TODAY'S HEADLINES

That Was Last Night - St. Paul used three home runs from Brent Rooker, Ryan Jeffers and Jimmy Kerrigan to power their way to a 6-1 win over the Iowa Cubs last night. RHP Griffin Jax pitched five innings, only giving up one run on five hits.

Today's Game - Today the Saints will try to win back-to-back games for the first time this season. Bailey Ober will make his second start of the season, after his first was cut short due to rain on May 8th. The Cubs will send #15 prospect Cory Abbott to the hill for his second start.

Rooker's Good Reads - OF Brent Rooker is currently the Triple-A East leader in walks, drawing ten this season. He's gotten on base in seven straight games, with a on-base percentage of .500 in that stretch. Rooker has two games with three walks this season.

Refsnyder's Rips - Saints' OF Rob Refsnyder is off to a hot start this season. He is currently riding a seven-game on-base streak, with a .424 on-base percentage in that span. He leads the team in runs and is also tied for the team lead in HRs.

Trying to get them over and in- The Saints batters this year have had some issues stringing hits together through the first week of the season. When there are runners on base, St. Paul is batting .189 so far, while their opponents are hitting .267 with men on.

Krushed by K's - Omaha's pitching staff struck out 19 Saints on May 6th, which was detrimental to a St. Paul offense that left the bases loaded three times in the game. That's the most strikeouts for the Twins Triple-A affiliate dating back to at least the start of the 2018 season.

A Clean Sheet, Sort Of - Despite giving up eight runs on four home runs and seven total extra-base hits on May 4th, the Saints pitching staff did not issue a walk in the game. That's the first time that the Twins' Triple-A affiliate has not given up a walk since August 3rd, 2019 when Rochester did not walk a batter against Pawtucket.

Roster Notes - The Minnesota Twins have optioned INF Nick Gordon back to St. Paul and recalled RHP Shaun Anderson on Monday.

Twins Update - The Twins dropped their second-straight game to the Chicago White Sox last night by a score of 13-8. Chicago scored multiple runs in the first, second, fourth and fifth innings. Former Saint Trevor Larnach got his first MLB hit, a double in the ninth inning.

- Was not a member of the Twins' 60-man player pool, but was added to the 40-man roster on November 20th.
- Ranked the 30th best prospect in the Twins' system by MLB.com in December
- The 2019 season saw Ober play at 3 levels in the Twins' organization. He started in the GCL and finished at Double-A Pensacola and finished with a perfect 8-0 record and a 0.69 ERA that was best amongst Twins' minor league pitchers (min 75.0 IP). During that season, he held righties to a .183 average and lefties at a .206 clip.
- In 2018 he won the Twins' Minor League Pitcher of the Week award in consecutive weeks, making him the first Twin to win it twice in one season, won it again twice in 2019.
- Pitched at the College of Charleston from 2014-17. Went 24-9 over the course of his career with a 2.91 ERA. He was also named the 2014 NCBWA National Freshman Pitcher of the Year. He then missed the 2015 season after needing "Tommy John" surgery.

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Brewers alternate training site, reuniting with them after spending 2016-18 with Milwaukee.
- Saw Big League action with 3 different teams in 2019, suiting up for the New York Mets before being traded to the Baltimore Orioles and then being claimed off waivers by the Seattle Mariners hitting a combined .167 for the season.
- Was a 20-20 player in the Majors in 2017 hitting .220/20/49 and stealing 21 bases. Broxton was 5th in speed at 29.4 ft/sec. 30 ft/sec is elite & average is 27.0 ft/sec
- Played 2B and SS at Lakeland HS. On that team was Evan Chambers (3rd round pick by Pirates in 2009 & passed away in 2013), Drew Hutchison (15th round pick out of HS in 2009, 98 Major League pitching appearances) & Chris Sale (13th overall pick in 2010 out of FGCU)
- Chose baseball at Santa Fe (FL) CC instead of a football scholarship at FAU, went on to reach the JUCO World Series in 2009, finishing as the runner-up

- Spent 2015-2018 playing rookie ball before getting the promotion to Cedar Rapids. He hit a career-high .318 in 2017 with the DSL Twins.

- league debut, and just the 13th MLB player to do so since 1901.
- Was recalled from the Twins' Alternate Training Site on April 23, but did not appear in a game.
- Missed 2020 season due to an undisclosed injury, but was ranked the Twins' 16th best prospect by MLB.com.
- Spent the 2019 season with the Twins' Triple-A affiliate in Rochester. Hit .298 with 40 RBIs and hit .307 with 27 XBH against RHP. He also led the club in stolen bases with 14 and was second in 2B with 29.
- Half-brother is Dee Gordon (4th round pick by Dodgers in 2008 out of Seminole (FL) CC) and Dad is Tom "Flash" Gordon (6th round pick by the Royals in 1986 out of Avon Park (FL) HS). Tom played 23 seasons of pro ball, 21 in the Majors (only 69 players have played more seasons) as a pitcher for eight different teams.
- Had committed to Florida State before being drafted by the Twins.
- Selected to the 2017 Futures Game in Florida, home of where his brother Dee played. Dee played in the Futures Game in 2010 (Dee and the Marlins were in San Francisco the day of the Futures Game)

27 JEFFERS, RYAN C

Last Series: 6-22, 2B HR, 6RBI, SF

Current Series: 2-7, 2B, HR, R, 2RBI, BB

- Started the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site in St. Paul, making his MLB debut on August 20th. He played 26 games wiith the Twins, batting .273 with three home runs and seven RBIs.
- He crushed left-handed pitching with Minnesota, hitting .300 with a .417 OBP.
- Going into 2020 he was fourth best Twins' prospect and and the best defensive catcher in the system by *Baseball America*. He caught the third-most games amongst rookie catchers in the majors with 25.
- Jeffers started in professional baseball on a tear in 2018 with Elizabethton, he played 28 games hitting .422 with a .543 OBP and a staggering 1.121 OPS.
- Among all Twins catchers with a minimum 150 innings caught at the major league level, Jeffers is third in catcher ERA at a 3.89. He is only behind Butch Wynegar with a 3.73 in 1976 and Joe Mauer with a 3.36 in 2004.

31 KERRIGAN, JIMMY OF

Last Series: 0-5, 2R, BB

Current Series: 2-7, HR, R, RBI

- Has made two appearances in Triple-A, making appearances in 2018 and 2019 with Triple-A Rochester. He's played a combined 24 games at the Triple-A level and hit a total .266 with seven home runs, six of which came in his 2019 stint.
- In 2018 he was named a Florida State League All-Star after hitting .281 in the first half of the season, which earned him a promotion to Double-A Chattanooga.
- Spent a season in the independent Frontier League in 2017. At the time that the Twins signed him from the River City Rascals, he led his team in hits, average, home runs, RBIs and doubles.
- After going undrafted in 2016, took an internship with a gym near Richmond, VA where he finished his college career at VCU. That led to contacts with independent league coaching staffs that kept his baseball career alive.

4 OZORIA, DANIEL INF

- Started 2021 with Low-A Fort Myers, collecting his first hit of the season in his last game before being sent to St. Paul.
- Finished the 2019 season at Low-A with Cedar Rapids, and started the 2021 season with Low-A Fort Myers, has never played a game above that level having spent the 2017, 2018 and part of the 2019 season in rookie ball.
- Born on 8/4/2000, Ozoria is the youngest player on the roster, and the first Saints' player to be born in the year 2000. At 135lbs, he is also the lightest player in St. Paul, 35lbs lighter than anyone else listed on the roster.
- Stole 15 bases, and got caught just once in 2019, after swiping just six bags the year before. That was six short of his career high 21 steals in his first season in 2017.
- Started his career with Los Angeles (AL), before being flipped to the Twins in January of 2019 in exchange for RHP John Curtiss.

56 PENA, ROBERTO C

Last Series: 3-6, HR, 3RBI, R, BB

Current Series:

- Peña is on his fifth Triple-A team, having previously played on Fresno, Charlotte, Durham, Salt Lake and now St. Paul.
- Did not see any action in 2020, but did play in the Puerto Rican Winter League, which he has played in every off-season since 2011.
- Got an invite to Major League Spring Training in 2019 with the Los Angeles Angels.
- In 2015 he set a Corpus Christi Hooks record and led the Texas League by throwing out 49% of would-be base stealers.
- Was named an MiLB and Rawlings Gold Glove winner in 2014 with Adv.-A Lancaster who won the California League title. He threw out 56.5% of baserunners (52 of 92) which led the league.
- Was originally a shortstop in high school, but as he grew he needed to move to either third base or catcher. Upon testing his pop times, his first was 1.87 and had one as low as 1.76 and stuck with it since.

2 REFSNYDER, ROB OF

Last Series: 7-24, 2B, 2HR, 4RBI, 5R, HBP, 4BB

Current Series: 0-6, RBI, BB

- Twins are the seventh organization for Refsnyder, having been in the Yankees, Blue Jays, Rays, Reds, Diamondbacks and Rangers organizations before arriving in the Twin Cities.
- Was drafted as an outfielder by the Yankees in 2012, but was converted to a second baseman before returning to the outfield in 2017.
- Has made two Opening Day rosters in his career: Texas (2020) and Tampa Bay (2018).
- He spent all of the 2020 season with the Rangers, hitting .200 across 15 games.
- Over the course of 427 Triple-A games leading into the 2021 season, Refsnyder has a career average of .296 at Triple-A.
- When being promoted to the Yankees in 2015, he became the fourth South-Korean player to make the majors.

ACQUIRED: Signed with the Minnesota Twins as a minor league free agent on 11/23/20.

12 RIDDLE, JT INF/OF

Last Series: 5-23, 2 2B, 2RBI 2R, BB, IBB

Current Series: 1-7, BB

- Played 4 games with Minnesota already this season, getting two hits in six plate appearances, while scoring a run
- Has played with two other big league clubs: Miami and Pittsburgh. He had spent the whole 2020 season with the Pirates, batting .149 with two doubles and a home run.
- A true utility man, spent time with Pittsburgh at: third base, shortstop, left, center and right field, as well as second base and an appearance at first base.
- Has played 85 games with Triple-A New Orleans (Miami), where he's batted .284 with ten home runs and 46 RBIs. In 2019 he had a career-high 10 doubles at Triple-A.

19 ROOKER, BRENT OF

Last Series: 5-20, HR, 3RBI, 2R, 8BB

Current Series: 1-6, HR, R, RBI, BB

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site, then had his contract selected on September 4th.
- Got hit by a pitch in the right forearm that placed him on the IL and ended his season on September 12th.
- While with the Twins, he reached base safely in all seven games he played, and collected a hit in his final six games.
- Got his first invite to Spring Training before the 2019 season. He spent the year with Triple-A Rochester, and was named a mid-season All-Star in the International League.
- Ranked the 12th best prospect in the Twins' system by MLB.com
- Played his college baseball at Mississippi State, where he won the Triple Crown in the SEC his junior season. He was also a finalist for the Dick Howser trophy for National Player of the Year after being named First Team All-SEC and SEC player of the year.
- He's a two-time Twins' draft pick, having been picked in the 38th round in 2016, but then picked again by Minnesota in 2017

- Spent the 2020 season at the Twins' Alternate Training Site. He was on the Taxi Squad several times during the season, and also remained with the club during several homestands to serve as a bullpen catcher.
- Had one of his best seasons at the plate in 2019, playing 82 games hitting .330 with 21 doubles, eight home runs and 46 RBIs leading to an .846 OPS.
- Has been on Triple-A rosters since 2014, spanning 441 games, and has a .308 average at Triple-A.
- Made the 2018 Opening Day roster with Miami, the first and only of his career.
- Signed back in 2007 with the Rangers as a shortstop before being converted to catcher full-time in 2009.

- A seven-year minor league veteran, Tomscha was originally a Phillies prospect from 2014-2019 when he was released by the Phillies and then signed by the White Sox organization.
- He's played 81 Triple-A games between Lehigh Valley and Charlotte, batting .205, but is a career .273 hitter.

41 ANDERSON, SHAUN RHP

Relief Highs - IP: 4.0 H: 3 SO: 4 BB: 2

- Was on the Giants' Opening Day roster last season, the first of his career. His first 16 career appearances came as a starter, but since 8/24/19 has been used exclusively as a reliever.
- In 2020, he inherited ten runners, allowing only three to score and help opponents to a .182 average.
- Threw his slider 53.4% of the time last season, which was eighth among right-handers (min. 250 pitches) and resulted in a 39% whiff percentage on that pitch. His opposition only hit .108 against the slider.
- Ended the 2020 season on a 5.1 inning scoreless streak that started on August 25th.
- Drafted with the last pick of the 40th round of the 2013 draft, making him the 15th winner of the MLB.com "Don't Count Him Out Award"
- Pitched in college at the University of Florida, was in the same class as Pete Alonso.

ACQUIRED: Traded to the Minnesota Twins from the San Francisco Giants on 2/4/21

26 COULOMBE, DANNY LHP

Relief Highs - IP: 3.0 H: 5 SO: 5 BB: 4

- Spent most of the 2020 season at the Alternate Training Site, had his contract selected on August 22nd and made two appearances with the Twins throwing 2.2 scoreless innings.
- Has spent parts of six of the last seven seasons on Major League rosters. He spent most of his time in the Bigs with Oakland, making 134 appearances with the A's over three seasons.
- The 2017 season called Coulombe's name 72 times with the A's. He was didn't allow a run in 57-of-72 games but pitched less than 1.0 IP in 42-of-72 outings.
- He was a two-time selection of the Los Angeles Dodgers draft pick. Once in the 17th round 2008, then opted for college and was picked again in the 25th round of the 2012 draft. Three years later, he was dealt to the A's.

ACQUIRED: Signed with the Minnesota Twins as a minor league free agent on 11/9/20

16 FARRELL, LUKE RHP

Relief Highs - IP: 5.0 H: 2 SO: 8 BB: 4

- Son of former Red Sox and Blue Jays manager John Farrell. Older brothers both work for Major League teams: Jeremy is a minor league field coordinator for the Chicago Cubs and Shane is an amateur scouting director for the Toronto Blue Jays.
- Made his MLB debut in 2017 against the Twins. His dad, John, took the day off managing the Red Sox to watch his son Pitch. Luke ended up with a no decision, meanwhile his father's team won 7-1.
- While in the minor leagues, he has appeared almost exclusively as a starter, but in his time in the majors, he has come out of the bullpen 39 of his 43 career appearances.
- Twins are his sixth organization (Royals, Reds, Dodgers, Cubs and Rangers).

ACQUIRED: Signed with the Minnesota Twins as a minor league free agent on 12/14/20

57 GIBAUT, IAN RHP

Relief Highs - IP: 3.0 H: 5 SO: 7 BB: 4

- Spent the 2020 season with the Texas Rangers. Had his contract selected on July 23rd. Was optioned to the Alternate Training Site in August while he led the team in appearances with 14.
- Allowed runs in just five of his 14 games, he held lefties to a .192 average, while righties fared a bit better, hitting .273 against him.
- Prior to his time with Texas, he was a member of the Tampa Bay Rays organization, where Baseball America ranked him the 18th best Rays' prospect after the 2018 season.
- During the 2018 campaign, he was named an International League All-Star with the Durham Bulls.
- Has had his run-ins with injuries, missing his junior season of HS and most of his sophomore year of college due to injury.

ACQUIRED: Claimed off of waivers from the Texas Rangers on 10/30/20

44 HAMILTON, IAN RHP

Relief Highs - IP: 2.2 H: 6 SO: 5 BB: 3

- Has spent his whole playing career with the White Sox prior to suiting up in the Twins organization in the 2021 season. He was claimed off of waivers twice in the 2020 offseason, by Seattle in September and then Philadelphia in December.
- Made four appearances in 2020 with the White Sox. He pitched four innings, giving up two earned runs.
- Prior to the 2020 season, was ranked as the White Sox #18 prospect.
- In 2018, he was named the second best relief prospect in the White Sox' system behind Zach Burdi. He was also named a Southern League All-Star with Birmingham that season as well.
