YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Baysox, 6-1. Creed Willems hit an RBI single in the bottom of the first inning for Chesapeake's only run. John Michael Bertrand threw 5.2 innings and allowed one run with four strikeouts in his start. In the third, Carter Howell tied the score with an RBI single. Jairo Pomares hit a go-ahead single in the fourth for a 2-1 lead. In the fifth, Turner Hill plated Diego Velasquez with a sacrifice fly and Adrian Sugastey added an RBI single to extend the lead to 4-1. In the top of the seventh, Sabin Ceballos launched a two-run homer, his second in the last two games, to open a 6-1 lead. Richmond relievers Dylan Hecht, Marques Johnson and Tyler Myrick combined for 3.1 scoreless innings to finish the game.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the second of a three-game home series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This is the third set between these two teams this year. From Tuesday through Thursday, the Baysox went 2-1 at The Diamond, winning the final two games. The Baysox won four-of-six at The Diamond from April 15-20. The Flying Squirrels will return to Prince George's Stadium for the final series between the two teams from August 19-24.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks sixth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS lost two-of-three against the Baysox at home earlier this week after falling in four-of-six in last week's series against the Fightin Phils to open the second half, splitting the first four before dropping the last two. Of Richmond's 52 losses this season, 29 of them have been by two runs or less (19 by one, 10 by two). Their 19 one-run losses are the most in the EL, two ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (253). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.54 ERA.

THE BAYSOX: went 1-5 to open the Eastern League's second half last week at home against the Curve before winning two-of-three in Richmond this week. Chesapeake's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including OF Enrique Bradfield Jr. (No. 3), RHP Braxton Bragg (No. 9), RHP Trey Gibson (No. 10), RHP Levi Wells (No. 11) and RHP Nestor German (No. 13). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list includes six Baysox players, including Bradfield (No. 2), German (No. 10), C/1B Creed Willems (No. 11), Gibson (No. 14), Bragg (No. 15) and Bright (No. 25).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.26 ERA (46 ER/127.0 IP) in 15 games. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 1.34 ERA (9 ER/60.2 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in their last road set at Altoona from June 17-22 was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander Manuel Mercedes makes his 15th Double-A start and his second against the Baysox. He last pitched on Sunday at The Diamond and allowed five runs over 3.2 innings in a loss. In his previous start against the Baysox on April 18 at The Diamond, he threw 5.2 scoreless innings and allowed three hits. Mercedes spent all of last season with High-A Eugene, going 4-9 with a 5.28 ERA. He was tied for second in the Northwest League in games started (25) and ranked fifth in innings pitched (116.0). Mercedes spent the prior two seasons with Low-A San Jose. In 2023, he went 3-6 with a 3.64 ERA in 25 outings (21 starts). He signed with the Giants in their 2019 international class. FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Trace Bright makes his 13th start of the season and the fifth of his career against the Flying Squirrels. He last pitched on Sunday against the Curve and allowed four runs over 2.2 innings in a no-decision. In his previous three starts from May 29-June 11, he went 0-1 with a 1.20 ERA (2 ER/15 IP). In part of three seasons with the Baysox, Bright has gone 2-16 with a 4.38 ERA in 43 outings, including 42 starts. Against the Flying Squirrels, Bright is 0-2 with a 5.09 ERA (10 ER/17.2 IP) in four starts. Bright was selected by the Orioles in the fifth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Auburn.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of Adrián Sugastey, Zach Morgan and Onil Perez have combined to catch 42 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 29 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has the third-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013) and **Andrew Susac** (31 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 42 runners caught stealing for his career is tied with **Andy Thomas** (2023-24) for fifth most in franchise history, one behind Johnny Monell (43 - 2011-12).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman Victor Bericoto has homered twice in his last nine games. He hit a solo homer last Wednesday and added another last Saturday. He has six homers with the Flying Squirrels this season, giving him 28 for his Richmond career dating back to 2023, which is the fourth-most in franchise history. He is two homers behind third-place **Jarrett Parker** (30). Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels on June 3.

SAVING THE DAY: Tyler Myrick recorded his fifth save of the season on Wednesday night in the completion of Tuesday's rain-suspended game against the Baysox. It was the 17th save of his Richmond career, tying home for seventh on the Flying Squirrels career saves list with **Heath Hembree**. He is three saves behind **Cody Hall** for sixth on the all-time list.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Diego Velasquez is ranked tied for fifth in hits (72), sixth in OBP (.367) and seventh in walks (40). Turner Hill is tied for second in triples (5). Seth Lonsway is sixth in innings pitched (75.1), eighth in ERA (3.58) and tied for eighth in strikeouts (71). **John Michael Bertrand** is first in innings pitched (83.2) and seventh in ERA (3.55). **Joe Whitman** is tied for eighth in strikeouts (72). **Jack Choate** is tied for eighth in strikeouts (71).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager Dennis Pelfrey has led the team to 229 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including Joe Whitman (No. 5), Diego Velasquez (No. 10), Sabin Ceballos (No. 21) and Jack Choate (No. 26). John Michael Bertrand is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1958: The Richmond Virginians beat the Havana Sugar Kings, 5-3, at Parker Field. Deron Johnson hit two homers for the Vees, both solo shots, giving him 16 for the season. His first was in the fourth inning, kicking off a four-run inning to overcome a 3-0 deficit. He hit his second homer in the seventh inning to cap the scoring. 1960: The Richmond Virginians beat the Miami Marlins, 10-9, at Parker Field. Richmond led, 9-3, before Miami scored four runs in the eighth and two in the ninth to tie the score. Jim Pisoni led off the ninth with a game-ending homer to left. 1981: The Richmond Braves beat the Toledo Mud Hens, 7-6, at Parker Field. In the third, Ron Washington gave Toledo a 2-1 lead with a two-run homer and scored two more runs after an error in the fourth for a 4-1 lead. In the bottom of the fourth, Randy Johnson hit a solo homer, Larry Whisenton, Mike Miller and Brett Butler hit RBI singles to give Richmond a 5-4 lead. Chico Ruiz singled in a run in the fifth to open a 6-4 lead. Toledo tied the score, 6-6, in the eighth with a two-run homer by Mark Funderburk. Tied, 6-6, entering the bottom of the ninth, Craig Landis won the game with a solo homer. 2011: The Flying Squirrels beat the Trenton Thunder twice. After being suspended for rain in the bottom of the second inning on the previous night, Richmond beat Trenton, 5-1, in the completion. Eric Surkamp pitched out of the bullpen and struck out 11 over 5.2 scoreless innings. In the second game, which was shortened to seven innings, the Flying Squirrels won, 9-6. Trenton led 5-2 until the bottom of the fifth, when Juan Perez hit an RBI triple to pull the score to 5-3. Trenton's Corban Joseph hit a solo homer in the top of the seventh to extend the lead to 6-3. In the bottom of the seventh, an error by Joseph plated a run. Johnny Monell worked a bases-loaded walk to cut the deficit to 6-5. After a strikeout for the second out, Francisco Peguero hit a walk-off grand slam to win the game, 9-6. It was the first walk-off
