Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) in the second game of a three-game set in Eastlake. This is the continuation of six straight games between the two clubs.

Current Series (3 G in Eastlake): Dayton 1, Lake County 0. **Weeklong Head-to-Head Series (6 G):** Lake County 3, Dayton 1.

Last Game: Friday: Dayton 5, Lake County 1. Dayton pitchers Nick Sando, Trey Braithwaite, and Dylan Simmons combined to allow only five hits and Anthony Stephan blasted a home run as the Dragons snapped a five-game losing streak. The game was tied 1-1 when the Dragons took the lead for good with a run in the third inning. Braithwaite entered the game with the bases loaded and two outs in the fifth and got a strikeout to end the threat as the Dayton bullpen shutout the Captains over the final 4.1 innings.

Weeklong Series Recap: The Dragons are 1-3 in this six-game set, outscored 29-20. They are batting .215 as a team (.250 with runners in scoring position) with five home runs and a team ERA of 7.00.

Recap of Last Series at Lansing (June 24-29): The Dragons split the six games in Lansing, winning three of the first four before Lansing took the last two. Dragons hit .314 in the series while averaging 8.7 runs per game. The Dayton team ERA in the series was 5.12 and the Dragons committed seven errors. The Dragons outscored Lansing in the series, 52-35.

Team and Player Notes:

- In the Second Half season (13 games), the Dragons lead the Midwest League in doubles (31) and triples (6), and rank second in extra base hits (49). They rank within the top three in hits (9.6/G), slugging percentage (.444), and OPS (.802). The Dragons Second Half ERA of 6.39 ranks last in the MWL.
- The Dragons full-season team ERA stands at 5.32. The highest team ERA in modern Midwest League history (1963-2025) is 5.35, by Burlington, in 2010. The Dragons team record for highest ERA is 5.03 in 2004.
- Carlos Jorge** leads the MWL in Second Half season batting average at .410. In 9 G, Jorge is 16 for 39 with 1 HR, 1 3B, 4 2B, 8 RBI, and 5 stolen bases. He has only four strikeouts in 47 plate appearances.
- Victor Acosta** has shown improvement as a hitter over a significant sample size. Acosta was hitting .150 on May 10. In 199 plate appearances starting May 11 (42 G), Acosta is batting .290 with a .402 on-base percentage. He ranks 11th in the MWL in hits since May 11.
- Yerlin Confidan** in his last 9 games is 16 for 38 (.421) with 4 2B, 1 3B, 10 RBI, and 9 runs scored. Confidan is 10th in 2nd Half average at .356.
- Leo Balcazar** went 0 for 5 last night to snap his 11-game hitting streak. Balcazar has three home runs in his last seven games and nine on the year.
- Anthony Stephan** in his last 10 games is 14 for 43 (.326) with 2 home runs, 5 doubles, 1 triple, and 9 RBI. He is tied for the MWL lead in Second Half extra base hits and 10th in Second Half slugging percentage (.560).
- Carter Graham** over his last 6 games is 9 for 24 (.375) with a home run, 2 doubles, 4 RBI, and 7 runs scored.
- Carlos Sanchez** is hitting .303 with two home runs in 10 games since joining the Dragons. He has posted an OPS of .997 with a .545 slugging pct.
- Jack Moss** in his first three games since joining the Dragons has gone 4 for 9 (.444) with 1 double and 3 RBI.
- Reliever **Easton Sikorski** has an ERA of 1.99 on the year, tied for second in the MWL among pitchers with at least 40 innings.
- Reliever **Trey Braithwaite** over his last seven outings: 16.1 IP, 2 ER, 1.08 ERA.

Prospecting: The Dragons roster features several players ranked among the Reds top-30 prospects based on the MLB Pipeline and Baseball America lists: Starting pitcher Adam Serwinowski (#12 on MLB; #13 on BA); shortstop Leo Balcazar (#25 on MLB; #21 on BA); center fielder Carlos Jorge (#21 on MLB); catcher Connor Burns (#27 on BA); second baseman Peyton Stovall (#27 on MLB), and starting pitcher Luke Hayden (#30 on MLB).

Rehab Note: Wade Miley became the second player in Dragons history to start a game for Dayton after throwing a no-hitter in the Major Leagues. Miley threw a no-hitter for the Reds in 2021. Homer Bailey made a rehab start for the Dragons in 2017 after throwing two no-hitters for the Reds.

Vince Harrison Jr. returns to the Dragons for his second season as manager after leading the team to a second half division title in 2024. Under Harrison's leadership in 2024, the Dragons full-season winning percentage of .561 ranked third best among the 24 years in Dragons franchise history. The Dragons finished with a winning record in both halves for the second time in franchise history. After going 34-32 in the first half, they went 40-26 in the second half to win the East Division title. Harrison enjoyed a nine-year professional career as a player, playing in the Rays, Mets, and Marlins systems as a third baseman. After his playing career ended following the 2011 season, he was hired as a coach by the Pirates. He joined the Diamondbacks organization as a hitting coach in 2014 and spent five years in that role before becoming a manager. He managed for three years in the Diamondbacks system before joining the Reds organization in 2023 as a coach with Louisville. Harrison played at Princeton High School in Cincinnati before starring in both baseball and football at the University of Kentucky. He was drafted by the Tampa Bay Rays in 2001 and spent four years as a player in their farm system, reaching the Double-A level. Harrison's younger brother, Josh Harrison, spent 12 years as a player in the Major Leagues, collecting more than 1,000 career hits while playing in two MLB all-star games.

Memorable Moments from 2025

May 9: Dragons pitcher Brian Edgington struck out 13 Great Lakes batters in five innings, one short of the club record of 14 set by Josh Hall in 2001 and Daniel Renken in 2011.

May 13: The Dragons trailed at Quad Cities 6-1 entering the eighth inning before battling back to win 11-9 in 12 innings. Dayton scored three in the eighth and two in the ninth to tie the score. Both runs in the ninth came on a two-out, two-run single by John Michael Faile. Dayton's Carlos Jorge blasted a tie-breaking two-run home run in the top of the 12th to give the Dragons an 11-9 lead and close out the scoring. The game marked just the third time since record-keeping of lead changes began in 2004 that the Dragons trailed by at least five runs in the eighth inning and battled back to win the game, and the first time since 2012. The Dragons have come back from deficits of at least five runs to win 27 times since 2004, but only three times when they trailed by five runs or more in the eighth inning or later. The 12-inning contest tied for the most innings played in a Dragons game since the rule putting a free runner on second base to begin each inning after the ninth was implemented in 2018. **Note:** Carlos Jorge's 12th inning two-run home run marked the second time in his Dragons career that Jorge hit a 12th inning, tie-breaking home run in a Dragons win. He did the same on September 2, 2023 at Great Lakes to break a 5-5 tie in a Dragons 7-6 win.

May 16: Catcher Connor Burns enjoyed the first two-homer game of his pro career, the first multi-home run game by a Dragons player since Cam Collier hit three on August 23, 2024.

June 22: The Dragons overcame the second largest deficit to win in recorded team history, battling back after trailing 10-2 in the middle of the fifth to defeat Fort Wayne 12-11. The Dragons trailed 11-4 when they erupted for eight runs in the bottom of the sixth inning to take the lead. Anthony Stephan's three-run home run tied the game at 11-11, and the Dragons added one more run in the inning to break the tie on a bases-loaded walk to Peyton Stovall. The Dragons sent 14 batters to the plate in the inning, and the eight-run frame was the Dragons largest since they scored eight runs in an inning at Great Lakes on July 26, 2023. Dayton reliever Trey Braithwaite shutout Fort Wayne over the final 3.1 innings to preserve the victory. Details on Dragons comebacks are available since 2001. Their largest recorded comeback in a victory is nine runs, on April 19, 2001 at Lansing, when they trailed 9-0 after two innings and won 10-9.

June 27: The Dragons produced their highest run total in 18 years in a 19-4 win at Lansing, as they collected 19 hits with eight of their nine batters picking up at least two hits. The Dragons finished just two runs short of the club record of 21 runs in a game. They scored 19 runs for the first time since July 5, 2007. The Dragons attack was led by Victor Acosta, who had a home run and five runs batted in. Leo Balcazar had three hits including a home run. The Dragons had eight extra base hits in the game. Dayton led 4-2 going to the fifth inning when they exploded for 13 runs over the next three frames including six in the sixth.

Dragons Team Facts

The Dragons are celebrating their 25th Season in 2025. All 25 seasons have featured a partnership with the Cincinnati Reds. Over the Dragons history, 153 players have played for the Dayton club before reaching the Major Leagues.

The Dragons compete in the Midwest League (classified as High-A) and play a 132-game schedule (66 home games) from April 4-September 7. The MWL features 12 teams from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, and Wisconsin. The Midwest League has been in operation since 1947 and has been known by its current name since 1956.

The team named their 12 Greatest Dragons in franchise history as part of this season's celebration. Those players, listed alphabetically, are Homer Bailey, Jay Bruce, Zack Cozart, Johnny Cueto, Elly De La Cruz, Adam Dunn, Todd Frazier, Hunter Greene, Billy Hamilton, Austin Kearns, Joey Votto, and Jesse Winker.

Five Great Achievements in Dragons History

- Austin Kearns hit home runs in eight consecutive games, July 17-24, 2000
- Billy Hamilton stole 103 bases for the Dragons in 2011, most for any player with a single team in Reds history (Major League or Minor League). Hamilton stole 155 the next season, splitting his season between two clubs, the highest total in baseball history.
- Donald Lutz hit for the cycle in reverse order (home run, triple, double, single), all within the first five innings, July 21, 2011.
- Jose Siri broke the Midwest League record for longest consecutive game hitting streak with 39 from June 22-August 3, 2017.
- Elly De La Cruz hit home runs from both sides of the plate twice within three days, July 7-9, 2022.

Three members of the Reds Hall-of-Fame have served as coaches for the Dragons including Ken Griffey Sr., Chris Sabo, and Tom Browning.

Every season in Dragons history has featured a future Major League player/s on the Dayton roster, including this season. Most recently: Chase Burns in 2025; Rhett Lowder in 2024; Blake Dunn and Julian Aguiar in 2023; Elly De La Cruz, Rece Hinds, Noelvi Marte, Andrew Abbott, Connor Phillips, Evan Kravetz, Joe Boyle, and Julian Aguiar in 2022.

Attendance Leader: The Dragons finished third in all Minor League Baseball in 2024 in attendance average per game (8,012). They have ranked first in attendance at the Single-A level for each of their 24 seasons, and first among all teams below Triple-A for 18 straight seasons. The Dragons have ranked in the top-10 among all classes of the minor leagues for each of their 24 seasons.

The First Season: After a 48-year absence of professional baseball in Dayton, the Dragons came to life in 2000. The first home game was played on April 27, 2000, and featured a lineup that included future Reds stars Adam Dunn and Austin Kearns. The manager of the first Dayton team was Freddie Benavides, now the Reds bench coach.
