2023: Spent majority of the season with Clearwater (A)... Went 1-0 with a 2.87 ERA (5 ER, 15.2 IP), 25 SO to 3 BB and struck out 39.7% (25-63) of batters faced over 4 appearances (3 starts) in April... Picked up his first win with Clearwater on 4/29 vs St. Lucie (5.0 IP, ER) and set a career high in SO with 8; had 8 SO again on 9/2 vs Aberdeen... Set a career high with 6.0 IP on 7/26 (gm 1) at Jupiter... Promoted to Jersey Shore (A) on 8/3 and earned his first win with the BlueClaws on 8/18 vs Asheville (5.0 IP, 0 ER, 6 SO)... Following the season, was rated as having the best pitch control in the Phillies system by Baseball America... Following the season, was ranked as the No. 27 prospect in the Phillies organization by MLB.com...

2022: Pitched for Florida Complex League Phillies (R)... Struck out 31.5% of the batters he faced (17-54)... Participated in Florida Instructional League...

2021: Began professional career with FCL Phillies... Made his pro debut, 6/28 at FCL Blue Jays... Promoted to Clearwater, 7/17... Was placed on the IL, 8/20, with a left elbow injury and missed the remainder of the season... Struck out 34.8% of the batters he faced (32-92)...

2020: Did not pitch as season was cancelled due to COVID-19 Pandemic.

SCOUTING REPORT: The last Italian-born pitcher to make it to the big leagues was Marino Pieretti, who appeared in 194 games with Washington, Chicago (AL) and Cleveland, a career that ended in 1950. Signed for \$210,000 in July 2019 a few months shy of his 18th birthday, Aldegheri could break that 70-plus year schneid. He couldn't make his Phillies debut until 2021 because of the pandemic, then missed most of '22 with shoulder soreness. Healthy in 2023, he turned in a solid performance with Single-A Clearwater and earned a bump up to High-A Jersey Shore. The left-hander has a back-end rotation spot starter kit when he's throwing well. His fastball sat around 92 mph in 2023 and was up to 95 mph, a heater with good spin that adds some solid carry in the zone. He has both a slider and a curve, and Aldegheri throws the former a lot more than the latter, a solid low-80s breaking ball. The curve is more of an upper-70s pitch that's more fringy. He started throwing his changeup more as the season wore on and it should be a third at least average pitch. Aldegheri's walk rate was concerning in 2023, though it did improve over his four starts with Jersey Shore; there's belief within the organization that it will continue to drop as he gets more reps on the mound. He still hasn't pitched all that much, but the gloves could come off more in terms of usage this season.
