OPENING NIGHT ERUPTION LEADS 'CATS TO 11-2 WIN: The Fisher Cats (Blue Jays) started the 2021 season with a bang, overwhelming the Sea Dogs (Red Sox) with an Opening Night 11-2 win at Hadlock Field. Each of New Hampshire's nine starters recorded a hit, led by catcher Gabriel Moreno's 3-for-5 night. Moreno drove in two runs and scored three times.

LOGUE SHARP IN DEBUT: LHP Zach Logue (W, 1-0) picked up right where he left off from his 2019 All-Star Season in New Hampshire, holding Portland to five scattered singles over five shutout innings with one walk and five strikeouts. Logue improved to 4-7 in a New Hampshire uniform in 20 games, 19 career starts. The win was his first in four career decisions against the Sea Dogs.

OPENING NOTE: The 17th opener in franchise history was one for the record books, with the Fisher Cats scoring 11 runs. The previous high had been nine, in a 9-0 win over Reading on April 4, 2013. Because of the pandemic, May 4 will go down as the latest start in team history. The previous mark of April 10 had been set in 2015.

ROSTER MOVES: The Toronto Blue Jays assigned the maximum of 28 players to Double-A New Hampshire to open the season. Three members of the Fisher Cats are currently on Toronto's 40-man roster – pitchers Elvis Luciano (who starts tomorrow's game), catcher Gabriel Moreno, and infielder Otto Lopez. There are 15 pitchers and 13 position players.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: May 5, 2008 – The Fisher Cats opened a four-game series at Hadlock Field with a 5-4 win over the Sea Dogs. Aaron Mathews tripled off Portland starter Justin Masterson to drive in a pair of runs in a four-run sixth inning.

SEA DOGS HITTING COACH: Lance Zawadzski is the new hitting coach in Portland, but he has New Hampshire ties. Zawadzski, who reached MLB with the Padres in 2010, finished his career in affiliated ball with the Fisher Cats in 2013. He hit his only homer in Binghamton on 9/1 that year. Lance, who was born in Framingham, Mass., has been a coach in the Red Sox system since 2018.

FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays dropped a second straight game in Oakland last night, 4-1. Anthony Kay, who came to Toronto in the Marcus Stroman trade along with tonight's starter Simeon Woods Richardson, was hit for four runs in the second inning. Toronto was held to three hits including one each by Fisher Cat alums Cavan Biggio and Santiago Espinal. Elsewhere, Triple-A Buffalo beat Worcester 6-1 (in Trenton). Nate Pearson struck out eight in 3.2 innings. Tri-City blanked Vancouver 4-0, and Tampa beat Dunedin 11-7.

ON THE HILL: This will be the first Double-A start for Simeon Woods Richardson, a 20-year old RHP the Blue Jays acquired as part of the Marcus Stroman trade with the Mets on July 28, 2019. He took every turn in the rotation in 2019 when making 26 starts (106.2 IP) between Class A Columbia (Mets) and Advanced A Dunedin (Blue Jays). With Dunedin, he went 3-2, 2.54 ERA, holding Florida State league hitters to a .182 average. He walked seven and struck out 29 in 28.1 innings with the D-Jays.

Portland starter RHP Frank German was part of a rare trade between the Red Sox and the Yankees. The Yankees sent right-handed pitcher Adam Ottavino, German, and \$850,000 to the Red Sox for a player to be named later or cash. German was drafted by the Yankees in the fourth round of the 2018 MLB draft at the No. 127 overall pick out of the University of North Florida in Jacksonville. He placed fifth in NCAA Division 1 with an ERA of just 1.58. He spent most of the 2019 season with Advanced-A Tampa, where he appeared in 16 games but did miss some time during the summer with an injury.
