ABOUT LAST NIGHT.

The Blue Jays dropped their sixth straight on Tuesday night, falling 7-5 to Jupiter despite a strong showing from the pitching staff, which allowed just one earned run on five hits with nine strikeouts... Dylan Watts was perfect over 3.1 innings with seven strikeouts in his first professional start, but Luis Victorino entered in the 4th and, following a Blue Jays error, was tagged for five unearned runs highlighted by a Carlos Sánchez grand slam. Jupiter added another unearned run in the 5th on a throwing error to extend the lead to 6-0. Dunedin rallied for three runs in the 5th on RBI singles from Blaine Bullard and Eric Snow, along with a Jupiter error, but left the bases loaded. The Blue Jays added a run in the 8th on a Victor Arias RBI double, though Arias was picked off with the tying run at the plate to end the inning. Both teams traded runs in the 9th, but Dunedin came up short despite bringing the tying run to the plate twice in the frame... The six-game losing streak is one shy of Dunedin's longest skid last season, a seven-game stretch from July 1-10. The club also endured a six-game skid in mid-May as part of a 2-12 stretch that dropped them out of first place in the Florida State League West. Over the current skid, the Blue Jays are batting .160 with a .556 OPS.

PERRY THE PLATYPUS

Nolan Perry makes his fifth appearance (fourth start) of the season on Wednesday. He's coming off a strong outing in Ft. Myers, allowing one earned run over 3.2 innings with seven strikeouts, recording his first seven outs via strikeout. Over his last two appearances, Perry has fanned 19 batters in 7.2 innings, and his 29 strikeouts this season lead the Florida State League. He was named FSL Pitcher of the Week after firing five shutout innings with 12 strikeouts on April 16 vs. Clearwater, facing just one over the minimum. After missing the 2025 season following Tommy John surgery, Perry has shown a significant jump from 2024 to 2026, with his average fastball velocity increasing from 92.1 MPH to 94.2 MPH, while also throwing 7% more strikes and generating over 7% more whiffs.

HE IS THE JUAN

Blue Jays No. 7 prospect Juan Sanchez was one of the most feared hitters in the Dominican Summer League last year, slashing .341/.439/.565 with eight home runs in 56 games. He was named a DSL All-Star. Sanchez reportedly hit a ball 115.8 MPH in 2025. He starred in the 2026 Blue Jays vs. Phillies Spring Breakout game, where in the 9th inning, Sanchez launched a bases-clearing 105.6 MPH double off the wall in left-center to make it a one-run game and put the tying run in scoring position.

VAMOS, VICTORI!

Blue Jays No. 12 prospect Victor Arias joined Dunedin on minor league rehab assignment Sunday, where he played nine innings in CF, walked and stole a bag. Arias had shoulder surgery on his right (non-throwing) shoulder in the fall and opened 2026 on the Double-A New Hampshire 7-day injured list. Arias was a Florida State League All-Star for Dunedin in 2024, when he batted .279 with 8 HR and 17 SB in 76 games before a promotion to Vancouver.

JOJO SIWA

Blue Jays No. 2 prospect JoJo Parker has reached base in 17-last-18 games since going hitless in his first two pro games. Despite scorching his hardest hit ball of the season on Tuesday, a groundout at 108.6 MPH, he went 0-for-5 to snap his 12-game on-base streak, over which he hit .326 with 2 HR, 11 RBI, and a 1.096 OPS. It was a strong series at home vs. Clearwater last time at TD Ballpark for Parker, who launched his first and second professional homers, with his first coming on Tuesday at 108.3 MPH over the right-field admin building, and on Wednesday he worked a nine-pitch walk-off walk in the 10th inning. This spring, MLB's No. 40 prospect slapped a single at 109.1 MPH in the Blue Jays Spring Breakout game, and launched home runs in Minor League Spring Training at 109.3 MPH and 111 MPH.

GAX ON, GAX OFF

Aldo Gaxiola went 2-for-5 and scored a run in Thursday's loss, marking his fourth multi-hit game of the season. After opening the year 0-for-17, Gaxiola is batting .324 over his last 10 games with a 1.039 OPS. Last Saturday vs. Clearwater, Gaxiola smacked a two-run homer in the 7th 407 ft. at 106.9 MPH off the bat for his third homer of the season as part of a three-hit, three-RBI night. His 6th inning RBI single on Saturday was 111.6 MPH off the bat, the hardest hit ball by a Blue Jay this season and hardest by a Jay since Yeuni Munoz at 112.2 in 2025.

BLAINE'S WORLD

Blue Jays No. 15 prospect Blaine Bullard cashed in a career night Saturday, recording a career-high four hits highlighted by an RBI triple in the 5th inning, and solo homer in the 9th. Bullard either scored or drove in all four Dunedin runs in the contest and fell a double shy of the cycle. His solo blast in the 9th marked his team-high fourth long ball of the year. T-2nd in the FSL. His solo shot left the bat at 103.3 MPH and traveled 383 ft. Bullard added two stolen bags and has six stolen bases over his last four games without being caught.

2026 DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Ryan Casteel | Manager Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Chattanooga, TN

Casteel makes his managerial debut in 2026, joining the Blue Jays organization after a 14-year professional playing career. Casteel spent time in the Colorado Rockies, Seattle Mariners, and Atlanta Braves farm systems, while also playing winter ball in Australia and Puerto Rico. A four-time minor league All-Star, he was named Australian Baseball League MVP in 2013 after earning California League Catcher of the Year honors that summer with the Mariners' High-A Modesto Nuts. Casteel spent parts of six seasons at the Triple-A level, including the final four years of his career with the Gwinnett Strippers. After being placed on the Gwinnett Development List for much of the 2024 season, Casteel was activated for a July series against Jacksonville and delivered a ninth-inning, walk-off home run on July 12 in his first game in nearly two months, lifting the Strippers to a 7-6 win after entering as a late-game defensive replacement. Two days later, on July 14, he announced his retirement following a nearly 900-game minor league career. Casteel immediately transitioned into a coaching role with Gwinnett and served as a coach with the FCL Braves in 2025 before stepping into his first managerial role. Was Arizona Fall League teammates with Blue Jays Farm Director Joe Scalfani in 2014 for the Salt River Rafterers on a team that won the AFL Championship and also included Byron Buxton, Trevor Story, Taylor Rogers, Max Kepler, and Tyler Heineman.

Brett Kennedy | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Galloway, NJ

Kennedy enters his first season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach and second with the Blue Jays organization after leading the Complex League Champion FCL Blue Jays pitching staff in 2025. Kennedy enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career, including MLB service time with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2023. A Fordham University graduate, Kennedy takes over for fellow Ram Cory Riordan, who was named the Blue Jays' Pitching Coordinator after three seasons in Dunedin.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Denton, TX

Knight returns for his third season as Dunedin's Hitting Coach. Under Knight's guidance in 2025, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League's top offensive clubs, finishing fourth in batting average (.244) and home runs (85), second in slugging percentage (.371), and third in OPS (.716). Through the first 46 games of the 2025 season, the Blue Jays led the league in home runs (41), on-base percentage (.368), slugging percentage (.416), OPS (.784), and runs scored (292). Eight position players earned their first promotions to High-A in 2025 under Knight, including JR Freethy, who reached Double-A by season's end. The Denton, Texas native spent six seasons as a player in the Blue Jays organization from 2015–2021, reaching the Triple-A level. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Bench Coach Year with Toronto: 4 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson returns for her second season on Dunedin's coaching staff and fourth with the Blue Jays organization. Stephenson spent the 2025 season as a Position Coach for Dunedin, primarily working with the outfielders. She spent the prior two seasons in the same role with the High-A Vancouver Canadians, where she helped guide the club to a Northwest League championship in 2023. Inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. She starred collegiately in hockey at Wilfrid Laurier University, winning four conference titles and a CIS National Championship before playing professionally in both the National Women's Hockey League and Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson represented Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004–2018, earning two Team MVP honors, an All-Star selection at third base at the 2008 IBAF World Cup, and the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was later renamed in her honor. In 2022, she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team, leading her squad to two victories over Team USA in the Friendship Series, before joining the Blue Jays organization.

Andy Fermin | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 9 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cleveland, OH.

Fermin joins the Dunedin staff as a Position Coach in his first season with the club. A former infielder in the Blue Jays farm system from 2010–2016, Fermin has remained with the organization in a coaching capacity following his playing days. He served as a coach with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats from 2017-2019 and was part of the 2018 Eastern League championship staff under current Toronto Manager John Schneider. He served as Hitting Coach for the DSL Blue Jays in 2021 and managed the club from 2022–2023. He returned stateside as manager of the FCL Blue Jays in 2024 before serving as the club's Bench Coach in 2025. Fermin returns to Dunedin after spending parts of three seasons at TD Ballpark as a player in 2014-2016. His father, Felix, played mainly shortstop over 903 MLB games from 1987-1996 while with Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Seattle and Chicago (NL).

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 26 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Cotui, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995-1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

Over his four collegiate seasons, Smith hit .305 across 213 college games with 20 home runs and 160 RBI. As a left-handed pitcher, he posted a 16-9 record and a 4.12 ERA in 53 college appearances and 28 starts while striking out 168 batters. Smith's final outing as a Torero saw him earn the win after pitching the final seven innings of San Diego's 14-inning thriller in the WCC Tournament Championship, allowing just three runs on four hits as he used 99 pitches to put his team in position to earn a walk-off victory. As a senior in 2025, Smith batted a career-high .353 with 46 runs, six homers, and 48 RBI. His go-ahead 14th-inning home run at No. 14 UCLA on April 6 helped the Toreros stop a 6-24 skid to begin the season and sparked a 10-game win streak. Griffin and Parker are best friends, and played on the same teams growing up before Griffin reclassified, and they train together in the offseason. Closest MLB team to his home in Mississippi was the Atlanta Braves, over six hours away, so never had a favorite team but grew up idolizing Derek Jeter. Hobbies include fishing, hunting, and play golf. In 2nd grade wrote on a piece of paper that his teacher gave him that he wanted to be an MLB baseball player.
