**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Curve, 18-6, in 11 innings. **Scott Bandura** led off the game with a homer and **Maui Ahuna** brought in a run with a sacrifice fly to open a 2-0 lead in the first. The Curve scored a run in the second before taking a 3-2 lead in the third. After a bases-loaded walk brought in a Curve run in the bottom of the seventh for a 4-2 lead, Ahuna tied the score with a two-run double in the top of the eighth. In the ninth, **Parks Harber** gave Richmond a 5-4 lead with an RBI single but Altoona evened the score in the bottom of the inning. **Diego Velasquez** singled in a run in the top of the 10th before the Curve matched it with a run in the bottom of the 10th. The Flying Squirrels scored 12 runs in the top of the 11th, tying a franchise record for runs in a single inning. Bandura and Davidson hit RBI singles before three runs scored on bases-loaded walks. **Jonah Cox** brought in a run grounding into a force out, a run scored on an error, Bandura hit another RBI single, **Aeverson Arteaga** singled in a run and **Bo Davidson** hit a three-run homer. The Richmond pitching staff tied a franchise record with 13 walks issued. The Curve stranded 21 runners on base, the most in an EL game since 2015. The game was played in four hours and 12 minutes, the longest Richmond game since 2019.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the third and fourth of a six-game series against the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates. It is the second series between the two teams this season and Richmond's first of two series in Altoona. The Flying Squirrels are 7-1 against the Curve this year. This is the first doubleheader of the season for both teams, making up Wednesday's rainout.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 18-4 start is the best in team history through 22 games, passing the 14-8 start in 2018, 2022 and 2023. Richmond has won all four series it has played so far this year. All four Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 18 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 12 of them. In eight of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. Last Sunday, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On Thursday, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** have the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, ahead of an 18-5 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.297), runs (173), hits (229), doubles (57), RBIs (159), OBP (.392), OPS (.878), sacrifice flies (13) and has the fewest strikeouts (188). They are second in MiLB in batting average, OBP and OPS. In 10 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .320 (125-for-391) and have scored 99 runs (9.9 runs per game). In 12 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .274 (104-for-379) and have scored 74 runs (6.2 runs per game).

**THE CURVE** are 6-16 this season, last in the Southwest Division, but won their first series of the season last week, taking three-of-five against second-place Harrisburg. Altoona's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including C Omar Alfonzo (No. 13), RHP Khristian Curtis (No. 15), 2B Duce Gourson (No. 21) and SS/3B Jack Brannigan (No. 28). Five players are featured on MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list, including Alfonzo (No. 15), Curtis (No. 22), Brannigan (No. 23), Gourson (No. 27) and 1B Callan Moss (No. 29).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his fifth start of the season and the seventh of his career against the Curve in Game 1. He last pitched last Friday in the first start of his career against Somerset, his former team, and he allowed two runs over five innings with a season-high six strikeouts. He faced the Curve on April 11 at CarMax Park and also surrendered two runs over five innings. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

Right-hander **Darien Smith** makes his third Double-A start and his fifth appearance in Game 2. It is also his third outing against the Curve this year. In his last start on Saturday working a game shortened to seven innings due to a late start time, Smith took a shutout bid into the seventh before allowing a solo homer and worked the longest outing of his career, surrendering one run over seven innings in a win. He made his first two Double-A appearances against the Curve on April 7 and April 12 at CarMax Park, allowing two runs over a combined 8.1 innings, including 4.1 hitless innings in the series finale. For the year, Smith leads the Eastern League in WHIP (0.75) and ranks tied for first in ERA (1.35), tied for second in BAA (.145) and tied for third in wins (3). Smith pitched collegiately at Jacksonville University (2019), JUCO Eastern Florida State College (2020-21), Florida Gulf Coast (2022) and NAIA Southeastern (2023-24). At Southeastern in 2024, he was named the ABCA/Rawlings NAIA Pitcher of the Year, going 12-0 with a 1.87 ERA in 17 games (16 starts). Smith signed with the Giants as a non-drafted free agent that summer. In his first professional season in 2025, Smith went 8-0 with a 1.91 ERA in 20 outings (three starts). **For more on Smith, see page two.**

**FOR ALTOONA:** Left-hander Dominic Perachi makes his fifth start of the season and his third this year against the Flying Squirrels. In his last start last Friday at Harrisburg, he allowed a season-high three runs over five innings. In his two starts at CarMax Park on April 7 and 12, he combined to allow three runs over nine innings. Last year, he made eight Double-A appearances and went 3-1 with a 4.49 ERA. He also worked rehab outings with three Pirates affiliates. Perachi has made six previous starts against the Flying Squirrels, going 2-0 with a 4.60 ERA (15 ER/29.1 IP). Perachi signed with the Pirates as a non-drafted free agent in 2022. He pitched for the Salt River Rafters of the Arizona Fall League after the 2025 season.

**SABIN SOARING:** **Sabin Ceballos** hit his fifth homer of the season on Tuesday, one shy of his home run total from last season. Last week against the Patriots, he homered in back-to-back games last Tuesday and Wednesday. Over his last 13 games since April 14, he is batting .373 (19-for-51) with three doubles, five homers and 11 RBIs with 10 walks. He homered twice in the April 15 win at Hartford and finished the night 3-for-4 with four RBIs and four runs scored. Prior to this stretch, he opened the season batting .160 (4-for-25) in his first seven games from April 3-12. Last season, Ceballos hit .311 (46-for-148) with five homers, 11 doubles and 27 RBIs over final 43 games from July 3-September 6. He has hit safely in 10 straight games, the longest active EL hit streak.

**GREAT SCOTT:** **Scott Bandura** has 22 RBIs over his last 14 games since April 12, including 10 in the last road series at Hartford, four last week against Somerset and six this series in Altoona. On April 14 at Hartford, Bandura went 3-for-4 with two doubles and drove in five runs, the most by a Richmond batter this season. The next day, he hit a solo homer before clubbing a go-ahead, three-run double in the ninth. Bandura led off Thursday's game with a homer and drove in three runs on three hits. His 23 RBIs lead the Eastern League this year.

**JUST HOW WE DREW IT UP:** **Drew Cavanaugh** has reached base multiple times in 11-of-his-13 games started this season and leads the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.540), which is second in MiLB. He has at least one hit and one walk in 11 starts. Last Friday, he entered as a pinch-hitter in the ninth and hit the first walk-off home run in CarMax Park history, a two-out, two-run shot for a 7-6 win. In this series, he is 1-for-2 with four walks.

**COX ROCKS:** **Jonah Cox** has reached base in all 20 games he has played this season to begin his Double-A career. The streak is tied for the third-longest in the Eastern League this year. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 19-of-20 games he has played. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.397). His 15 steals are second in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 278 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,348).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.397), second in steals (15), tied for second in RBIs (21), third in OBP (.481), tied for fourth in hits (27), fifth in SLG (.647) and fifth in OPS (1.128). **Scott Bandura** is first in RBIs (23), tied for first in hits (31), second in runs (23), tied for third in triples (2), tied for third in extra-base hits (13), tied for third in total bases (52), tied for fourth in doubles (8), fifth in OBP (.449), seventh in batting average (.348) and ninth in OPS (1.033). **Drew Cavanaugh** is first in OBP (.540), third in batting average (.356), third in OPS (1.162), eighth in SLG (.622) and ninth in runs (19). **Turner Hill** is tied for third in triples (2). **Darien Smith** is first in ERA (1.35), first in WHIP (0.75), tied for second in BAA (.145) and tied for third in wins (3). **Jack Choate** is first in wins (5). **Joe Whitman** is tied for fifth in strikeouts (28) and tied for eighth in innings pitched (22.1). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (5) and tied for fourth in games pitched (9). **Mitch White** is tied for fourth in saves (2).

### THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

**1958:** The Richmond Virginians beat the Rochester Red Wings, 3-0, at Parker Field. Jim Coates struck out 10 with no walks in his first start of the season. **1971:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 6-5, at Parker Field. Oscar Brown won the game with a pinch-hit ninth-inning single to score Fred Velazquez. Don Baylor and Bobby Hitch hit early homers to help Rochester take a 5-0 lead. Tommie Aaron hit his first homer of the year to tie the score in the eighth. **1985:** The Richmond Braves beat the Maine Guides, 4-3, at The Diamond. Steve Curry won the game with a walk-off single in the bottom of the ninth off Jose Calderon to score Milt Thompson. Curry was back with Richmond for the first time since 1982. **2019:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 7-3, at Prince George's Stadium. In his first day back off the IL, Jacob Heyward hit a homer on the first pitch of the game. Later in the game, he went deep with another home run. Richmond homered four times in the game, tying what was then the franchise single-game record for home runs, which was broken in 2022 and then passed again in 2023.
