Delmarva Shorebirds (15-27) vs. Charleston RiverDogs (29-13)

Today's Game: The Charleston RiverDogs (affiliate of the Tampa Bay Rays) continue a 12-game homestand by welcoming the Delmarva Shorebirds (affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles) to The Joe for the first time since August of 2019. The RiverDogs have gone 8-1 through the first nine games of the homestand and trail Myrtle Beach by 1.5 games at the top of the South Division standings. Delmarva is in last place in the North Division. **RiverDogs-Shorebirds Season Series in 2022: Overall:** RiverDogs 3, Shorebirds 0. **At The Joe:** RiverDogs 3, Shorebirds 0.

Last Time Out: The RiverDogs never trailed despite some tense moments in the middle innings on the way to a 7-3 win over Delmarva on Thursday night. Luis Leon's two-run single through the right side gave the RiverDogs a 2-0 lead before Edwin Barragan blasted a two-run home run to left field in his first at-bat with the team to double the advantage. Delmarva pulled within one in the fifth inning without the help of a hit. Neraldo Catalina issued three walks and two wild pitches, resulting in the damage. The score was 4-3 entering the eighth inning, when the home team added some insurance with RBI singles from Oneill Manzueta and Barragan, as well as a run-producing groundout from Shane Sasaki.

Take Me Out to the Crowd: The RiverDogs have played 24 home games this season, tied for the most at the Single-A level. With an average attendance of 3,780, the RiverDogs rank second in the Carolina League and third in Single-A in attendance per home game. Only Fresno and Augusta have welcomed more fans per game this season.

Dogs Déjà Vu: The 2021 edition of the RiverDogs was the most successful team in franchise history. Through the first 42 games of the season, this year's team is one game ahead of the pace set by the record-breaking squad. The 2021 team was 28-14 at this stage of the campaign.

Hawaiian Punch: Outfielder Shane Sasaki, a native Hawaiian, has been on a tear of late, rebounding from a slow start. Sasaki has a hit in 14 of his last 15 games and went 11-21 with four doubles in the last series against Augusta. That showing has pushed his batting average to .301, placing him 10th in the Carolina League. In addition, the former third round pick is fourth in MiLB with 26 stolen bases and has been caught stealing just twice. Sasaki is tied for 10th in the Carolina League with 28 runs scored.

Balanced Ballclub: The RiverDogs have been able to win games in a variety of fashions this season thanks to their consistent offense and pitching prowess. The RiverDogs sit atop the Carolina League with a team batting average of .257. They rank second in earned run average with a mark of 3.12. The ERA mark is sixth in Minor League Baseball.

Running Wild: The RiverDogs enter play tonight with 91 stolen bases. That number leads the Carolina League and is second in Minor League Baseball, five behind the Lake Elsinore Storm. The team has been incredibly efficient, having been caught just 17 times, the fewest for any team with more than 77 successful attempts. The 2022 RiverDogs are on pace to steal 287 bases this season which would demolish the current franchise record of 255.

Triple Threat: The RiverDogs roster has plenty of speed throughout the lineup. On Wednesday night, the lineup tallied three triples and on Thursday, Willy Vasquez added another to the total. The team has hit triples in consecutive at-bats on three separate occasions this season. The RiverDogs lead Minor League Baseball with 28 triples, eight more than the next closest club. Carson Williams is tied for the Minor League Baseball lead with seven triples. Mason Auer has six and is tied for third in MiLB.

Blue Chip Bat: Shortstop Carson Williams was selected 29th overall by the Rays in the 2021 MLB Draft. The 18-year-old won't celebrate his birthday until late June. The Torrey Pines High School product leads the Carolina League lead in slugging percentage, extra-base hits and triples, is third in OPS and total bases, seventh in batting average and tied for seventh in doubles.

Prized Pups: The RiverDogs opening night roster contains four members of MLB Pipeline's Top 30 Rays prospects. The highest ranked of that group is infielder Carson Williams who came in at #9. Infielder Willy Vasquez is also part of the top 10 on that list, slotting in at #10. The highest rated hurler in the group is Cuban right-hander Sandy Gaston who is ranked #13. The list is rounded out by fellow pitcher JJ Goss at #19.

RIVERDOGS FIELD STAFF

Manager: Blake Butera

Butera returns for his second season as the manager of the RiverDogs after leading the team to the franchise's first championship in 2021. Prior to his arrival in Charleston, he led the Hudson Valley Renegades to a postseason berth in his two seasons guiding the short-season club. Butera coached with the Leones del Escogido in the Dominican Winter League following the cancellation of the 2020 minor league season. At the time he received the managerial job in Hudson Valley, Butera was the youngest manager (25) in all of Minor League Baseball. The native of Metairie, Louisiana was drafted by the Rays in the 35th round of the 2015 Amateur Draft out of Boston College and appeared in 80 minor league games over two seasons. At Boston College, he was voted team captain his senior year and finished his career as the Eagles' all-time leader in walks (112) and at-bats (774). His father, Barry, reached Triple-A with the Red Sox and his brother, Barry, spent two seasons in the Astros minor league system after being selected out of Boston College in the 2009 Amateur Draft.

Pitching Coach: R.C. Lichtenstein

Lichtenstein returns for his second year as the pitching coach for the RiverDogs and his 18th year in the Rays organization. He guided the 2021 pitching staff to the lowest earned run average and most shutouts of any Low-A team The pitching staff also led the Low-A East in strikeouts and allowed the fewest hits of any team in the circuit. Lichtenstein has served as pitching coach at several stops in the Rays farm system including Southwest Michigan (2005-06), Vero Beach (2007-08), Bowling Green (2009-11) and Double-A Montgomery (2012-19). Throughout his career in baseball, the 53-year-old has also coached in the Milwaukee Brewers organization and managed two independent squads.

Hitting Coach: Perry Roth

Roth takes on his first assignment with the Rays in Charleston after coaching at the college level since 1996. He served as interim head coach at UAB in 2021 and spent 15 years with UAB's baseball program, also serving as recruiting coordinator, hitting coach and assistant head coach. Roth previously served as an assistant for two separate stints at Birmingham Southern and also coached at Bradley, Illinois State and Greenville College.

Coach: Frank Jagoda

Jagoda joins the RiverDogs for his first season in the Holy City. He initially joined the Rays organization in 2020 when he was slated to be a member of the Princeton Rays staff until the MiLB season was canceled. Jagoda was part of the 2021 FCL Rays staff that helped lead the team to the best record in the circuit and one of the top winning percentages in MiLB. He previously spent two seasons with the Minnesota Twins, serving as rehabilitation pitching coach in 2018 and a coach for the Fort Myers Miracle in 2019. Jagoda has also coached with USA Baseball and at the collegiate level for Patrick Henry Community College, Wingate University, Canisius College and Jamestown Community College.

Athletic Trainer: Ruben Santiago

The 2022 season will be Santiago's seventh as an athletic trainer with the Rays. In 2021, he worked with the FCL Rays after spending the previous three seasons on the Princeton coaching staff. Santiago joined the organization from the Toros del Este in the Dominican Winter League in 2016 and spent his first two seasons with the Gulf Coast League Rays.

Strength Coach: Mia Salvemini

Salvemini began the 2021 season with the FCL Rays and completed the campaign as the RiverDogs Strength and Conditioning coach. She is also a CrossFit Level One Trainer and spent time working with athletes at Cressey Sports Performance. Salvemini was originally hired by the Rays in 2020 after graduating from the University of Tampa in 2019 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Human Performance with a concentration in Exercise Recreation and Leadership.
