FIRST HALF CHAMPS!: With the win over Hill City on June 7, the FredNats secured the Carolina League North's first-half title, the only first-half championship in Fredericksburg history. The title is the first for the franchise since the Potomac Nationals' 2018 win.

JUST ONE RUN: The FredNat offense has struggled over this latest stretch, producing just one run in four of the last six contests. Over this span, the FredNats are 0-4 in games when scoring just one run, and 2-0 when scoring more.

TOP OF THE ORDER: The FredNat top of the order, which had previously hit just .179 (14/78) between the usual top three (Fien, James, Dickerson) over the previous 10 games, came alive Friday night. The top four in the order produced six extra base hits, with every member collecting a double, in addition to homers by Coy James and Gavin Fien. Saturday night, Luke Dickerson reached base on a walk, and the rest of the FredNat top four collected three of the team's four hits in the game.

BOTTOM OF THE ORDER: The bottom five in the FredNat order has also struggled, with their woes continuing throughout the entire series with Wilson. All in all, the bottom five in the order were 5/59 (.101) during the final three games of the series with Wilson.

EXTRA, EXTRA: The FredNats improved to 6-1 in extra innings Thursday night win a 7-3 win. On the season, the FredNats won their first five extra inning games, before dropping the first in Myrtle Beach, a walk-off grand slam off position player Christian Fagnant. Overall, the FredNats have outscored opponents 9-1 in extra inning wins this year.

DRAFT SIGNINGS: Washington signed 18/20 picks from the 2026 draft, missing just two high school draftees from the 16th and 17th rounds. The class was highlighted by college bats Chris Hacopian (Texas A&M) and Chase Brunson (TCU) in the top two rounds. August 4 brought the first member of the 2026 class to Fredericksburg, as C Cashel Dugger, the Nationals' ninth round pick from UCLA, reported from the FCL. Dugger, who is set to debut in the series opener, will become the fastest National to appear in Single-A post-draft in FredNats history, beating out Dylan Crews in 2023 by one day.

HOME STRETCH: 31 games now remain in the regular season for the FredNats as they look to defend their second-half title from last year. The FredNats are guaranteed to host game two and three (if necessary) of both the division and league championship series.

ABOUT DELMARVA: Single-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles and members of the Carolina League since 2021, Delmarva has served as one of Fredericksburg's chief rivals since reorganization. An active team during this year's trade deadline, the Orioles acquired OF Jhonardo Reyes from Minnesota, adding a sixth member of the Orioles top 30 to Delmarva's roster this week.

A RECORD BREAKING SEASON: Clinching a title on June 7 with a win against Hill City, the FredNats followed their title by winning their 46th game of the first half the following Wednesday, besting the 1982 Alexandria Dukes' 45-20 first half to break the franchise record.

ANOTHER RECORD FALLS: The FredNats broke another record earlier this year, as the fastest team in franchise history to 50 wins. The previous record (as far back as game-by-game data exists to 2004), was set by 2013 Potomac, who needed 80 games. The record since relocation belonged to the 2024 team, who needed 85 games, with 2026 FredNats Austin Amaral and Travis Sthele winning games 49 and 50.

ABOUT LAST YEAR: The FredNats finished last season at 65-64 overall, winning the North division's second-half title to advance to the playoffs for the second straight year. The FredNats' season ended in a 2-0 series loss to Hill City in the Division Series.

FREDNATS BASEBALL NETWORK IS BACK: Once again, all 132 FredNat games this season will be broadcast live on the FredNats Baseball Network, with Luke West Poley and Adam Gotkin beginning their first seasons calling the action in Fredericksburg. Home games are broadcast on MiLB.tv and the Bally Sports Live App to go along with the audio-only stream at frednats.com/broadcast or the MiLB App. For road games, the radio broadcast is available at the same link. In addition, all FredNats games preceded by a 20 minute pregame show and postgame coverage following each night of action.

A LASTING LEGACY: The Fredericksburg Nationals adopt the franchise history of their predecessors in the Carolina League dating back to 1978...the Alexandria Dukes (1978, 1980-83) and Alexandria Mariners (1979) played at Four Mile Run Park in Alexandria, Virginia...the Prince William Pirates (1984-1986), Prince William Yankees (1987-1988), Prince William Cannons (1989-1998), Potomac Cannons (1999-2004) and Potomac Nationals (2005-2019) played at G. Richard Pfitzner Stadium in Woodbridge, Virginia...the franchise has won six Carolina League championships, as the Dukes in 1982, as the Yankees in 1989, and as the Potomac Nationals in 2008, 2010 and 2014. The franchise won its first league title as the Fredericksburg Nationals in 2024, defeating the Kannapolis Cannon Ballers and winning the title at Virginia Credit Union Stadium. The franchise has appeared in the Carolina League playoffs in three out of the last four seasons, and are playoff bound again in 2026 after the team's first-half division title.

1st Season | Previously: Hitting Coach/Recruiting Coordinator, Virginia Commonwealth University

O'Neill, 36, joins the Nationals organization after two seasons (2024-25) as a hitting coach/recruiting coordinator at Virginia Commonwealth University. Prior to that, he served as an assistant coach and assistant recruiting coordinator at George Washington from 2022-24.

O'Neill is credited with helping fuel major offensive surges at both VCU and George Washington, as both schools set offensive records and contended for Atlantic 10 championships under his watch. O'Neill spent the 2021 season as the director of operations at Duke University and prior to that, he served as an assistant coach at Bucknell University (2020), Marshall University (2018-19) and the University of Maryland-Eastern Shore (2017).

This season will be O'Neill's first time managing since he led the Grand Lake Mariners (Great Lakes Summer Collegiate League) in the summers of 2016 and 2017. A Pennsylvania native, he received his Bachelor's degree in Education from King's College in 2012. O'Neill and his wife Kate have two boys, Easton and Callum.

Dziados earned his Bachelor's degree from Binghamton in 2021 and also earned a Graduate Certificate in Leadership from Villanova in 2023.

1st Season | Previously: Player Development Assistant, California State University, Northridge

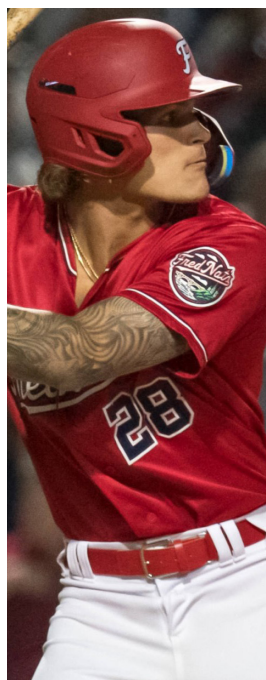

FredNats Career:

Brady House, drafted by Washington 11th overall in the 2021 MLB Draft, played for the Fredericksburg Nationals in the 2022 and 2023 seasons. The infielders first first professional season was cut short due to injuries. In his second season in Single-A, House entered the year as a top-50 prospect in baseball, and dominated, playing in just 36 games, . hitting .297 with a .500 slugging percentage, before being called up to High-A Wilmington

Current Success:

House debuted in the Majors on June 16, 2025, at 22-years-old. He has since split time between the big leagues and Triple-A Rochester. The former first round pick played first base for the first time in his professional career the other night, with Washington, signaling the organizations belief in his bat. House is hitting .250 since being called back up to Washington on July 26th.
