RHP TANNER GORDON (0-1, 4.15) vs. LHP BRADNON WALTER (0-0, 1.23)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque claimed game three last night with a 7-2 victory over Sugar Land to snap their three-game losing streak ... The Space Cowboys, however, hold a 2-1 series advantage ... Tanner Gordon is expected to toe the rubber for the Isotopes while Brandon Walter is slated to start for Sugar Land.

RUNS SCORED: Albuquerque plated seven-plus runs in Sugar Land last night for just the third time in the club's last 21 games (others: August 20, 2024 and July 18, 2023. The Isotopes have never scored double-digit tallies in Sugar Land.

MARGIN OF VICTORY: The five-run margin of victory yesterday is tied for the second-largest (three times) in 39 all-time games in Sugar Land (largest: 7-1 win, August 20, 2024).

BY WAY OF THE K: The Isotopes pitching staff registered 12 strikeouts last night, the third-straight contest with double-digit punchouts. The last time Albuquerque struck out double-digit batters in at least three-straight games was June 25-29, 2024, a string of five-straight.

HITS ALLOWED: Albuquerque has permitted just 12 hits over the club's last 25.0 innings on the mound.

RUNS RELENTED: The Isotopes staff limited the Space Cowboys to two runs last night, the third time in 2025 the staff has surrendered two runs or fewer (also: April 2 vs. Salt Lake and March 30 at Sacramento).

HOMER STREAK: Albuquerque has homered in eight consecutive games, their longest stretch since Aug. 30-Sept. 7, 2024 (eight games).

MULTIPLE DINGERS: Albuquerque has also connected on multiple clouts in five-straight, the longest such streak since June 6-10, 2023.

KEEP IT CLEAN: Albuquerque was not charged with an error last night, the ninth contest this year without an error. The Isotopes' six miscues on the year are second-fewest in the Pacific Coast League (fewest: Tacoma, five).

DINGERS: Albuquerque has homered in 10 of their first 12 games to begin the season ... The club has 21 homers on the year, the most in Triple-A.

STARTER: Carson Palmquist earned the win last night after tossing 5.0 one-run innings, allowing just three hits and one walk with seven strikeouts, the most punchouts by an Isotopes starter this season.

YF: Yanquiel Fernandez went 3-for-5 last night, including a double and his third homer on the year. Has a dinger in two-straight and three of his last four contests. Has reached base in nine-straight games. During stretch, is slashing .286/.375/.600 with two doubles, three homers, three walks and five RBI. Recorded his second three-hit game in 44 Triple-A games (also: September 22, 2024, at Reno).

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson swatted his first Triple-A four-bagger in the second frame yesterday, a two-run shot. It's his second-straight game with an extra-base hit (double).

THE VET: Austin Nola, making his Isotopes debut last night, belted a solo shot in the eighth inning.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel singled twice last night for his third multi-hit contest of the year and second in his last four games. Also swiped his first Triple-A bag in the fifth frame.

AMADOR: Adael Amador roped a double to leadoff the game Wednesday to extend his hit streak to seven games. During the stretch, he is slashing .276/.417/.414 with one double, one homer and three RBI. Has a hit in eight of the nine games he's played.

FULFORD: Braxton Fulford's three-game homer streak came to an end Wednesday but he registered two hits for his fourth multi-hit game of the year and fourth-straight. Over his last four contests, he is slashing .533/.588/1.333 with eight hits, four homers and seven RBI ... Has reached base in eight-straight games.

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard has 78 home runs in an Isotopes uniform across five seasons (2019, 21, 22, 24 and 25). He is one blast away from tying Mike Busch (1993-96) for most among all Albuquerque Triple-A players.

ISOTOPES RBI RECORD: Hilliard has 219 RBI with Albuquerque, which ranks third among career leaders in team history. Jordan Patterson (2016-18) is second with 229 RBI.

REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk singled last night and has a hit in four-straight and five of his last six games ... Over his last six, he is slashing .348/.400/.565 with one triple, one homer and seven RBI.

SUGAR LAND TIES: Veteran right-hander Miguel Castro pitched in a total of 27 games with Albuquerque during the 2015 and 2016 seasons ... Space Cowboys outfielder Quincy Hamilton lived in Alamogordo for a decade and played one season of baseball at Alamogordo High School.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his fourth season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in its third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

- Began college career at John A. Logan Community College, pitching for two seasons (2017-18) ... Named National Pitcher of the Week April 26, 2018, after spinning a complete-game victory where he fanned a school record 19 batters

- Made second start of the year on April 4 vs. Salt Lake and did not factor into the decision ... Tossed 5.2 innings and allowed two runs on five hits, one homer and one walk with six punchouts ... Induced four groundouts and five flyouts ... Retired 11 of the first 12 batters he faced ... First run surrendered came on a Niko Kavadas homer in the fourth ... Second run scored on a J.D. Davis RBI groundout in the sixth, his final batter
