SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the RubberDucks, 7-2. **Seth Lonsway** started and took a no-hit bid into the eighth inning until a one-out single by Guy Lipscomb. Lonsway finished his outing with a career-high 7.1 innings pitched and allowed one run, tying his season high with seven strikeouts. Akron pitching issued 13 walks in the game, a new single-game franchise record for Richmond. It passed the previous record of 12 walks for the Flying Squirrels offense set on April 12, 2014 against Altoona. The Flying Squirrels opened a 4-0 lead in the top of the fourth inning without a hit. **Adrian Sugastey** reached on an error to start the inning. After a walk to **Justin Wishkoski**, a wild throw by catcher Cameron Barstad into center field on a double steal attempt brought home the first Richmond run. Tommy Mace walked the next five batters, including bases-loaded walks to **Aeverson Arteaga** and **Diego Velasquez**. **Vaun Brown** later scored on a wild pitch to open a 4-0 lead. Brown added an RBI single in the fifth for a 5-0 lead. In the top of the eighth, **Turner Hill** hit a two-out, two-run single to push the Richmond lead to 7-0. After the RubberDucks broke up the no-hit and shutout bids in the eighth, they scored one run in the ninth on a two-out, infield single by Jorge Burgos.

TODAY'S GAMES: The Flying Squirrels play the opener and second of a three-game road series against the Harrisburg Senators, Double-A affiliate of the Washington Nationals. This is the Senators final trip to The Diamond. Richmond went 2-4 in Harrisburg from April 8-13 and against went 2-4 at FNB Field from May 6-11. The Senators won four-of-six in Richmond from May 27-June 1. This is the last series between the two teams this year. It is also the last three-game series for the Flying Squirrels in 2025.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks seventh among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS are 9-3 in their last 12 games and tied for first place in the Southwest Division Second-Half standings. Their six-game win streak from July 4-10 was their longest winning streak since picking up seven consecutive wins from Sept. 2-9, 2023. It was the 17th time in franchise history the Flying Squirrels have won six-or-more straight games. In the nine eight games since July 1, the Flying Squirrels lead the Eastern League in triples (6), walks (57), stolen bases (21) and OBP (.342). Of Richmond's 53 losses this season, 29 of them have been by two runs or less (19 by one, 10 by two). Their 19 one-run losses are tied for the most in the EL with Reading.

THE SENATORS have won three consecutive games. In last week's series at Erie, they lost the first two games before taking three straight. Sunday's game was postponed. The Senators lost six consecutive games from June 28-July 4 but have gone 5-2 since July 5. Harrisburg's roster features four players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Nationals prospects, including SS Seaver King (No. 8), RHP Andry Lara (No. 18), 3B Cayden Wallace (No. 20) and RHP Riley Cornelio (No. 22). There are four Harrisburg players in MLB.com's top-30 Nationals prospects list, including King (No. 4), Wallace (No. 9), Lara (No. 15) and SS Kevin Made (No. 25).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 18, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.96 ERA (65 ER/198.0 IP) in 23 games, which is second-best in the Eastern League. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 1.77 ERA (18 ER/91.1 IP) in that stretch. In their last 12 road games since June 17, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 2.29 ERA (28 ER/110.0 IP).

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Jack Choate** makes his 18th start of the season and the fifth of his career against the Senators. He last pitched on Saturday at Akron and allowed two runs (one earned) over four innings in a no-decision. Choate had three straight starts shortened from June 19-July 1. On June 19, he pitched two innings before play was suspended at Altoona for rain. On June 25 against Reading, he worked two outs into the second inning before being removed with a high pitch count (58). He started against the Baysox on July 1 and allowed one run over three innings before play was stopped for rain. Last year, Choate spent most of the season with High-A Eugene, going 1-3 with a 2.90 ERA in 19 outings (18 starts). He was promoted to Double-A Richmond in August and made eight starts for the Flying Squirrels, posting a 1-4 record with a 5.82 ERA to close the season. Choate finished 2024 ranked first among qualified, full-season Giants minor-league pitchers in BAA (.231) and WHIP (1.21) while ranking second in ERA (3.79). Choate was selected by the Giants in the ninth round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Assumption University. He entered 2025 ranked by Baseball America as the No. 28 Giants prospect and No. 27 by MLB.com. **For more on Choate, see page two.**

FOR HARRISBURG: Right-hander Kyle Luckham makes his 15th Double-A start of the season and his fourth this year against the Flying Squirrels. His last outing was on July 9 against the SeaWolves and he threw five innings, allowing three runs. It was his third straight start getting charged with a loss. In his three previous starts this year against the Flying Squirrels, Luckham is 1-0 with a 2.65 ERA (5 ER/17.0 IP). In his seven career starts against Richmond, Luckham is 1-2 with a 5.95 ERA (24 ER/36.1 IP). He is in his third season with the Senators. Luckham was selected by the Nationals in the 15th round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Arizona State, where he pitched one season. He spent his first three seasons at Fullerton.

NEW FACES: Outfielders **Bo Davidson** and **Scott Bandura** were assigned to the Flying Squirrels this week from High-A Eugene. With the Emeralds this season, Davidson was ranked second in the Northwest League in batting average (.309), second in RBIs (56), second in triples (6), third in SLG (.507), fourth in OBP (.412), fourth in OPS (.919), fourth in hits (87), tied for fourth in total bases (143), tied for fifth in runs (53), seventh in walks (49) and seventh in extra-base hits (30). He was also second in the Northwest League in wRC+ (148). Davidson is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 4 Giants prospect and No. 8 by MLB.com. Bandura was leading the Northwest League in runs (65) and ranked second in hits (98), second in stolen bases (30), third in batting average (.307), fifth in OBP (.399) and seventh in total bases (140).

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 45 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 32 runners caught stealing. Sugastey has the second-most runners caught stealing by a catcher in a single season in franchise history, trailing **Jackson Williams** (35 - 2013). For his career with Richmond, Sugastey's 45 runners caught stealing for his career is fourth-most in franchise history, four behind **Brandon Martorano** (49).

SUGEY SHOW: At the plate, **Adrián Sugastey** is batting .286 (14-for-49) with two homers, a double, nine RBIs, seven walks and six runs scored over his last 14 games since June 21. His eight-game hit streak was snapped last Friday night, which was the third-longest active streak in the league at the time. For the season, Sugastey is second on the team with 31 RBIs and second with eight homers, which is a new career high.

KING OF THE HILL: **Turner Hill** has reached base in 10 consecutive games since July 3, batting .314 (11-for-35) with two doubles, two triples, a homer, eight walks and eight RBIs. Last Saturday night at Akron, he went 3-for-4 with two doubles and a walk. Despite not starting his season until May 27, Hill is tied for second in the Eastern League with five triples this year.

SAVING THE DAY: **Tyler Myrick** recorded his seventh save of the season last Saturday night in Akron. It was the 19th save of his Richmond career, which sits seventh on the franchise's all-time list, one behind sixth-place Cody Hall (20). Myrick has converted all three of his save attempts since July 1 over four appearances.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in hits (82), sixth in OBP (.373) and fifth in walks (46). **Turner Hill** is tied for second in triples (5). **Seth Lonsway** is third in innings pitched (87.0), sixth in ERA (3.31) and tied for seventh in strikeouts (81). **John Michael Bertrand** is first in innings pitched (90.2) and sixth in ERA (3.28). **Jack Choate** is sixth in strikeouts (83) and ninth in BAA (.237). **Joe Whitman** is ninth in strikeouts (78). **Tyler Myrick** is tied for fifth in saves (7).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 236 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Bo Davidson** (No. 4), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 7), **Joe Whitman** (No. 8), **Jack Choate** (No. 24) and **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 29). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features six Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Davidson (No. 8), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1969: The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 9-8, in 13 innings at Parker Field. Syracuse scored three runs in the first and four in the third to open a 7-0 lead behind two homers and five RBIs by John Ellis. After a 27-minute rain delay in the third, Jack Damaska cut the deficit to 7-1 with an RBI single. After a Chiefs run in the top of the sixth, Mike Page hit a solo homer in the bottom of the inning to move the score to 8-2. In the seventh, Darrell Evans hit a two-run triple and Damaska brought in a run with a sacrifice fly to close the score to 8-5. In the bottom of the ninth, Shaun Fitzmaurice hit a two-run triple and Evans tied the game with a single. After three walks to load the bases in the bottom of the 13th, Mike Page reached on an infield single to score Ralph Garr and win the game. **1976:** The Richmond Braves beat the Rhode Island Red Sox, 4-3, at Parker Field. In the fourth, Bob Beall tied the score, 2-2, with a single. Down, 3-2, in the seventh, Beall singled in a run to tie the score again. In the ninth, Jeff Geach led off with a triple. Rhode Island manager Joe Morgan brought right fielder Dave Machemer to play between short and third for a five-man infield. After a flyout and a groundout, Machemer returned to the outfield. With two outs, Bob Beall won the game with a walk-off single. **1988:** The Richmond Braves beat the Pawtucket Red Sox, 3-1, at The Diamond. John Smoltz started and pitched five perfect innings, retiring all 15 batters he faced on 46 pitches for his 10th win of the season. It was his final R-Braves start. Before the game, the 21-year-old pitcher received a call from a reporter who asked him for his thoughts on being promoted to the big leagues, which was a surprise to Smoltz. The reporter told Smoltz he better talk to his manager, Jim Beachamp, who told him he would be on a pitch limit because he was heading to the majors.
