LOPSIDED LOSS: The Omaha Storm Chasers fell behind, 5-0, through the first two innings and ultimately fell, 7-1, to the Indianapolis Indians on Saturday at Victory Field. The Indians scored three runs in the first inning, two runs in the second, and their final two runs in the third. Omaha collected 10 hits—including three from INF/OF Gabriel Cancel and two from OF Brewer Hicklen, but stranded nine runners on base and went 1-for-11 with runners-in-scoring-positing. 1B Nick Pratto hit a solo home run in the third inning for the Storm Chasers' lone run, his third home run of the series.

BULLPEN BRILLIANCE: Through four games, the Storm Chasers bullpen has combined for 1.31 ERA (3 ER) across 20.2 combined innings with 33 strikeouts and seven walks. LHP Sam Freeman leads the relief corps with 3.2 scoreless innings while RHP Colten Brewer has struck out all seven batters he's faced in 2.1 scoreless innings. BULLPEN BY GAME IN THIS SERIES

FEELIN' 2022: 2022 marks the 11th season of Storm Chasers baseball (2011-pres.) and the 53rd season in franchise history (1969-pres.). Since 1969, 1,316 players have appeared in either an American Association, Pacific Coast League, or Triple-A East game. Of those 1,315 players, 987 (75%) have appeared in a Major League game. 311 players in franchise history (24%) made their debut with Omaha prior to their Major League debut.

THE MIGHTY THOR: Scott Thorman embarks on his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for **Brian Poldberg**, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlana on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager **Tommy Shields**, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: RHP Ronald Bolaños makes his second start of the season after starting on Opening Day on Tuesday, when he threw 4.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts and one walk. The right-hander made 10 starts for Omaha in 2021, posting a 6.34 ERA in 381 innings, striking out 34 and walking 27. After starting the year with Omaha, the 25-year-old from Santa Cruz del Norte, Cuba, joined the Kansas City bullpen before missing more than two months with a right forearm strain. He faced Indianapolis twice last season, both at Werner Park, striking out a season-high eight batters in 5.0 innings of one-run ball on 5/27 and allowing three runs on five hits in 4.2 innings with six strikeouts and two walks on 9/25.

FOR INDIANAPOLIS: RHP Osvaldo Bido makes his second appearance of the season and his first start after pitching in relief on Opening Day. He threw 2.1 innings on Tuesday, allowing two runs on three hits with five strikeouts and two walks. He made his Triple-A debut against Omaha on Sept. 26, 2021 at Werner Park, allowing nine runs (six earned) on nine hits—including two home runs, one to **C MJ Melendez** and another to **1B Nick Pratto**—striking out four and walking three in a game the Indians won 17-12.

DOPPLER RADAR: SS/3B Bobby Witt Jr. (2021), who entered 2022 as the No. 1 prospect in baseball per MLB Pipeline, made his Major League debut with Kansas City on April 7 at Kauffman Stadium against Cleveland, collecting a go-ahead, RBI double in the eighth inning for his first Major League hit. **RHP Collin Snider** (2021) made his Major League debut with Kansas City on April 9 at Kauffman Stadium, picking up his first career strikeout in a scoreless 10th inning as part of the Royals' 1-0, walk-off win over the Cleveland Guardians. **INF Lucius Fox** (2021), who was named to the Washington Nationals' Opening Day roster, is poised for his Major League debut with his first appearance.
