Today is a Grand Slam School Day Doubleheader between the Lansing Lugnuts and the Dayton Dragons, making up a postponement from April 4. These are the second and third games in a seven-game, six-day series between the two clubs, part of an 18-game series. The Nuts are 2-1 against Dayton this season and 239-193 all-time vs. the Dragons dating back to 2000.

**Yesterday: Lansing Locos 11, Dragons 6.** Lansing collected nine walks (three by **Devin Taylor**) and ten hits (three by **Bobby Boser**, each immediately following a Taylor walk), built leads of 4-0 and 5-3, relinquished them, and then scored six unanswered runs against the Dayton bullpen to romp to the series-opening victory. **Nate Nankil** blasted his first home run of the season in the win.

### LUG-NOTES

**Prospecting:** The Nuts' roster has No. 8 (**Devin Taylor**), No. 16 (**Steven Echavarria**), No. 19 (**Zane Taylor**), No. 26 (**Nate Nankil**) and No. 30 (**Bobby Boser**) on MLB Pipeline's Top 30 rankings of Athletics prospects.

**All Aboard:** Shortstop **Bobby Boser** has reached base in 19 straight games (23 hits, 12 walks and four HBPs). **Davis Diaz** has reached base in 17 straight games (21 hits, 16 walks, one HBP).

**Cincinnati's Own:** Outfielder **Devin Taylor**, born in the Queen City, is slashing .404/.486/.649 in his last 16 games, going 23-for-57 with five doubles, three home runs, three steals, and 11 walks.

**No Relief for the Enemy:** The Nuts are the best offense in the Midwest League at hitting relief pitching, ranking 1st in batting average (.291) and base hits (115), and 2nd in on-base percentage (.400). Leading the way: **Carlos Franco** (6-for-14, .429 avg., .971 OPS); **Justin Riemer** (9-for-24, 13 BB, .375 avg., .579 OBP, 1.121 OPS); **Davis Diaz** (13-for-35, .371 avg., .476 OBP, 1.076 OPS); **Bobby Boser** (15-for-41, .366 avg., .491 OBP, 1.076 OPS).

**Going Deep:** Lansing's starting rotation has tossed the most innings in the Midwest League (98 1/3), just above Dayton (94 1/3). No other staff has thrown more than 85 innings.

**Milestone Watch:** Lansing is eight wins away from the 2,000 in Lugnuts history and 3 players away from 1,000 players all-time.

**Cooperstown Bound:** An original 1996 Lugnut as a member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** went to be voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, was named a nine-time All-Star, and won three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and the 2017 World Series during a 20-year MLB career. On July 27, Beltrán will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown.

**Miller Time:** The most dominant former Lugnut in the Majors is untouchable Padres closer / 2022 Lugnut **Mason Miller**... but Mason had his 35 2/3-inning scoreless streak stopped Monday, giving up two runs on three hits in an inning in a 9-7 win over the Cubs. Of his 37 appearances since joining the Padres, 35 have been scoreless – not including his four scoreless innings in the WBC for Team USA.

**Major League Nut:** The 201st Lugnut to reach the Major Leagues, 2023 Lugnuts catcher **Daniel Susac**, has opened his career batting .478 (11-for-23) with two doubles and a triple through 11 games with the Giants. Debuting on April 1, Susac hit safely in his first five at-bats, setting a new Giants modern-day franchise record and coming up one shy of the Major League modern-day franchise record set by Boston OF Ted Cox in 1977. Susac was taken in the Rule 5 Draft by Minnesota and traded to San Francisco.

**Player of the Week, April 7-12:** The first Midwest League Player of the Week was 23-year-old Lansing C/3B **Davis Diaz**, who batted .611 (11-for-19) while reaching base 16 times and scoring nine runs in five games at Fort Wayne. Diaz added four doubles, four walks, one HBP, and two runners caught stealing.

### APRIL 29TH IN LUGNUGS HISTORY

**2001:** Aaron Krawiec sets a franchise record with 17 strikeouts in eight shutout innings, allowing two hits and no walks, as the Lugnuts defeated the South Bend Silver Hawks, 2-0. 2000 Cubs third-rounder Krawiec struck out 14 of the first 18 batters and pitched 6 1/3 innings of no-hit baseball. The gem earned him the honor of Midwest League Pitcher of the Week.

**2008:** The Lugnuts had 14 hits, the River Bandits had eight, and yet it took only two hours and six minutes for the Nuts to win, 3-1, at Clinton's Alliant Energy Field. Randy Boone tossed six scoreless innings, striking out four. This was the second game of a three-game series played in three different Iowa cities due to the Mississippi River flooding around the ballpark

**MLB Pipeline's No. 16 A's prospect / No. 7 pitcher** (behind Jamie Arnold, Gage Jump, Wei-En Lin, Braden Nett, Kade Morris, Shotaro Mori); grades: Fastball 55, Curve 45, Slider 55, Changeup 45, Control 45, Overall 40... topped the 2025 Lugnuts in starts (25)... closed out the A's Spring Breakout win vs. MIL... posted quality start last time out (6 IP, 3 R at QC).

**2026 Campaign:** 2026 Lugnuts Opening Day starter, gave up 2 R in 1st inning vs. Dayton, April 2, but that was all; finished with 4 2/3 IP, 4 H, 2 R, 1 BB, 4 K on 74 pitches, 52 strikes; Lugnuts brought 6-2 lead to 7th, but lost 8-7... in second start, limited Fort Wayne to only one hit while striking out six and walking four in five scoreless innings at Parkview Field, April 8, earning his first win of the year; 71 pitches, 45 strikes; Casey Yamauchi homered twice in a 15-1 laugh.

**Gatorade, Not Gator:** Echavarría posted a 0.28 ERA with 80 strikeouts in 50 innings as a senior at Millburn High School, allowing only one extra-base hit the whole season. He was named New Jersey's 2022-2023 Gatorade High School Baseball Player of the Year and the top prep prospect in the state. Initially committed to Oregon, he changed his commitment to the University of Florida as his senior year dawned, but then signed with the A's for \$3 million to head into professional baseball – the only New Jersey high schooler taken in the 2023 MLB Draft.

**Pro Ball:** After signing, Echavarría debuted in instructional league ball in 2023. He was slated to pitch in the 2024 Spring Breakout for the A's against the Giants, but the game was canceled due to rain. On May 2, 2024, Game 22 of the Stockton Ports' season, he made his official professional debut, starting against Visalia and working three scoreless innings before allowing two unearned run in the fourth... posted 9.00 ERA in six May starts (20 R/18 ER in 18 IP)... limited opposition to one run or fewer in nine of his final 13 starts of the year, including stretch from June 25-August 4 with just 2 ER allowed in 25 2/3 IP... vs. right-handers: .306/.386/.387, 1 HR, 5 GiDP... vs. left-handers: .316/.431/.474, 3 HR, 1 GiDP... best inning was the fourth inning: 3-for-26, .115 avg. against... base-stealers were successful in 11 of 13 attempts.
