Lake County Captains (1-1, 36-32) at Dayton Dragons (1-1, 40-28)

RH Tommy Mace (0-2, 5.40) vs. RH Justin Dunn (no record)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) host the Lake County Captains (affiliate of the Cleveland Guardians) at Day Air Ballpark in the heart of the Water Street District. Today's game is the last in a seven-game series and the third game of the second half in the Midwest League's split-season format.

Season Series vs. Lake County: Dayton 9, Lake County 8. Current Series: Lake County 4, Dayton 2. The Dragons in the current series are batting .191, averaging 2.3 runs per game, with six home runs, a 7.59 team ERA, and five errors.

Previous Series at Cedar Rapids: Cedar Rapids 4, Dayton 2. The Dragons batted .259 while averaging 4.3 runs per game with nine home runs, a team ERA of 5.22, and five errors in six games.

Historically Speaking: The Dragons first half winning percentage of .591 (record of 39-27) was the second best in franchise history, trailing the 2007 Dragons, who finished 44-26. The 2022 first half record was the fourth best in any half in Dragons history (2011 second half: 48-22; 2001 second half: 41-28).

Dragons in the Standings: Dayton finished the first half in second place, one game behind Great Lakes. They have opened the second half by splitting their first two games, tied for second place, one game out of first.

What Happened? Entering a doubleheader on June 9, the Dragons were 36-15 (best record in franchise history after 51 games) and held a lead of eight and one-half games over second place Great Lakes with 15 to play. At the time, Dayton had not lost more than two consecutive games all season. How did they lose that lead?

The Dragons went 3-11 over the next 14 games while Great Lakes went 12-1 over the same period, a difference of nine and one-half games as the Loons clinched the division title...From June 9 through the end of the first half (15 games), the Dragons averaged 3.3 runs per game (last in the league)...Dragons hitters struck out 178 times in those 15 games starting June 9 (most in Minor League Baseball by 15; most in the MWL by 42)...In their 12 losses from June 9 through the end of the half, the Dragons batted .118 with men in scoring position (13 for 110)...Meanwhile, the Dragons team ERA from June 9 through the end of the half was 5.34 (next to last in the league).

What's Next: The 66-game second half is underway. The Dragons could qualify for the playoffs in one of two ways: 1) By winning the second half East Division title; 2) By finishing with the next best <u>full-season record</u> in the East Division (behind Great Lakes) should Great Lakes win the second half division title. If the same team wins both halves, the team with the next best <u>full-season record</u> qualifies as the second half representative.

Last Game: <u>Saturday</u>: Lake County 17, Dayton 2. Joe Naranjo hit two home runs including a grand slam. The Dragons allowed season highs in runs, home runs (5), and walks (12) while collecting just three hits. Allan Cerda hit a two-run home run for Dayton.

Team Notes

- Dayton is tied for first in the MWL in home runs with 80. However, the Dragons lead the league in strikeouts (their total of 794 is second most in Minor League Baseball).
- The Dragons reached a 2022 high point (so far) of 21 games over .500 (36-15 on June 7). The last time they were 21 games over .500 came at the end of the 2011 season, when they were 26 games over at 83-57.
- The Dragons roster includes 11 players selected in the first five rounds of the draft and 10 of the Reds top 27 prospects (MLB.com).

Player Notes

- <u>Elly De La Cruz</u> (seventh youngest position player in the league with at least 100 AB) over his last 27 games is batting .314 with seven home runs and 20 RBI. De La Cruz is among the top five in the MWL in home runs, RBI, hits, runs, slugging percentage, extra base hits, and OPS.
- Nick Quintana over his last 26 games is batting .307 with 2 HR and 19 RBI.
- Joe Boyle has an earned run average of 0.72 and opponent's batting average of .089
 on the year. Both figures would lead all Minor League Baseball, but he is four innings
 short of the minimum number to qualify.
- <u>Connor Phillips</u> is second in the MWL in strikeouts with 90 and tied for first in opponent batting average (.181). Since April 28, Phillips has made nine starts, posting a 2.34 ERA (50 IP, 13 ER, 20 BB, 69 SO).

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Bryan LaHair is in his first season as Dragons manager and his fifth year in the Reds organization. He served as manager with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona Complex League in 2021 and was the manager at Billings in 2019. LaHair opened his coaching career as the Billings hitting coach in 2018. LaHair played professionally for 14 seasons from 2003-14 and 2016-17, appearing in more than 1,000 games. He was primarily a first baseman but also saw considerable time as a corner outfielder. He played in 195 major league games with the Seattle Mariners and Chicago Cubs. In 2012, he appeared in the MLB All-Star Game. LaHair played for TEAM USA's national team three times (2005 World Cup, 2006 regional Olympic qualifier, 2007 Olympic qualifier). LaHair led all of Minor League Baseball in home runs in 2011 with 38 with the Iowa Cubs and was selected as the Pacific Coast League Most Valuable Player. He played one season in Japan in 2013. LaHair is a native of Worcester, Massachusetts and was chosen as the 2000 Massachusetts High School Player of the Year. He was selected by the Mariners in the 39th round of the 2002 draft out of St. Petersburg College in Florida.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** returns to the Dragons in 2022 as pitching coach after serving in the same position in 2021. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level. He finished fourth in the Pioneer League in saves with nine in his first pro season with Helena in 2010.

Hitting coach Daryle Ward returns to the Dragons in 2022 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18 and 2021. He is in his seventh year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Reds affiliate in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. Ward played in 948 big league games with the Astros, Dodgers, Pirates, Nationals, Braves, and Cubs. He connected on a career-high 20 home runs in 2000 with the Astros. In the later stages of Ward's Major League career, he emerged as one of the National League's top pinch hitters. He led all of baseball in pinch hits and runs batted in as a pinch hitter in 2006 while finishing tied for first in pinch hit home runs. Ward played in 2,318 professional games before retiring at the age of 40 following the 2015 season. Ward was originally signed by the Tigers as a 15th round draft pick in 1994 out of Rancho Santiago College in California. He is a native of the Los Angeles area and now makes his offseason home in Riverside, California. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Juan Samuel joins the Dragons as bench coach in 2022, his first season in the Reds organization. The 2022 season is Samuel's 40th year in professional baseball as a player or coach. After a 19-year professional playing career including 16 seasons in the Major Leagues, he served on the Detroit Tigers big league coaching staff for seven years from 1999-2005. He was the manager of the Mets Double-A club in Binghamton in 2006 before returning to the Majors as a coach for the Baltimore Orioles from 2007-10. He served as the manager of the Orioles on an interim basis in 2010. He was a Major League coach for the Philadelphia Phillies from 2011-17. He served as a coach with Monclova in the Mexican League in 2021. Samuel has 18 years experience as a Major League coach and two years as a coach in the minors. Samuel enjoyed a 16-year Major League playing career from 1983-98 and was selected to play in the MLB allstar game three times. Samuel collected more than 1,500 big league hits during his time with the Phillies, Mets, Dodgers, Royals, Reds, Tigers, and Blue Jays. In 1984, he set an MLB record for stolen bases by a rookie with 72 and finished second in the NL Rookie of the Year voting. His best season came in 1987 when he blasted 28 home runs and drove in 100 runs while batting .272 to win the NL Silver Slugger award at second base. Samuel was inducted into the Phillies Wall of Fame in 2008 and was selected as one of the 50 greatest players in Phillies history in a book by Robert W. Cohen. Samuel was born in San Pedro de Macoris, Dominican Republic and graduated from Licey High School in Puerto Rico.

Rules Changes for 2022

The Midwest League has adopted a Pitch Clock to encourage a quicker pace of play. Pitchers are required to deliver each pitch within 14 seconds of receiving the ball when the bases are empty, and within 18 seconds with runners on base. Defensive positioning rules now require at least two infielders on each side of second base, with at least four infielders positioned on the infield dirt. Pitchers are now limited in the number of unsuccessful pick-off throws they can make to a base. The third pick-off throw must result in an out, or the runner with be awarded the next base via a balk. Additionally, the size of each base has been increased from 15" to 18".
