**YESTERDAY:** The Flying Squirrels lost to the SeaWolves, 14-7. Richmond took a 1-0 lead in the second with a sacrifice bunt by **Diego Velasquez**. Erie scored five runs in the second to jump ahead. In the fourth, Isaac Pacheco extended the lead to 7-1 with a two-run single. **Zane Zielinski**, who was making his Double-A debut, hit a solo homer in the top of the fifth. Erie added two runs in the bottom of the fifth and a three-run homer by **Thayron Liranzo** in the seventh pushed the lead to 12-2. Richmond scored three in the eighth with an RBI triple by **Jonah Cox**, an RBI groundout by **Parks Harber** and an RBI single by **Diego Velasquez**. Erie added two runs in the eighth before **Parks Harber** hit a two-run homer in the ninth, his second in the last two games, to move the score to 14-7.

**TODAY'S GAME:** The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Erie SeaWolves, Double-A affiliate of the Detroit Tigers. This series is the second between the two teams this year, both at UPMC Park. From April 3-5, the Flying Squirrels won two-of-three to open the 2026 season and are 4-2 against the SeaWolves this year.

**STRONG START:** The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 27-8 start is the best in team history through 25 games, passing a 22-13 start in 2010. Richmond has won five series and split one so far this year. Five-of-eight Richmond losses have been by one run.

**RELENTLESS:** In their 27 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 14 of them. In nine of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In the April 7 home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. On April 9, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. On April 11, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On April 15 in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11. On April 24, **Drew Cavanaugh** hit a walk-off, two-run homer in the ninth for a 7-6 win over the Patriots. On April 26, Richmond tied the score with two outs in the ninth before **Parks Harber** hit a walk-off single in the 10th. On April 30, the Flying Squirrels rallied from a two-run deficit in the eighth to take the lead in the ninth and 10th but were answered by Altoona before a 12-run top of the 11th. On Wednesday against Akron, **Jonah Cox** hit a two-run homer to tie the score in the ninth before Cavanaugh won the game, 5-4, with a walk-off double. On Friday, the Flying Squirrels tied their largest come-from-behind win in franchise history, overcoming a 6-0 deficit to win, 9-6, over Akron.

**THE FLYING SQUIRRELS** have the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, ahead of a 27-9 record for High-A Eugene (Giants). The Richmond offense leads all 120 full-season MiLB teams in batting average (.294) and doubles (85). Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average, runs (251), hits (356), doubles, RBIs (231), OBP (.378) and OPS (.859). In 16 road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .306 (193-for-630) and have scored 142 runs (8.3 runs per game). In 18 home games at CarMax Park, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .281 (163-for-580) and have scored 109 runs (6.1 runs per game).

**THE SEAWOLVES** are in fourth place in the Southwest Division. They won eight consecutive games through last Friday, including the first four of their series in Harrisburg before dropping their next four. Erie has won the Southwest Division championship and reached the Eastern League Championship Series each of the last four seasons and won EL titles in 2023 and 2024. Erie's roster features two players in Baseball America's top-30 Tigers prospects list, including SS John Peck (No. 15) and C Thayron Liranzo (No. 20). MLB.com's top-30 Tigers prospects list features four Erie players, including Liranzo (No. 6), Peck (No. 14), 3B/1B Izzac Pacheco (No. 20) and OF Brett Callahan (No. 30).

**FOR RICHMOND:** Left-hander **Cesar Perdomo** makes his fifth Double-A start and seventh appearance of the year. It is his first time facing Erie. He last pitched last Friday against Akron and allowed five runs, all in the fifth inning, in a no-decision at CarMax Park. This year, he is the only Eastern League pitcher who has worked at least 25 innings without allowing a home run. Perdomo spent all of last season with High-A Eugene, going 8-6 with a 3.96 ERA in 26 starts. For the year, he led the Northwest League in innings pitched (127.1) and ranked tied for first in games started (26), second in WHIP (1.24), tied for third in wins (8), fourth in ERA (3.96) and fourth in strikeouts (118). Among Giants minor leaguers, he ranked tied for second in starts (26), fourth in innings pitched (127.1), eighth in strikeouts (118) and ninth in ERA (3.96). Perdomo split the 2024 season between Low-A San Jose, where he posted a 1.26 ERA in 13 outings and was a California League Post-Season All-Star, and Eugene. He signed with the Giants as an international free agent in 2021. *For more on Perdomo, see page two.*

**FOR ERIE:** Right-hander Max Alba makes his first Double-A start of the year. He began the season on the injured list before working three rehab starts between Low-A Lakeland and High-A West Michigan, posting a 3.86 ERA (4 ER/9.1 IP). His last outing was with West Michigan on Saturday against Dayton and he allowed two runs over three innings. Alba split last season between West Michigan and Erie. With the SeaWolves, he went 0-1 with a 6.12 ERA in eight starts. He faced Richmond on August 6, 2025, at UPMC Park and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits. Alba was selected by the Los Angeles Angels in the 39th round of the 2018 MLB Draft but did not sign. He played two seasons at the University of North Carolina before transferring to Liberty University in 2022. He signed with the Tigers as a non-drafted free agent in 2022.

**COX ROCKS:** **Jonah Cox** reached base in the first 23 games he played this season to begin his Double-A career before an 0-for-3 outing on May 5. He opened the season on a 12-game hit streak and has at least one hit in 29-of-31 games he has played, adding a 10-game hit streak that was also snapped on May 5. He is currently riding a seven-game hit streak. On May 1 (G1) at Altoona, he became the fifth player in Flying Squirrels history to hit three triples in a single game. He went 3-for-3 on May 6 against Akron with a game-tying, two-run homer in the ninth. For the year, he leads MiLB in batting average (.426) and ranks second in SLG (.713), second in OPS (1.192) and eighth in OBP (.479). His 19 steals are third in the Eastern League after swiping 58 bases each of the last two seasons. Cox hit his league-leading fifth triple of the year on Thursday.

**IT'S BO TIME!** After batting .200 (11-for-55) in his first 15 games of the season through April 28, **Bo Davidson** is hitting .385 (20-for-52) with six doubles, a homer and 12 RBIs in his last 13 games since April 30, adding six multi-hit games in that stretch. He has struck out six times in his last 56 plate appearances. His nine-game hit streak was snapped on Saturday night, but he has reached base in 14 consecutive games since April 29.

**WHIT WON'T QUIT:** **Joe Whitman** was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week on Monday for May 5-10 after throwing two scoreless starts against Akron at CarMax Park last week, totaling 11 innings and 15 strikeouts. In a win on Tuesday, Whitman threw six scoreless innings with seven strikeouts and held Akron hitless until two outs into the sixth for a 5-0 Richmond win. On Sunday, he pitched five scoreless innings and held the RubberDucks to three hits with a season-high eight strikeouts in a 6-0 win. For the week, he led the league in strikeouts, innings and wins (2) while ranking third in BAA (.108) and sixth in WHIP (0.64). It was the second EL Pitcher of the Week award for Whitman in his career.

**TOP SKIPPER:** Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 287 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Macheder** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

**PACKING THE HOUSE:** In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. April 7's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels rank second among the 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (7,342).

**IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS:** In the Eastern League, **Jonah Cox** is first in batting average (.426), first in OBP (.479), first in SLG (.713), first in OPS (1.192), first in triples (5), second in RBIs (30), second in hits (46), second in total bases (77), third in stolen bases (19) and tied for sixth in extra-base hits (18). **Scott Bandura** is first in runs (33), tied for second in walks (24), third in OBP (.431), tied for third in RBIs (29), tied for third in hits (42) and seventh in batting average (.321). **Darien Smith** is tied for second in wins (4), third in BAA (.180), fourth in ERA (2.84) and fifth in WHIP (1.11). **Joe Whitman** is second in strikeouts (43), tied for second in wins (4), sixth in WHIP (1.11), seventh in BAA (.211) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (33.1). **Jack Choate** is first in wins (5). **Trystan Vrieling** is seventh in ERA (3.38) and 10th in BAA (.227). **Tyler Vogel** is tied for second in saves (5). **Mitch White** is tied for fifth in saves (3). **Matt Wilkinson** is first in ERA (1.52), first in WHIP (0.84), first in BAA (.165), tied for third in strikeouts (42) and tied for ninth in innings pitched (33.1).

**PROSPECT WATCH:** Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Parks Harber** (No. 16), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), Harber (No. 14), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

### THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

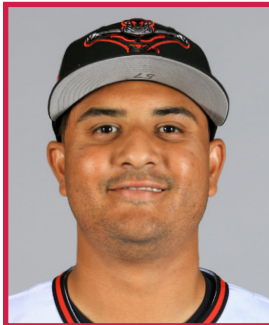
**1973:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 6-3, at Parker Field. Andy Thornton hit two homers and the Braves came from behind twice in the win. Guy Rose drove in what became the winning run with a single to extend his hitting streak to 11 games.

**1981:** The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox 2-1 at Parker Field. Randy Johnson hit a walk-off sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Harrisburg Senators, 11-4, at The Diamond. The Richmond offense set a franchise record with 22 hits, which has since been tied twice. Juan Perez tied the single-game franchise record for hits, going 5-for-5 with a double, a triple and two RBIs. Charlie Culberson, Nick Noonan and Sharon Schoop each had three hits.
