LUG-NOTES

Streiking: **Jake Reinisch** enters today on a 41-game on-base streak, batting .299 with a .458 OBP and a .518 slugging pct. during the streak, with 41 base hits and 38 walks. It is the longest active streak in the minors. In case you were wondering, the longest in MLB history was Ted Williams' 84 games (July 1-Sept. 27, 1949).

Roll Call: The Lugnuts have suited up 54 different players this year, 26 position players and 28 pitchers (plus one scoreless inning from **Gunner Gouldsmith**).

No Place Like Home: The Nuts have won 14 of their last 17 home games.

Two for the Price of One: The Lugnuts lead all of High-A in turning double plays, 120. Fort Wayne is in second with 112 double plays.

Moving On Up: The Lugnuts have seen above-average roster movement, with 18 players moving to the upper levels of the minors...

- 2026 Nuts **Ryan Magdic**, **Jake Garland**, **Devin Taylor** and **Davis Diaz** have reached Triple-A Las Vegas.
- **Nathan Dettmer**, **Jay Dill**, **Steven Echavarria**, **Jackson Finley**, **Ben Hansen**, **Blaze Pontes**, **Zane Taylor**, **Logan Sauve**, **Bobby Boser**, **Ali Camarillo**, **Jared Sprague-Lott**, **Nate Nankil** and **Pedro Pineda** are with Double-A Midland.
- **Kyle Robinson** was traded to Pittsburgh, then swapped again to the Angels at the deadline; he is now with Double-A Rocket City.

Major League Lugnuts: Ten former Nuts have made their MLB debuts this season: **Daniel Susac** for the Giants, **Junior Perez** for the White Sox, **Eduardo Rivera** for the Red Sox, **Jack Weisenburger** with the NY Mets, and **Henry Bolte**, **Gage Jump**, **Kade Morris**, **Joshua Kuroda-Grauer**, **Tommy White** and **Yunior Tur** for the Athletics. In all 48 Lugnuts have appeared in a Major League game this season.

Playoff Perspective:

- While the Lugnuts and TinCaps play out the string, the Great Lakes Loons are up 1.5 games in the Midwest League East Division on West Michigan and 3.5 games on Lake County entering the day. The division champion will face the Dayton Dragons in East Division Final.
- In the California League, Stockton (31-31) trails Fresno (33-29) by 2.0 games for the final remaining North Division playoff berth.
- In the Texas League, Midland (28-31) trails first place Amarillo (34-25) by 6.0 games; the RockHounds are eliminated.
- And in the PCL, defending champion Las Vegas (33-26) is already in the postseason after winning the first half and is now waiting to see whom it will play in the championship series.

Cooperstownian Nut: A member of the very first Lugnuts lineup on April 5, 1996, **Carlos Beltrán** was inducted on July 26 into Cooperstown alongside Jeff Kent and Andruw Jones. In his 11th game with the Lugnuts (batting .143, 6-for-42, with one walk and 11 strikeouts), Beltrán suffered a right knee in an outfield collision. He flew back to the Royals' complex in Florida and never returned to Lansing, making his MLB debut on September 14, 1998, against the Oakland Athletics. A year later, Carlos was voted 1999 American League Rookie of the Year, and was on his way to a 20-year MLB career with 2,725 hits, 565 doubles, 78 triples, 435 homers, 312 homers, nine All-Star appearances, three Gold Gloves, two Silver Sluggers, the Roberto Clemente Humanitarian Award, and a 2017 World Series ring as a member of the Astros.

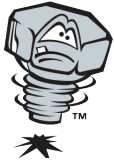

SEPTEMBER 3 IN LUGNUTS HISTORY

2011: It was 96 degrees in Dayton as Billy Hamilton went 2-for-3 with a sacrifice, stealing three bases to reach the 100-steal mark.

2012: In the final game of the regular season, the Lugnuts finished with an 82-55 record after scoring six runs in the 3rd – and then blowing the lead in absurd fashion, allowing Lake County to score three in the 4th, three in the 5th and then nine runs in the 7th inning. The Nuts lost, 15-6.

2022: Cooper Bowman hit a grand slam and Sahid Valenzuela stole home, helping the Lugnuts win at South Bend, 10-8. Mason Miller started the game, firing two innings, followed by two innings apiece from TJ Czyz, Mac Lardner and Brock Whittlesey before Calvin Coker wrapped up the ninth, striking out Pete Crow-Armstrong to end the game. Crow-Armstrong shattered his bat over his knee in frustration, upset by a strike call earlier in the at-bat.

Today is his 23rd start of the year, leaving him one behind Quad Cities' David Shields and Wisconsin's Ethan Dorchie for the league lead.

Personal: Pitched for 2019 USA Baseball 16U National Team Development Program... enjoys fishing... wears Oakleys in order to see the signs... first cousin is Riley Quick, Twins' No. 7 prospect and the 36th overall pick in the 2025 draft.

What a Year! As a senior at Westbrook Christian H.S., 1) threw four no-hitters, one a perfect game, as a senior, going 9-0, 0.40 ERA, 53 IP, 14 H, 5 BB, 117 K, and 2) batted .515 with .612 OBP, 4 HR, 39 RBI, leading Warriors to 2021 state title (first title in school history)... named Collegiate Baseball First Team All-American.

College - From Tiger to Tiger: Spent three years at LSU, one year at Auburn... ascended to Game 3 starter as true freshman at LSU in 2022, spent 2023 as reliever and was named SEC Academic Honor Roll (sport administration), majority reliever in 2024 (tossing 1 1/3 scoreless IP vs. Tennessee in SEC championship game)... transferred to AU for senior season and was named Second Team All-SEC (first Auburn player to earn All-SEC since 2018) and ABCA First Team All-Southeast Region... led Auburn in wins (7) and strikeouts (95), the most strikeouts for a Tiger since 2019... played with older brother Andrew at Auburn; Andrew had been at Birmingham-Southern for four years, forced to transfer when they shut their baseball program; he transferred in to Auburn for 2025 and blasting a home run in his only plate appearance of the year.
