#### Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP Kirk McCarty to the mound tonight, looking to keep the opposition to a reasonable number of runs (opponents have 44 in 4G since back to back shutouts on 7/6-7/7). St. Paul will counter with LHP Charlie Barnes. The Clippers are 4-6 (.400) against left handers this year. Barnes has faced Columbus once, on 6/25 in Columbus (L, 5.0IP, 7H, 7R, 6ER, 2BB, 4K).

#### vs. the Saints

Columbus went 4-2 against the Saints in the first ever series between the two (6/22-6/27), scoring at least seven runs three times (gave up at least six runs in four games; 22ER, fewest allowed in a home series this year). Individually, Gabriel Arias has batted .409 (9x22) opposing St. Paul in 5G and Andres Gimenez has hit .375 (9x24) with a HR and 7RBI in 6G.

#### **Historical Beatdown**

Last night the Clippers got beat by at least 18 runs for the fourth time in franchise history (last, 7/6/17 vs. Indianapolis, 21-1) and the consecutive losses by double digits mark the second time in franchise history (8/15-8/16/82 vs. Syracuse). They have given up at least 11 runs in back to back games for the first time since four straight from 6/3-6/6/19 (happened zero times from 2005-18).

#### Loneliest Number

Through 53G, the Clippers were the only team in the IL that had not been held to a single run (all others had at least 3G scoring once). Over the last 6G, the Clippers have plated just one runner three times, including each of the last two. Columbus is operating at a franchise worst -28 run differential over the last 2G (previous worst: -25 from 6/24-6/25/02 vs. Scranton/WB; losses of 19-1 and 8-1).

#### Crushing It

Yu Chang had another multi-hit effort last night, bringing his total with Columbus to three (6G; had four multi-hit games in 49G with Cleveland). His homer was the first since a 2HR game vs. Toledo on 8/23/19 and his first in an opposing IL park since 7/17/19 at Scranton/WB (17HR at Huntington Park, 6HR elsewhere). Chang is the only Clipper with at least 3XBH in the last week.

#### Take Two

The double from Nolan Jones last night was his IL-best 20th of the year (snapped 6G drought, longest since 6G from 5/29-6/4). He is slugging .527 over his last 32G, collecting 15 doubles, a triple, 4HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 30K (had 43K in first 26G). Jones is on pace for 43 doubles, a number that would set the franchise record (42 by Kurt Bierek in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

#### Work to Do

Owen Miller is batting .254 (18x71) since returning from a three week stint in Cleveland, turning in nine hitless games in 20 chances (four hitless games in first 16). Miller was hitless in 9AB before Friday's single in the 1st (hitless in 14AB from 6/18-6/22), sinking from .342 to .317 (lowest of the season). He has only 7XBH during the cold spell, including just a double from 6/18-7/1 (.194SLG in 36AB).

#### **Old School**

Wilson Ramos has yet to strikeout this season with Columbus (14PA; has 8K in 118PA at the minor league level since the start of 2013; current stretch in Columbus is only non-rehab stint). Ramos will DH tonight with Ryan Lavarnway assuming the catching duties. Both are the only position players that are at least 30 years old (only other 30+ position player this year was also a catcher, Roberto Perez).

#### Three Left Turns

Gabriel Arias has scored just once in the last 6G, following a streak of runs in 15 of 18G (6/12-7/4). Still, beginning with a 3-run game on 6/12 at lowa, Arias has scored 23 runs in his last 24G, leading the IL in that time (hitting .303, 27x89, since 6/12). On the season, Arias is tied for 4th in the IL in runs (36) and is on pace to score 78 (most since Cord Phelps' 82 in 2012).

#### **Big Time Slumps**

Tyler Krieger is slated to start tonight for the first time since his 2-hit game on 7/8 vs. Indianapolis. Prior to that, Krieger was 6x55 (.109) in 21G since 5/27. Alex Call was 4x9 with a pair of homers through his first 2G in Triple-A, but has gone 4x33 (.121) in 10G since. His double last night was his first XBH since a 2HR game at Toledo on 6/30 (.152SLG over last 33AB).

### This Date in Clipper History 7/14/2010

The International League defeated the PCL 2-1 in the Triple-A All-Star Game. The Clippers had three representatives on the IL squad, including **Michael Brantley** (did not attend due to promotion to MLB). **Josh Tomlin** worked an inning of scoreless relief for the IL and 2010 Clipper of the Year, **Jose Constanza**, made an appearance as a pinch-runner in the 8th inning.

#### **Huntington (Small) Park**

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (972 to 930).

#### Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.15 per game, putting them 21 off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.42 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 26, even with the shortened season.

#### Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 11-32 (.256) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th.

#### Not Close

The Clippers have the 2nd most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (19, Memphis leads with 21) and rank 13th in wins by at least that many (9, two ahead of Memphis). That poor ratio has led to a -63 run differential, a figure that places them 13th in the IL (Memphis is securely in the basement at -90).

#### Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

#### **Trending Downward**

The current staff ERA of 5.37 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.66ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

#### Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 6th (566K, 53 off the pace, Charlotte). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.59K per game.

#### Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is almost 150 points higher (.536, 15-13) than when they make a mistake in the field (.387, 12-19). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 100 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .980.

#### One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 51% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 14 times (on pace for 30HR).

#### Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

#### International Accolades

**Bobby Bradley** was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

#### Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 57-78 (.422), 27-32 with Columbus (.458).

#### Go West, Young Man:

Through 5GS west of Columbus, McCarty is a perfect 5-0 with a 3.09ERA (32.0IP, 24H, 11R, 11ER, 10BB, 23K), turning in 4QS (1-2 with a 6.00ERA in 7GS at Huntington Park). The only other time McCarty pitched in a league with teams west of Columbus was in 2018 with Lake County (only team in the Midwest League east of Columbus). Things were completely opposite that year, with McCarty going 1-7 with a 5.00ERA in 13GS on the road and 3-2 with a 3.26ERA in 9GS at home.

#### Winning Ways:

McCarty began the season with wins in five consecutive decisions, after having never won more than two in a row in his career prior. While he had his share of success in the wins (31.0IP, 10ER), he needed the offense to get him off the hook in two of his no-decisions (came back from 7-0 deficit vs. Nashville on 5/28, trailed 3-1 when leaving start vs. Toledo on 6/15).

#### Off the Board:

Starting with his last 2.0IP in the season opener on 5/4 at Louisville and continuing through his first 2.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/16, McCarty fired 10 straight scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 4K). Through his first 4GS, McCarty started 24 innings (retired the first batter 20 times) and allowed a single tally in seven of them with zero multi-run innings allowed. In his fifth start, on 5/28 vs. Nashville, McCarty allowed multi-run innings in each of the first three, surrendering 4HR (career high, 6th multi-HR game). In his next 5GS (6/3-6/26), McCarty allowed one multi-run inning in each, while producing scoreless baseball in 22 of 30.0IP.

#### Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (Logan Allen- 5, Scott Moss- 4, Tanner Tully- 3, Sean Brady- 2 and Kyle Nelson- 1), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. Josh Smith led Clipper lefties with 52.2IP in 2019, a total that was surpassed by McCarty on 6/26 (leads IL with 65.2IP).

#### 2019 Season:

Started the year on Lynchburg's DL with a strained lat... activated on 6/12 and threw 42 pitches at Wilmington (3.0IP, 2H, 4K)... gave up 24H in 16.0IP over next 4GS (10ER)... allowed 1H in 6.0IP (2BB, 6K) at Down East on 7/11, then had a brief stint on the DL (7/18-7/23)... returned from the DL and had 7GS to finish the season, posting a 7.37ERA (30.2IP, 25)... had 10K in 5.1IP at Wilmington on 8/13 (also had 5BB, career high 93 pitches)... following the season, pitched in 6G for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League (24.0IP, 17H, 8R, 8ER, 6BB, 19K).


