The St. Paul nine rapped out 18 hits, the most for the club in an Opening Day game in franchise history and the second-most the Saints lineup has ever produced in a game at .1-0 CHS Field (it ranked t-6th for the most hits by the St. Paul lineup in a single-game 0.0-0 overall; the last time the Saints reached at least 18 hits was July 20 last season 0.0-0 @Toledo). On the pitching side, four Saints arms combined for a 4-hit shutout, 1.0-0 needing just 112 pitches to navigate the Indianapolis lineup (81 were for strikes). Last season, it took the Saints pitching staff until their 16th game of the season to notch their first shutout, a 1-0 victory on April 16 @Indianapolis. The St. Paul pitching staff finished with four shutout victories on the season, with three of them coming against the Pittsburgh Pirates affiliate, all on the road at Victory Field.

IT'S EARLY, BUT ...: One game into the season, the Saints lead all Triple-A clubs with 18 hits and a .462 (18-39) team batting average. They're second only to the Louisville Bats (CIN) in team OPS (1.147 vs 1.233) and were the only Triple-A team to score at least 11 runs yesterday in the Opening Day for the minor leagues 1-0 St. Paul pitching were the only team in the International League to record a 0-0 shutout in yesterday's opener, and one of just two in Triple-A as a whole (also the Sacramento River Cats). The Charlotte Knights (CHW) staff only allowed 2 hits and 1-0 five total baserunners, but gave up a run in a 9-1 victory over Gwinnett in North Carolina last night.

...0-0/0-0 THE STARS OF TOMORROW, TODAY: The Saints Opening Day roster features nine of Minnesota's Top-30 prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseball Minimesor a hip-so prospects according to MLB.com and ten according to Baseban to a high prospects and the macro a top-100 overall lists of both publications.

HOME SWEET HOME: During the past four years (2021-24), the Saints are tied for fifth in all of Minor League baseball with 163 home wins. Their .570 Win% at home is fourth-best in Triple-A and third in the IL in that span. Last year's 35-38 record was the 1st season the Saints played below .500 at home in 4 years as a Triple-A club.

FRESH FACES, NEW ENEMIES: The Saints will play three International League teams for the first time in franchise history in 2025: Norfolk (BAL) for a home series late-May, Worcester (BOS) at home in late-July, and Memphis (STL) in a September road series. Also new to Triple-A this year, the Saints will take part in an International League vs Pacific Coast League crossover series as Round Rock (TEX) visits CHS Field for the first-time in August. In addition to the four new teams they'll face, the Saints will also visit Coolray Field for their first road games ever vs Gwinnett (ATL).

I TOTALLY REMEMBER LAST YEAR, BUT REMIND ME AGAIN?: Following their best season as a Twins affiliate, the Saints finished last year 70-79, a 14-win dropoff from the season prior and their lowest win total in four years in Triple-A. In a season of peaks and valleys, the Saints opened up the year 28-35 before they ripped off an 11-game winning streak, the longest in the International League all year. St. Paul peaked at four games over .500 after winning back-to-back games in lowa to open the secondhalf before being bogged down by a pair of extended losing skids, including a string of 10 consecutive losses from Aug. 9-Aug. 20, tied for the longest in the league

ON THE FAST TRACK: In just his second full-season in the minors last year, Morris ascended through three levels of the minor league ladder to finish the year making his first six starts at the Triple-A level. It's not the first time that Morris has accelerated at a faster pace than his peers. He graduated high school at just 16 years old, starting his freshman season of college at just 17. He was born on the cutoff date of September 1 for starting school and his mother chose to start him in kindergarten a year ahead. Not only that, he also skipped second grade as he was being homeschooled in Alaska.

BUILDING UP TRAVEL POINTS: Although he was born in New York City, Morris claims Boulder, Colorado as his hometown. He moved from NYC as a child to Oregon, then to Alaska, and then to Colorado, where he attended Monarch High School in Boulder. He tells people Boulder is where he's from as that's where he lived the longest.

LET'S GET FUNKY: Lacking the prototypical build of a frontline starter, Morris' unusual delivery has been noted as a reason why hitters have such a hard time picking up his pitches. Fangraphs prospect writer Eric Longenhagen noted in <u>last year's mid-season report</u> that "Morris' delivery is weird. He has a high front side throughout his delivery and creates a slight crossfire angle with stride direction before throwing out of a high arm slot. It's rare for cross-bodied pitchers to also have a north/south arm slot this extreme and it seems to disorient hitters."

CLIMBING THE LADDER: Before transferring to Texas Tech for his senior year, Morris pitched for three years at Division 2 Colorado Mesa University, helping his team reach the DII National Championship Game in 2019 as a freshman (Mesa finished as Runner-up to Tampa that year). Morris was named the Rocky Mountain Athletic Conference Freshman of the Year for his efforts that season and was a Division 2 2nd-Team All-American in 2021 before transferring to Texas Tech as a redshirt junior.

MAD MORRIS: Morris' mound routine can involve arguing with himself or talking to himself on the mound. "I'm really just analyzing the last pitch, moving on to the next pitch and what it should be," Morris remarked. "Sometimes there are not-so-nice words involved, but reall it's 'Trust it. Throw it to the mask' Other times, 'it's good left side, how can we work off of that? What's next, and then next?'
