RHP XZAVION CURRY (1-1, 9.45) vs. RHP AJ BLUBAUGH (5-8, 5.27)

TODAY'S GAME: The Space Cowboys hold a 3-0 series lead after a 9-8 come-from-behind, walk-off victory last night ... Xzavion Curry is expected to start for Albuquerque while AJ Blubaugh is slated to take the hill for the Space Cowboys.

DOWN 0-3: Albuquerque has dropped the first three games of a series for the third time this season (also: August 5-6 vs. Round Rock, doubleheader on August 6, and May 20-22 at Reno, series split). Lost first four games just once against Round Rock.

SKID: The Isotopes have lost at least four-straight games for the seventh time in 2025 (last: August 3-7, five-game skid).

WALK-OFF LOSS: The walk-off loss last night was the fifth of the year for Albuquerque (last: July 11 at RR, Matt Strahm RBI single in the 11th, 9-8) and first via homer since September 21, 2024, at Reno (Sergio Alcantara two-run homer in the 11th inning, 6-5).

-All-time, it was the sixth walk-off victory for Sugar Land over the Isotopes, series began in 2021 (last: July 22, 2023, Jon Singleton three-run homer, 7-5).

SWIPES: The Isotopes swiped four bases last night, tied for the third-most in a contest this season (five times). It's the 17th time Albuquerque has stolen at least three bags in a game and the 11th time since July 1 (Braiden Ward promotion to Albuquerque).

-Since July 1 (48 games, Braiden Ward's promotion to Albuquerque), the Isotopes have stolen 73 bags, seventh-most in Triple-A and third-most in the PCL after swiping just 56 bags in their first 80 contests.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Albuquerque doubled three times yesterday and has multiple two baggers in nine-straight games, their longest such streak since April 23-May 2, 2024.

AGAINST SUGAR LAND: The Isotopes have dropped 77 of their last 104 games on the road against Houston's affiliate (OKC, Fresno, Sugar Land) dating back to April 2012.

-With a loss in any of the next three games, the Isotopes will drop their sixth series over 10 total sets in Sugar Land (four splits).

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller went 1-for-4 last night with a three-run dinger, his ninth of the season ... Has homers in back-to-back games for the first time since May 23-24, 2023, with Milwaukee

-Four of his nine homers have come in his last 17 games ... His nine homers on the year are the second-most in a season during his career (most: 2019, 13, with Double-A Amarillo).

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went 1-for-4 Wednesday with a double, extending his on-base streak to 19 games. Slashing .400/.514/.717 with five doubles, one triple, four homers, 12 RBI and 11 walks ... His 14 dingers on the year ties a career-high set in 2023 with Spokane (7) and Hartford (7).

-Over his last 72 games, is slashing .337/.431/.596 with 20 doubles, seven triples, 12 homers and 46 RBI, increasing batting average from .178 to .292.

-In the PCL, is 2nd in triples (8), T-3rd in XBH (47), 7th in OPS (.900), 9th in, slugging (.512) and total bases (193) and 10th in OBP (.388).

-Needs two triples, one homer and one stolen base over the final 21 games to tally 25+ doubles, 10+ triples, 15+ home runs and 10+ steals for the campaign, only accomplished by seven Triple-A players since 2005. Sam Hilliard is three doubles and one homer away from joining the list.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia went 3-for-4 last night with a double, extending his on-base streak to 15 games. Slashing .421/.507/.737 with four doubles, one triple, four homers, 13 RBI and 10 walks ... Was his fifth game with three-plus hits with Albuquerque in 2025 (last: August 16 at Oklahoma City, four).

ADAEL: Adael Amador went 1-for-5 Thursday with a double and three RBI. Extended his on-base streak to 12 games. Slashing .340/.456/.596 with five doubles, two triples, one homer, 15 RBI and nine walks ... Was his eighth game of 2025 with three-plus RBI and third in his last six games.

SPEEDSTER: Braiden Ward went 2-for-4 yesterday with two runs, a walk and two stolen bases ... Was his fifth contest with multiple swipes (last: August 14 at Oklahoma City, four) ... Has scored multiple runs in 10 of 28 games with a PA with Albuquerque.

-Has 25 steals with the Isotopes, tied for the most in Triple-A since July 1 (also: Duke Ellis, SWB) ... Has 198 swipes since the beginning of 2022, third-most in MiLB during span (Chandler Simpson, 225 and Jonatan Clase, 200).

SAM I AM: Sam Hilliard leads PCL in Triples (11) and T-3rd in XBH (47) ... Tied for third in all of MiLB in triples ... Second player in Isotopes history with at least 22 doubles, 11 triples, 14 homers and 11 stolen bases (other: Nick Buss, 2013).

CRIM DE LA CRIM: Blaine Crim is one of two players to tally 20+ homers in the Minor Leagues in every season since 2021 (also: Ryan Ward, Oklahoma City).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

Was the first true freshman to start opening-day for the Yellow Jackets on the mound since Kris Wilson in 1995 - Reached MLB in just his second full season of pro ball - Made MLB debut on August 15, 2022, with Cleveland and tossed 5.0 innings and allowed three runs on eight hits and one walk with three punchouts ... Became the Yellow Jackets' 73rd Major Leaguer in program history	- Over 62 games, 16 starts, in the Majors, tallied a 4.38 ERA (150.0 IPm 73 ER) with a 99:46 K:BB ratio - Made three relief appearances for Miami in 2025, tallying a 6.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 2 ER) - Released by Miami on June 3, 2025 ... A month later on July 1, 2025, signed with the Tigres de Quintana Roo of the Mexican League - Designated for assignment by Cleveland on August 6, 2024 ... Three days later, Miami claimed Curry off waivers on August 9, 2024
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- Made third Isotopes start on August 23 vs. Las Vegas and earned first win ... Tossed 5.0 innings and allowed four runs on eight hits, one homer, one hit batter and two walks with two punchouts ... Induced five groundouts and two flyouts over 23 batters faced ... Surrendered two-run homer to Zack Gelof in first ... In second, allowed RBI single by Henry Bolte ... In fifth, relented RBI single to Shane McGuire

- ◆ Began season with Marlins; had contract selected by Miami on March 30
- ◆ Made three appearances with club, recording a 6.00 ERA (3.0 IP, 2 ER)
- ◆ Designated for assignment on April 11 and outrighted to Triple-A Jacksonville April 14 ... Made 10 appearances, three starts, compiling an 8.04 ERA (15.2 IP, 14 ER) with an 8:13 K:BB ratio
- ◆ Released by Miami on June 3
- ◆ Signed with the Tigres de Quintana Roo of the Mexican League on July 1 ... Made seven appearances, six starts, tallying a 3.44 ERA (34.0 IP, 13 ER) with a 14:9 K:BB ratio
