YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Senators, 11-3. Harrisburg opened a 2-0 lead in the first with an RBI groundout by James Wood and a run-scoring single by Frankie Tostado. In the bottom of the first, the Flying Squirrels tied the game with a pair of runs. Shane Matheny drove an RBI single and was later caught in a rundown between first and second, during which Marco Luciano scored from third base. The Senators took a 3-2 lead in the second on an error and added seven runs in the fourth to pull ahead, 10-2. Trey Lipscomb added an RBI single in the seventh to extend the lead to 11-2. In the bottom of the seventh, Brandon Martorano hit a solo home run, his third of the year.

TODAY'S GAME: The Richmond Flying Squirrels play the third and fourth of a six-game series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. The second game of tonight's doubleheader serves as a make-up game for Wednesday's rainout. Richmond played six games in Harrisburg from April 11-16 and dropped four of them, three by one run. The Flying Squirrels return to Harrisburg for a three-game series from July 14-16. The Senators will play a second six-game set at The Diamond from August 15-20.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS were 14-7 through their first 21 games but are 15-29 since May 3. For the year, the Richmond offense has combined for a .227 batting average, which is 11th in the Eastern League. The Flying Squirrels' 3.94 ERA is third-best in the league. Richmond starters have thrown 232.0 innings, which is the fewest in Double-A. Richmond relievers have thrown 330.0 innings this year, the most in Double-A. The Flying Squirrels bullpen has a 3.44 ERA, which is the eighth-lowest in Double-A and is sixth-lowest of the 120 teams in the minors. Richmond is for the fourth-most one-run games is the league this year (21) with Portland, trailing Bowie, Harrisburg and Somerset (22 each), and they lead the league in one-run losses (16), ahead of Harrisburg (13).

THE SENATORS are in fourth place in the Southwest Division, five games behind first-place Erie. They have dropped six-of-their-last-nine games, including four-of-six in last week's series at home against the SeaWolves. The Harrisburg offense has scored 284 runs, tied for the fewest in the Eastern League this year. Harrisburg relievers are tied for the league lead with 20 saves. Harrisburg's roster features seven of Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including OF James Wood (No. 1), OF Robert Hassell III (No. 2), RHP Jackson Rutledge (No. 6), RHP Cole Henry (No. 13), 3B Trey Lipscomb (No. 17), LHP Mitchell Parker (No. 24) and OF Jacob Young (No. 27). Hassell is rated by Baseball America as the best hitter for average and the best strike-zone discipline in the system. Evan Lee is rated as having the best curveball in the system. MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects list includes Wood (No. 1), Hassell (No. 2), Rutledge (No. 11), Henry (No. 12), Lipscomb (No. 18) and Parker (No. 22).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander Carson Whisenhunt makes his third Double-A start in Game 1. He started the series-opener last Tuesday in Bowie and allowed a career-high four runs over 3.2 innings. All four runs scored with two outs in the fourth inning, his Double-A debut on June 7, he threw five scoreless innings on May 31 at Vancouver and struck out seven straight batters from the third through fifth innings. He was named the Northwest League Pitcher of the Month for May. During his time in High-A, Whisenhunt led the Northwest League in ERA (1.42), strikeouts (36), BAA (.107) and WHIP (0.67). He allowed one-or-less hits in five-of-his-six starts for the Emeralds. Whisenhunt began the season with the Low-A San Jose Giants before being promoted to Eugene on April 26. A native of Winston-Salem, N.C., Whisenhunt pitched two seasons at East Carolina University in Greenville, N.C. He was selected by the Giants in the second round (66th overall) in the 2022 MLB Draft. Whisenhunt is rated by Baseball America as the No. 8 Giants prospect and No. 8 by MLB.com. For more on Whisenhunt, see page two.

Right-hander **Carson Seymour** takes the mound for his ninth Double-A start in Game 2 and his second of the year against the Senators. He last pitched last Friday in Bowie and allowed one run over our innings for the second straight outing. He last faced the Senators on April 13 in Harrisburg and surrendered three runs over four innings in a loss. He leads the Eastern League and ranks tied for eighth in the minors (min. 45 IP) in HR/9 (0.18). The only homer he has allowed this season was in his start at Harrisburg to Frankie Tostado. A native of Poway, Calif., Seymour was selected by the New York Mets in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Kansas State University. After making four appearances in 2021, he began the 2022 season with Low-A St. Lucie, where he went 4-0 with a 1.19 ERA in seven outings (four starts). He was promoted to High-A Brooklyn on May 23 for 11 outings before being traded to the Giants on August 2 as part of the deal that sent Darin Ruf to the Mets. Seymour closed the year with High-A Eugene, going 2-3 with a 3.99 ERA in six starts. Seymour is rated by Baseball America as the No. 12 Giants prospect and No. 17 by MLB.com. *For more on Seymour, see page three.*

FOR HARRISBURG: Left-hander Dustin Saenz makes his second Double-A start in Game 1. He last pitched on June 10 against the Fisher Cats at FNB Field in his Double-A debut and surrendered four runs over 3.2 innings in a loss. Saenz began the season with High-A Wilmington and went 2-2 with a 1.97 ERA in 10 outings (eight starts). He was selected by the Nationals in the fourth round in 2021 out of Texas A&M. Saenz split last season between Low-A Fredericksburg and High-A Wilmington, going 6-8 wit a 4.73 ERA in 21 starts.

In Game 2, Alemao Hernandez makes his seventh Double-A start and eighth appearance of the year for the Senators. He last pitched out of the bullpen on Sunday against the SeaWolves and threw two scoreless innings. He started the opener of last week's series against Erie on Tuesday and worked six innings, matching his longest outing of the year, surrendering four runs, which also tied a season high. Hernandez was originally signed by the Dodgers in 2016 out of Mexico. He signed with the Nationals as a free agent on March 10.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all of Double-A in total attendance (406,560) and average attendance (6,160) for the first time in franchise history. This year, the Flying Squirrels are again at the top of the level in average attendance (6.589) and rank first in total attendance (224,012). The team's average attendance is the 12th-highest among the 120 full-season teams in Minor League Baseball.

LDVE LUCI: On June 4, **Marco Luciano** hit a grand slam and a two-run homer in the Flying Squirrels' 11-2 win. It was the fourth multi-homer game of his career. He went deep again with a two-run homer on Sunday afternoon and added a 432-foot, opposite-field two-run shot last Wednesday at Bowie. Luciano is tied for the team lead with nine homers this year. He went on a five-game hit streak from June 10-14, during which he hit .588 (10-for-17) with four homers, a double, five walks and 10 RBIs. Since then, he has gone 1-for-20 in his last five games.

WELCOME BACK, WADE: Wade Meckler was reinstated from the injured list last Saturday after missing 12 games. In his seven games back from the IL, he has reached base 14 times (seven hits and seven walks). With Richmond, Meckler has reached base 25 times, at least once in each of his 13 Double-A games, which is tied for the fourth-longest active on-base streak in the league. For the year, Meckler leads all minor league hitters (min. 140 PA) in batting average (.395).

ALL ABDARD THE SHANE TRAIN: Shane Matheny was assigned to the Richmond roster on June 13. In his season debut for the Flying Squirrels that night at Bowie, he hit a first-inning homer on the second pitch of the game. On Sunday, Matheny added three hits, including two doubles, and drove in three runs. In his eight games with Richmond this year, Matheny has three doubles, a homer, six RBIs and six walks.

OLD FRIENDS: Harrisburg's Frankie Tostado returns to The Diamond this week as a visitor for the first time in his career. He played 177 games for the Flying Squirrels in 2021 and 2022, batting .264 with 25 homers, 34 doubles and 104 RBIs. His 25 home runs are tied with **Sean Roby** for the fifth-most in a career in Flying Squirrels history. Tostado is one of four former Richmond players who are on other teams in the Eastern League this year. Diego Rincones, who was with the Flying Squirrels in 2021 and 2022, is now playing for the Erie SeaWolves. Pitcher Grey Fenter, a member of the 2022 Flying Squirrels, is now with the Somerset Patriots. Reliever Matt Seelinger was with Richmond in 2021 and is now in his second season with the Reading Fightin Phils.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, Hayden Cantrelle is eighth in OBP (.399). Tyler Fitzgerald is tied for third in triples (3). Kai-Wei Teng is tied for ninth in strikeouts (68). Mason Black is tied for second in games started (13).

PROSPECT WATCH: The Flying Squirrels have nine players ranked in Baseball America's Top-30 Giants prospects, including Marco Luciano (No. 1), Vaun Brown (No. 6), Carson Whisenhunt (No. 8), Mason Black (No. 9), Carson Seymour (No. 12), Landen Roupp (No. 13), Ryan Murphy (No. 20), Wade Meckler (No. 23) and Randy Rodriguez (No. 30). Luciano is also rated as the No. 63 prospect on Baseball America's Top 100. In Baseball America's "Best Tools" list, Luciano is rated as the best power hitter, Brown is rated as the best hitter for average and best athlete, Meckler is rated as having the best strike-zone discipline, Roupp is rated as having the best changeup. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list includes 10 Richmond players, including Luciano (No. 2, No. 18 overall), Brown (No. 5), Whisenhunt (No. 8), Black (No. 10), Roupp (No. 13), Seymour (No. 17), Rodriguez (No. 25), Murphy (No. 26), Cruz (No. 29) and Meckler (No. 30).
