YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels had their franchise-record 10-game winning streak snapped with a 6-5 loss to the Yard Goats. The Flying Squirrels went 1-for-14 with runners in scoring position and stranded 14 on base, including leaving the bases loaded three times. **Aeverson Arteaga** gave Richmond a 1-0 lead in the second with a sacrifice fly. In the bottom of the second, Cole Messina hit a two-run homer, Jose Torres brought in a run with a groundout and Dyan Jorge hit an RBI single to give Hartford a 4-1 lead. **Adrian Sugastey** hit a solo homer in the fourth to cut the deficit to 4-2. In the bottom of the sixth, Andy Perez hit an RBI double and Skyler Messenger brought in a run with a sacrifice fly to open a 6-2 Hartford lead. **Bo Davidson** hit a two-run homer in the eighth. **Jonah Cox** brought in a run with a walk in the top of the ninth but the Flying Squirrels stranded the bases loaded.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play the fourth of a six-game series against the Hartford Yard Goats, Double-A affiliate of the Colorado Rockies, in their first six-game road series of the year. This week marks Richmond's first visit to Hartford since August 29-September 3, 2024, when they won four-of-six. Facing the Yard Goats in the final series of the 2025 season and the final series at The Diamond last September 9-14, the Flying Squirrels won the first five games before dropping the finale.

STRONG START: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 10-2 start is the best in team history through 12 games, passing the 9-3 start in 2018. In the 10 wins of the current streak, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in seven of them. In five of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. On April 4, they scored two in the ninth for an 11-9 win at Erie. In last Tuesday's home opener, they never trailed but jumped ahead in the bottom of the eighth for a 3-2 win over the Curve. Last Thursday, they scored two in the eighth for another 3-2 win against Altoona. Last Saturday, the Curve scored two in the top of the 10th before the Flying Squirrels walked off with three in the bottom of the 10th. On Wednesday in Hartford, the Flying Squirrels scored five runs with two outs in the ninth to win 13-11.

MEET THE TEAM: This year's season-opening Flying Squirrels roster includes 19 players who have previously played in Richmond. There are nine players who have made their Richmond debuts this season, including **Maui Ahuna**, **Charlie Szykowny**, **Mitch White**, **Darien Smith**, **Greg Farone**, **Logan Martin**, **Cesar Perdomo** and **Dylan Carmouche**. Each of the newcomers also made their Double-A debuts this season. Of the 28 players, 11 were acquired by the Giants in the MLB Draft, five were signed by the Giants as international free agents, five were signed by the Giants from independent teams, four were acquired via trade and three were signed as non-drafted free agents.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have the best record in the Eastern League and are tied for the best record of all 150 teams across Major League Baseball and Minor League Baseball, even with the Giants' High-A affiliate in Eugene. The Richmond offense leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.303) and RBIs (85). They also have the fewest offensive strikeouts (94) in Double-A. Richmond leads the Eastern League in batting average, hits (128), total bases (203), doubles (35) and RBIs. In six road games this year, the Flying Squirrels are batting .325 (77-for-237) and have scored 59 runs (9.8 runs per game).

THE YARD GOATS are 5-7 on the season, tied for fifth in the Northeast Division. They opened the season 3-1, including taking two-of-three at home against the Baysox, before dropping four-of-five entering this series. In 2025, the Yard Goats went 69-68, third-best in the Northeast Division. Hartford's roster features three players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects, including LHP Griffin Herring (No. 12), 2B Roc Riggio (No. 15) and C Cole Messina (No. 23). MLB.com's top-30 Rockies prospects list features four Hartford players, including Herring (No. 9), Riggio (No. 10), Messina (No. 21) and LHP Konner Eaton (No. 26).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his third start of the season and the fifth of his career against the Yard Goats. He last pitched on Saturday against the Curve and allowed two runs over five innings in a no-decision, but matched his career high with four walks for the second consecutive start. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

FOR HARTFORD: Left-hander Alberto Pacheco makes his first Double-A start. He has pitched twice this season, both times as a reliever. On April 7 at Reading, he worked two scoreless innings and struck out three. In his most recent outing on April 12, he allowed three runs over 2.2 innings. Pacheco spent last season with High-A Spokane and went 7-9 with a 6.53 ERA in 29 outings (21 starts). This is his first Double-A season. Pacheco signed with the Rockies as an international free agent on July 2, 2019.

GREAT SCOTT: **Scott Bandura** has 11 RBIs over his last four games dating back to Sunday with a homer and five doubles. In the final of last week's series against the Curve, he went 2-for-3 with two doubles and drove in two runs. On Tuesday night in Hartford, Bandura went 3-for-4 with two doubles and drove in five runs, the most by a Richmond batter this season. On Wednesday, he hit a solo homer before clubbing a go-ahead, three-run double in the ninth. Bandura is tied for the Eastern League lead in doubles (6) and ranks tied for second in extra-base hits (8), tied for fourth in RBIs (12), tied for fourth in hits (15) and tied for ninth in total bases (26).

JUST HOW WE DREW IT UP: **Drew Cavanaugh** has reached base multiple times in seven-of-his-nine games played this season and ranks second in the Eastern League in on-base percentage (.564). In the minors, he is tied fourth in OBP and ranks ninth in OPS (1.278). He has at least one hit and one walk in seven games and has hit at least one double in five games.

COX ROCKS: **Jonah Cox** has hit safely in all 10 games he has played to open his Double-A career. His 10-game hit streak is tied for the longest in the Eastern League this season, even with Jackson Hornung of New Hampshire and Dante Nori of Reading. During the streak, Cox is batting .353 (12-for-34) with four doubles and 10 RBIs. Cox is also fifth in the EL with seven stolen bases this season.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 270 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PACKING THE HOUSE: In 2025, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in total (446,679) and average (6,768) attendance for the fourth consecutive season. The average attendance was the highest in the franchise's history. Tuesday's inaugural game at CarMax Park had been sold out for more than a month, marking the 16th consecutive home-opener to sell out for the Flying Squirrels. This season, the Flying Squirrels lead all 120 MiLB teams in average attendance (8,235).

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Drew Cavanaugh** is tied for first in doubles (6), second in OBP (.564), third in OPS (1.278), tied for fourth in runs (13), fifth in SLG (.714) and sixth in batting average (.393). **Bo Davidson** is tied for fourth in homers (4). **Scott Bandura** is tied for first in doubles (6), tied for second in extra-base hits (8), tied for fourth in RBIs (12), tied for fourth in hits (15) and tied for ninth in total bases (26). **Dayson Croes** is tied for fourth in hits (15). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for seventh in hits (14). **Turner Hill** is tied for first in triples (2) and tied for sixth in runs (12). **Jonah Cox** is fifth in stolen bases (7).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features three players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 3), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and **Joe Whitman** (No. 25). **Adrian Sugastey** is rated by Baseball America as the top defensive catcher in the Giants organization and **Jonah Cox** is rated as the top defensive outfielder. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Davidson (No. 7), **Maui Ahuna** (No. 20) and Whitman (No. 26).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1985: The Diamond opened for its first game, welcoming a crowd of 12,435. Connie Joyce, daughter of Dr. William Parker, threw out of the ceremonial first pitch, caught by Larry Owen. Steve Shields start-ed the game for the Richmond Braves and allowed one unearned run over eight innings in a losing decision as the R-Braves lost to the Syracuse Chiefs, 2-1. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 6-3, at The Diamond. Facing Fernandez Valenzuela on a rehab assignment, the R-Braves posted three runs in the first inning. Ramon Caraballo brought in Keith Mitchell with a single. Chipper Jones reached on an infield single that scored a run and later scored on a single by Melvin Nieves. After Rochester tied the score, 3-3, in the fourth, Mike Kelly hit a go-ahead single for a 4-3 lead in the bottom of the inning. Jones rounded out the scoring with an RBI hit in the sixth. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Altoona Curve, 6-2, at The Diamond. Will Wilson won the game with a walk-off grand slam in the bottom of the 10th inning.
