of his promotion, he led the Northwest League in strikeouts (118), ranked tied for second in wins (7) and fifth in innings pitched (98.2). With his debut on August 30, Bresnahan became the third-youngest pitcher in Flying Squirrels franchise history (21y, 2m, 3d), trailing only Kyle Harrison in 2022 (20y, 9m, 15 days) and Adalberto Mejia in 2014 (20y, 9m, 16d). Bresnahan was selected by the Cleveland Guardians in the 13th round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Summer High School in Washington. He was acquired in a trade by the Giants along with INF Nate Furman (PTBNL) for LHP Alex Cobb on July 30, 2024. Bresnahan is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 6 Giants prospect and No. 9 by MLB.com. **For more on Bresnahan, see page two.**

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander JT Quinn makes his fifth Double-A start and his second against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched last Friday against the Sea Dogs and worked his first scoreless start at Double-A, allowing three hits over five innings with five strikeouts. He faced the Flying Squirrels in his second Double-A start on August 22 in Bowie and allowed two runs in five innings, striking out two. Quinn was selected by the Orioles with the 69th pick in the 2025 MLB Draft out of the University of Georgia, where he pitched one season after spending his first two collegiate seasons at Ole Miss. He made his professional debut with High-A Frederick this spring and went 4-3 with a 3.75 ERA in 21 outings (20 starts) before being promoted to Chesapeake on August 11. Quinn is rated by Baseball America as the No. 13 Orioles prospect and No. 14 by MLB.com.

CROES CONTROL: **Dayson Croes** is batting .347 (34-for-98) with 27 singles, six doubles, a homer, 12 RBIs and seven walks over his last 24 games since August 13, raising his season batting average at Double-A from .237 to .277. Croes has picked up multiple hits seven times in his last 18 games since August 21, including three three-hit games and two four-hit games. On Wednesday, he went 4-for-5, tying his career high for hits and RBIs (4). He also hit three doubles, tying the Flying Squirrels single-game record.

NICE GOIN': COHEN: **Trevor Cohen** is batting .365 (19-for-52) with two doubles, a homer and six RBIs over his last 12 games since August 27. He has picked up at least one hit in 11-of-12 games and has multiple hits seven times, including a three-hit game on August 30 against Portland, in that stretch. For the season, Cohen leads all Giants minor leaguers in runs (106) and stolen bases (46).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 333 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, Dave Machemer won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Sabin Ceballos** is sixth in walks (70). **Maui Ahuna** is tied for ninth in stolen bases (30). **Jonah Cox** is tied for first in triples (5). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (15) and tied for third in wins (9). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1) and fourth in ERA (4.23).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Jacob Bresnahan** (No. 6), **Dakota Jordan** (No. 9), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 10), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 12) and RHP **Miguel Mendez** (No. 20). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features seven Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 6), Jordan (No. 7), Bresnahan (No. 9), Cohen (No. 14), Mendez (No. 16), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 18) and **Lisbel Diaz** (No. 29).

MISC NOTES: **Tyler Vogel** is the first Eastern League reliever to reach 15 saves in a season since Portland's Luis Guerrero (18) in 2023. He now has the fifth-most saves in a season in franchise history, with Heath Hembree's 17 saves in 2011 next on the list. Vogel is also seventh in franchise history in career saves with 21, trailing Josh Osich (2013-2016) and Tyler Myrick (2023-2025) for a tie for fifth with 22. His nine wins this season are the second-most as a reliever in team history, trailing Edwin Quirarte (11, 2014). **Lisbel Diaz** hit his second Double-A homer on Aug. 30 and his 26th overall this season between Low-A San Jose, High-A Eugene and Richmond, which is second-most in the Giants organization this year. **Ryan Vanderhei** is 3-0 with a 1.50 ERA (5 ER/30.0 IP) in his last 21 outings since June 20, allowing five earned runs and seven total runs in that stretch with 32 strikeouts and a .176 BAA. **Sabin Ceballos** has 70 walks this season, tied for the second-most in a season in franchise history with Diego Velasquez (2025) and trailing only Jacob Heyward (80, 2019). In his career, Ceballos has worked 117 walks, which is fourth-most in Flying Squirrels franchise history. He is six walks behind Velasquez (123, 2024-26) for a tie for third on the all-time franchise list. **Maui Ahuna** has 30 stolen bases this season, sixth-most in a season in franchise history behind Gary Brown (33, 2012). He also has the highest (min. 25 att.) stolen base percentage (.882, 30-for-34) in a season in team history. **There have been 51 Flying Squirrels alumni who have played in the majors this year (plus Donovan Walton, who had previous MLB experience before playing in Richmond), including 29 with the Giants.**

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1978: The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 7-3, in Game 1 of the Governors' Cup finals. **1983:** The Richmond Braves lost to the Tidewater Tides, 6-1, in Game 4 of the Governors' Cup finals at Parker Field. Dwight Gooden, 18 years old, threw a complete game and allowed one run with eight strikeouts. **1994:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 11-7, at MarArthur Stadium to take a 2-0 lead in the Governors' Cup finals. The R-Braves scored five runs in the first inning with two outs. Mike Kelly hit a two-run homer in the fifth for an 11-6 lead. **2007:** The Richmond Braves beat the Durham Bulls, 4-2, at Durham Bulls Athletic Park in Game 1 of the Governors Cup Championship Series. Mike Rozema hit a two-run double in the seventh to break a scoreless tie and he hit a solo homer in the ninth. Jeff Bennett threw six scoreless innings and allowed three hits. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 2-1, at The Diamond to cap a three-game sweep in the Western Division Series. Chris Dominguez hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the sixth. Justin Fitzgerald held the Senators scoreless until the top of the eighth inning.
