Joe Whitman · LHP

Currently the No. 14 prospect in San Francisco's system, Whitman was selected in the second round out of Kent State in 2023. This is his first Double-A season, and the Akron, Ohio native has racked up the fifth-most strikeouts (95) in the Giants system. He posted a 2.75 ERA over 19.2 innings in July, with opposing batters hitting just .156 against him. Whitman features a three-pitch mix—a fastball (up to 97 mph), slider, and changeup—and currently projects as a starter.

Diego Velasquez -INF

Velasquez, the top signee from the Giants' 2021 international class, is ranked as the No. 21 prospect in San Francisco's system. Known more for his contact hitting than his batting power, the 20-year-old hit .313 for Richmond and has maintained a batting average above .274 at every level since the start of 2024. He's also swiped 51 total bases. Defensively, he is a steady shortstop; however, his arm strength may not be enough to keep him at the position in the Major Leagues. A utility role may be in Velasquez's future—but the outlook remains bright.

Seaver King -SS

Selected 10th overall in the 2024 Draft, King is Washington's No. 5 prospect. Following a collegiate career that began at Division II Wingate and ended at Wake Forest, he impressed in his first 20 professional games with Single-A Fredericksburg, hitting .295 with 10 steals. He opened the season at High-A Wilmington, where he hit .263, and was promoted to Double-A Harrisburg midseason. King is a contact hitter with the ability to drive the ball to any part of the field, but it's his speed and defensive presence at shortstop that makes him a name to watch in the coming years.


Jake Bennett -LHP

A former Oklahoma Sooner, Bennett was taken in the second round of the 2022 Draft. He dominated for Single-A Fredericksburg and quickly got the promotion to High-A Wilmington. However, his season was cut short by Tommy John surgery, which kept him out until 2025. Now back on the mound, Bennett posted a 1.90 ERA for Wilmington before earning a July promotion to Double-A Harrisburg. His imposing 6-foot-6, 234-pound frame allows his fastball to touch the upper-90s; however, Bennett's calling card is his control. He complements his fastball with a changeup, slider, and sinker.

· Roberto Mercado - MANAGER

Roberto Mercado returns for his second season as Chesapeake Baysox Manager in 2025 after completing his first year at the Double-A level last season. Named the 17th manager in franchise history in 2024, he led the Baysox to a 62-75 overall record, oversaw 18 player promotions to Triple-A and coached two former Baysox who would go on to make their Major League debuts in the same season. The New Britain, Connecticut native also managed the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League this past offseason, where he led them to a league-best 18-10 record and a Fall League Championship Game appearance.

Before joining the Baysox, Mercado spent two seasons as manager of the Orioles' High-A affiliate - the Aberdeen IronBirds. He led Aberdeen to a 147-120 record, including an appearance in the South Atlantic League Championship Series in 2022. Mercado received the Cal Ripken, Sr. Player Development Award in 2022 by the Orioles.

Prior to joining the Orioles, Mercado spent 17 years on the coaching staff at New Britain High School in Connecticut and served as Dean of Students for over 18 years.



· Jordie Henry - PITCHING COACH

Jordie Henry enters his first season as Baysox Pitching Coach in 2025 and his third season as a member of the Orioles' system. Previously, Henry served as the pitching coach at High-A Aberdeen where his staff recorded 1,357 strikeouts last season – 2nd-most in the South Atlantic League and 2nd-most in IronBirds franchise history. Before joining the Orioles, Henry was the Director of Pitching at Prime Sports Performance in Baltimore – a private athletic development training facility. He also worked as a pitching coach and instructor at the high school and summer collegiate levels. Henry pitched collegiality for four seasons at Wayland Baptist University.



· Gosh Bunselmeyer - HITTING COACH

Josh Bunselmeyer returns for his second season as Baysox Hitting Coach in 2025 and his sixth as a member of the Orioles' system. He joined the Baysox as hitting coach in 2024, after filling the same role for the Orioles' Single-A affiliate, the Delmarva Shorebirds, in 2023. He spent the previous three campaigns as a hitting coach in both the Florida Complex League and Dominican Summer League. Bunselmeyer played three seasons in the Independent Frontier League following a collegiate playing career at St. Louis University.

· Chase Sebby - FUNDAMENTALS COACH

Chase Sebby returns for his second season as Baysox Fundamentals Coach in 2025 and his fourth as a member of the Orioles' organization. Before joining the Baysox, Sebby was the fundamentals coach for High-A Aberdeen in 2023. Prior to that, he was a development coach within the Orioles' system in 2022. Sebby played collegiality as a catcher at Cypress College and Ball State.



Calvin Christiansen – DEVELOPMENT COACH

Calvin Christiansen joins the Baysox staff for his first season as Baysox Development Coach in 2025. Previously, Christiansen spent three seasons with Single-A Delmarva as a Minor League technology coordinator and most recently as the team's development coach. He is a 2019 graduate of the University of California, Davis.



Julio Ibarra – ATHLETIC TRAINER

Julio Ibarra returns for his second season as Baysox Athletic Trainer in 2025 and his sixth in the Orioles' organization. Before joining the Baysox, Ibarra spent two seasons as head athletic trainer in Single-A Delmarva and as an athletic trainer in the Dominican Summer League, Born and raised in Venezuela, Ibarra moved to the United States in high school, played college baseball at Pratt Community College in Kansas before finishing his career and earning his degree in athletic training at Texas Weslevan University.



Chris Frosch - STRENGTH AND CONDITIONING COACH

Frosch spent each of the past two seasons as the Strength and Conditioning Coach with the IronBirds and joined his manager, Mercado, in the 2024 Arizona Fall League. 2025 will be the fourth season Frosch has spent in the Orioles' organization following a two-year stint with the Chicago Cubs in the same role. Frosch also spent a year on the strength and conditioning staff at the collegiate level at both Texas Christian and Florida State University. Frosch played baseball at the University of Tampa, where he studied Human Performance.

CONCESSIONS

Concession stands at Prince George's Stadium have transitioned to a cashless experience for this season. Concessions can be purchased with a credit or debit card, or with mobile tap-to-pay. The new purchasing procedures will increase safety and security standards for fans, while also providing a quicker transaction experience.

DOGS/SERVICE DOGS

Fans bringing a dog (service or non-service) into the ballpark must prove their dog is up to date on their rabies shots: either with tags on the dog's collar or via written proof. Service dogs are welcome at any stadium event. Non-service dogs can attend games during Woof Wednesdays and Bark in the Park events.

FLEVATOR

The main elevator to the Luxury Suite Level of the stadium is in the area behind home plate on the 3rd base side of the stadium concourse.

IBEW LOCAL 26 FAN ASSISTANCE CENTER

The IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center is located just past the elevators on the 3rd base side of the main stadium concourse. Please go to the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center to report lost children, inquire about lost and found items, inquire about upcoming events, get Ticket & Group information or ask any questions that arise during your visit with us.

FAN CONDUCT

Anyone trespassing on the field, throwing any object onto the field, using abusive or obscene language or those deemed intoxicated will be subject to ejection from the ballpark and/or prosecution. If you witness a violation of any of these policies, please contact any Baysox Staff Member, Security Officers or the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center.

FIRST AID

Medical care is available at the Patient First – First Aid Office located just past The Tackle Box Gift Shop on the main 1st base concourse.

FOOD & DRINK

Eastern League rules prohibit any outside food or drink to be brought into Prince George's Stadium. Fans with special dietary needs can contact the Baysox offices prior to the game they are attending for special accommodations.

FOUL BALL/BAT ALERT

Please be aware that balls and bats may leave the playing field and can come into the seating area. Always stay alert, both in the seating areas and on the stadium concourse level. If you catch a foul ball, please feel free to keep it.

RATES OPEN

Stadium gates open one hour prior to game time. Times may be adjusted for special events.

LOST & FOUND

You may inquire about lost items or turn in found items at the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center on the 3rd base stadium concourse.

DARING

The Baysox will utilize the public address system to page a person only in cases of extreme urgency or for a lost child/parent. For emergency assistance, report to the IBEW LOCAL 26 Fan Assistance Center on the 3rd base concourse.

PUBLIC ANNOUNCEMENTS

SMOKING



PLAYER FEATURE - Trey Gibson

Trey Gibson was one out away from ending a memorable night in his home state.

Down at The Diamond in Richmond, about an hour from his hometown of Yorktown, Gibson had already fired 6.2 shutout innings in the second game of a doubleheader and needed one more out to secure a Baysox win.

With the count 3-2 on Richmond's Jairo Pomares, Gibson shook off his fastball and opted for his curveball instead. The 6'5", 240-pound right-hander took a deep breath, rocked, and threw.

Foul tip. Strike three. Game over.

It marked the first complete game shutout of his career—just one hit allowed, six strikeouts, and a night he won't forget.



"It was special," Gibson said. "Tons of family and friends there. It's a stadium I've pitched at before in my lifetime, but it was just a special night overall knowing that I had a lot of family there."

It would be the start of a dominant month of July for the Orioles' No. 19 prospect. His performance against the Flying Squirrels earned him Eastern League Pitcher of the Week honors. He won the award again on July 28, after delivering seven shutout innings and eight strikeouts in Altoona three days earlier.

The right-hander finished July with a 1.23 ERA in 22 innings, racking up 28 strikeouts to just six walks.

"The past month or so I've been working with [pitching coach] Jordie Henry on my sinker,"
Gibson said. "I've been getting several two-pitch outs on that pitch, a lot of ground balls,
and many uncomfortable swings from right-handed hitters on it. I feel good
about the direction that my sinker is headed."



Signed by the Orioles as an undrafted free agent out of Liberty in August 2023, Gibson has emerged as a breakthrough performer in the Orioles system this year. His 126 strikeouts between High-A Aberdeen and Double-A Chesapeake lead all Orioles minor league pitchers and rank third in the Minors overall.

Much of that success comes from his deep mix of offspeed pitches. He leans heavily on his curveball, sweeper, and death ball to complement his fastball and cutter. The death ball is a unique slider with more vertical drop than the traditional slider that works more horizontally.

"It's the same grip as my curveball," Gibson said. "I just throw it without turning over my wrist. I'm trying to kick the axis of the ball slightly down, so it gets some downward movement.

Luckily, I can throw it decently hard, and I can throw it at any time."

While his teammates and coaches know him as Trey, Gibson's given name is Richard.


"I'm the third Richard in my family," he said. "I've just been called Trey my entire life. I don't really know how or why it started."

Does anyone actually call him Richard?

"No. Unless you're trying to get under my skin," Gibson laughed.

Triple-A Norfolk sits just 40 miles away from his family in Yorktown—but Gibson isn't looking too far ahead just yet.

"I have to look at every day as a new day and try and keep building on the previous day," he said. "You can't think too much into the future because this game can humble you fast."

Ethan Anderson

The Orioles' No. 26 prospect has made his mark everywhere he's played. Ethan Anderson, a switch-hitting catcher and first baseman, has recently been heating up for High-A Aberdeen.

Anderson's career began in Virginia Beach, where he quickly rose to the top of recruiting boards. Choosing to stay close to home, he played college ball at the University of Virginia and made an immediate impact as a freshman, starting 41 games and hitting .302.

Over the next two years, Anderson solidified himself as a solid draft prospect. Though he never stuck as a full-time catcher with the Cavaliers, his switch-hitting bat was enough to draw second-round interest.

That stock climbed further after a standout junior season, where he earned first-team All-ACC honors, hit .331, and finished tied for sixth in the ACC with 20 doubles.

Anderson started both of Virginia's games in the 2023 College World Series before the team was eliminated, collecting hits in both games, including a solo homer against TCU.

In 2024, the Orioles selected him with the 61st overall pick. He played in 19 games between Single-A Delmarva and High-A Aberdeen and hit .288 between the two levels.

He started 2025 on a tear, stringing together a nine-game hitting streak to open the season. During that stretch, he drove in 11 runs and walked seven times. A slump in May briefly cooled him off, bringing his average down to the low .200s, but he rebounded in July.

On July 25, he went 4-for-4 with three RBIs in a game against Winston-Salem—a highlight in a 10-game stretch where he hit .314 with two doubles, seven walks, and just four strikeouts.

The switch-hitter generates more power from the left side and is known for his on-base ability. While not a power hitter, Anderson shines when hitting line drives.

If his recent stretch continues, a call-up to Chesapeake could be on the horizon.





PLAYER SPOTLIGHT: Blake Money

The presence is hard to miss at Prince George's Stadium. Standing at 6-foot-7, Blake Money carries himself like a 10-year veteran.

Compliments and playful teasing bring smiles to fans' faces, in sharp contrast to the frustration felt when Money faces opposing hitters. Eight games into his Double-A career, he has seemingly found his footing.

"I'm enjoying it a lot," Money said. "Obviously, it's been a lot of learning, and the competition is great. Every team we play each week, the depth that they have has been phenomenal."

Money's Double-A debut was a rocky one. In his first two appearances, Money allowed eight runs across six innings. But since then, he's begun to find a rhythm.



"It's just been learning how to execute pitches in certain counts, limiting damage, remaining in control of the game, controlling the speed of the game," he said.

In seven of his eight appearances, Money has gone three or more innings, making him a reliable option for bulk innings out of the bullpen. Since those first two outings, he has allowed more than three runs just once.

Over his last four appearances, he has a 3.85 ERA across 14 innings. He attributes his success to having multiple pitches on which he can rely.

"I feel like I've had good execution with a lot of my pitches, whether it be the heater, the cutter, sweeper, or the curveball," Money said. "And then the changeup has been there when I needed it the most."

His arsenal is still expanding.

"I've got a new pitch that I've been working on the last couple of weeks," Money said. "It was great for me the other day. I got three punch-outs on it. I'm working a little bit of a death ball."


A death ball is a type of slider that has more vertical break than horizontal. Money stumbled upon it by accident during the preseason.

"I was trying to actually throw my curveball harder, and then somehow, randomly, metrically, this thing showed up." Money said. "It was a weird chain of events, but that's what's so cool about this game. You can tinker here and tinker there, and all of a sudden you develop a new pitch."

He's also gotten support from a teammate.

"Trey Gibson throws a really good one," Money said. "He and I have talked about it a lot over the last couple of weeks—just shared some cues, some things that he talks or thinks about when he's out there playing catch with it or practicing with it."

As his confidence grows and his pitch mix deepens, so does his impact on the Baysox and their fans. No matter the level, his goal remains the same: "[I want to] get the guys that are on the field off the field and let them come hit, because that's what they enjoy doing the most."

ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: Kyle Stowers

In the top of the sixth inning of the 2025 MLB All-Star Game, Kyle Stowers jogged out to left field to replace MVP candidate Pete Crow-Armstrong. In his first full season in the big leagues, Stowers was taking the field at the Midsummer Classic.

His journey started in El Cajon, California, just 20 minutes outside of San Diego. He stayed in-state for college, *playing for Stanford, where he posted batting averages of .286 and .303 while hitting a combined 19 home runs* in his sophomore and junior seasons.

That production caught the eye of the Orioles, who selected him with the 71st overall pick in the 2019 MLB Draft. He went on to appear in 55 games for Single-A Aberdeen before the 2020 MiLB season was cancelled.

When play resumed in 2021, Stowers quickly made up for lost time. In just 36 games with Aberdeen, he hit .275 with seven home runs and 32 RBI—numbers that earned him a promotion to Double-A Bowie. After a quiet start at the higher level, where he hit just .154 in June, he quickly found his footing in July. That month, he batted .340, ranked fifth in total bases in Double-A, and launched seven home runs, placing him fifth in the Eastern League. He also posted a 14-game hitting streak.

Stowers carried his momentum into August and September and earned a call-up to Triple-A Norfolk on September 7. It took him a few games to get adjusted—he started one for 19—but he finished the season hitting .272 for the Tides.

Despite his strong finish, Stowers began the 2022 season back in Norfolk, where he continued to show promise at the plate, including a three-homer game in May. That stretch earned him a long-awaited MLB call-up in June. He debuted at the Rogers Centre in Toronto, where his first big-league hit was an RBI double to the opposite field.

After his brief stint with the Orioles, he returned to the team in August and hit .253 over 34 games to close the season.

Stowers faced setbacks in 2023, missing two months with a shoulder injury and appearing in just 14 MLB games. But in 2024, following a solid season between Baltimore and Norfolk, he was traded at the deadline to the Miami Marlins for Trevor Rogers. He finished the year batting .208.

Then came the breakout.

Stowers opened the 2025 season hitting .321 in April and added six home runs in May. In July, he was selected as Miami's lone All-Star. In the game, he was picked by manager Dave Roberts to participate in the swing-off tiebreaker, where he hit a home run to help the National League defeat the American League. He capped the month slashing .364/.451/.818 with 10 home runs and 20 RBI, earning him National League Player of the Month honors.

After years of growth, Stowers has proved he belongs with
